Legislative Team Update

Greetings CBH/SAA friends and family!

The CBH/SAA Legislative Team has some exciting news to report regarding **California elk hunting opportunities** following the Fish and Game Commission (FGC) Meeting in December. California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) Elk and Pronghorn Coordinator Tom Batter kicked off the Elk Hunting agenda item with a presentation noting that elk populations in California are increasing and expanding/shifting range resulting in human-elk conflict being above tolerable levels, increased threat of disease, potential hybridization between elk species, and that bull/cow objectives are not being met. With CDFW's goal is to increase elk hunting opportunities where biologically supportable and compatible with population objectives, CDFW has identified the following areas where increased public elk hunting opportunities are feasible and support achievement of population objectives:

- CDFW is recommending establishing a **new Tehachapi Rocky Mountain Elk Hunt Zone** with a total of 25 bull tags and 25 antlerless tags, with 20 of the bull and 15 of the antlerless assigned to the SHARE Program
- CDFW is recommending a modification of the adjacent **Bear Valley and Cache Creek Tule Elk Hunt Zones** boundaries to bound demographically and genetically interacting populations, with the intended result being an increase in regulated elk harvest.
- CDFW is recommending increasing antlerless harvest in the **Siskiyou Roosevelt Elk Hunt Zone** by 10 tags and shifting the bull season to a later hunt period.
- CDFW is recommending increasing public bull harvest in the **Northwestern Roosevelt Elk Hunt Zone** by 22 tags.
- CDFW is recommending that the **La Panza Hunt Zone** be modified to a smaller area, creating a **new Gabilan Tule Elk Hunt Zone** with 4 bull and 6 antlerless tags from most of the Salinas/Fremont Peak Elk Management Unit and the full extent of the remaining La Panza Hunt Zone, and creating a **new Central Coast Tule Elk Hunt Zone** with 10 bull and 10 antlerless which will incorporate the Camp Roberts Tule Elk Management Unit.

Further discussion on DFW's proposed 2023 elk hunting regulations will take place at the Commission's meeting in Sacramento on February 8, 2023, with final adoption taking place at the Commission's meeting in the Fresno/Bakersfield area on April 19, 2023. CBH/SAA will work with

the CDFW and the California Hunting and Conservation Coalition (CHCC) to recommend that an appropriate number of these new elk tags be allocated toward archery hunts.

In less favorable news, CDFW also shared their proposal to amend **bighorn sheep hunting regulations for 2023** including a significant (up to) 5 tag decrease in tags available in the Marble/Clipper and South Bristol mountains units, which have been subject to extreme drought, low recruitment, and respiratory disease in recent years. While CBH/SAA and our partners in the CHCC prioritize conservation and health sheep populations, we believe that CDFW's proposal is overly conservative. Specifically, science seems to suggest that while a reduction in tags is appropriate, the proposed 5 tag decrease exceeds the number required to meet objectives based on the most conservative sheep population estimates. Moreover, we believe that a fundraising tag opportunity should be retained as it provides an important source of conservation funding for big horn sheep. CBH/SAA lobbyist Bill Gaines provided verbal testimony at the meeting to this point and CDFW proactively amended the proposal to include a range of tag reductions, up to 5 tags. Continued on page 4

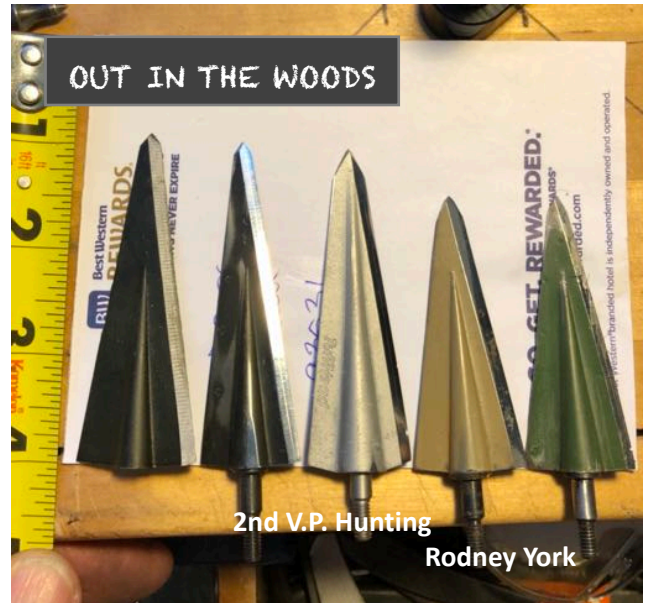
Additionally, the CBH/SAA Legislative team is following up on a few pieces of concerning news:

- On December 12, 2022, ABC News and other media outlets reported that **arrows with field tips and broadheads were being fired into the air and landing on rooftops in a Huntington Beach neighborhood.** Arrows and ball bearings have been showing up lodged in roofs and around houses in this neighborhood since summer, but the frequency of occurrences increased over the last several weeks and there are concerns that someone could be injured. As ambassadors for the sport of archery and responsible sportsmen and sportswomen, we cringe to see stories like these that could lead local municipalities to increase restrictions or otherwise limit our sport. Please contact the Legislative Team if you see/hear stories like these so that we can be prepared to take action if necessary.

- CBH/SAA is also following up on a rumored proposal to remove the archery hunting opportunity during waterfowl season at **Los Banos State Wildlife Area** (the only Type A State Wildlife Area Where Currently Allowed) to protect and preserve this unique hunting opportunity. We believe decisions related to this hunt need to be based on science and population health. Little is known about the proposal at this time. Stay tuned for more info.

State Broadhead 2023

Cover Story

Years ago it was the *California Bowmen Hunters Big Game Club* that came up with the idea of having a broadhead shoot to prepare for hunting season. Back then the idea of cardboard targets with bales of straw behind them wasn't a realistic depiction of the hunting experience. With that thought in mind, the host club, Woodlake Archers, and the skilled hands of *Dennis Haworth*, the first 3D State Broadhead Championship Tournament was held.

In that day, and many to more come, one large group of archers would gather in the evenings to share (and even embellish) the previous season (and even prior years) hunting stories. Depending on the year, something new like VHS videos were shared during the gathering. In addition to shooting the tournament, contestants shared their skills of calling coyotes, turkey and elk before the audience and the judges.

In other years, participants could enter contests to field judge various animals set out at random yardages and record their guess as to what the critters might score. Continued on page 5

State Broadhead Continued From 4- Those were times of close camaraderie, although competition lived there, it was the enjoyment of being together that topped the coveted trophy list. Friendship was the grand prize, outlasting even death. The number of shooting styles were but a handful rather than the three multiples of ten we see now. The “primitive weapons” were for the most part just that. Neither technology nor equipment advances had yet to begin their erosion of hunting seasons, limited number of tags, nor astronomical prices seen in every state today.



At last years' State Broadhead Championship we again experienced division within our ranks. “Protests” have now become the norm and most commonly these are over equipment used. The height of these protests seem to center around the broadheads used. The *Big Game Committee* was again caught up in these discussions and disagreements much more often and spending endless time on the subject.

Over the months that followed last years' championship, committee members conducted discussions in hopes of coming to a consensus to remedy the reoccurring problems. Many opinions were considered to include the following; but certainly not limited to these expressed. Please read through them to follow our deliberation.

Shooting a mechanical broadhead only in the locked open position? It may be simpler to say that no broadheads are allowed that are sold as a mechanical or moving broadheads.

Only allowing one stabilizer may not HELP us increase our numbers of attendees.

The State Broadhead tournament was set up to allow the hunters of our breed to shoot what would normally be considered archery “hunting” equipment in most circles, and to do so at lifelike foam/rubber animals in hunting scenarios. We understand that there are hunters out there using some more modern tackle. The vast majority of people we have spoken to have said they like things the way they are.

We have fielded questions from individuals complaining about the difficulty of the broadhead and asking for changes in rules. Most, if not all of these individuals are older guys and “trophy” hunters (not the furry kind, the award kind). If some at their advanced age can trudge around a course like NOMADS and score the way they do, then it is incumbent on the Big Game Committee to honor that by forcing the rest of us to toughen' up a bit and work for it. Some are adamantly opposed to any new age groups. Continued on page 6

State Broadhead continued From Page 5- Shooting Adult class and refusing to advance to the dark side (Senior) is adhered to by some. Some subscribe to the Craig Fritz mantra..."if the shirt is too big then eat more...if the shirt is too small then go on a damn diet". The Broadhead is hard, it was designed that way. It was NOT designed so you could win the Grand Slam. Shoot better.

An introduction of a petition codifying the Broadhead rules as completely within the purview of the Big Game Committee may transpire. Wherein, no one would have the authority to petition to change the rules of the Broadhead but with the blessing of the BGCThe Broadhead does not need more styles, it needs fewer. What the broadhead needs (along with all CBH shoots) is stronger advertising and exposure. We need to get the graphics on the measuring clinic trailer and then we need to get started with that project. We need to tell folks about - NFAA, CBH and the Broadhead, plus both BGC and SGC. We need to explain what CBH Leg Fund works to preserve and promote our hunting and talk up their shoots. What great tools to advertise!



The Big Game Club can NEVER make everyone in the archery community happy. You can add styles and classes until you are blue in the face. It will never amount to anything but talk and expense on trophies just to make one guy happy. Get out there and tell everybody what a great thing it is to have an animal measured and recorded. That is the true intent of this (BGC) organization.

History has shown many groups have promised more attendance at the Broadhead if we changed the rules and it NEVER came to fruition as they promised.

The Broadhead was birthed by our bowhunters and it was intentionally a test of hunting equipment and skill with the same. t's now a tournament but we still try to create a semblance of the original intent. We have seen thousands of bowhunter success photos and don't recall any of them having 40" stabilizers or multiple stabilizers.

People that can't win always want to reinvent the wheel hoping they can find the secret to winning. The secret is practicing; getting good at what you do. That's why the same people win most of the time. They aren't proposing changes in the rules to help them.

There are a 1000 or more archery tournaments each year in California for the tournament style shooters. There is but one Broadhead...in the whole country!!! We don't need better attendance but it would be great to see more people fall in love with it. We need people who have a passion for the Broadhead. The kind of passion that keeps them coming year after year after year.

Here is a really radical thought? What about no trophies at all? A real, dedicated bowhunter at the Broadhead would be thrilled to be able to own the bragging rights to winning that weekend and being able to say, "Heck yes! I won THE BROADHEAD!" Continued on page 6



State Broadhead continued From Page 6-There are rendezvouses where attending persons are charged either a day fee, or a full pass (three day). Shooters can go around any, or all of the multiple courses; as many times as they wish. They have NO score keeping and no awards. Hundreds and hundreds of people of all ages, genders, and ethnicities, each shooting their bows.

Each day has over 2,000 shooters engaging in conversation, swapping stories and in most cases just trying to help each other out. Nowhere else is such involvement in archery enjoyed as much - the entire event is about the camaraderie of bow and arrow.

All those, and hundreds of other considerations were heard and weighed before the *Big Game Committee* decided to proceed in a direction which it felt would allow for the smoothest running, in the original intent of our broadhead tournament.

Please read through our flier, invite a friend and come enjoy our 2023 Broadhead Championship at the host club range in Lodi. No mechanically manufactured broadhead - ONLY fixed blades - NO Mechanical BROADHEADS period. Only **ONE** "izer" whether it be stabilizer, equalizer, side bar or any such weighted balance with a total protrusion from the bow not to exceed 12 inches.

Roger Cady A Faithful Friend

Do you know Roger Cady? He is an unassuming man and could be easily overlooked, but many of you know and love him because he is just that kind of guy. Usually seen in a plaid shirt and a pair of Levis. Roger is a man of few words but as I have gotten to know him over the years I know to listen because when he speaks, it's something very important.

He has been in the archery world since 1961, a really long time. What you may not know about him is his love for making longbows. One of which was a gift to Wayne Raupe and dearly treasured. The first time I saw it, I was amazed at how it was so beautifully crafted.

He even devised the "bale squeeze" which helps make the ranges safer. Over his lifetime he has been involved in legislative issues as he lives near Sacramento.

He became a member of Eldorado Hills Archers in 1991, and that is when his volunteer work to help archers really began. He was a range master and then became a vice president of the club for five years. He has been involved with Laguna creek archers and active in Golden Arrow Archers for 30 years or more.

Roger attended many CBH-SAA annual meetings throughout the years, always waiting patiently to share with the group his opinion, especially on various legislative issues but weighs in all of the agenda topics. He is one of those people you know will be there to support the organization.

Roger is not only a target archer but has harvested numerous deer with his bow. He has also taught hunter safety programs in schools and clubs. He is an expert bow fisherman and hunter on the Sacramento River Delta, always willing to share a seat in his beautiful boat to help others find both fish and animals near the river bank.



When I met Roger, it was my very first Tilapia Shoot in 1999. My first impression was what a really nice man. He was helpful and kind and really, really wanted me to succeed at getting my first fish with a bow. “Sneaky Feet”

After dropping to his knees, the hunter’s pace slowed to that of a snail as he crawled upward. The additional ankle support was not only needed but also appreciated in the steep, rocky terrain which surrounded him for miles in every direction. The relatively stiff boot was rated a 4 out of 5 which proved its’ worthiness over the multiple weeks above the timber.

This was a spot and stalk hunt which meant hours of glassing each day. The hunter had taken into account that there was a tie for reasons of unsuccessful stalks. It could be that inadvertently the hunt had started *upwind* from the quarry. If so, the chances of *sighting the game first* would vanish 2/3 of a mile away, before and without the hunter’s knowledge.

The hunter did realize that he must be the first to see his prize in order to do the utmost in avoiding detection. That same person also recognized the need for minimizing detection by *moving extremely slow* and maintaining as much of a *horizontal figure* as possible. To maneuver within range he knew it wise to seek out the *shadows* that trees, rocks or crevices would provide.

Equally necessary, but painfully harder to employ, was the use of *patience*. In observations of calm, feeding animals the hunter had noted most animals moved so slow it was often hard to detect them at all. Also noted was the *lengthy pause* animals exhibited *before*, and just after crossing over a *ridge-line*.

Honestly, I don’t remember if I got a fish that time. But he made me feel special that day, and I do remember the conversations I had with him as he was a caring man and a good listener.

In 2005, Roger was recognized with a CBH/SAA Small Game Honorary Life Membership. And in 2016, he was inducted into the California Archery Hall of Fame. Both are well deserved.

Roger has been a cherished friend to Wayne and I; he even gave a boat to Wayne after we lost everything in the California Cedar Fire. His incredible generosity has always touched my heart. I was thinking about him recently, and all he has done for archery, and I thought you might want to know he has recently had some health setbacks. If you know him, I think he would love to hear from you, maybe with a note of encouragement.

Sneaky Feet continued from page 8-It seemed to him this was usually practiced around thirty yards from the crest. Consequently, most often he would engage the apex with a belly-crawl or at least on bent knees. Allowing his *silhouette* to be projected from a distant skyline was not a choice.

After sitting near the top for several minutes (or hours) a *crab-crawl* may be the next technique used to remain low, but continue to approach the target with a bow balanced across his stomach. This multi-decade practice came about from having his camera shutter heard as pictures were snapped a one hundred yards distant from his subjects. He had come to understand that if his ears could *hear* his With animals still unaware of his presence he would *remove* his *boots* and slip into his ankle-high *moccasins* frequently donning a heavy pair of wool socks over them for an added muffler. an animal could easily detect the noise at 40 yards or more.

Pictured on this page are two different choices the author is aware of which can assist in hampering *auditory detection*. Most choices are just over ankle height. FOOTSKINS men's Walking Boots found with the link below run \$190-\$206:

The size 9, roughly weigh 2 pounds and are thick cowhide leather canoe sole, wraps around the toe and heel. Pictured this page top right.

The deertan cowhide boots have a double layer for toughness, and Poron insole for a cushion between your feet and the ground. These are made from American leather.

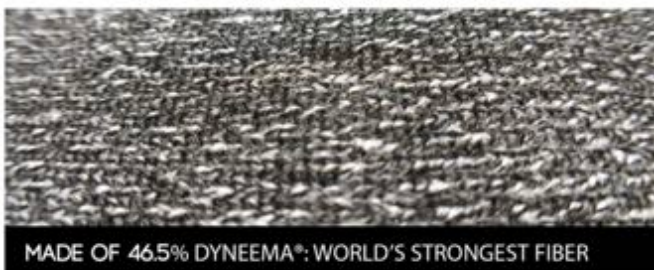
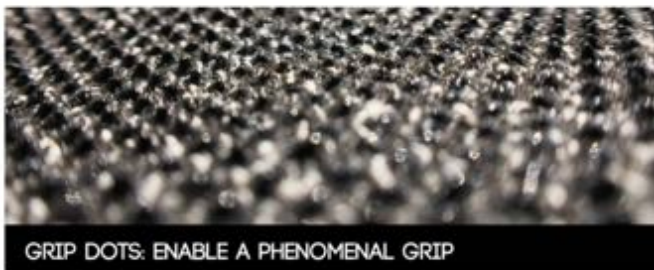


Or another option, the McCullough Buckskin ar roughly 9.2 ounces and WOODLAND 27 oz are found at ANXYNT: <https://anxynt.com/footwear/>

Both are constructed with 5.5-6 oz cowhide with insoles featuring 6mm thickness, plus an additional layer of 5.5-6 oz leather on the sole; \$184.99 and \$160 respectively. This company also has a pair called Bison.

Basic construction begins with a solid color of American 8-9 oz Bison tanned hide. As always an insole is sandwiched between two leather layers providing close to a 1/2" of padding and protection between the ground and your foot. A size 9 of these weighs in around 30 ounces with a cost of \$210. Continued on the next page.

William Russell, for whom the business is named, started the W.C. Russell Moccasin Company in 1898. A notable fact is that Saxton Pope and Arthur Young, the fathers of modern archery, were wearing Russells as early as 1915. These boots were originally manufactured for loggers on the east coast. These would not be as quiet as other brands listed here but would presumably last much longer. Shown upper right.

A serious consideration for the hunter who likes all the best qualities rolled into one. This choice is by far the lightest, most comfortable, least restrictive and functional of the list. With an outstanding warranty to last 2 years and an offer to “resole” the 6.5 ounces puncture proof “sneakers” you can’t afford to wait to order yours.



The 2022 version uses a leather that’s a little more flexible and has a brushed texture. The company has received great feedback that these are *noticeably quieter*. It's tough to quantify, but they seem to be about 25% quieter than the previous models. Double-layered leather soles turn back thorns, and cactus (be sure to check out the [“Got Cactus”](#) a 13 second video on the home page) and sharp rocks. The six eyelet lacing system allows them to cinch tight for steep terrain. Happy -“shhhh” - hunting in 2023.

SLOPPY JOE STUFFED SWEET POTATO

4 medium-sized sweet potatoes
1 T of ghee or avocado oil
1 onion chopped
2 cloves garlic chopped
1 pound ground venison
1 red bell pepper chopped
1 cup BBQ sauce
1/4 cup green onions sliced
1/4 cup parsley chopped

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
2. Individually wrap sweet potatoes in aluminum foil. Place on a parchment-lined baking tray and bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. (depends on the size of the sweet potato)
3. In a large cast-iron skillet over medium-low heat add in ghee or oil and sweat the onions and garlic until translucent. 2-3 minutes.
4. Add in the ground beef and break apart with a spoon. Cook the meat until completely brown. There should be no visible pink.
5. The chopped bell pepper goes in next and cooks for 2 more minutes.
6. Pour in 1 cup of Whole30 BBQ sauce and cook for 5 minutes until everything mixes together and heats through.

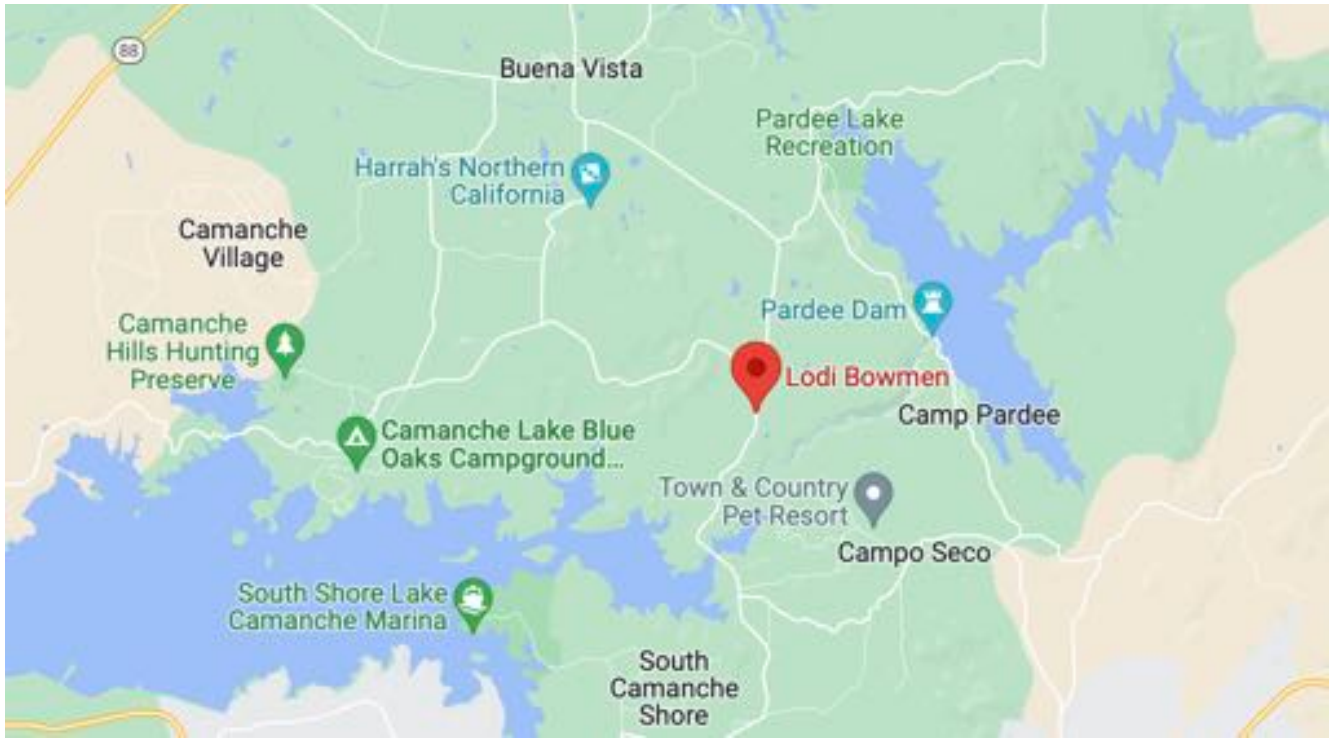

CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

1. This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to offer the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Field tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event
 2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
 3. The 2nd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament
 4. The range for this event shall be laid in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
 5. Archers shall use hunting tackle for this event which is keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.
 - A. Scoring:
 - 1) Vital—10 Kill-8 Wound-5
 - 2) An arrow must be in the target to score, except a “pass-through” which must be witnessed and scored a witnessed by other shooters in the group.
 - 3) “Bounce-ins and Glance-offs” shall not score.
 - 4) “Antlers” do not score.
 - 5) Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
 - 6) Double scoring is required.
 - 7) This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.
 - B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:
 - 1) Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64): Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (15-17): Male and Female
 - d) Youth (12-14): Male and Female
 - 2) Styles:
 - a) Sight Fingers (SF)
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Release ®
 - d) Recurve (RC)
 - e) Longbow (L)
 - C. Awards:
 - 1) CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
 - 2) Guest Class is one Class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
 - 3) No awards will be mailed.
 - 4) Cubs and Peewees Participation Awards Only
 - D. Tackle
 - 1) No Mechanical Broadheads
 - 2) Only ONE “izer” whether it be stabilizer, equalizer, side bar or any such weighed balance with a total protrusion from the bow not to exceed 12 inches.
 - 3) Bow Quivers are allowed in all styles.
 - 4) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
 - 5) No compound over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no weight limit.
 - 6) Binoculars are allowed. No rang finding binoculars allowed even with the battery removed. NO RANGEFINDERS , Period!
 - E. Miscellaneous:
 - 1) Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only
 - 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
 - 3) All protests to the Protest Committee will be in writing within thirty (20) minutes of the end of the tournament each day an include a \$25 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
 - 4) There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
 - 5) Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament. Clubs and Peewees will not be allowed to shoot in top flight groups. NO EXCEPTIONS
 - 6) No target or sight notes allowed (sight tapes ok)
 - 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven’t shot will be assisted .
 - 8) No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours except for tournament officials
 - 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
 - 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
 - 11) No cell phone, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or bow.
 - 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
 - 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualifications.
- 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot—No Mechanical/Expandable Blades period!
 - 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (7/8 minimum diameter)
 - 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
 - 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
 - 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
 - 12) Longbows: any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
 - 13) Longbows: must be shot off the shelf
 - 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.

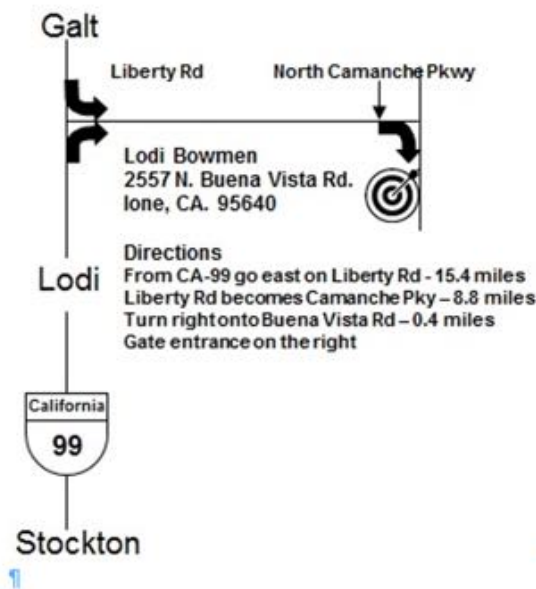
