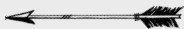

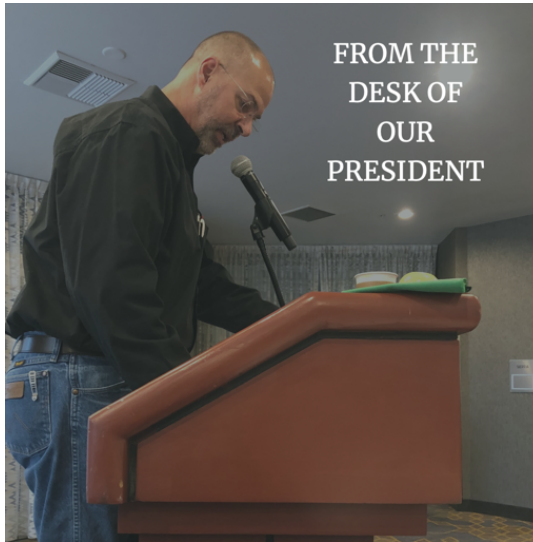

The Big Game Club has done a nice job of updating its measurer's list so please reach out and submit your animals. As I have said before, don't hesitate to have your harvest measured. It may not make the book, but its worth the experience and isn't particularly expensive. Keep in mind that many other western states have some nice hunting opportunities coming up. We intentionally moved the state meeting so as not to conflict with Arizona. Most of these other states are significantly less restrictive so now may be the perfect time to get out (without a mask) and enjoy some time in the field.

The state legislature has finished their session and as previously noted, it doesn't make much difference what they say if the Governor wants it anyway. We saw the Kalra 3030 bill go down in flames only to see the Governor's office issue an executive order mandating it anyway. That being said, our legislative team headed by Robert Moore, continues the good fight. The Fish and Game Commission meets on December 9th and 10th for their last meeting of the year. Go to the F&G Commission website to get the agenda and call in details if you wish to participate. The last meeting of the year is usually uneventful, but its always worth listening. As most of you know by now, Commissioner Russell Burns has retired from the commission and that seat is now vacant. He was a good friend to the conservation community and will be missed as a valuable ally to outdoor sports groups throughout the state. CBH/SAA along with most all members of the outdoor sportsman's community has signed a letter supporting Mike Mikich as nominee for the vacant spot. Mr. Mikich's background is in organized labor and should be viewed as an asset to both the Governor as well as sportsmen and women throughout California. Looks like a win/win (if such a thing exists) for everybody. Stay tuned for more details.



As we all know, the state tournament calendar got shaken up a bit after the COVID mess really got rolling. Sadly, we lost the State Broadhead and State 900 Outdoor Target championship for 2020. BAKED CARP IN SOUR CREAM WITH WILD MUSHROOMS, HUNGARIAN STYLE

Serves 8 to 10

5 lbs cleaned and scaled carp

salt and pepper

4 T unsalted butter, plus more for the parchment paper

1/2 lb wild mushrooms, sliced

1 med onion, chopped fine

1 T chopped flat-leaf parsley

1 c dry white wine

1 c sour cream

1/4 c heavy cream

1 T flour

buttered steamed new potatoes

Preheat oven to 375.



Cut the cleaned carp into serving pieces, and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Place the pieces in a baking pan in one layer and dot with the butter.

Sprinkle mushrooms, onion, and parsley over carp. Pour wine over fish and cover with buttered parchment paper. Bake for 15 minutes, or more, until cooked through.

Mix sour cream, heavy cream, and flour in small saucepan and bring to simmer. When carp is about half done, pour sour cream mixture over it and complete cooking.

Adjust salt to taste, and serve with buttered steamed new potatoes.

A Fish and Game Commission meeting was held December 9-10, 2020, webinar/teleconference

Selected agenda items of interest **4** Justice, equity, diversity and inclusion Receive and discuss draft plan for developing a justice, equity, diversity and inclusion plan, and provide staff direction **DAY 2 CONSENT ITEMS**

Note: Items on the consent calendar are expected to be routine and non-controversial. After public comment, the Commission will consider approving items on the consent calendar in a single vote without discussion. The presiding commissioner may choose to remove any item from the consent calendar and allow a separate discussion and potential action on that item in response to a request by a Commission member, staff, or interested person. **18.**

California bighorn sheep, receive the Department's five-year status review for California bighorn sheep (*Ovis canadensis californiana*) which is listed as an endangered species under CESA. (Pursuant to Section 2077, Fish and Game Code) Staff will recommend this item be continued to a future meeting **21.** Wildlife Resources Committee, discuss referred topics and consider revisions to topics and timing. From meeting in September, (A) Mammal Hunting Lehr indicated that the Department has detected multi-year

declining trends in one population of deer and one of antelope; hence, it is recommending reduction in tags for each. Additionally, based on the unprecedented nature of wholesale public and private land closures, the Department is proposing a rulemaking to allow the Department to partially refund, and restore the preference points of, elk and pronghorn antelope tag holders who were not able to hunt for a significant portion of the season. The proposed refund would be available for fourteen specific elk hunts and two specific antelope hunts. Hunters would need to return unfilled tags to be eligible for the refund. The Department anticipates a revenue impact of just over \$75,000 and does not expect a significant loss of opportunity for deer hunters. Recommendation The Wildlife Resources Committee recommended that the Commission support and issue a notice of proposed rulemaking for the proposed regulation changes for the mammal package as discussed, including (a) targeted reductions in antelope and deer tags, and (b) partial refunds and restoration of preference points for unused elk and antelope tags in selected hunts. Consider approving draft agenda topics for next committee meeting. Wildlife Diseases (A) Disease Informational Items the Committee received presentations on treponeme-associated hoof disease (TAHD), rabbit hemorrhagic disease, *Lactococcus garvieae*, and adenovirus hemorrhagic disease. (A) Committee work plan. Scheduled topics include: • Update on progress of boat limit discussions • Update on bullfrog and non-native turtle stakeholder engagement process (B) Next committee meeting, January 17th **25.** Waterfowl hunting (annual) consider authorizing publication of notice of intent to amend waterfowl hunting regulations. (Amend Section 502, Title 14, CCR) **26.** Mammal hunting, consider authorizing publication of notice of intent to amend regulations for deer and antelope hunting quotas and seasons, and regulations for elk, antelope, and bighorn sheep tags. (Amend sections 360, 363, and 708.19, Title 14, CCR) **28.** Wildlife and inland fisheries petitions for regulation change Consider requests submitted by members of the public to adopt, amend, or repeal a regulation. (Pursuant to Section 662, Title 14, CCR) (A) Action on current petitions – none scheduled at this time (B) Action on pending regulation petitions referred to staff or the Department for review I. Petition #2012-005 AM 1: Striped bass slot limit **29.** Wildlife and inland fisheries non-regulatory requests from previous meetings, consider action on non-regulatory requests submitted by members of the public at previous meetings. ←→

How to Submit a Score The Basics

First let's go over some basic measuring protocols. (Most often a 60 day drying period at room temperature) is required.

What you will need to provide:

Hunters Name

CBH Membership# Expiration Date (you can join CBH/SAA for \$40)

A complete set of Pictures: Field, Front view, R side and L view.

Complete and Sign Affidavit and Score Sheet
CBH/SAA Big Game Club Recording Fee (\$10)

The measurer must include their assigned number and submit all forms outlined above.

(If Committee Measured include ALL three measurer's numbers (*required*). When all forms are signed the measurer mails in the entire application. Once received the packet is checked for completed forms and accuracy in all areas before approval. Once approved the entry is then entered into the records system and certificate(s) mailed to the successful hunter.

***When all of these things are not done it takes *extra time* to search the information or request those items outlined above which were not included. *Delays* in processing and recording are never pleasant for anyone. ←

HAPPY NEW YEAR- Continued from page 7- So what will this new year bring? None of us can know, merely predict, presume and anticipate. One thing is certain most are relieved to have 2020 in the past. As you look forward planning your hunting year, and plan you must; will you book a hunt or rely on another DIY venture? Those of you that follow western hunting trends know all too well each year it becomes more challenging to obtain a tag and hunt on public land. Preference points, or whatever the individual states refer to them as seem less of an assurance for procuring a tag [ever hear of point creep?]. The state of Idaho while not enlisting the use of preference points has long been known as the fall back state. When individuals were not successful in drawing a tag sportsmen would take to the field on an over-the-counter (OTC) tag. Not so the past two years when both deer and elk tags were sold out before opening day. This set the stage for a huge opportunity for Idaho to inflate non-resident tag fees. While the state boasts of "more options" the reality remains a non-resident bow hunt for elk in 2020 totaled \$591.50. For the 2021 year the bow hunt will now relieve the hunters of \$918.50 (a \$327 INCREASE!) In over forty years in the work force this writer never saw that percentage in an annual wage increase. Back to the original point: PLAN. Looking ahead here are states' usual months for big game applications deadlines. Arizona - JAN/JUNE/SEPT : Wyoming - JAN/MAY/ JULY/OCT: New Mexico, Oregon, Utah - FEB (same for Montana plus the months of APR, OCT): Colorado, Idaho and Kentucky - MAR: Kansas, Maine, Nevada and New Hampshire - APR: California, Iowa and Washington - MAY: Vermont - JUN: Pennsylvania - JUL

***Plan ahead so you can enjoy the wilds and your hunts. While on the topic of planning ahead here are some dates and items to put on your calendar. As of this writing the Big Game Club is still slated to host the our **Big Game Awards Banquet**. The event is scheduled (Covid permitting) for **February 26th-28th @ Ontario Gateway Hotel, 2200 E. Holt Blvd.** Be sure to monitor CBH sites for the most up to date information and registration details. Looking further down the road your Big Game Committee has set the date for **2021 State Broadhead Championship**. We have returned to the traditional Memorial Day weekend which will be May 29th-30th. One way or another the **\$10,000 Reverse Drawing will take place**. Tickets are limited to 200 and are available with a \$100 donation to CBH Big Game Club. California Double: with a TRADbow

The end -

The sun had just started to set on October 15th near San Miquel CA at the Sky Rose Ranch. I, having just loosed an arrow was on my hands and knees in the grass looking desperately for my arrow or any sign of blood in the last bit of light of the day. Before I could find either my guide was standing behind me ready for a high five saying "He's down! He's down!"

The Boar was in a large sounder that had just filed out of the oaks and into a field to feed as the light faded. Jared and I having spotted them had already crawled into about 30 yards and were laying in wait. As the last of the hogs finally joined the party, I closed the final few yards on my own. Using my Vortex binoculars I picked a big red boar who had let himself fall behind the group.

From a kneeling position less than 18 yards away I'd knocked my arrow and slowly raised my Bwana longbow up into position, calmly drew back to anchor and sent the 615 grain carbon arrow on its way.....

The silence of the day exploded into the squealing of wild hogs running while all I could feel was my heart pounding in my chest. I immediately began thinking back nearly 30 years ago to a photo I'd seen as a 21 year old from a non-hunting family.

The Beginning –

It was mid-winter of 1990 and I had just picked up my first hunting bow from the Bow Hut in Visalia, a *Damen Howatt* 60# takedown recurve with a set of 2117 Easton Game Getters. On my way back home,

I decided to stop into a shop I'd heard about but not yet visited in Fresno: *Impact Archery*. It was a Tuesday night and they were just about to start their indoor TRAD League and I was right on time to pay my \$5 and join in. During the shoot I was checking out the brag board full of compound shooters who had taken some amazing animals, I'd never seen anything like it. As I stood there inspecting photo after photo, I found 1 that I couldn't move away from. It was a man with a recurve bow, full camo, posed next to a deer he had taken and all it said was ~Rodney York~

I searched the board and found another photo of the same man with a hog he had killed with the same bow. At that moment I said to myself "*I want to do that!*" Growing up in a small valley town I knew some people who had hunted for doves but none that hunted deer and back then nobody even talked about wild hogs.

The idea that a man could hunt in California with a traditional bow and kill a buck and a hog had just blown my mind. Over the years that followed I've been able to take several bucks and hogs with my recurve. Some years I'd get one, or the other, rarely both. Never both in one day. Absolutely never both in a little over an hour but here I was having just pulled the California Double.

The Middle -

The whole thing started with a *Facebook* post about some Management deer hunts at Sky Rose Ranch. This was a new Ranch in the California PLM program and with most of the Sierra on fire lots of guys were looking for options to hunt during the 2020 “covid-fire-lockdown” deer season.

Not really being interested myself due to other options, I pointed some guys I knew Jared's way after speaking with him about the ranch, the game available and his goals as a new hunting ranch.

A few weeks later I got a text message from Jared of a large 4x4 on the ranch he had on a game camera. We talked about it a while and he explained how he was letting it go 1 more year and seeing how he might grow out.

Somewhere during that text conversation he sent me a photo on a game cam of a buck with one of the most unique racks I'd seen on the central coast. My response was “that would be my target buck”. Over the next few weeks we talked about the **Wonky Buck** more and more and the next thing you know I'm on the ranch, longbow and binos in hand looking at the buck we named Arnold, bedded with his does under an oak. We took our time and set up an ambush near some water hoping the does would come to drink and Arnold would be in tow as the rut was just starting to heat up. I looked at my watch and it was 4:45. Just as the clock was passing 5 pm out of a wash comes a hot doe with a small buck on her tail. No sooner had we seen them in the glass and out of nowhere Arnold cuts the small buck off and takes the doe for himself. They were about 150 yards out and crossing an open field until they walked out of view. We looked at each other and agreed we might have a shot tonight. Just as we started

to get comfortable again the doe walks back out no more than 15 yards away, Arnold is behind her. I quietly knocked an arrow and the buck turned and looked directly at me... I don't think either of us took a breath for at least 30 seconds, then he turned his attention back to his doe and at 8 yards that was all I needed to take my shot.

We found him 60 yards away piled up in a dry creek. It wasn't until we got our hands on him we could tell how truly special he was.

His antler had been broken when in early velvet and had now grown into a 24” long u-shaped main beam on the wonky side and a deep fork with a sticker on the other, his teeth were ground deep into the gums. Arnold was in decline and we took him at the right time. No sooner did we have him tagged, photos taken and hung in the cooler we were back in the side by side after hogs. That takes us back to where this story began and where in just over an hour and a half after taking one of the most recognizable bucks in my 30 year history I'd have completed the California Double with a Tradbow.

Thirty years earlier I'd said “*I want to do that*” so it's only fitting that in a year as wild as 2020 I would finally pull it off.



Harold MacQuarrie

Harold Macquarrie, was born in Stockton, California and passed away in Fair Oaks, California, April 19, 1973, became interested in archery in 1928. He was Field Captain for several Flight and NAA Tournaments held in the late 1930's. "Mac" and his partner, John Potter, owned an archery shop in San Francisco from the mid '30s to early 1960. They made the Pomac Bow. (Po-Potter, Mac- Macquarrie). "Mac" also invented a dowel making machine and made cedar shafts. Pope and Young used Macquarrie arrows for their African hunt.

He was a prime mover in organizing archery clubs in Northern California in the '30s and '40s. The prime examples were: the White Company (Redwood Bowmen), San Francisco Archers and the Albany Archers (Tilden). He was an early President of the Northern California Division of California Archers Association, which later became the NCFAA Region, and assisted in organizing the California Bowmen Hunters in 1943. Together with Roy Hoff, he framed and presented to the California Legislature a bill, asking for a bowhunting pre-season of 10 days.



After several years, the bill was signed into law giving California archers their first "special hunting season". "Mac" was vice-president of CBH in 1954, 1955, 1956, and 1957.

He was awarded the Pomac perpetual trophy at a CBH Field Championship Tournament.

He received the POMAC "20" pin, one of the first medals to be awarded by an archery club (Redwood Bowmen) for shooting a "20" on an 18" or 24" target on a field round.
