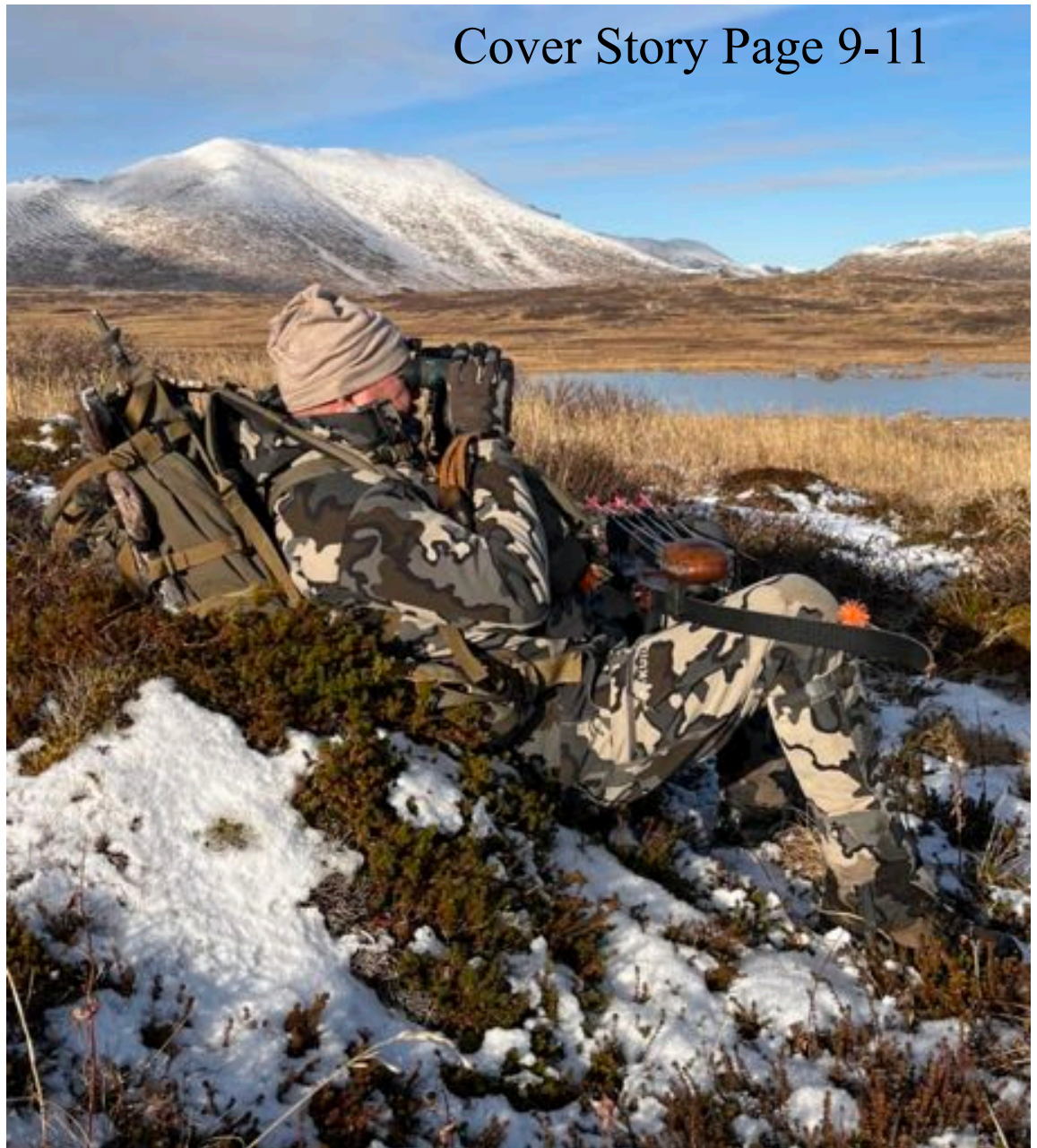

A Fish and Game Commission (FGC) meeting was held December 15-16 by webinar/teleconference. Agenda items of interest December 15, 2021, 9:00 AM  
12. Waterfowl hunting, Consider authorizing publication of notice of intent to amend waterfowl hunting Regulations, (Amend Section 502, Title 14, CCR), *FGC authorized publication notice*. 13. Big game preference points reinstatement and tag refunds. Discuss proposed amendments to big game regulations to include preference point reinstatement and tag refunds due to public land closures. (Amend Section 708.14, Title 14, CCR), *No action taken as it's in the FGC administrative process*. 15. Wildlife and inland fisheries and administrative regulation change petitions and non-regulatory requests (A) Consider whether to grant, deny, or refer for additional review, petitions for regulation change and non-regulatory requests received under general public comment at previous meetings. Note: New petitions for regulation change will be received under general public comment. Any petitions granted today will be added to the Commission's rulemaking calendar for development and future consideration. (Pursuant to Section 662, Title 14, CCR) I. Action on current petitions a. Petition 2021-017: Request to make multiple changes to big game hunting regulations. *This petition would make substantial changes*

Every one of you that carry an NFAA card or CBH card have a voice in what your state organization is doing and how your money is spent. ## Roy Dill WWII Veteran, CBHSAA and CAHOF Member

In February the CBH/SAA will be having their Annual Meeting in Visalia. A banquet will be held on Saturday evening at which time new members will be inducted into the California Archery Hall of Fame (CAHOF).

In light of the Anniversary of the Bombing of Pearl Harbor that we just recognized in December, I thought it would be fitting to recognize and remember one of our World War II (WWII) Veterans who also is a member of the CBH/SAA and the CAHOF.

Roy Dill and I communicate a couple of times a year and this year was no exception. I received a large envelope from him which contained a note and a book that he compiled from his brother Bob's daily journal during his travels in Africa. The book is titled... "A Wild Adventure in Africa" by Robert Dill. I read the book, which is a quick read of 49 pages, and found it to be very interesting and sometimes exciting because of misadventures, dangerous African animals, and terrorists.

I called Roy at my next opportunity and thanked him for the book and told him how much I enjoyed it. Then we began to chat about anything and everything. He told me that he had been interviewed by the local newspaper and that he was featured as the World War II Veteran in the December 7th issue commemorating the Anniversary of the Bombing of Pearl Harbor. I listened intently, to this man whom I respect and admire, as he told me about the article and other things involving his personal life of which I wasn't aware. Near the end of our conversation I asked him if it would be okay with him if I wrote an article for the CBH/SAA magazine about him. I noted the surprised humble laughter in his voice when he said... "Yes, you can."

Roy was born November 8th, 1926, in Chicago. His family moved to San Diego in 1928. In 1938 Roy bought his first lemon wood bow for \$6. This single purchase led to his lifetime involvement in archery and his love for shooting a bow and arrow. Roy subsequently joined the San Diego Field Archers and began shooting competitively until he graduated from high school.

As you all know from our history lessons, on December 7th 1941, the Japanese attacked the United States by bombing Pearl Harbor killing

2,390 Americans and sank or damaged multiple ships and destroyed military airfields. This surprise attack kicked off the United States of America's involvement in World War II.

Roy Dill was 15 years old and in junior high at the time of the attack. He recently said that he doubts if there are many, if any, of you folks that remember that day, 80 years ago, as vividly as he does. He recalls that it was Sunday morning and his family was having breakfast around the dining room table. The radio was on and we were listening to President Franklin D Roosevelt announcing the attack on Pearl harbor. Roy indicated that the severity and consequences of this attack didn't really register with him. However, his father was a WWI Veteran and he absolutely realized the possible impact and consequences of this attack which gave him great concern as he had two sons that could end up in the war.

**Roy Dill WWII Veteran** continued from page 6- Roy's father's concerns met reality when Roy graduated from high school and he received a draft notice in the mail. As Roy states it... "I got an all expenses paid trip by the US Army to WWII." Immediately after completing basic training Roy found himself stationed in the Philippine Islands where he stayed until the end of the war. He was then transferred to South Korea for the rest of his enlistment and received an honorable discharge in 1946.

Roy returned home to San Diego and with the help of his GI Bill he was able to obtain his MBA from Pepperdine University. His education however, did not interfere with his love of shooting a bow and arrow. From 1947 to 1951 Roy was a formidable competitor throughout the state of California winning many local, state, and national championships.

Just to name a few of the interesting ones... in 1947 he won the San Diego City Championship, then he placed second in the California State Field Championship, and placed second in the NFAA Field Championship. In 1948 he again won the San Diego City Championship, he won the California State Field Championship, he won the NFAA Field Championship, and won the California Clout Championship. In 1949 he set a new record for the California State Broadhead with a score of 930 points. He won the first Professional Archery Championship in Pasadena California. He shot in the first 900 Round ever hosted in NFAA competition. In 1950 Roy won the California State Field Championship shooting a newly recognized style of archery... "Freestyle." It just so happens

that this was the first State Championship Tournament where shooters in the Freestyle Class were allowed to have a sight on their bow.

In 1948, through 1951, Roy and his younger brother Robert (Bob) toured the United States performing in over 2,000 archery exhibitions.

As a side note... Shortly after Roy returned from South Korea Bob found himself in the United States Army and stationed in South Korea. Bob's talent for shooting a bow and arrow was known to the Army and he was allowed to take his bow and arrow with him to South Korea. Bob was even required to take his bow with him on some of the reconnaissance missions he was part of. The Army even did a Public Relations photo shoot there in Korea that featured Bob with his bow and arrow.

Roy helped Frank Eicholtz during the development and testing of Frank's "Composite Bows". Because Roy had a 32 inch draw length Frank used him to do the stress-testing of the bows. Roy's draw length was the demise of many of these bows as they would shatter before he reached his anchor point.

After a 30-year hiatus from tournament archery Roy returned to the competition fields and in 1981 he competed at the California State Field Championship Tournament held in Fresno California. He scored the third highest overall score at that tournament using a 46 lb recurve bow. Continued on page 8

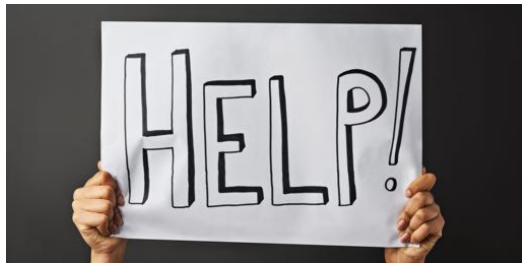
In 1990 & 1991 Roy won the State Traditional Championship and then in 1992 & 1993 he won the State Indoor Traditional Championship.

Reflecting on the war Roy said... Thinking back on the time from the attack by the Japanese, to the end of the war, on September 2, 1945, was an incredible few years to have lived through. He said the attack took our Country to its knees. The men went off to war while everybody at home went to work in different ways to survive and contribute to the war effort. Women went to work in the factories building aircraft and a multitude of other war machines and munitions. During that time everybody worked together and got things done. It showed what fantastic, almost impossible, things a country can do when the citizens work together.

Roy said... "What happened between December 7, 1941, when we were around our breakfast tables, and the end of the war on September 2, 1945... We should never forget."

On all written communications with me Roy has always signed off with "Ye Olde Ancient Archer... Roy" which always brings a smile to my face.

Now this one may shock all of you! Roy and Pam Severtson share the same birthday! I think that is just amazing! Roy Will be celebrating his 100th birthday in 5 years and all I can say is Pam looks damn good for being 95 years old!!!

We are in a 2 year cycle with legislation. January will start the 2nd half of the cycle with the following bills still in play.

**AB 645** (Gallagher) – Fish and Wildlife: Poaching Violations **Update:** is in appropriations committee and held under submission

**AB 1223** (Levine) The Gun Violence Prevention, Healing, and Recovery Act, The Gun Violence Prevention, Healing, and Recovery Act, would, commencing July 1, 2022, impose an excise tax in the amount of 10% of the sales price of a handgun and 11% of the sales price of a long gun, rifle, firearm precursor part, and ammunition as specified. **Update:** 2 year bill

**SB 370** Dodd, Wildlife: Big Game Management Account: uses. **Update:** SB 370 2yr bill

**SB 470** Jones, Fishing and hunting: annual combined hunting and fishing licenses. **Update:** 2yr bill

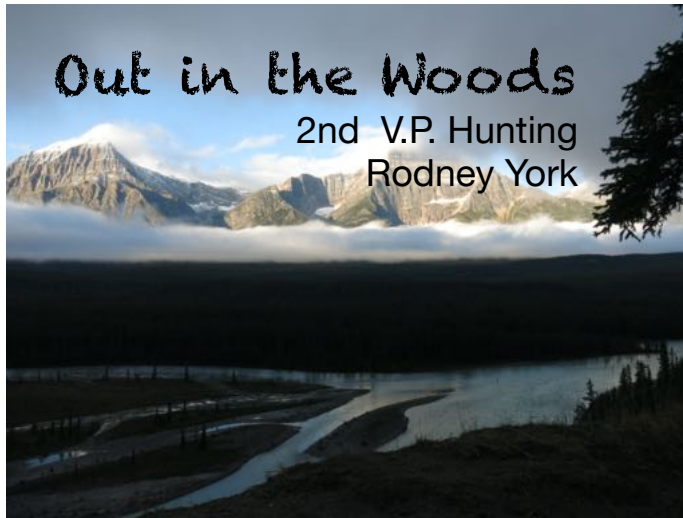

We had been hunting for six days in the bitter November cold on Kodiak Island when the eyes of a Sitka Blacktail became visible through the alders. At just 25 yards away, Steve and I had concealed ourselves. Even at that close range the alders were so dense I had to use my binoculars to get any real definition. In doing that, the form of a buck slowly came to shape, a good buck, the kind of buck we were looking for. *I turned to Steve and whispered, "There is your buck"*.

*In that moment everything we all dream about in a hunt had worked out to perfection. Our decoys were in position, Steve and I were set up just like we had practiced for months and the buck was starting to move into a place where Steve could get a shot.*

*To tell this story properly though you have to go back, not to the start of the hunt, not to earlier in the year but to the 1990's when (my now friend) Steve Walters invited me on my first deer hunt close to home in D7. We were young and capable; but green, not the seasoned bowhunters we are today. **A Handful of Feet Together** from page 9- We hunted hard in those years, we learned and grew as hunters and men. Over the years we formed a friendship that was close. A friendship that didn't require maintenance or need to impress each other: similar to the bond brothers may have. Due to the nature of our friendship I wasn't surprised when I got a text in February, *"2 spots open in the peak of the rut, kodiak island"*.

As that text pinged the phone, my wife saw me smile and she asked *"who's that?"* "Steve" I said. She asked, *"Oh, what's he doing?"* Well, he's asking if I want to hunt Kodiak this fall.....to which she responded, *"You should do it."* I looked at her and said *"It's expensive"*. *The conversation between us continued, Do you have the money?* Yes, but it's a long time away. You haven't booked anything yet and have vacation time, right? You should do it, tell him.

Excuses all gone - I responded **"Green Light, I'm in"**

Steve had done this trip twice before so I was going to rely on him to help me prepare as I've never hunted Alaska. He helped with a gear list, we looked at maps, worked out at the stadium for months and shot a lot. *Finally* after 10 months we were on *"The Rock"*. Steve gave me the first opportunity so I could get my species credit by taking a **Sitka Blacktail**.



On day four I got my chance. After hunting all day and being set up in a good spot we were able to decoy a buck in. Steve was talking me through it the whole way until the buck presented me with a perfect quartering, away uphill, a thirty-six yard shot.

The shot flew in slow motion, the arrow hit him a little far back but sank 18" into him as he bolted for cover. The blood was heavy and of good color, this was a fatal shot.

As fate would have it though I had shot this buck late in the day. Before we knew it darkness had covered us and we were in bear country on a fresh blood trail and miles away from our pick up location. I made the decision to back out, go to the boat and come in and collect the buck the next day. As luck would have it, the island had its own plans, and the temperature dropped to below zero. The winds came up and the waves were too dangerous for our transporter to land us on the beach the next day. Continued on page 11.





**A Handful of Feet Together** from page 10- We were forced to wait another day with the sinking feeling that the clock was ticking and the island and its Kodiak bears may claim my buck. We were able to get onto the beach on the morning of day six. We hiked the mile and a half to the *on X* pin I had set and we picked the blood back up and were on the track.

Fifty yards into the tracking we found a very large bear track - and then another, and another. I thought for a moment about pushing forward, but the idea of finding a 1000 pound bear with my buck wasn't an adventure I was ready to face. After several hours of glassing the grid we accepted my buck was lost. The cold in the moments following that became almost unbearable. I'm confident now it was more disappointment than hypothermia that had set into my bones.

That was about my lowest point of the whole trip. Then Steve said, *"there's a buck, there are 2 bucks.....they are about to face off."* That reset my thermostat and I was back in the hunt. We watched the two mature bucks face off, postured a bit and then the larger buck gave way; the winner set to breed his prize doe. We quickly set to looking at the map and came up with a plan to close the 800 yards for our play on this buck. The game was on.

Off the mountain we went, stayed out of view and with good wind. The river crossing, on a good day, would have been second guessed with its ice and swift waters; but today it was just a part of the process and we cleared it quickly.

Six days in and Steve had helped me every step of the way, encouraged me and given his whole hunt to my opportunity. Now it was my turn to return the gesture. Within an hour of first spotting the bucks we were in place, decoys up and back to the start of this story.

As I said in the beginning we were concealed near our decoys and in a prime spot where we knew a mature buck was on patrol. The doe we had seen earlier came into view first and she had us busted. She stood and stared at us for the entire conclusion of the setup but every once in a while she would look to her right.

After doing this three or four times I was able to pick out the eyes of the buck as we remained frozen. The buck stared at us through the alders for what seemed to be forever but in reality only a few minutes. Then he did something we could have only hoped for. He turned and walked to a spot we had already ranged at 30 yards. As Steve readied himself for the shot. The buck made it to the 30 yard mark, but he kept coming. I whispered to Steve 25, then at again at 20 yards. Steve sent an arrow and it hit its mark putting the buck down in under 30 yards.

It had all worked perfectly. Later when we green scored the buck it became more evident how good he was: he had surpassed the Pope and Young minimum by almost a full thirteen inches. Steve had taken a Pope and Young Sitka Blacktail with traditional equipment, a great bow hunting achievement. A day later I'd have my chance again when I took a beautiful Sitka Doe at 41 yards and I had my species credit and some amazing venison for my family back home. While falling short of my goal to harvest a buck, I did have an amazing adventure with a good friend. We are already planning to go back in November of 2023, to create new stories and enjoy once again the island they simply call "Kodiak."

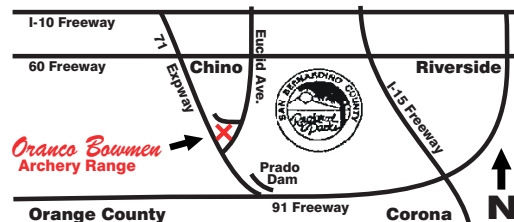

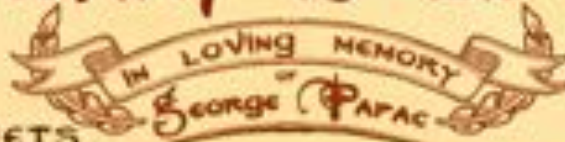
