Winter Time Bowfishing is firing on all cylinders!

As most hunting seasons come to an end and archery migrates back to targets at ranges and indoor competitions, there is still great hunting to be had for small game. The kind of game with gills and fins. That is bowfishing. While some lakes, like Big bear tend to be a little tough due to no more boats on the water. In some lakes and areas, this is the best time of year to stack some bigger fish. Continued, next page.

Continued from page 3 ~We live in such an awesome State that bowfishing is good 12 months out of the year...if you know where to look. It does take a lot of exploring and lots of driving miles, but once you figure out what times of year are most productive, you can stack fish all year long.

Anything attached to the Colorado River usually has lots of carp, and in these waters, that's where monsters lurk.

Just recently, I was able to stick an arrow into my largest carp to date, which weighed 32.2 pounds. But besides the big carp, there are still thousands roaming around.

You also have other spots like Lake Elsinore, Lake Isabella, and some San Diego Lakes that also hold fish year-round.



A few things to be successful this time of year, while some others claim there are no fish and their equipment is collecting dust. A good pair of polarized glasses is very important. Most carp hide in the murky water, but they are definitely in range and ready to eat arrows.

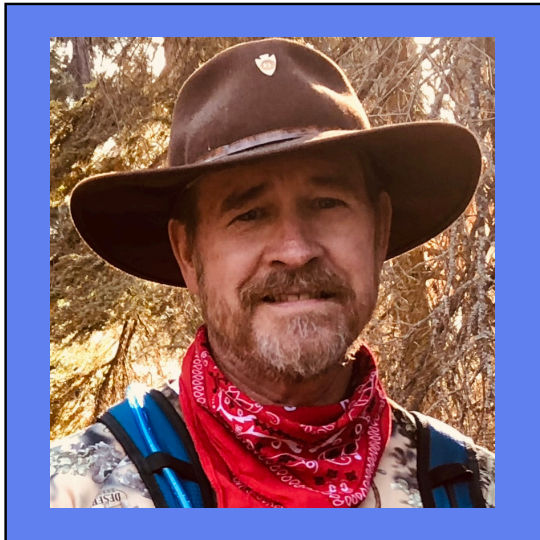


A slight wind gust can be your best friend as it makes it silent while you drift, and these fish stay shallower longer rather than bust out to where all you see is a dust cloud.

Team Rampage Outdoor, made up of Karen Imhoff and Don Augustine have also been stacking fish and filling by applying these methods. But they have also been putting in many hours on the water. Another thing that most don't realize is that fresh water is not the only area for bowfish.

The saltwater scene has also been very consistent with holding different species of fish as well. Most bays and Marinas are loaded with rays, sharks, and other game fish that also like to eat arrows as well. Typically, this is done at night under lights, so a decent boat set up with flood lights and a generator is a must.

To get into bowfishing, choose any standard compound bow or recurve, which can be used with a few add-ons to transform it into a bowfishing setup. You'll need a bowfishing reel, line, and a specific bowfishing arrow to which the line is attached. Cont. page 5

Catalina Islands Mule Deer

California mule deer were introduced to Catalina Island in 1928, when a small group—one buck and two does—from Modoc County in Northern California was brought to the island. In 1930, additional deer, mostly fawns, were brought over from Los Angeles County and released on the island.

These introductions were carried out by wildlife officials, including the California Department of Fish and Game, as part of efforts at the time to establish game animals for sport hunting and tourism on Catalina Island.

The population historically ranged between 500 and 1,000 deer and occupied most of the island, but tended to be concentrated in the Bulrush, Middle Cap, and Cottonwood canyons. The population estimate in 2023 was approximately 2,000 deer.

The Catalina Island Conservancy has welcomed hunters as a conservation tool in managing the island's introduced mule deer population. Wildlife West Inc. has served as the island's outfitter for many years and has provided hunting experiences to aid the Conservancy in its deer management objectives.

Resident deer hunters were required to take an

antlerless doe first; if a second deer was taken, an antlerless deer was preferred.

In October 2023, plans emerged to eradicate the deer herd as part of a broader ecosystem restoration project, including a proposal to use sharpshooters from helicopters to eliminate the population. Due in part to public backlash, the Conservancy later dropped the helicopter sharpshooting proposal.

The Catalina Island Conservancy has publicly pursued a plan to efficiently remove the mule deer population, drawing significant attention and controversy as part of its efforts to protect the island's ecosystem.

Hunting permits have continued to be issued as part of population management, with up to 1,000 deer tags in 2024 and up to 200 tags in 2025, exclusively for island residents.

Some good spots to check out, and get your set up for bowfishing are Riverside Archery, Turners outdoorsman that has an archery section, or Willow Creek Archery. CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

Purpose & Overview

1. This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter and allows archers to compete using their hunting equipment. NFAA rules do not apply to this event.
2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be a one- or two-day event held on Memorial Day Weekend.
3. The 1st and Vice President of Hunting or their delegates shall govern this tournament.
4. The range shall be laid out to simulate hunting conditions whenever possible.
5. Archers must use hunting broadheads that comply with California State Fish & Game laws for big game hunting.

A. Scoring

- 1 Vital – 10 | Kill – 8 | Wound – 5
- 2 Arrow must be in the target to score, except a pass-thru, which must be witnessed by other shooters in the group.
- 3 Bounce-ins and glance-offs do not score.
- 4 Antlers do not score.
- 5 Shaft touching the line earns the higher score.
- 6 Double scoring required.
- 7 This is a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.
- 8 7a. Targets 40 yards and over will be marked.

B. Divisions and Styles of shooting

7) Division

- A. • Senior (65+)
- B. • Adult (18–64)
- C. Junior (12–17)

7) Styles

- A. Sight Fingers (SF)
- B. Compound/Recurve Non-Sights (NS)
- C. Bowhunter Release (BR) up to 7 fixed pins, Max 12" stabilizer front. Backbar ok.
- D. Hunter Release (HR) Bow must be camo or matte finish. QUIVER MUST BE ATTACHED TO BOW. Any sight ok, No stabilizer restriction
- E. Recurve (RC) No sights allowed
- F. Longbow (LB) No sights allowed
- G. Junior class (J) sights / non-sights

C. Awards

1. CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) required to compete for awards.
2. Guest Class (Male/Female combined) – no awards.
3. Awards will be mailed.
4. Cubs and Peewees receive participation awards only.

D) Tackle:

- 1) Mechanical Broadheads must be operational
- 2) 12" Stabilizer restriction on Bowhunter Release class, class only.
- 3) Bow Quivers are allowed in all styles, but are REQUIRED in "Hunter Release" class
- 4) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
- 5) No Compound over 80 lbs peak draw weight. Rec Recurves and Longbows have no weight limit.

D) Tackle continued

- 6) NO RANGE FINDING DEVICES ALLOWED ON COURSE!!
- 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish and Game codes at all times during the shoot
- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish and Game code (7/8 minimum diameter)
- 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 12) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 13) Longbows: Will be shot off the shelf.
- 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- 15) All Bows and Broadheads must be inspected on Saturday Morning. All Top Flights must be inspected on Sunday Morning.

E. Miscellaneous:

- 1) Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only
- 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
- 3) All Protests to the Protest Committee will be in writing within (30) thirty minutes of the end of the tournament each day and include a \$25 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
- 4) There must be a MINIMUM OF THREE shooters and a MAXIMUM OF SIX shooters per target each day.
- 5) ALL SHOOTERS WILL BE FLIGHTED BOTH DAYS OF THE TOURNAMENT. If you wish not to be flighted, then you can shoot in the guest class for no awards. Min 3 Max 6 shooters still applies. Cubs and Peewees will not be allowed to shoot in top-flight groups on second day. NO EXCEPTIONS. Parents will be responsible for their kids' care, if shooter is in top flight.
- 6) NO TARGET OR SIGHT NOTES ALLOWED (SIGHT TAPES OF)
- 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will be assisted.
- 8) No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours except tournament officials.
- 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
- 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
- 11) Cell phones allowed, pictures and promotion on social media encouraged.
- 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
- 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.

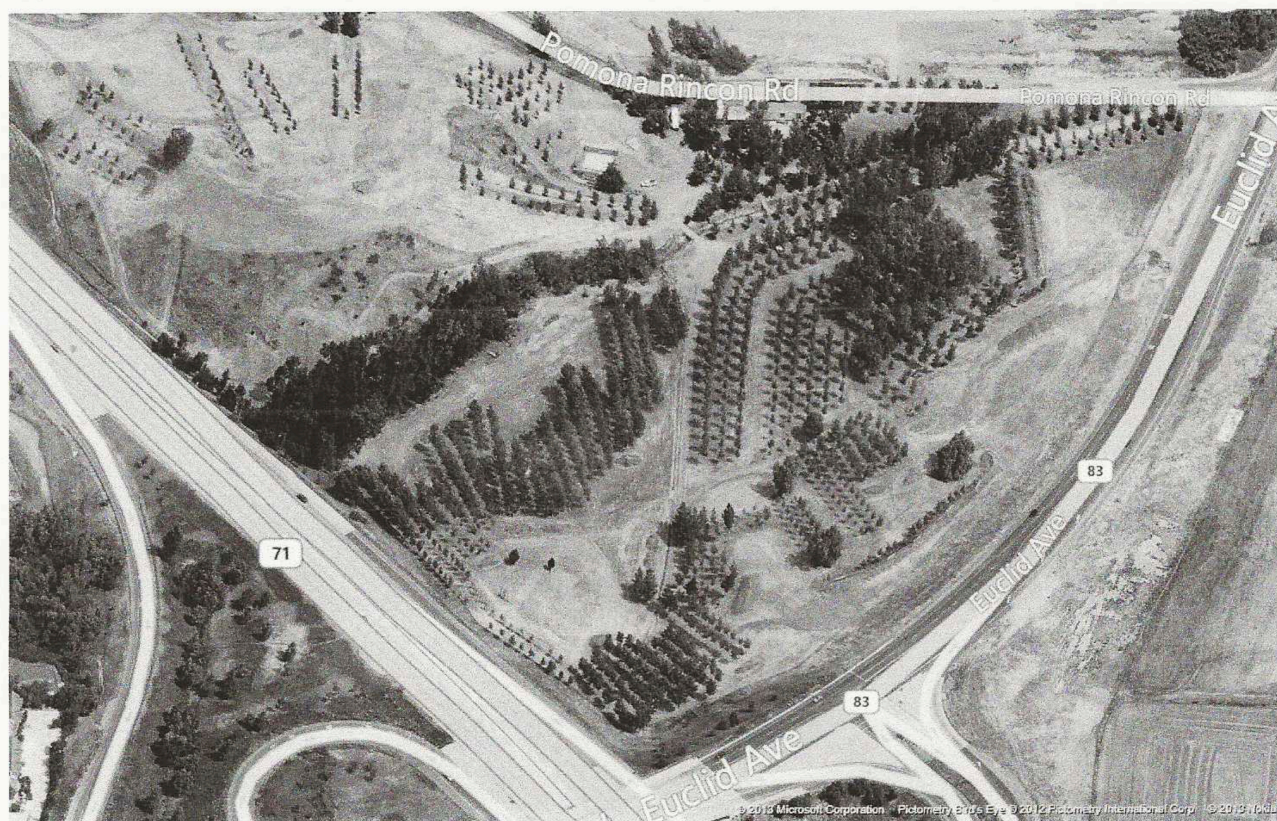
