

Legislative Information By Robert Moore

Follow up to last month's article I have highlighted certain items within the Fish and Game Commission (FGC) meeting agenda from December 12/13. CBHSAA was represented by President Chriss Bowles, Past President Wayne Raupe and Lobbyist Bill Gaines. Update: the meeting has concluded and after viewing the meeting video I have added a summary to parts of the agenda. Agenda items of note: DAY 1 - 2. general public comment for items not on agenda. The Commission may not discuss or take action on any matter raised during this item, except to decide whether to place the matter on the agenda of a future meeting (sections 11125 and 11125.7(a), Government Code). Update; no bowhunting/bowfishing presentations. 19. Departmental informational items (marine) The Department will highlight marine items of note since the last Commission meeting, (A) Director's report, *Update*; secured funding from Governor to fill budget shortfall. (B) Law Enforcement Division, *Update*; secured funding from Governor to fill budget shortfall. 20. Strategic planning Discuss and consider adopting core values, vision statement and mission statement, and discuss next steps in the strategic planning process. Note: CBHSAA participated in a working group with other conservation groups on the language of these documents. The commission has our recommendations along with others to come up with final statements. Update; commission took this to be a 2 day comment.. DAY 2 – Agenda item #21, general public comment time for items not on agenda. Update; several thank you presentations to Commissioner Williams and many comments on coyote problems in urban area including attacks on pets and small children. Commission took the step to hear from DFW on parts of this public comment. 20 cont. Update cont; approved new statements, the only reference to hunting and fishing is Consumptive and Non-Consumptive. This a first phase and the second phase starts mid year. 27. Wildlife Resources Committee Discuss and consider approving draft agenda topics for the next committee meeting. Consider approving new topics to address at a future committee meeting. (A) Work plan development I. Update on work plan and draft timeline II. Discuss and consider approving new topics. *Update*; approved 3 new topics, 2 fishing and upland birds. **31**. Mammal hunting Consider authorizing publication of notice of intent to amend mammal hunting regulations, including sheep/ elk tag quotas, and deer/elk tag validation, (Sections 362, 364, 364.1, and 708.6, Title 14, CCR). Update; tag adjustments, new hunt zones for big horn sheep proposed. Tag adjustments in a few zones for elk increased, share hunt increase. Clarify and update who can validate elk tags. Wayne and Bill commented. 32. Archery equipment and crossbow Consider authorizing publication of notice of intent to amend archery equipment and crossbow regulations, including bow draw weight and possession of a firearm while bow hunting, (Section 354, Title 14, CCR). Note: CBHSAA has met with DFW on both regulation amendments. The change to go from casting an arrow 130 yards to a draw weight minimum comes from enforcing a regulation and ethically having enough bow for big game. All western states regulations were looked at to establish this change.

Update; the minimum draw weight to hunt big game has been set at 40lbs. Wayne and Bill commented. Possession of a concealable firearm while bowhunting; Update: This change effects everything except deer due to regulation language within Fish and Game Code. Code changes have to go through the legislature so expect a follow up legislative bill this year to make the change for deer. Wayne and Bill commented. 33. Waterfowl (annual) Consider authorizing publication of notice of intent to amend waterfowl regulations, (Sections 502 and 509, Title 14, CCR). Update; a lot of discussion on weekday open/closure due to federal changes. Commission voted to modify the ISOR to possibly add 5 days to the waterfowl season, this is still in discussion. 34. Wildlife and inland fisheries petitions for regulation change Consider requests submitted by members of the public to adopt, amend, or repeal a regulation, (Pursuant to Section 662, Title 14, CCR) (A) Action on current petitions I. Petition #2018-014: Boat limit of finfish. Update; voted to move the petition forward. 35. Wildlife and inland fisheries non-regulatory requests from previous meetings Consider non-regulatory requests submitted by members of the public at previous meetings. (A) Action on non-regulatory requests I. Request to cancel hunting seasons in areas affected by wildfires. Update; DFW is monitoring wildlife in the wildfire areas and if necessary when final big game population surveys are completed may make adjustments. Not in DFW purview is non department lands and possible of closures due to past wildfire. III. Request for clarification on whether plastic corn cob is considered a decoy or bait when hunting. Note: interesting concept. Update; no presentation at the meeting, meeting documents indicated Chief of Enforcement contact the person requesting clarification.

Update on efforts to eradicate nutria in California *Update; region 3 taking over operations command, 351 taken so far, population is reproducing, still priority.* II. Update on wildfires and wildlife populations. *Note: see 35A.* Next meeting – February 6, 2019 in Sacramento, this is scheduled as a one day meeting. Committee recommendations for 2019-20 regulations Discuss and consider approving recommendations for upland game bird hunting regulations for the 2019-20 seasons. 5. Initial recommendations for Department lands regulations. Identify and discuss initial recommendations for changes to public use

regulations on Department lands. 6. Statewide sport fishing revision and simplification for 2020. Receive an update, discuss, and consider approving recommendations for statewide sportfish regulations revision and simplification. 7. Delta Fisheries Management Policy Discuss a potential delta fisheries management policy and repeal of the Commission's striped bass policy. 8. DFW big game management plans are being updated. The process has been in the works now for many years as they update best available science practices. The elk and sheep management plans are completed. The plans for Antelope, Deer and Bear are still in process, and releases should be in the order I have listed with bear probably several years out.

We have been fortunate that the current DFW executive management (Director & Deputy Directors) and current FGC commissioners are very responsive to fishers and hunters. The midyear elections are over and there is a new Governor for California. The Governor appointments include Secretary of Resources Agency, DFW executive management and Fish and Game Commissioners. FGC commissioners serve a 6 year term, on a very rare occasion the Governor can replace a commissioner before their term expires. Current members and expiration, Mrs. Jacque Hostler-Carmesin 1/19, Mr. Anthony C. Williams 1/21, Mr. Russell Burns 1/22, Mr. Eric Sklar 1/23 and Mr. Peter Silva 1/24. When the new governor takes office he will have the option to continue status quo or make new appointments. Only one commissioner's term expires at first of the year. She will remain on the commission until the governor fills the position or she retires. Update: Commissioner Anthony Williams has been selected by the new Governor to fill the position of "legislative affairs secretary".

While this will be negative for the Commission it can be great for legislation related to conservation and what the Governor does with that legislation at Mr. Williams's suggestion. We don't know yet who will fill his seat on the Commission.

Remember to submit your deer and/or bear harvest report even if you didn't tag one. Failure to submit your deer report will result in a penalty when purchasing the next years deer tags.




