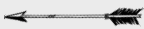

We are in a 2 year cycle with legislation. January will start the 2nd half of the cycle with the following bills still in play.

AB 645 (Gallagher) – Fish and Wildlife: Poaching Violations **Update:** is in appropriations committee and held under submission

AB 1223 (Levine) The Gun Violence Prevention, Healing, and Recovery Act, The Gun Violence Prevention, Healing, and Recovery Act, would, commencing July 1, 2022, impose an excise tax in the amount of 10% of the sales price of a handgun and 11% of the sales price of a long gun, rifle, firearm precursor part, and ammunition as specified. **Update:** 2 year bill

SB 370 Dodd, Wildlife: Big Game Management Account: uses. **Update:** SB 370 2yr bill

SB 470 Jones, Fishing and hunting: annual combined hunting and fishing licenses. **Update:** 2yr bill

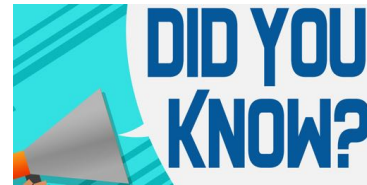
The next Fish and Game Commission (FGC) meeting will be December 15-16 by webinar/teleconference.

Wildlife Resources Committee (WRC) meeting is scheduled for Thursday January 13, 2022 by teleconference. No agenda has been posted at this writing.

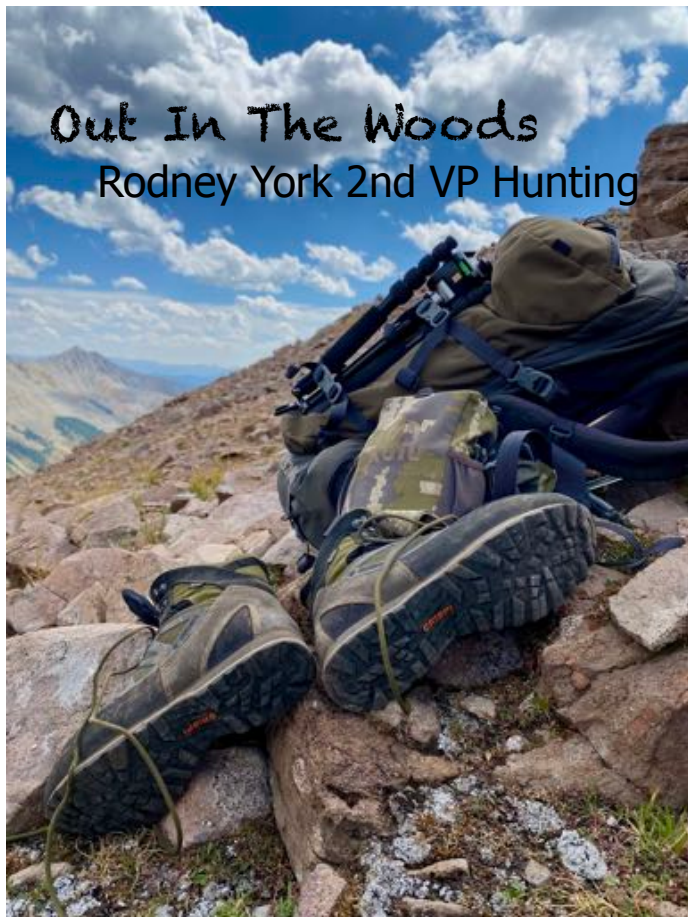

The Legislative Defense Fund

CBHSAA has a legislative defense fund that is available for the purpose of funding the activities of the state legislative representatives expenses and if hired a lobbyist. The volunteer legislative reps. at their option can submit expense forms for reimbursement if they attend meetings to represent CBHSAA. The meetings attended may include California Fish and Game Commission, any subcommittee meeting of CFGC, California Department of Fish and Wildlife, State Government, County government, City government and cooperative meetings with other conservation organizations. Most of the time Leg. reps. don't submit expense forms and consider it a donation to the Leg. fund.

CBHSAA currently has a hired lobbyist who assists the Legislative team. Continued on page 5

California bear season also has concluded. For those of us in the northern part of the state we have Golden Eagles. Golden Eagles such as these pictured below, in a battle over a rabbit



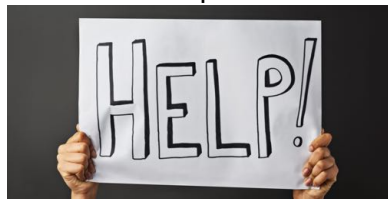
The Legislative Defense Fund, continued from page 4 -This fund is also there for anytime we need to seek services of a lawyer to fight a government entity who may be seeking to close an archery range or bowhunting area. Years ago CBHSAA sued the City of Burbank. While I don't remember all the details it did end up in the State Supreme Court.

No membership dues contribute to this fund.

The Legislative Defense Fund only gets it's funding from donations or fundraisers of which are limited. Donations have come from clubs who either donate a \$1 per shooter who registers for their tournaments or a yearly amount.

Members who join or rejoin CBHSAA may add monies dedicated to the Leg. fund or donate once a year. Members have set up reoccurring monthly payments/donations through their online banking. A reoccurring payment of \$10, \$20, \$30 or more each month would be greatly appreciated.

Unfortunately donations are not tax deductible due to our legislative activities the IRS has classified CBHSAA as a 501c4 nonprofit.



We need two CBHSAA State Legislative Representatives. Two regions have vacant positions, Regions 3 and 4. Region 3 covers Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, Sacramento (partial)*, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, San Francisco, San Joaquin (partial)*, Solano, Sonoma, and Yolo (partial)* counties. Region 4 covers Fresno, Kern, Kings, Madera, Mariposa, Merced, Monterey, San Benito, San Luis Obispo, Stanislaus, Tulare and Tuolumne counties. Anyone interested please contact Robert.

Golden Eagles (shown on page 5) Generally one egg is laid between January and early April and it is incubated by both parents for roughly 56 to 58 days.

So, time marches forth, waiting on no animal or bird. Another joy not to be overlooked in California is our year-around season to collect pork from the field such as this huntress demonstrated on her very first bout with wild hogs. Dawn Owen (cover) is no stranger to hunting and proved this again with her successful stalk on a bedded boar.



At 20 yards she took her time and settled the point of aim low; and just behind the shoulder which produced immediate table fare in less than forty yards.

This month both Wyoming and Arizona host hunts, your funds to apply for tags to pursue your quest to hunt and harvest elk in their respective states. In one short month away we shall gather the ranks of California Bowmen Hunters and guests to celebrate the success of hunts past and honor new inductees into our Hall of Fame. Cody's First Bull Frog By William Barr

It started with Steven Krock a friend of Cody Abeyta inviting him to a waterfowl hunt along with Scott Dayton and myself. Scott and I decided not to tell the boys and surprise them Friday night after dinner. Scott had an extra fishing bow the boys can use. Shortly after dinner we asked the boys if they would like to go BULL FROG hunting with a bow? They perked up like two does in head lights and said HECK YAH!! Scott and I gathered our gear and bow's and off we went.

Once we decided who was going to shoot first, Scott and I gave them a quick overview of bull frog hunting. First, to shoot bullfrogs with your bow you need a fishing license, once you're of age to have one, of course. Scott and I both had ours and the boys are both 12 years of age so they didn't need their own license. [A current California Freshwater Sport Fishing License is needed by any resident or non-resident 16 years of age or older to take, or collect, reptiles and amphibians in California". A good flashlight or two is most important. The frogs will be on the banks close to the water if not partially in the water. Shining the light 20 to 30 yards ahead looking for shiny yellowish-green glowing eyes. The bigger the eyes the bigger the frog.



Scott was first up to bat both of us using our hunting bows (set up for fishing) with small game heads. The boys walking and flashing light along the water's edge looking for the amphibians. It wasn't long before we spotted frogs, and soon after Scott sticks the first one of the night and it was a BIG one, everyone was excited. I was up next, after several jumping frogs and frogs that weren't cooperating, Cody saw one in the tules, not far from the shore. Bull frog number two... down. It was a small one. Up next was Steven, Scott gave him a quick lesson on how the bow fishing rigging worked, and how to aim and release the string without touching the arrow. Cody quickly found one close to a lonely bush, Steven drew back the string and ugh, a miss. This went on a few times, we decided to give Cody a chance.

Scott gave Cody some pointers with the bow and off we went Cody was hesitant and excited at the same time. We found one and Cody approached, drew back, and missed. This happened a few more times. Keep in mind we are shooting 3' to 8' feet away it's not far but it's not easy either. Steven and Cody were ahead about forty feet ahead of Scott and I. We let the boys be boys and enjoyed watching how they were working together to hunt the frogs. Hunting Bull Frogs at night with flashlights and a bow was an experience all on its own.

Steven spots a good one telling Cody the frog is next to a bush, look next to the tules at the water's edge. Cody spots it, gets into position, draws the bow back. TWAKKK! He yells out, "I GOT IT! I GOT IT!" And then jumped in shin high of water to get the bull and the arrow while Steven holds the light and the bow while Cody retrieves his first Bull Frog with a bow, the smiles on their faces said it all...

When A Wrong Tournament Goes Very Right

Every archer has a tournament where circumstances are not in their favor. Everyone knows the feeling; weather is rough, location is sketchy, maybe your equipment was damaged in travel or a flight was delayed. If you're lucky, the tournament will go smoothly or perhaps just one thing goes wrong and it can be managed. Sometimes we aren't so lucky. But it is in those moments that the archery community really shines.

My name is Anessa Williamson and this story starts on the 17th of August. My coach and I are heading to Virginia for Outdoor Nationals, and boarding a plane to travel all the way across the country. The trip immediately took a detour from the plan: we were stuck on the runway because our layover in Dallas was shrouded in an intense storm.

Three false starts, four hours later, we take off and make it to Dallas- but our connecting flight was cancelled. We are forced to spend the night in a hotel and the airline wouldn't pay for our room. We ask the airline if we can have our bags back to make sure they get on the plane with us the next day. Three times they assured us, "They'll make it to Virginia." Luckily, our next two flights went smoothly, and we arrived in Virginia unscathed. We would miss practice, but hey, we train for a reason, no big deal.

As we wait, tapping our feet at the baggage claim, watching the luggage make its way around the carousel, our worst fears are confirmed. None of our bags made it with us. At this point I can feel panic welling in my chest, my hands start to shake. My Godsend of a coach, addresses the airline employees and we learn that one bag was sent to New York and would arrive much, much later that evening. We didn't know which bag it was and had no way of finding out. The remaining two bags wouldn't arrive until the next day. Keep in mind, qualifications start the next morning.

We would later find out that the one bag was not my equipment. We scrambled to find a solution, asking around, "Do you know anyone that has any spare equipment?" One person replies, "I'll check," whipping out her phone typing away furiously like the hero she was. Theresa Caballero, a local archer and friend, pointed us in the right direction.

That night, within hours, we were saved. The archery community, notably the Women Master's, Master's 60+ and Master's 70+ division, converged upon us in the digital realm of Facebook, everyone offering something, people pointing out suggestions and tuning and plans for the following morning.

Many were up until the late hours of the evening in order to put together something, anything, for me to shoot. A bow here, a quiver there, several sets of arrows, a spare finger tab, an extra stand, all of it. One person in particular spent the night setting up her spare bow and waited for us to get there to try it out. Her name is Elizabeth Ginebaugh and I will never forget her kindness.

The next morning, I got to meet everyone else who had volunteered to help: Cadice Raines, Allison Eaton, Martha Anderson, and Barbara Schettler-Jehl, among others. The setup wasn't perfect, but the fact that I had a bow in my hand, and (several!) sets of arrows in my quiver. This meant the world to me. Continued on page 9



When A Wrong Tournament continued from page 8 These people put in so much effort and kindness for someone they didn't know, who they'd never met before, and I am forever grateful to them. I was surrounded by people trying their best, pinning a too-big chest guard together with safety pins, all saying words of encouragement. I had been adopted by their group, and I'm not going to lie; I almost cried tears of joy. It was my last big tournament of the season, and my fourth qualifying tournament for national rankings; I had to shoot, and they made that possible.

I'll admit that my score left a lot to be desired, but the truth is, I was just happy to be there, on the line, alongside my fellow archers, participating in the sport that I've dedicated the last 9 years to. And more than the logistical gain, these people have gifted me a memory that I will cherish for the rest of my life. Years from now, I will look back, and I will think of them, and I will think about the family that we all have become in the archery community. We have each other's backs. We take care of our people. And above all- we overcome adversity *together*.

To those of you that got me through this tournament, I want to say: Thank You. I couldn't have done it without you, and I hope your kindness is repaid in kind. See you at the next tournament! - **Anessa Williams**

I asked Anessa to pen down her experience in her own words about what other archers (and Coaches) would consider their worst nightmare during a tournament season. Arriving at your destination, physically worn down, patience stretched to its limit, and no archery bowcase to meet you. I'm glad that Anessa said it first and that's when I knew, I have to do something. Anything to help her. Giving up was not in our vocabulary.

For a moment, that day happened to us, our spirit sank - briefly - but I came to a decision that the next day, with or without the equipment, we will be at the field first thing in the morning.

Sure enough, someone heard our plea for help and it went out to the great grapevine of contacts, exchanging information, meeting, up until 11pm, the night before the first round of ranking. In 30, some odd years, of archery life, my fellow archers, my adopted community have never failed me and this is the best take away, in the worst travel experience we ever had KINDNESS and SUPPORT were given.

Anessa is right, this is the best "gift" we can ever give, to her generation and the next. Not a medal, or 15 minutes of fame: kindness. Out of kindness, we can lift someone's spirit. Out of unconditional support, we show them that you are never alone. Heroes don't always wear capes and leap tall buildings. We all know how precious our archery equipment is, especially since we spend days tuning, assembling and matching it to our skills. There were no questions asked, handing them over other than what else she needed. There was not one doubt if they could trust their arrows and bow to strangers. All they heard was that a fellow archer is in need and we can't allow anyone to stay off the field.

Put aside everything else, the world is full of good people, it just happens that most of them are archers. Thank you to the Masters Divisions for the tools and equipment. Thank you Masters Ladies for the pep talk and for stepping up with encouragement during the competition. Thank you for reminding me that what we do on the field and off it help shape and define what it means to be in the archery community. You deserve proper recognition for your outstanding act of kindness.

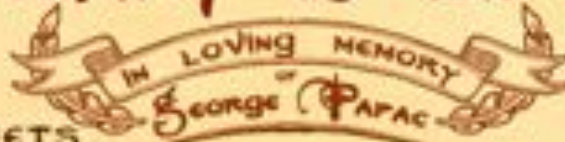

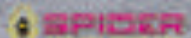
