



# LEGISLATIVE DIRECTOR

**Greetings CBH/SAA friends and family!**

We are excited to announce that Cherry Valley Bowhunters will again host the State Unmarked 3D Championship and Legislative Defense Raffle. Mark your calendars - Sunday, November 8, 2026.

This is your chance to conquer a fantastic range and hang out with the legendary crew at Cherry Valley.

Want to dial in your sight before the big day? Sharpen your skills at these upcoming Cherry Valley events:

- March 15: Big Horn Shoot
- May 17: North American Big Game Shoot
- August 1–2: The Legendary "Big Bear Shoot" at Jenks Lake (San Bernardino National Forest). Pro Tip: This is the SoCal "Do Not Miss" event, featuring MOUNTAINS of raffle prizes!

What’s the legislative committee up to? Here are a few things:

- **Catalina Deer Eradication** – CDFW approved the permit for the Catalina Island Conservancy to begin eradication of mule deer on Catalina Island. Eradication is expected to occur using professional hunters that will systematically shoot deer from the ground, no aerial hunting. Catalina Island residents are seeking legal means to stay the Conservancy’s actions. - Carry of sidearm while archery hunting deer (AB 1912) – CBH continues to work with representative Hadwick to craft a bill to allow hunters to carry of a sidearm with archery hunting for deer. Draft language is being crafted in partnership with CRPA and will seek to extend this privilege to CCW permit holders. Any bill with the word “firearm” is expected to carry significant opposition in Sacramento.
- Mountain lions - The California Fish and Game Commission will consider and potentially act on the petition received to list the southern California/central coast evolutionarily significant unit of mountain lion (*Puma concolor*) as endangered under the California Endangered Species Act. The CDFW will review their status report and take public comments. To learn more about this agenda item and participate in the February 12 FGC meeting visit <https://fgc.ca.gov/Meetings/2026>

- **B&L Productions Inc V. Newsom - CBH** signed on as a plaintiff in this legal case in support of California Rifle and Pistol Association (CRPA). This action is tied to our right to preserve opportunity to raffle firearms, ammo, and firearms parts on state property.
- **Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Incentive Drawing Winner** – CBH supported the CDFW incentive drawing for hunters to submit lymph nodes samples from harvested deer for CWD testing. Participating in citizen science is an important role for hunters in the wildlife management and conservation process. Ricardo D from Pacifica, CA was awarded a \$500 Turners Gift Card provided by CBH!

- **California ban on 1 pound propane cylinders** - Beginning in January 2028, a new California law will take effect that prohibits the sale or offer for sale of propane cylinders unless the cylinders are reusable or refillable. In practical terms, this law would prohibit the sale of the common disposable one-pound propane cylinders that CBHSAA members and other people who enjoy the outdoors rely on for heat, cooking, and light on their hunting, fishing, and camping trips. Once the law takes effect, only reusable/refillable propane containers may be sold in California. Although refillable options exist today, they are not widely available, often less convenient and significantly more expensive than disposable one-pound cylinders. To address this very real concern for our outdoor community, CBH is collaborating with Worthington Enterprises, Inc. -- the manufacturer of Coleman® and Bernzomatic® one-pound propane cylinders in the United States - on an application requesting a determination as to whether the federal Hazardous Materials Transportation Act (HMTA), 49 U.S.C. § 5101 et seq., preempts California’s requirements regarding the sale of disposable propane cylinders.

January was full of excitement as 581 scores were submitted by archers of all ages and bowstyles across the State of California. We had 26 hosts this year, up from 20 last year.

Two hosts offered their ranges for the first time for this Championship: Break the Barriers and All Seasons Archery/ Golden State JOAD.

All of our hosts have been wonderful and really care that the people they serve are taken care of in this Championship.

We're excited to announce a new award tradition this year: custom belt buckles will be awarded to the highest-scoring male and female champions in each of our 11 bow styles.

For the 2026 CBH State Indoor tournament, 20 custom belt buckles have been ordered and will be mailed directly to the individuals who earned them.

Congratulations to all ranking winners in each age division who will be receiving brand new medals this year. Your dedication and skill have truly earned these honors. In addition, there were 29 new State Records entered for 2026.



## FROM OUR HISTORIAN

When Ishi arrived in San Francisco in 1911—silent, alone, and carrying the weight of a vanished people—he was placed under the care of anthropologists at the University of California.

He lived quietly at the Museum of Anthropology, demonstrating ancient skills to curious scholars who struggled to understand his world.

Across the museum grounds worked Dr. Saxton Temple Pope, a young physician and instructor at the University of California Medical School.

At first, Pope knew Ishi only indirectly, as a medical curiosity spoken of in academic corridors. Their lives ran parallel but did not yet intersect.

That changed one ordinary afternoon. Looking out from a medical building window, Pope noticed a small man seated in the courtyard below, utterly absorbed in his work. Ishi was shaping a bow from a length of yew, his movements deliberate, precise, and unlike anything Pope had ever seen.

The doctor watched for some time, struck not by spectacle but by craftsmanship—the calm authority of hands that knew exactly what they were doing.

Curiosity overcame formality. Pope went outside and approached.

There was no shared language, no greeting as Pope understood it. Yet as he watched Ishi work, something passed between them—an unspoken recognition of skill and intent. Pope did not interrupt. He observed. Ishi allowed it. That quiet moment marked the beginning of an extraordinary friendship.

Pope, trained in modern medicine, would become a student of one of the last Stone Age hunters in North America.

From Ishi, he learned how bows were truly made, how arrows flew, and how hunting was bound to respect, patience, and restraint.

What began as a physician's curiosity became a lifelong devotion—and through Pope.

## Small Game Club Updates

These are the small game events I have set up so far and what is on the agenda in the coming months.

Save the date: Saturday, April 4. We're planning a small bowfishing event and final details are still coming together. This will be a boat-only tournament with teams of 2-4 adults. Each team may also include one junior hunter (15 or younger) at no cost—so a team of 4 adults can add one youth participant.

**CBH Tilapia and Carp shoot.** Mandatory check-in is Saturday, April 11 from 6:30-8:00 a.m. All participants must sign in before starting the hunt. Once you're registered, you're free to begin. Weigh-in is Sunday, April 12 from 11:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m., with awards announced shortly after so everyone can get on the road at a reasonable time. Location: Palo Verde Campground (same as previous years). This event is open to boat and/or shore bowfishing. No teams—this is an individual competition, and each person will weigh in their own fish.

**Clear Lake Bowfishing Blitz** – April 17-19  
The Bowfishing Blitz runs Friday, April 17 at 8:00 p.m. through Sunday, April 19 at 10:00 a.m. at Clear Lake in Northern California.  
This is not a CBH event, but it's open to anyone who loves bowfishing. I'll be there with my team and working with the organizers about possibly partnering next year and adding a CBH side category. Consider this a work in progress for 2027. Either way, it's shaping up to be another fun one to add to the calendar.

### 2nd Annual Carp Quest – May 17


Join us Sunday, May 17 at Lake Elsinore, CA for the 2nd Annual Carp Quest.




# CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

## Purpose & Overview

1. This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter and allows archers to compete using their hunting equipment. NFAA rules do not apply to this event.
2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be a one- or two-day event held on Memorial Day Weekend
3. The Range and Vice President of Hunting or their delegates shall govern this tournament.
4. The range shall be laid out to simulate hunting conditions whenever possible.
5. Archers must use hunting broadheads that comply with California State Fish & Game laws for big game hunting.

## A. Scoring

- 1 Vital – 10 | Kill – 8 | Wound – 5
- 2 Arrow must be in the target to score, except a pass-thru, which must be witnessed by other shooters in the group.
- 3 Bounce-ins and glance-offs do not score.
- 4 Antlers do not score.
- 5 Shaft touching the line earns the higher score. Double scoring required.
- 6 This is a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.
- 7a. Targets 40 yards and over will be marked.

## B. Divisions and Styles of shooting

### 7) Division

- A. Senior (65+)
- B. Adult (18–64)
- C. Junior (12–17)

### 8) Styles

- A. Sight Fingers (SF)
- B. Compound/Recurve Non-Sights (NS)
- C. Bowhunter Release (BR) up to 7 fixed pins, Max 12" stabilizer front. Backbar ok.
- D. Hunter Release (HR) Bow must be camo or matte finish. QUIVER MUST BE ATTACHED TO BOW. Any sight ok, No stabilizer restriction
- E. Recurve (RC) No sights allowed
- F. Longbow (LB) No sights allowed
- G. Junior class (J) sights / non-sights

## C. Awards

1. CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) required to compete for awards.
2. Guest Class (Male/Female combined) – no awards.
3. Awards will be mailed.
4. Cubs and Peewees receive participation awards only.

## D) Tackle:

- 1) Mechanical Broadheads must be operational
- 2) 12" Stabilizer restriction on Bowhunter Release class, class only.
- 3) Bow Quivers are allowed in all styles, but are REQUIRED in "Hunter Release" class
- 4) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
- 5) No Compound over 80 lbs peak draw weight. Rec Recurves and Longbows have no weight limit.

## D) Tackle continued

- 6) NO RANGE FINDING DEVICES ALLOWED ON COURSE!!
- 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish and Game codes at all times during the shoot
- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish and Game code (7/8 minimum diameter)
- 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 12) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 13) Longbows: Will be shot off the shelf.
- 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- 15) All Bows and Broadheads must be inspected on Saturday Morning. All Top Flights must be inspected on Sunday Morning.

## E. Miscellaneous:


- 1) Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only
- 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
- 3) All Protests to the Protest Committee will be in writing within (30) thirty minutes of the end of the tournament each day and include a \$25 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
- 4) There must be a MINIMUM OF THREE shooters and a MAXIMUM OF SIX shooters per target each day.
- 5) ALL SHOOTERS WILL BE FLIGHTED BOTH DAYS OF THE TOURNAMENT. If you wish not to be flighted, then you can shoot in the guest class for no awards. Min 3 Max 6 shooters still applies. Cubs and Peewees will not be allowed to shoot in top-flight groups on second day. NO EXCEPTIONS. Parents will be responsible for their kids' care, if shooter is in top flight.
- 6) NO TARGET OR SIGHT NOTES ALLOWED (SIGHT TAPES OF)
- 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will be assisted.
- 8) No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours except tournament officials.
- 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
- 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
- 11) Cell phones allowed, pictures and promotion on social media encouraged.
- 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
- 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.
