Saying Goodbye to "Pete" By Wayne Raupe CBH/SAA Past President



On the morning of December 10th, Kathy Budding called to tell me that Pete had passed away in his sleep during the previous night. Kathy, of course, didn't have any information beyond that. She also said she hadn't had time to plan for a celebration of life for him but said there would something after the new year. Pete "Henry" Budding is an Archery Icon, past CBH-SAA President and California Archery Hall of Fame Member

My thoughts and prayers are with Kathy Budding as she navigates this time of loss.

Thinking of Pete, I reflected back to when Pete was serving the last year, of his second two-year term as President of the California Bowmen Hunters and State Archery Association (CBH/ SAA). This was when I attended my first Annual CBH/SAA meeting. I was in such awe of his knowledge, his command of the meeting, his handling of the "Point of Order" objections from the floor, and most of all, his good standing and the respect he received from the members of CBH/SAA.

In 1994 when I was elected and began my first term as CBH/SAA President, Pete was in my corner and showed me the ropes. Pete and I became close from that point on, and he was always there for me. During the 10 years of my presidency

Pete kept me out of trouble while I was conducting the annual meetings (the best he When I got myself into a bind or crossways with Robert's Rules of Order, a situation I got myself into often. Pete was there to get me out and back on track.

Pete always spoke his mind. He provided current and historic information that the CBH/ SAA Governing Board didn't know or forgot. Sometimes his temper showed when the meeting was running askew. His temper, his voice, his dedication, and his unabashed commitment to CBH/SAA and archery as a whole...well, that is who he was. I will miss our annual get-togethers at the meetings and our phone calls over the years, which were many. The week before Pete passed away I was thinking of him and now I have regrets that I didn't act on my thoughts and dial his phone number.

H. A. "Pete" Budding Celebrated

A part of the rich history in California history is the people who have paved the way for us. "Pete," as we all know him, is one of these people who have shaped CBH_SAA and archery.

Pete got his start in the sport of archery in 1968. The Solano Field Archers was the first local club to have benefited from his membership. That same year saw Pete joining CBH-SAA and NFAA. Within two years, Pete served the Solano Field Archers as Vice-President and later as President of that organization. His involvement as club president caused him to get involved with regional archery politics, and within that capacity, he served the archery community with a variety of activities.

Pete continued in club service for over 25 years. And served as the legislative representative to the Northern California Field Archery Association.

In 1976, Pete was elected to the CBH-SAA Vice-President position and shortly thereafter became President by default, through the resignation of the sitting president. He served CBH-SAA for a five-year presidential term.

Pete's legacy will be remembered for many things, but one important area was creating a financially solvent organization and correcting mistakes that resulted from prior mismanagement. He later continued his leadership within the organization as an honored "immediate past president" of CBH-SAA for four additional years, offering his wisdom and history.

The California Archery Hall of Fame was born during Pet's tenure, and he continued to support it as a Hall of Fame Board of Directors. Throughout his life, he was actively involved with legislative work preserving the rights of all hunters and archers in the state of California and has been involved in the California Wildlife Federation, the California Sportsman's Task Force, and the Outdoor Sportsman's Coalition.

Pete attended and offered testimony at California Fish and Game hearings, various City Councils, and Regional and State Park board meetings. He has defended the California hunter in many diverse public forums. Pete is an INFAA Medal of Merit award recipient.

Pete has competed on the club and regional levels in the State Championships, the Southwestern Sectional Championships and the NFAA Championships. He has competed at the international level through the International Field Archery Association.

Pete shot a variety of equipment in many classes, such as barebow, bowhunter, freestyle, freestyle limited, and the traditional class.

As we say farewell my friend, to Pete, may we always look up to him as a role model of one who dedicated his life to a sport he loved and nurtured.

Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD): What you need to know

WHAT IS CWD?

CWD is a **fatal neurological disease** of cervids (i.e., deer, elk, moose and reindeer).



HOW DOES IT SPREAD?



CWD spreads to cervids through contact with infected animals, tissues and environments.



HOW CAN WE HELP PREVENT THE SPREAD

Testing deer samples helps us know if CWD is present and allows us to better respond and manage the disease.



WHICH U.S. STATES HAVE DETECTED CWD?

States with detected cases of CWD

(Non-positive CWD states are

(Non-positive CWD states are OR, NV, AZ, SC, GA, ME, NH, VT, MA, CT, RI, NJ, AK and HI.)



Hunters can bring their harvested deer or elk to a California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) sampling station or regional office to be sampled for CWD. Alternatively, the head can be brought to a meat processor or taxidermist participating in CDFW's CWD Sampling Program. CDFW will collect paired lymph nodes, dime to quarter-sized tissues, located behind the jaw along the spine.



OUT-OF-STATE HUNTING & HARVEST IMPORT



The California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 712 governs the importation of hunter-harvested deer and elk (cervid) into California. Only some parts of a harvested deer or elk can be imported, and no portions of the brain or spinal cord may be imported. Visit <u>wildlife.ca.gov/CWD</u> to learn more.



CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

- This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter. It is designed to offer the Archer the benefits of using their hunting equipment in a tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event.
- The State Broadhead Tournament shall be a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
- 3. The 2nd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
- 4. The range for this event shall be laid in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
- Archers must use hunting Broadheads for this event which is keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.
 - A. Scoring:
 - 1) Vital—10 Kill-8 Wound-5
 - An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
 - 3) "Bounce-ins and Glance-offs" shall not score.
 - 4) "Antlers" do not score.
 - Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score
 - 6) Double scoring is required.
 - This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.
 - B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:
 - 1) Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64):
 - c) Junior (12-17):
 - 2) Styles:
 - a) Sight Fingers (SF) Compound/Recurve
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Bowhunter Release (BR) up to 7 fixed pin, Max 12" Stab Front, Backbar OK.
 - d) Hunter Release (HR) Bow must be camo or matt finish, Quiver must be attached to bow, Any sight ok, No stabilizer restriction
 - e) Recurve (No Sight) (RC)
 - f) Longbow (No Sight) (L)
 - g) Junior Class will be Sights/Non Sights

C. Awards:

- 1) CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
- 2) Guest Class is one Class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
- 3) No awards will be mailed.
- 4) Cubs and Peewees Participation Awards Only
- D. Tackle
 - 1) Mechanical Broadheads must be operational
 - 12" stabilizer restriction on Bowhunter Release Class Only.
 - 3) Bow Quivers are allowed in all styles.
 - 4) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
 - No compound over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no weight limit.

- 6) NO RANGE FINDING DEVICES ALLOWED!!
- 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot.
- Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (7/8 minimum diameter)
- 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament
- 12) Longbows: any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 13) Longbows: will be shot off the shelf
- 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- 15) All bows and broadheads must be inspected on Saturday morning.

E. Miscellaneous:

- 1) Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only
- Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
- 3) All protests to the Protest Committee will be in writing within thirty (20) minutes of the end of the tournament each day an include a \$25 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
- There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
- 5) Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament. Cubs and Peewees will not be allowed to shoot in top flight groups. NO EXCEP-TIONS
- 6) NO TARGET OR SIGHT NOTES ALLOWED (SIGHT TAPES OK)
- 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will be assisted.
- No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours except for tournament officials
- 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
- 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
- 11) Cell phones allowed, pictures and promotion on social media encouraged.
- 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
- Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualifications
