# Carrie Wilson Know the signs a baby bear is near

Q: When hunting bears, how can you be certain that the adult you are stalking does not have a cub nearby? And what should be done if after the harvesting of a bear, you determine or find out that it had a cub hidden from sight, like up a tree?

— Dwight H.

A: As you track the bear and do not encounter smaller bear-like tracks in close proximity, it may indicate you are not stalking a family unit but instead an individual adult or sub-adult. If possible, from a distance try to observe the bear with binoculars to further verify that it is not accompanied by cubs.

According to California Department of Fish and Wildlife Bear Program Coordinator Jesse Garcia, black bear young are born around the first of February while the sow is hibernating. The newborn cubs weigh less than a pound at birth and continue developing while suckling. They emerge with the sow from their dens in April or May at around five to seven pounds.

Cubs are dependent on their mother's milk for 30 weeks - birth through early September, transitioning to solid food after their teeth have erupted, and will reach independence at 16 to 18 months. Cubs approaching their first birthday will be denning with their mother and learn aspects about hibernating.

Cubs of the year will be dependent upon and remain with their mother throughout the entire bear season while they are less than a year old. Sows with yearlings - one year plus - will have separated by the time the first bear season opens in early August. The percentage of sows with cubs of the year during bear season can change from one year to the next based on various factors.

Keep in mind that all bear harvesting requires immediate reporting. Therefore, the inadvertent take of a sow with a hidden cub would also need to be reported for follow-up enforcement action. If there is any doubt at all, do not take the bear.

Q: As our creeks dry up, ponds are formed, some of which appear at the road culverts. Is it legal to fish these ponds with a pole, by hand or a dip net?

— Jeanne G., Portola

A: In intermittent streams like you describe, what appear to be ponds are actually isolated pools. Although not apparent during the dry season, water may still be flowing out of sight, under the streambed surface. This is often called intragravel flow. Because a creek is still a stream and not actually a pond or lake, the stream regulations still apply. Fish can only be taken from these waters under the regulations currently applicable for that stream, including seasons, limits, methods of take, etc. Current California Freshwater Sport Fishing Regulations can be found online or you can pick up a copy of the booklet wherever fishing licenses are sold.

Burt was a Champion story teller. He loved to make people laugh and he did it very well. He started telling stories at the Annual CBH/SAA Banquet and dubbed it as the "Tall Tales of the Quilled Shaft". He challenged



others to try to tell a "Taller Tale" than his in order to win the coveted Champion of the Tales of the Quilled Shaft plaque. Some of the non-believers said it was just telling lies but Burt held that only truths were told during these exercises of exaggerations. Those of you who missed these antics missed out on some good stuff! Burt was a true pioneer in the history of California's Archery. He fought for the Bowhunter and the Target Archer for most of his life. He spoke with Department of Fish and Game and the Department of Fish and Game Commission and he presented the Bowhunter's cases to the Senate and to individual legislators. He debated the anti-hunting crowds on many occasions. He encouraged our youth to pick up the bow and arrow and take up the pursuit of small game. He was the CBH/SAA Big Game Club's Small Game Chairman for many years. He was always looking at ways to increase the interest in the pursuit of small game and he traveled California over to find new creatures for his followers to hunt. Our hearts are sad for the emptiness and loss we feel with the passing of Burt. I will always miss him and remember him not as an acquaintance but as a friend and as a brother.

Burt Malech you are with our savior... rejoice in eternity our friend, our brother. Until we all meet again in another one of your Small Game Hunting Camps.

# **Legislative Information**

The next California Fish and Game Commission meeting (CFGC) was held December 7 & 8 in San Diego. Agenda items of interest, 16a petition 2016-20 modify CCRT-14 section 28.95 bowfishing for sharks and rays, 23; Adopt proposed regulations concerning enhanced penalties for illegal take of game species (Section 748.6, Title 14, CCR), 29. Authorize publication of notice of intent to amend mammal hunting regulations (Subsections 360(b) and 360(c), and Sections 361, 362, 363, 364, 364.1, Title 14, CCR) 30. Authorize publication of notice of intent to amend regulations concerning deer tagging and reporting requirements

(Section 708.5, Title 14, CCR), 31; Authorize publication of notice of intent to amend waterfowl hunting regulations (Section 502, Title 14, CCR), 32; Discuss proposed changes to regulations concerning the use of dogs for the pursuit and take of mammals (Section 265, Title 14, CCR) 34. Nonmarine items of interest from previous meetings (A) Department presentation on the status of gray wolves in California. Next meeting is scheduled for February 8 & 9 in Santa Rosa.

The next Wildlife Resources Committee meeting will be January 18<sup>th</sup> in Redding. Continued discussion on the Predator Policy work group in regards to non-game and predators. No agenda has been posted at this writing.

Deer hunting in California has concluded, you have until the end of January to submit your deer report cards regardless of success or not. Failure to submit report card will result in a \$21.86 per tag penalty when you attempt to purchase 2017 tags.

The California National Archery in the Schools Program (CalNASP) was adopted by the Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) in October 2005. Initial training of teachers and volunteers took place at Weimar middle school east of Sacramento. Steady progress has been made on continued certification of additional schools throughout the state. A virtual state championship tournament was established in 2011 to qualify a state delegate to attend the National Championship. New for 2017 will be a single point land based state championship to be held February 4<sup>th</sup> at Sierra College in Rocklin.
