

Archery Returns in Paradise

The Camp Fire, November of 2018, basically burned much of Butte County and pretty much all of Paradise, California. The Paradise Bowhunters and Hope Christian Church were out of all archery activities. The forty-two target field range and all equipment to support the Paradise Bowhunters was totally burned, also Hope Christian Church where Joan & I were members and had taught beginning archery classes for several years, was in ashes.

Joan and I saved our 27 foot RV, pickup and car. Everything else was gone. For the first month after the fire we lived in the trailer. Then we moved back to Yuba City to Sutter Estates, an assisted living complex. With Joan having COPD, her lungs continued getting worse. She Joined our Lord in Heaven in July 2019. The following March of 2020, I moved back to my property in Paradise and purchased a manufactured home. It has taken until October of 2021, to have it ready for occupancy.



Paradise Bowhunters are still out of business, but Lord willing, they will be able to start rebuilding archery ranges again in 2022.

For the first year after the fire Hope Christian Church was used Chico Church, and never missed a Sunday service since the fire. Since early 2020, they have rented a building in Magalia to call home, and presently have began progress to build on their property in Paradise where the original church stood.



Next to talk about archery. This past spring I decided to once again offer a beginning archery class. Johnnie Waddles loaned the NASP equipment to use. On the back section of my lot, we built a 30 yard by 24 foot archery range. We printed flyers for students to sign-up for an eight session, sixteen hour beginning archery class. We followed the steps of NASP's outline, and viewed the NASP video. Included in the class, besides shooting, I provide paper work, attempting to cover and discuss all information about archery in our state. This covers from equipment to organizations, local pro shops and archery terms commonly used in the sport of archery. My goal is to assist any person desiring to shoot a bow the basics. Most people learn the hard way, but hopefully they will join a CBH/SAA club in the future, plus purchase their equipment at a pro-shop that is knowledgeable in archery.



How to become a bowhunter continued from page 4- Trading stories through the smoke of what fire remains of the charred cedar stick are the highlights, but the stalk is primarily characterized as singular.

To follow is my attempt to outline some necessary steps for one who wants to consider bow hunting. The first two items do not necessarily need to be done first but they can take some time to fulfill since they must be scheduled. The spring is a great time to start this pursuit. In these classes you will learn fundamentals and safety procedures. Some classes are now available on-line but also have a field day where you are required to be there in person. Plus, the in person classes can put you in touch with individuals who share your interest (who knows this may lead to life-long friendships - many of mine have).


(2) An official *Hunters Safety Course* is required to obtain a hunting license here in California as well as for other states. These classes will cover rifle, shotgun and archery tackle and some technique.

If you are truly lucky you could get instructors who allow you to practice some tracking and blood-trailing.

- (5) Of course in this day and age the internet is another form of information. You can check on *Youtube.com* for channels that have videos of bowhunting techniques.




