CBH Legislative Committee Update Amanda Duchardt CBH/SAA Legislative Director

Greetings CBH/SAA friends and family!

The Legislative Team is back and eager to reengage in our efforts to advance and protect hunting, conservation, and archery opportunities in the State Legislature and Fish and Game Commission (FGC) forums.


First, a quick updated on the efforts to track and halt the spread of Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) in California. The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) collected over 1,600 CWD samples (from hunter harvest and roadkill) as of December 2024. Despite a significant delay in CDFW announcing a **free CWD incentive raffle drawing**, a total of 133 hunters that submitted harvest samples for CWD testing participated. CBH/SAA, along with other NGOs, partnered with CDFW and donated prizes to the raffle. CDFW plans to include information on next year's incentive raffle in the upcoming Big Game Digest so keep an eye out for your chance to win!

The next **Fish and Game Commission (FGC) Meeting is scheduled February 12** in Sacramento, CA. The meeting will be live streamed; visit <u>http://</u><u>www.fgc.ca.gov</u> the day of the meeting to watch or listen. To provide public comment, join in person at the Sacramento location, via Zoom, or by phone. For complete instructions on how to join via Zoom or phone, visit <u>fgc.ca.gov/meetings/2025</u>.

Leading up to the FGC meeting, CBH/SAA President Chriss Bowles attended the January 15 **Wildlife Resource Committee (WRC)** meeting in Sacramento. Key discussion topics, which may become agenda items at future FGC meetings, included:

- Striped Bass Slot Limit: General agreement on the slot limit with no expected pushback, suggesting a quick adoption.
- Preference Points: Consensus on the need for a streamlined system to return preference points to hunters affected by wildfires/land closures. Commissioner Anderson advocates for a hunter-friendly, case-by-case approach, while others stress the importance of clear guidelines to avoid misunderstandings.

- CWD Testing: Positive participation from hunters with no positive CWD tests so far. Discussions included the need for more samples from northern zones and potential collaboration with CalTrans for roadkill samples. Revised regulations would allow the CDFW to declare "CWD hot zones."
- **Falconry:** Contentious debate over unannounced inspections, which falconers oppose as a violation of the 4th amendment. Lawsuits are ongoing, and falconers seek to remove this requirement from federal regulations.
- Non-Game Mammals: Heated discussion about coyote management, with some advocating for humane treatment and others supporting urban control. There is talk of reclassifying coyotes as game animals with high bag limits, though this lacks support from the hunting community.
- Management Plans: The Bear and Sheep Plans are expected to be finalized at the end of January. Bobcat Plan is also progressing on schedule. Continued next page



Legislative Committee Update from page 3 I strongly encourage everyone to attend the Friday Legislative Session at the CBH Annual Meeting on February 21 for a full and comprehensive update on legislative issues. Here are a few samples from the California Hunting and Conservation Coalition (CHCC) to get started:

Following elections last November, we observed that there are a significant number of new legislators because of prior representatives terming out and/or other departures. Although the legislature is still controlled by a Democratic super majority, there were several close races, decided by fewer than 2,500 votes, that could influence key committee decisions. While that is a generally positive sign for hunting and conservation legislation, we are exercising caution. The consensus is that the CHCC will continue torely on "winning through litigation" rather than affecting change through new policies. We've also been informed that the Legislature has a hard cap of 5,000 new bills. It will be interesting to see how legislatures prioritize issues. Here is list of potential legislative topics that the California Hunting and Conservation Coalition (CHCC) is advocating for and would like to see addressed:

- SHARE Program: Propose amendments aim to remove outdated restrictions and pay landowners based on the quality of hunting opportunities. Allow non-government organizations (NGOs) to be contracted to manage hunts and enhancing the program's effectiveness.
- **Duck Stamp Amendment**: Efforts to apply contracting exceptions to the Duck Stamp program face labor opposition and prevailing wage issues.
- **Duck Stamp Amendment**: Efforts to apply contracting exceptions to the Duck Stamp program face labor opposition and prevailing wage issues.
- Mute Swan Invasion: Mute swans are disturbing habitats and displacing native waterfowl. Proposals include allowing hunting of mute swans year-round with a valid license, though enforcement and animal rights concerns remain.

- Mountain Lions: Discussions on proactive hazing of mountain lions using dogs before they become problematic. Evaluating statutes to craft a bill that aligns with Prop 117.
- **Bear Hunting**: Addressing the challenge of limited bear tags and the non-viability of spring bear hunting and baiting in California. Emphasis on public education and legislative support for science-based wildlife management.
- Managed Wetlands: Reintroduction of the 828 Managed Wetlands bill, previously vetoed by the governor. Focus on addressing concerns and engaging sponsors like Audubon.
- **Firearm Regulations**: Cleaning up Title 14 statutes related to firearms while deer hunting, with input from current law enforcement.

Reminder: Whether you have been involved in archery or hunting your whole life, or are new to this sport, you have something of value to add to the conversation and I encourage you to reach out to me and the CBH Legislative Committee to share your knowledge and experience! We look forward to hearing from you soon!





CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

- 1. This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter. It is designed to offer the Archer the benefits of using their hunting equipment in a tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event.
- The State Broadhead Tournament shall be a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
- 3. The 2nd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
- 4. The range for this event shall be laid in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
- Archers must use hunting Broadheads for this event which is keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.
 - A. Scoring:
 - 1) Vital-10 Kill-8 Wound-5
 - An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
 - 3) "Bounce-ins and Glance-offs" shall not score.
 - 4) "Antlers" do not score.
 - 5) Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.

 - 7) This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.
 - B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:

 - a) Sight Fingers (SF) Compound/Recurve
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Bowhunter Release (BR) up to 7 fixed pin, Max 12" Stab Front, Backbar OK.
 - d) Hunter Release (HR) Bow must be camo or matt finish, Quiver must be attached to bow, Any sight ok, No stabilizer restriction
 - e) Recurve (No Sight) (RC)
 - f) Longbow (No Sight) (L)
 - g) Junior Class will be Sights/Non Sights
 - C. Awards:
 - 1) CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
 - 2) Guest Class is one Class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
 - 3) No awards will be mailed.
 - 4) Cubs and Peewees Participation Awards Only
 - D. Tackle
 - 1) Mechanical Broadheads must be operational
 - 2) 12" stabilizer restriction on Bowhunter Release Class Only.
 - 3) Bow Quivers are allowed in all styles.
 - 4) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
 - No compound over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no weight limit.

- 6) NO RANGE FINDING DEVICES ALLOWED!!
- 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot.
- Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (7/8 minimum diameter)
- 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 12) Longbows: any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 13) Longbows: will be shot off the shelf
- 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- All bows and broadheads must be inspected on Saturday morning.
- E. Miscellaneous:
 - 1) Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only
 - 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
 - All protests to the Protest Committee will be in writing within thirty (20) minutes of the end of the tournament each day an include a \$25 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
 - 4) There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
 - 5) Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament. Cubs and Peewees will not be allowed to shoot in top flight groups. NO EXCEP-TIONS
 - 6) NO TARGET OR SIGHT NOTES ALLOWED (SIGHT TAPES OK)
 - 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will be assisted.
 - No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours except for tournament officials
 - Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
 - 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
 - 11) Cell phones allowed, pictures and promotion on social media encouraged.
 - 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
 - 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualifications.
