Last on the event calendar for now will be the State Meetings with Hall of Fame Banquet and, of course, Vegas. Get signed up for both of them today! We need a headcount for the Hall of Fame banquet as soon as possible, and I hear Vegas is filling up fast, so don't miss out.

I did want to make a remark about the Big Game Club. The work we have accomplished is amazing. After a successful State Broadhead, we had a little money for a few new targets, so Bret made some killer deals, and we will see a few new ones on the range next year.

Jerry Maytum has done a fantastic job, along with Randy Long and David Bacon in getting many of the records straightened out and back in order.

We have a new Small Game Chairman in Andrew Mack who has hit the ground running and is cleaning up the small game records and species lists. Andrew has some great ideas for the tournament season next year and we are all looking forward to Palo Verde and Elsinore.

We are confident that we will have a new BGC Record Book available for purchase in 2026!! I want to say a big thanks to Bret for the Big Game Measuring clinic that he did at Oranco Bowmen. Austin and I had a great time and the class was very informative.

Our measurers' list has shrunk considerably over the last few years due to measurers moving out of state and, in some cases, passing away. Anyone who is interested in a measuring clinic (and becoming a certified measurer), please reach out to any member of the BGC, and we will do our best to put one together in an area near you.

Anyone who harvested a listed California big game species this last hunt season, be sure to get it measured and turned in. You never know, it might make the minimum book score and will get you on your way to being a member of the CBH/SAA Big Game Club! We are always happy to have more members.

The legislative team is hard at work as well! We have had the pleasure of participating in a number of meetings and discussions about Fish and Game decisions this last year and I think it has been very productive. I was personally thrilled with the new additional archery Elk tags that the department made available for 2025, and hopefully, the hunting community was too. Those tags came after a lot of work by CBH and RMEF, working closely with Gaines and Associates to get those offered on the books.

The hunting community has always worked for an additional bear tag for those avid bear hunters out there, and it looks like 2026 will be that year!

President's Message from Page 5- Two Bear tags are on the Big Game regulation recommendations for 2026, and they have momentum. I would like to see the archery and rifle bear seasons pushed together (butted up against each other) so archery Bear hunters get more continuous days in the field. We will push for that in 2027.

We have a sponsor for the "firearms carry during archery deer season," and our chances are promising. Assembly member Hadwick will carry that bill for us with CBH as the sponsor and others like CRPA in support. We are also looking forward to completing the Bobcat Management Plan and potentially bringing Bobcat hunting back in '27 or '28. The plan is completed in rough form and is currently approaching the peer review stage. It will then go to public review and hopefully a speedy adoption. Sadly, all of this takes time. Governments work on a different calendar than the rest of us, and sometimes we just have to say, "yes, I understand" and move on.

Amanda and the team are also working on revisiting the Gizzard Shad issue for all you bow fishermen out there. More to follow on that as it develops. We made a run at the department on that one a few years back and were not successful at getting that species added to the list, but this is a new crew and may be a bit more receptive. Keep yourselves up to date on all things legislative by signing up for leg alerts on the website.

My last update is Hunter Education. Hunter Ed is evolving and maybe not always in a positive way. Thankfully, we have not had any bowhunting incidents this year that I am aware of, but there have been a number of gun-related fatalities.

The Riverside County Sheriff's deputy was killed in Idaho by his partner while uncasing a loaded firearm from the back seat of the truck. A hunter in Texas was fatally shot while removing a loaded firearm from the backseat of the truck. A hunter in Wisconsin died from a self-inflicted gunshot while bringing his loaded firearm into his tree stand. All of these are preventable.

Carelessness is something we all need to overcome. Hopefully, it doesn't take a tragedy to wake us up. Follow basic safety rules anytime you are around firearms. There isn't a species in the world that's worth your life.

Please make sure you are planning ahead for Hunter Ed classes in 2026. There are fewer of us and fewer classes available. I have people traveling from the Central Valley down to L.A. to take Hunter Ed. Although I'm certainly flattered that people would travel that far just to hear my team talk, I somehow don't think that's why they're coming that far. Availability is at a premium right now, especially in the rural areas. Don't wait till the last minute. Especially, if you have a young person taking the class. They usually struggle and may need a second go at it to pass. Plan accordingly!

If you are in the middle part of the state and need some help finding a class or have enough for a class of your own then call me. I'll always try to help in any way I can.

In closing, I want to thank all of you for your continued support. I really appreciate everyone's membership in CBH and NFAA. Your support of archery in California and beyond is obvious and appreciated. I hope to see all of you at a tournament or event very soon!

BIG GAME CLUB

Well hopefully everyone had a wonderful holiday season and are chasing deer and javelina in Arizona now!

Congratulations to our two new measurers, Chriss Bowles and Austin Hong. They completed the two-day measuring clinic held at Oranco Bowmen in November. Chriss is in the Ontario area, and Austin is in Wildomar area if anyone needs to get an animal measured. If you are interested in becoming a CBH measurer, please call me to let me know and we will see if we can get enough people for another class.

We have a self-contained measurer's trailer with all the supplies to set up a class. This class will cost \$150 for each participant, and this provides all your measuring supplies.

Next, I have some exciting news for the 2026 State Broadhead Championship. As you know, it will be at Oranco Bowmen again on the Memorial Day weekend, May 23rd-24th.

We are going to try something a little different this time with a Hybrid marked yardage setup. Every target over 40 yards will be marked. We hope this will entice more new hunters who have only hunted with a rangefinder and weren't comfortable guessing the longer yardages. We figured everyone should be pretty proficient out to 40 yards, so we will help past that point.

We have purchased 16 new targets for this tournament so you should have fun shooting at some different animals. Look for the Tournament flyers on pages. If any Archery shops out there would like to sponsor a target please contact me for more info. Starting January we will start selling the \$10k Raffle tickets as well.

Another change we are making is adding a new Turkey category. We are adding a

"Bearded Hen Turkey" category with the minimum qualifying score to be 5" (combination of beard and spurs) So keep your eyes open this spring for a new species to add!

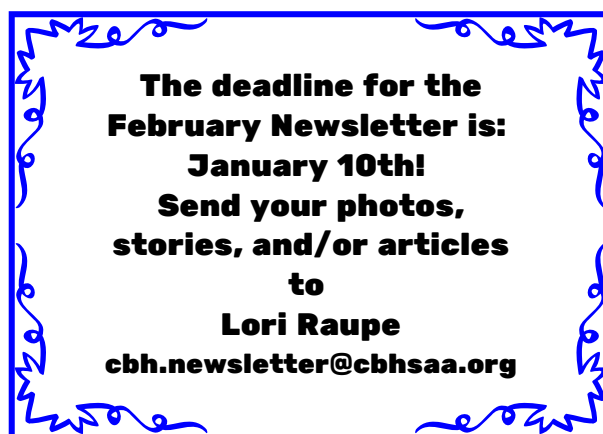

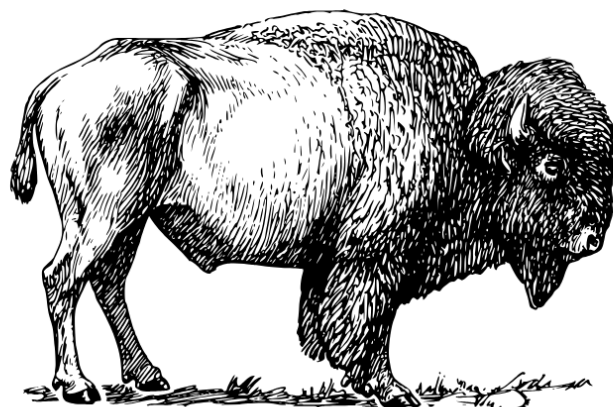

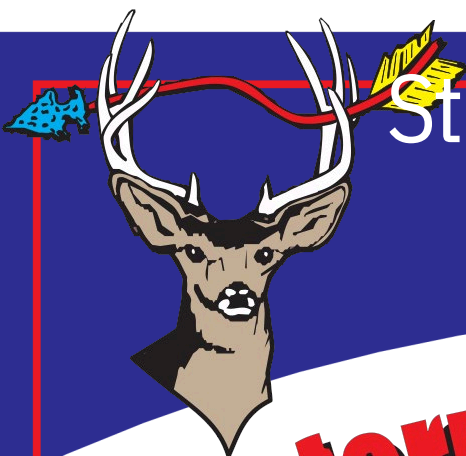

CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

Purpose & Overview

1. This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter and allows archers to compete using their hunting equipment. NFAA rules do not apply to this event.
2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be a one- or two-day event held on Memorial Day Weekend.
3. The 1st and Vice President of Hunting or their delegates shall govern this tournament.
4. The range shall be laid out to simulate hunting conditions whenever possible.
5. Archers must use hunting broadheads that comply with California State Fish & Game laws for big game hunting.

A. Scoring

- 1 Vital – 10 | Kill – 8 | Wound – 5
- Arrow must be in the target to score, except a pass-thru, which must be witnessed by other shooters in the group.
- 2 Bounce-ins and glance-offs do not score.
- Antlers do not score.
- 4 Shaft touching the line earns the higher score.
- Double scoring required.
- 5 This is a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.
- 7a. Targets 40 yards and over will be marked.

- A. Sight Fingers (SF)
- B. Compound/Recurve Non-Sights (NS)

- D. Hunter Release (HR) Bow must be camo or matte finish. QUIVER MUST BE ATTACHED TO BOW. Any sight ok, No stabilizer restriction
- E. Recurve (RC) No sights allowed
- F. Longbow (LB) No sights allowed
- G. Junior class (J) sights / non-sights

C. Awards

1. CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) required to compete for awards.
2. Guest Class (Male/Female combined) – no awards.
3. Awards will be mailed.
4. Cubs and Peewees receive participation awards only.

D) Tackle:

- 1) Mechanical Broadheads must be operational
- 2) 12" Stabilizer restriction on Bowhunter Release class, class only.
- 3) Bow Quivers are allowed in all styles, but are REQUIRED in "Hunter Release" class
- 4) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
- 5) No Compound over 80 lbs peak draw weight. Rec Recurves and Longbows have no weight limit.

D) Tackle continued

- 6) NO RANGE FINDING DEVICES ALLOWED ON COURSE!!
- 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish and Game codes at all times during the shoot
- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish and Game code (7/8 minimum diameter)
- 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 12) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 13) Longbows: Will be shot off the shelf.
- 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- 15) All Bows and Broadheads must be inspected on Saturday Morning. All Top Flights must be inspected on Sunday Morning.

E. Miscellaneous:

- 1) Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only
- 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
- 3) All Protests to the Protest Committee will be in writing within (30) thirty minutes of the end of the tournament each day and include a \$25 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
- 4) There must be a MINIMUM OF THREE shooters and a MAXIMUM OF SIX shooters per target each day.
- 5) ALL SHOOTERS WILL BE FLIGHTED BOTH DAYS OF THE TOURNAMENT. If you wish not to be flighted, then you can shoot in the guest class for no awards. Min 3 Max 6 shooters still applies. Cubs and Peewees will not be allowed to shoot in top-flight groups on second day. NO EXCEPTIONS. Parents will be responsible for their kids' care, if shooter is in top flight.
- 6) NO TARGET OR SIGHT NOTES ALLOWED (SIGHT TAPES OF)
- 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will be assisted.
- 8) No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours except tournament officials.
- 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
- 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
- 11) Cell phones allowed, pictures and promotion on social media encouraged.
- 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
- 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.

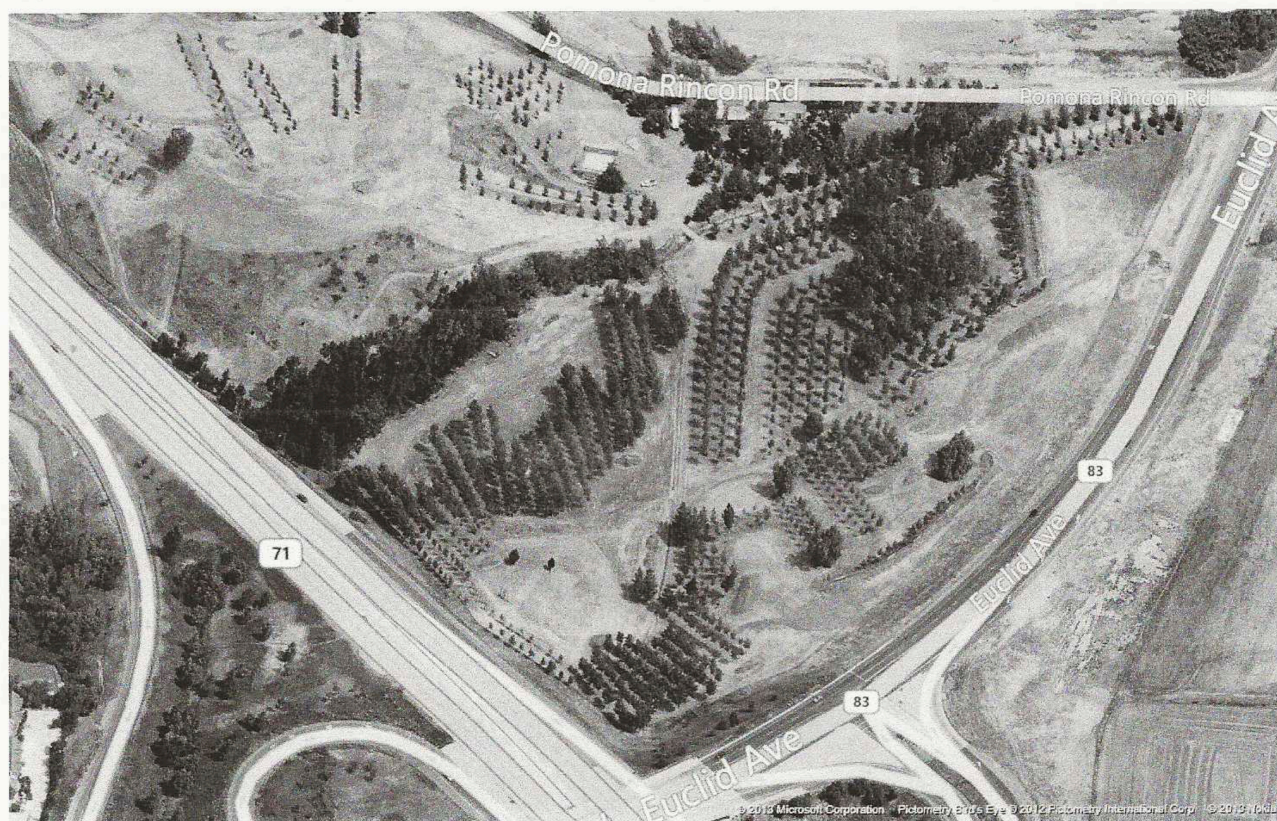
