

Legislative Team Update

Happy New Year CBH/SAA friends and family!

November was a quiet month for the CBH/SAA Legislative Team. Patrick Brannon, Joe Wylie, and I caught up with our lobbyist Bill Gaines, our partners in the California Hunting and Conservation Coalition (CHCC), and California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) staff at our quarterly CHCC meeting on November 10. I wasn't able to attend the whole meeting due to work conflicts but here are a few highlights from CDFW:

- CDFW continues to be challenged with staffing vacancies which are delaying a few of the wildlife management plans but the department is providing regular updates. We don't expect to see any major changes in tags and tag allocation until each plan is finalized but CDFW did share that they expect a decrease in Zone 1 sheep tags next year because the herd is below the mandated limit (15%) for mature rams. Bill Gaines was quick to point out that other sheep areas NEED a hunt but without an approved Sheep Management Plan, the CDFW deferred the conversation to 2024 (assuming the Sheep Plan is finalized).
- CDFW shared several enforcement actions including results from one CDFW checkpoint monitoring inbound hunter harvests from out of state. Out of 150 cars stopped, 1 citation and 1 warning were issued on the transport of wild game related to chronic wasting disease (CWD) prevention, a teen was issued a warning related to incorrect completion of a bear tag, and one potential poaching violation (deer, turkey and swan) is under investigation with a partnering state. CDFW was VERY happy with the rate of compliance with laws and regulations. Also, a call to 911 and CDFW in Garberville, CA resulted in authorities investigating and successfully locating an individual allegedly trespassing on private property and poaching.
- CDFW R3 efforts next year will focus on R3H3 and Advanced Hunter Education videos mainly targeted at adult-onset hunters and anglers (<https://wildlife.ca.gov/R3>). Current content (webinars and videos) with the highest viewing rates includes upland hunting, big game hunting, and fishing.

Finally, by the time you are all reading this letter the sad news will have reached most of you. I want to take a moment to acknowledge the passing of former Legislative

Coordinator and most recently Nor Cal Bowhunters Association Legislative Representative **Robert Moore** on November 25, 2022.

I am thankful to have had Robert as a mentor over the last year as I took on additional responsibilities in the CBH/SAA Legislative space. Robert was a wealth of knowledge, history, and practical insights into the workings of the California Fish and Game Commission, CDFW, and our State Legislature. Our thoughts and prayers are with Robert's wife Tammy and their friends and loved ones during this difficult time. Robert's presence will be dearly missed.



Robert Moore He Left A Legacy Johnnie Waddles (Cover Story)

It is with a heavy heart that I share the news that my friend, Robert Moore, died this past Thanksgiving. The bowhunting world of California has lost a leader and a guiding light in our community. As a distinguished expert archery and bowhunting instructor, he shared his passion with young and old alike, inspiring thousands of people to pick up a bow, connect with the outdoors, and truly appreciate their new or rekindled relationship with hunting. Robert's love for archery and hunting led him to engage in every facet of the sport. It was second nature for him to create and teach powerful youth programs, his work as an advocate with CBH/SAA to help pass new laws to benefit hunters was legendary, and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife entrusted him with developing and teaching their advanced Bowhunter programs. Robert helped blaze the path to what we now experience as a more open and inviting bowhunting environment in California. But far more than all that, Robert was an extraordinary human being whose kindness and calming spirit allowed him to connect and collaborate with everyone he met. Robert and I met not long after I moved to California, more than 40 years ago, when I began networking and learning about the bowhunting community in the state. Little did I know then that I had made a life-long friend and partner who shared a common love for archery, hunting, education, and community outreach. In every sense of the word Robert was a true partner in growing the sport of bowhunting in California. Earlier this year I acknowledged Robert's contributions to our community by awarding him the California Hunter Education Instructor of the Year. I am grateful that I had the opportunity to share my admiration and respect for him while he was still with us, so that others may know a little more of the significant impact Robert has made on the field of archery in California. His impact on our sport will be felt for generations.

Perhaps most importantly, I am thankful to have known Robert and to have called him a true friend. Robert is survived by his loving and supportive wife, Mrs Tammy Moore. Today, we celebrate the influential life of Robert Moore, honor his contributions, and give thanks for the energy and talent he shared with the world around him. He will be deeply missed.

Jerry Miller 1937 – 2022

It is with a heavy heart that I compose this article as Jerry was not only a Statesman to CBH/SAA, NFAA, and the Archery and Bowhunting Communities, but he was a personal friend, a brother, whom I called Mr. President when he was President and then he called me Mr. President when I was President. We had a long and special friendship.

I first met Jerry in 1980, at the first CBH/SAA Annual Meeting I ever attended. I was there as a guest learning the ropes of the CBH/SAA Annual Meetings. Jerry, at the time, was the Legislative Coordinator under CBH/SAA President, Pete Budding. I was in total awe of this organization, the officers, staff, and the board members as I sat there in that meeting. I had heard about these important people, the movers, and shakers, some famous and some not so famous, and I was rubbing elbows with them. Jerry Miller was one of those people. I had heard about him; I had heard how important he was in this world of archery and that he was a force to be reckoned with at the California Department of Fish and Game Commission Meetings. I, at the time, was the Legislative Representative (Leg Rep) for Bear State Bowhunters in San Diego and Fred Pasquarella was my mentor there. Fred had asked me to go with him to this meeting as he was grooming me to take his place as Leg Rep in the Southern Border Archery Association (SBAA).

It wasn't long after attending my first CBH/SAA Annual Meeting as president that Jerry, as the new Leg Coordinator along with the rest of the Leg Team, were fighting battles up and down the state where

archery and bowhunting was being attacked on several fronts. During these times my respect for Jerry grew and our friendship was cemented. I learned much from him.


Jerry got his first bow at the age of 12, (1949) but didn't become an archer until 1963 when a friend of his needed a hunting buddy. Subsequently he started to shoot his bow more and joined the South Gate Target Archers. A few years later he was a member of several local clubs in the LA area and held several different positions in the clubs. In 1975-1976, he went from being the Vice President of the Southern California Association (SCA) Region to being the President. During this time, he was instrumental in opposing and defeating the Wildlife Conservancy Group, a group we have battled many times, in their attempt to ban all shooting of bows and arrows in the entirety of Los Angeles County.

In 1975, Jerry was approached by Arlie Cliff to help establish the CBH/SAA California Archery Hall of Fame (CAHOF). Jerry selected the first CAHOF Committee Members which included John Slack, Lynn Gardner, Hugh Rich, Arlie and Kathy Cliff and himself. This committee inducted the first inductees into the CAHOF in 1977. Those inducted, which you will recognize, included Henry Bitzenberger, Babe Bitzenberger, James Easton, Mary Easton, Howard Hill, Roy Hoff, Hugh Rich, John Yount, Saxon Pope, Rube Powell, Doc Smalley, Art Young, and LuAnn Ryan (Olympic Champion 1976). Subsequently 102 other worthy individuals have been inducted into the CAHOF.

In 1976 CBH/SAA President Pete Budding appointed Jerry to the Legislative Coordinator position which he held until 1981, when he was elected President of the CBH/SAA for two terms.

In 1989, he was elected to the newly established NFAA Director position. This meant he was the very first NFAA Director for the State of California. He represented, with direction from CBH/SAA, all archers and bowhunters in the state of California at the NFAA meetings. Every state in the US sent its NFAA Directors to these meetings. Jerry held this position until 2004, when Tom Daily took over.

In 1996, Jerry was presented the NFAA Award of Merit by Pete Budding. And in 1998, he was inducted into the CBH/SAA California Archery Hall of Fame. Continued on page 10.



Measuring the Growth

The pine boughs of the tree obscured even an outline of the deer's body. But at eight feet it was certain the brown splotches verified the female which stood motionless. As the ninth minute passed she angled away and uphill. The buck was now close on her heels, and the head was thrown back with his nose testing her receptiveness. This was the week of peak rut in California. My pockets were empty, no tags, no knife; nor did a bow hang from a limb. I was in this tree for one reason, to learn more about animal behavior. In such cases of motionless in a tree, it is common for my mind to wander, and wander it did. How would I address the upcoming **California Bowmen Hunters Big Game Awards Banquet?**



What should be said in order to inform those who may not know about how animals are scored and how the process came about? *Boone and Crockett* was the first organization to create a system to measure animals growth quality. According to <https://www.boone-crockett.org/big-game-records-keeping> measuring trophy animals dates back to 1895. At the Sportsmen's Exhibition in New York's Madison Square

Garden, Theodore Roosevelt and other members first began scoring North American big game. In 1902, again with TR's leadership, *Boone and Crockett* created a standard scoring procedure for North American big game and organized its official scoring committee, of which TR served as a member.



The first formal recognition of outstanding North American big game trophies by the *Boone and Crockett Club* was in its 1932 records book, *Records of North American Big Game*. Compared to today's record books it included relatively few specimens that were listed by simple criteria of length and spread of horns, antlers or skulls. Since that first record book, the Club has published 14 additional All-time records books with the 14th Edition released in the fall of 2017.

Boone and Crockett Club's first big game competition held in 1947 (Trophies on display) at the American Museum of Natural History in New York City. Outstanding trophies were ranked by a series of measurements that were refined in 1950 into the current trophy scoring system.

Glen St. Charles was able to secure permission to use the same scoring system from *B&C* and in 1958, the idea of the record system was first introduced to the public in *Archery Magazine*.

Measuring the Growth from page 7 The NFAA compiled records for two years. In 1960, bowhunters gathered for the NFAA awards banquet in Graying, Michigan and decided a splinter the organization from NFAA in the style of the highly-successful *Boone and Crockett Club* was the next logical step for the records program. Measurers quickly began compiling archery big game records from across the nation and the newly formed club absorbed the NFAA's previous two years of records with permission from the organization. Thus, the *Pope&Young* records were born.

For the name, the group went with two of the four notable men who started it all, *Pope and Young*. The new *Pope & Young* adopted many of *B&C's* principles on fair chase and a scientific focus on conservation in the process. On January 27, 1961, *Pope and Young* became an official club. Glen St. Charles was chosen to serve as Chairman and the club's first President. The [St. Charles museum of bowhunting](#) was later named in his honor at the club's Chatfield, Minnesota headquarters. That museum has free admission and has continued to promote bowhunting ever since.


Only a year later (1962) within *California Bowmen Hunters* it became the responsibility of the *Second VP Hunting* to coordinate all the hunting programs for *CBH*. That same year the *California Big Game Record Club* was established to start keeping records of the big game animals taken by bowhunters within the state of California.

How then are measurements recorded to best represent a species consistently? The simplest explanation is that antler animals' length and circumference are measured in 1/8's of inches while skull, tusks and beards length and width are measurements taken in 1/16 of inches.



For antlered animals you want the deepest (LONGEST) tines. As seen in this comparison. The entire process is built on symmetry - what is on one side is what you want on the opposite. Sums are added and rechecked. The differences from each side is subtracted from the sub total for a "net" score. Growth from the back side or bottom of antlers are measured as non-typical! All this leads us to our present 31st Big Game awards Banquet.

The 2023 CBH/SAA Annual Meeting and *Big Game Club Awards Banquet* are slated for February 24-26, 2023. The event will be held at the Ontario Airport Hotel, 700 N. Haven Ave., Ontario, California. Robert and Jerry My Memories of Both

As I think of these two men, they both gave much to CBH and to archery. Jerry and I met when he was a regional officer, in 1977 when Pete Budding was first elected CBH President. He was who appointed Jerry as our Leg Coordinator and we attended Fish and game meetings. Jerry served in this capacity until 1981, when he became CBH President. He gave to archery and to CBH for many many years.

In 1986 while I lived in Sonoma Co. Robert and his hunting buddy from Truckee attended an IBEP weekend class lead by my wife Joan and I. That was first time I met Robert who lived in Citrus Heights where he and Tammy lived.

When Wayne ran for his third term as CBH President, he talked Robert into stepping into the Leg Coordinator's Shoes. From this point on you know Robert's history.




CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

1. This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to off the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Field tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event.
 2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be either a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
 3. The 2nd Vice President of hunting or his delegates shall govern this tournament.
 4. The range for this event shall be laid out in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
 5. Archers shall use hunting tackle for this event which is in keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game hunting.
 - A. Scoring:
 - 1) Vital-10 Kill-8 Wound-5
 - 2) An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "Pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
 - 3) "Bounce-ins" and "Glance-offs" shall not score.
 - 4) "Antlers" do not score
 - 5) Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
 - 6) Double scoring is required.
 - 7) This shall be a one-arrow tournament at un-marked yardages.
 - B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:
 - 1) Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64): Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (ages 15-17): Male and Female
 - d) Youth (ages 12-14): Male and Female
 - 2) Styles
 - a) Sight Fingers (S)
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Release (R)
 - d) Recurve (RC)
 - e) Traditional (T)
 - C. Awards:
 - 1) CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
 - 2) Guest Class is one class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
 - 3) No awards will be mailed.
 - 4) Cubs and PeeWees Participating Awards Only
 - D. Tackle:
 - 1) No Mechanical Broadheads
 - 2) Only ONE "izer" whether it be stabilizer, equalizer, side bar or any such weighed balance with a total protrusion from the bow not to exceed 12 inches.
 - 3) Bow Quivers are allowed in all styles.
 - 4) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
 - 5) No compound over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no weight limit.
 - 6) Binoculars are allowed. No rang finding binoculars allowed even with the battery removed. NO RANGE FINDERS , Period!
 - 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot—No Mechanical/Expandable Blades period.
- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (7/8 minimum diameter)
 - 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
 - 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
 - 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
 - 12) Longbows: any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
 - 13) Longbows: must be shot off the shelf
 - 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- E. Miscellaneous:
 - 1) Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only
 - 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
 - 3) All protests to the Protest Committee will be in writing within thirty (20) minutes of the end of the tournament each day an include a \$25 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
 - 4) There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
 - 5) Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament. Clubs and Peewees will not be allowed to shoot in top flight groups. NO EXCEPTIONS
 - 6) No target or sight notes allowed (sight tapes ok)
 - 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will be assisted.
 - 8) No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours—except for tournament officials.
 - 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
 - 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
 - 11) No cell phone, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or bow.
 - 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
 - 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualifications.


