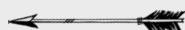

Next stop was the CBH/SAA State Traditional Archery championship. First, a big thank you to Dave Roach and the entire team at Verdugo Hills Archers. This is the second year in a row that they have graciously hosted this event and once again they did a fantastic job. Thanks also go out to CBH/SAA Vice President George Papac for serving as tournament director.

The range was in great shape with brand new animals at just about every shot. Traditional Archery disciplines have been getting ignored and overlooked by many in the archery community for years. NFAA did their best to eliminate Longbow shooters all together. George together with California NFAA Director Gary McCain were able to petition and lobby NFAA to get Longbow back on the books. George even went a step further by petitioning the state to divide Longbow into wood and carbon arrows and we now even have the Recurve class segregated to be a bit fairer. I would say by the turnout that Traditional archery disciplines are alive and very well in California! 161 shooters, great job team! This is a fantastic tournament and a lot of fun for all skill levels. Congratulations to all the winners and thanks to all the great shooters that came from long distance to shoot here in Southern California. Legislative Information By Robert Moore

The next FGC meeting was held February 21 in Sacramento. Agenda items watched; Invitation: The Commission invites members of the public to join commissioners and staff for a falconry demonstration sponsored by the California Hawking Club on Thursday, February 20 at 3:00 p.m. The demonstration will be held at Conaway Ranch, 45332 County Road 25 in Woodland; refreshments will be available starting at 2:30 p.m. Members of the public are welcome and must provide their own transportation.

2. Election of Commission president and vice president. The Commission reelected Commissioner Eric Sklar as President and elected Commissioner Samantha Murray as Vice President. The commissioners annually elect one of their number as president and one as vice president, by a concurrent vote of at least three commissioners. (Pursuant to Section 102, Fish and Game Code) 3. Committee assignments The Commission forms three committees from its membership, consisting of at least one commissioner: Marine Resources Committee, Tribal Committee and Wildlife Resources Committee. (Pursuant to sections 105, 106 and 106.5, Fish and Game Code)

Current co-chair assignments were retained for the three committees: commissioners Peter Silva and Murray for the Marine Resources Committee, commissioners Jacque Hostler-Carmesin and Silva for the Tribal Committee, and commissioners Sklar and Russell Burns for the Wildlife Resources Committee. CONSENT ITEMS 6. Riparian brush rabbit Receive Department's five-year status review for riparian brush rabbit (*Sylvilagus bachmani riparius*), which is listed as an endangered species under CESA. The full Commission agenda for this meeting along with supporting information is available at www.fgc.ca.gov. An archived video will also be available in coming days. The next meeting of the full Commission is scheduled for April 15 and 16 in Sacramento.

The next Wildlife Resources Committee was held Thursday March 5th in Sacramento. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss 2020 Simplification of Statewide Inland Fishing Regulations proposal.

Legislation 2019/2020, below is a list of bills within the state legislature that we continue to track and providing comment on. These bills have until the end of 2020 to complete or they die. New legislation could be introduced but have to complete by the end of the year or they will also die. This is just a partial list of bills in the state legislature that could affect sportsmen. January 24th was the last day to pass out of house of origin to continue or the bill dies. Not all information was posted before writing this article.

AB 18 (Levine) – Firearms: Excise Tax 2 year bill; would add additional cost to purchasing a firearm. AB 18 was held in Assembly Appropriations Committee and not heard. **Update:** Failed to get out of committee, died.

AB 276 (Friedman) – Firearms: 2 year bill; Storage, would require a person who is 18 years of age or older and who is the owner, lessee, renter, or other legal occupant of a residence to ensure that any firearm that person owns or controls is securely stored against theft or unauthorized access while that person is outside that residence. The bill defines a firearm as being “securely stored” if it is secured with an operable device that is listed on the Department of Justice’s roster of approved firearm safety devices and that is identified as appropriate for that firearm by reference to either the manufacturer and model of the firearm, or to the physical characteristics of the firearm that matches those listed on the roster for use with the device. **Update:** passed house no in Senate

AB 284 (Frazier) – Junior Hunting Licenses: Eligibility: Age Requirement, 2 year bill; In 2014, AB 1709 – legislation authored by Assembly Member Jim Frazier (D/11-Fairfield) was signed into law which increased junior hunting license age eligibility from 15 to 17 years of age. However, that legislation included a “sunset” provision which requires the age eligibility to revert to 15 years on July 1, 2020, unless the provision is extended by

subsequent legislation. As revised March 26th, AB 284 – legislation also authored by Assembly Member Jim Frazier – would extend the junior hunting license age eligibility of 17 years indefinitely. **Update:** Failed to get out of committee, died.

AB 584 (Gallagher) – Sport Fishing Licenses 2 year bill; As introduced, AB 584 by Assembly Member James Gallagher (R/03-Yuba City) remains a “spot bill” that, as introduced, makes non-substantive amendments to a provision of the Fish and Game Code which deals with sport fishing licenses. **Update:** Bill has been gut and amended to water conveyance for Paradise.

AB 688 (Chu) – Firearms: Vehicle Storage 2 year bill; Current law requires that a handgun in an unattended vehicle be either locked in the vehicle’s trunk, in a locked container out of plain view, locked in a container that is permanently affixed to the vehicle’s interior and not in plain view, or locked in a toolbox or utility box.

As introduced, AB 688 would make those requirements applicable to all firearms and would require the firearms to be secured to the vehicle’s frame using a steel cable lock or chain and padlock, or in a locked container that is secured using a steel cable lock or chain and padlock or that is permanently affixed to the vehicle. **Update:** Failed to get out of Committee, died.

AB1305 (Olbermolte) - Junior Hunting Licenses: Eligibility: Age Requirement, 2 year bill; see AB284 language above. Upon introduction in mid-June, AB 1305 was sent to Senate Rules Committee for referral to the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee. However, due to the bill’s language being highly similar to AB 284 (which was held in Assembly Appropriations Committee), Senate Rules has yet to refer the bill. With the deadline to be heard in policy committee being July 10th, AB 1305 is now a “two-year” bill which, at best, cannot be heard until early 2020. **Update:** static

AB 1387 (Wood) – Sport Fishing Licenses: 12 Consecutive Month Licenses 2 year bill; would, in addition to offering California residents a traditional calendar year fishing license, require DFW to offer a license that is valid for 12 consecutive months beginning on the date of purchase upon payment of a fee that is equal to 130% of the cost of the traditional calendar-year sport fishing license. AB 1387 would require DFW to provide applicants for these licenses the option of signing up for automatic renewal of the license by electronic payment and would set the fee for licenses issued upon automatic renewal at the same price as a calendar-year sport fishing license. **Update:** static

New Legislation:

SB1041 (Hueso) - Hunting: deer: use of dogs. Current Fish and Game Code 3960 allows the use of one dog for hunting deer during the general season including tracking. Dog use during the archery seasons or tag is not allowed. This bill would eliminate the use of a dog for hunting deer anytime. Status: From printer, may be acted upon on or after March 20.

SB 1175 (Stern) Iconic African Species Protection Act. This bill has been previously through the Legislative process but was defeated a couple of years ago. The author has reintroduced the same language as before and in a nut shell it will limit you from bringing back certain African species to California from a legal hunt. Can't be heard before March 22nd.

REALLY GRATEFUL 2020

After driving all night thinking of what new adventures I would be experiencing shortly, I was greeted by a beautiful sunrise over the deserts landscape. There's something about the Southwest that draws me every year since my first trip to the border years ago. I am not sure if it's the ruggedness of the terrain, the beauty of the landscape, or the phantom whitetails that frequently remind me of shortcomings as a bowhunter. Which ever one it is I would say I'm addicted to it. On this trip I decided to add the addition challenge of the hunt by leaving my compound and hike the desert mountains with my stick bow in hand. After buying all my legal paperwork for the 2020 season(s), I arrived to a familiar vista where I would spend the last few days of the January bowhunting. With a deadline of the 31st looming in the not too distance future the luxury of time wasn't on my side. Scouting and glassing all the rocky bluffs and mountain peaks I usually try to do wasn't in the cards this time. Water was also plentiful from all the December rains, so sitting on a waterhole wasn't a reliable option either. I needed to spend a lot of time behind my big glass looking at my favorite area for any chance of success. No time to learn new areas on this trip, unless necessity proved it a priority. On my first afternoon sitting and hours of glassing, I could only managed to find a few Coues does, a Border Patrol helicopter protecting our country and a herd of Javelina feeding in a creek bottom below me. I wasn't trophy hunting at all, any spot and stalk Coues buck with my recurve would be towards the top of my hunting resume. I just needed to find one that was approachable with a favorable wind condition. After



years of hunting them, I knew that being alone could be challenging in itself.

Thinking the rut may be in full swing, lady luck may be a little more frequent on this trip. That's what I was hoping for at least. The following morning a very brisk wind out of the North made me believe deer would be feeding at first-light on the Eastern exposure catching the rays of warmth as the sun crested over the distances peaks. It didn't take long before deer started to showing up in my eyepiece. A mixture of Mule Deer and Coues Deer milling about the Ocotillo and Cholla Cactus, but nothing with antlers. I strongly believed there were some Coues bucks near by looking over a hot doe. But after hours of glassing I couldn't turn up even one buck. Over the next few days finding deer and a lot of them wasn't the problem, but finding a rutting Coues buck proved more challenging. Their name of the Gray Ghost was proving to be very true once again. However, I still had a couple more days till the sun set on this season. The next day I hiked back to one of my favorite glassing points and waited for enough light to start making out shapes. As I sat there I contemplated the decisions I had made over the last few days. Apprehension started to creep in, would I even get one opportunity this season after all the miles of hiking and hours glassing? When doubt was at its highest, I spotted movement on a distance hillside. It was another Coues doe, but this time she was running around in circles acting funny. Soon after, I glassed a young buck in the brush near her. Then a couple more bucks came out above her to see what all the commotion was about. Continued on page 8

He checks over the entries, makes corrections and secures additional information as needed. Additionally, he saves entry photos for use in our future record books or on our website. Finally, Bret controls all the paperwork, prints and mails out the certificates to the applicants. Bret will play a huge part in the biennial BGC banquets and Award Dinners.

Then I saw him. He was already bedded, not 20 yards above her in the rocks; under a mesquite tree. One of the biggest Coues bucks I've seen in person. After taking some time to enjoy moment, and the grandeur of such an amazing Coues, an idea of an approach utilizing the wind and terrain to my advantage took shape. It would be a hard hike up and around, but I believed it was possible to get into bow range with some luck. Two hours had passed by the time I had made it to my final stalking position. Boots were off now, backpack left on the hillside behind me. I just needed to clear a small rocky point, and he should be bedded below me slightly to my right. I was hoping none of the other bucks spots me, and that the doe had moved off. With an arrow nocked, and my heart pounding in my chest, I inched closer toward the buck bedded 40 yards below me. I could see the top of his back, and his rump clearly as he watched the valley below him. He hadn't moved a foot since I last glassed him two hour before. I needed to get about 10 yards closer to have a clear shot at his vitals. Only few moments later I felt the touch of a breeze on the back of my neck, he bolted out of his bed bouncing through the cactus and rocks below. The last I saw him, he was several hundred yards into Old Mexico still running from the predator that he winded behind him. After the initial disappointment of another failed stalk of one of these amazing animals, I sat down on a near by rock with my bow still ready in my hand - I just smiled. I wasn't upset, wasn't angry, wasn't even cursing my bad luck. I was actually **really grateful** to just have an opportunity on a buck like this. Even though not many stalks work in our favor, all we can enjoy the moment, and let God control the future. I'll be back, and maybe, just maybe our paths will cross again.

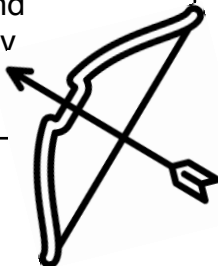

Bowfishing 101:

Preparing for the Palo Verde Tilapia Shoot

CBH Small Game Club is gearing up for the 2020 Palo Verde Tilapia Shoot April 25-26. If you have never tried bowfishing or don't know how to get started in Palo Verde, here is a quick beginners guide.

First, I want to say that I fell in love with this shoot the first time I shot it. All I knew was that the meet-up location was at Palo Verde County Park and the canals north of the campground had carp and tilapia in them. Two weeks prior to the shoot I did some e-scouting and then put some boots on the ground the weekend prior. Feeling relatively confident that I had a few spots in which I had seen fish, the plan was to stick a few tilapia and carp so that I had something to show at weigh-in and then focus on finding the big ones. The nice thing about this shoot is that you are looking for the biggest single tilapia or carp, so it's anyone's game.

The morning of the shoot, we gathered at the campground, finished registration, and went over the rules. Most shooters walk the canals and river

but a few folks had small boats that they launched from town and slowly drifted along the river. A few of the experienced bowfishers recommended trying my luck at the bridge in town. I had my spots picked out but decided to give it a try. At the bridge, the river is wide so the opportunity for big fish is good. But shooting over the railing with a recurve is tricky. I bounced around each corner of the bridge near where the rails were low and kept my eyes on the shallow water. About mid morning, after several narrow misses, arrows bouncing off rocks and getting arrows stuck and unstuck in the cattails, I shot a 1/2 pound tilapia. It was not impressive but I was excited for my first bowfishing success.

It turns out that the bridge is a hot spot for bowfishers to give it one last try before weigh in. It's close to the campground and I had company off and on as other bowfishers walked back and forth waiting for a tilapia or carp to rise to the surface to sun giving us an opportunity to shoot.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA WOMAN WINS WORLD ARCHERY TITLE, HELPS KIDS

Paige Pearce-Gore is a world-renown competitive archer who doubles as a youth outdoors instructor who has networks with the Congressional Sportsmen's Foundation, who as 22, was selected as California's "New Mover, Shaker" by the California Outdoors Hall of Fame and will be inducted at the Sportsmen's Expo on Jan. 20.

Paige Pearce-Gore, an outdoor camp instructor for kids from Northern California, shot perfect scores last week to win the archery World Series Finals in Las Vegas.

Pearce-Gore, 24, works at the Kids Outdoor Sports Camp in Red Bluff and also teaches hunter education for the California Department of Fish and Wildlife.

At the Las Vegas competitions, she posted perfect scores in compound bow women's events at the Archery World Series Finals and what is called the Vegas Shoot. She called the events "the Super Bowl of archery" and brought home \$19,000 for the victories.

I've met Paige several times over the future of youth in the outdoors, her trademark theme.

"Children don't always grow up in environments these days where they learn outdoor skills," she said.

Children who grow up loving outdoors activities are the ones who, as adults, are the most likely to help protect habitat that wildlife require, she said.

That approach inspired the Congressional Sportsmen's Foundation to invite her to Washington D.C., where she met Interior Secretary David Bernhardt, many agency chiefs and members of Congress, and delivered her message.

In 2018, she was the first winner of the "New Movers, Shakers" category as voted on by members of the California Outdoors Hall of Fame. The award was designed for those under 30 whose achievements are game-changers but whose short careers might not qualify them for the Hall of Fame.

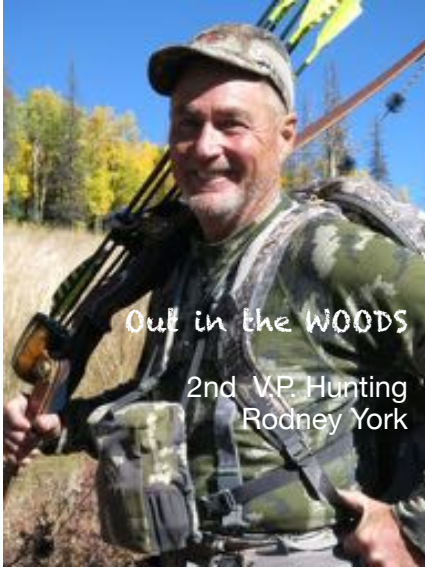
One of Pearce-Gore's dreams is to compete in the Olympics. She said archers would petition the International Olympic Committee to allow the use of modern compound bows.

In most world competitions, archers use compound bows, where the bowstring is engineered with a system of pulleys and levers to create a uniform process that reduces the strain. The Olympics permit only "recurve bows" — a design similar to what Robin Hood would have used.

Pearce-Gore previously won the largest outdoor 3D archery target competition in the world for five years straight and has traveled to archery events in China, Colombia, Turkey, Germany, France and El Salvador.

THUNDER IN THE SPRING

In the predawn darkness I pulled the striker against the surface of my slate call very softly three times. Immediately came the response I was hoping for. Gobble after gobble was being hurled at me from the roost tree some 150 yards south and along the creek that meandered through this large mesa flat. I put the call back in my pocket and settled back against the chair that was inside my pop up blind. The early morning chill made me thankful I had put my heavier sweater on.

I was confident, no, border line cocky about where I was currently setup. I had scouted the area weeks before, found three good mature toms and had watched them from a safe distance as they flew down from their roost and went about their normal travel routine. Based on my earlier observations the toms, with approximately five hens, would be coming from south to north and traveling along an old skid road. Two weeks earlier I had placed the pop up between some large boulders with a large white oak that had toppled over directly behind the blind.

I used some of the oaks limbs and branches to brush in the front of the blind. This morning I had placed two Avian hen decoys and one Avian tom decoy within 12 yards of my shooting window. I had carefully turned the tom to face the exact position I wanted one of the gobblers to be standing for my shot. Most times when the boys

From page 12- More gobbles from the roost tree caused me to jump a little with excitement and I looked at my watch. Any minute and there would be enough light for the birds to fly down. The gobbles were coming at a faster rate now and I knew from experience that the time was almost at hand. Suddenly the distinct sound of wings flapping could be heard from the direction of the roost tree, then all was completely quiet. I peered through the side window of the blind hoping to catch a glimpse of the birds so I would know that they were on their way. At first I could see nothing and then a dark ball shaped object was moving just off the skid road in a little green clearing. I looked through my binoculars and confirmed the black ball was a strutting tom trying to look his best for the girls.



I watched the show for about five minutes and then realized the strutter had been joined by two more toms. The birds were now moving towards my position very slowly. The hens were just feeding and walking slowly along in the front and apparently were just ignoring the boys best displays of color and dance.

When the birds were approximately 100 yards out I again pulled the slate from my pocket and stroked out four to five soft yelps. One of the gobblers responded immediately and began separating himself from the others, walking slowly in my direction. I reached over and turned the Canon video camera on that was already in a pre set position and quickly nocked an arrow on the string of the long bow and leaned it against the inside of my right knee. Another gobbler thundered across the flat and I knew he was coming fast. Another full minute passed and suddenly I could see him coming around a large boulder on my left about thirty yards out.

I leaned forward enough to push the record button on the camera and when I leaned back I could see that he had broken into full strut and was waddling towards the decoys. I placed my hand on to the leather grip of my bow and slowly brought the bow up into shooting position. The big tom gobbled again at approximately 18 yards and started his side walking dance towards my tom decoy. I was now watching this display through the sight window of my bow with my left arm extended and my fingers tight against the bowstring. As the tom reached the pre determined spot I slowly began drawing the bow. The gobbler began to turn as if on a carousel and when his fan obscured his head I picked the spot slightly above the anus, touched anchor and released. The arrow hit maybe one inch above where I was aiming and the tom did a double back flip in the air before running a short distance from the blind and folding up for good. I walked over to the downed old monarch. I stroked his beautiful iridescent feathers and gave thanks to God for allowing me another marvelous opportunity in His great outdoors.

Bowfishing Pointers

Wayne Raupe

Bowfishing is not what most people think of when they pick up a bow and arrow. Once tried, like anything in archery, you will want to make it part of your annual archery schedule because it is whole lot of fun. Here are a few tips to help you have a chance against fast moving fish and even some slow ones:

- Take a few practice shots in a safe area by shooting down at some thing floating rather than shooting straight ahead at a target.
- Make sure you have the proper licenses.
- Get Good SunGlasses - Make sure they are polarized. Some of the cheaper versions aren't worth the price or the bargain they advertise. While you are at it get a strap so they don't fall off into the water and are gone forever. If you can't see the fish you will not likely get a fish.
- Your bow will get muddy and wet, and in general, you will want to one that you don't mid if this happens, especially if you venture into salt water.
- Explore area, if possible the weekend before looking for good spots where fish may school under shaded areas. Aim for the thickest part of the fish and account for list refraction as it distorts what you look at. The fish are deeper than they appear most of the time so aim low. Buy 2 or 3 bow fishing arrows that are equipped with a bow fishing broad-head points. Keep in mind that you could lose or destroy arrows, one or two arrows per day.
- Note: it is illegal to bowfish with arrows that are not attached to your bow with a string.
- Perfect conditions for bowfishing are when the sun is shinning, there is no wind and a cloudless sky. These conditions will help you see easier into the water. Stand with the sun above you or at your back. TAKE SUNSCREEN. The reflection of the water makes for the perfect conditions for a bad burn if not protected.
- A hat is important to protect your head, but with a brim that won't interfere with shooting a bow.
- Take shoes that will help you on rocks but also wade into the water to retrieve your fish and arrows.

Ingredients

1 1/2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for brushing
 2 pounds ground moose or beef
 2 cups chopped Vidalia or other sweet onions
 6 cloves garlic, minced
 2 28-ounce cans fire-roasted peeled whole tomatoes
 1 8-ounce can tomato sauce
 1 cup diced bell peppers (any color)
 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
 1 mild green chile pepper (such as Anaheim), seeded and chopped (or a 4-ounce can green chiles, drained)
 2 jalapeno peppers, seeded and finely chopped
 1/2 red or orange habanero chile pepper, seeded and finely chopped
 1 New Mexico chile pepper, seeded and finely chopped
 2 1/2 tablespoons chili powder
 1 teaspoon ancho chile powder
 1/2 teaspoon chipotle chile powder
 Kosher salt to taste
 1 1/2 tablespoons ground cumin
 1 1/2 teaspoons dried oregano
 Freshly ground pepper
 1/2 cup beer (or use water)
 3 tomatoes

Directions:

★Heat the olive oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add the ground meat and cook, stirring and breaking up the meat, until no longer pink, about 10 minutes. Add half each of the onions and garlic and cook, stirring, 10 more minutes; set aside.

★Combine the fire-roasted tomatoes and tomato sauce in a large pot over medium heat and crush with a potato masher. Stir in the reserved meat, the remaining onions and garlic, the bell peppers, parsley, green chile, jalapenos, habanero and New Mexico chile.

★Add the chili powder, ancho chile powder, chipotle chile powder, 2 teaspoons salt, the cumin, oregano, 1/2 teaspoon pepper and the beer. Reduce the heat to medium low and simmer, stirring occasionally, 1 hour.

★Meanwhile, preheat the oven to 200 degrees F and lightly brush a baking sheet with olive oil. Cut the tomatoes in half and set cut-side down on the prepared baking sheet. Brush the tomatoes with more olive oil and sprinkle with salt; bake until darkened and wrinkled, about 1 hour.

★Crush the tomatoes with the potato masher and add to the pot; cover and simmer 2 more hours. Season with salt.

Other ways to try it:

★Although you could use beef, YIKES, please don't! Use your favorite game meat such as venison, elk, or anything you have on hand.

★Add unsweetened dark chocolate about 6 oz. This is a tip from Chef Mike Cleavenger (our son-in-law) It adds a creamy texture.

★Replace beer with coffee (another tip from Chef Mike), bone broth for additional health benefits (possibly), or beef broth.

★ Put over sweet potato or a yam, I know it sounds like it might not be good, but it is delicious! (Another idea from Chef Mike)

★Top with grated cheese, sliced green onions, Mexican Creme or sour cream.

I want to share a few insights from the 2020 event. We had two archers, Aaron Buchanan and Marsha Quan, each competing in 5 different categories. Aaron arranged his schedule so that he participated at five venues, while Marsha took advantage of multiple days/times at 2 venues. This is dedication to archery! There were fewer 450s this year, in general many scores were lower than last year. There were 20 state records broken or newly established (BB-R category).

I also want to remind participants that you, the archer, are responsible for your registration and scorecard. In making sure your registration and scorecard are completely and legibly completed, you are helping the host site and tournament coordinators. As you attend events this spring and summer, please remember to take that little bit of extra time to get all the info on your registration and scorecard. Some events will disqualify your score if the scorecard is not completed correctly. Scorecards that are difficult to read increase the time it takes to compile the results, so please write legibly.

Awards for the CBH Indoor will be sent to the host sites in the next couple weeks.

Enjoy the spring events.

2020 CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

1. The tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to offer the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Tournament. NFMA rules do not apply to this event.
2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be either a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
3. The 1st Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern the tournament.
4. The range for the event shall be set out in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
5. Archers shall use hunting tactics for this event which is in keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.

A. String

- 1) 18" - 19" 40 - 5 Wood - 5
- 2) An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "Pass through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
- 3) "Bounce-ins" and "Glance-offs" shall not score.
- 4) "Arrows" do not score.
- 5) Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
- 6) Double scoring is required.
- 7) This shall be a one arrow tournament at unmarked yardage.

B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting

- 1) Divisions
 - a) Senior (55+)
 - b) Adult (18-54) Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (ages 15-17) Male and Female
 - d) Youth (ages 10-14) Male and Female
- 2) Styles
 - a) Right (R)
 - b) Non-Right (NR)
 - c) Release (R)
 - d) Recurve (R)
 - e) Traditional (T)

C. Awards

- 1) CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
- 2) Quota Class is one class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
- 3) No awards will be mailed.
- 4) Cuts and Partisan Participation Award Only.

D. Ticks

- 1) One stabilizer not over 10 inches, allowed. A Quiver is not considered a stabilizer.
- 2) Bow-guards are allowed in all styles.
- 3) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
- 4) No compound bows over 60 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no limit.
- 5) Brackets are allowed for range finding. Brackets allowed even with the battery removed for manual mechanical function.
- 6) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot - expendable broadheads are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes.

- 7) Practice shots are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (1/4" minimum diameter).
- 8) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- 9) All bows shall be limited to 300 lbs with a 2% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- 10) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 11) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 12) Longbows: Must be shot off the shelf.
- 13) Cuts are allowed in all styles.

E. Miscellaneous

- 1) Cuts and Releases will shoot field points only.
- 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
- 3) All protests to the Protest Committee must be in writing within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the tournament each day and include a \$25.00 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
- 4) There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
- 5) Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 1st day of the tournament - Cuts and Releases will not be allowed to shoot in top flight groups. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 6) No target or sight noise allowed (sight tapes ok).
- 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will not be assisted.
- 8) No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours - except for tournament officials.
- 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
- 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
- 11) No cell phones, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or tent.
- 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
- 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.

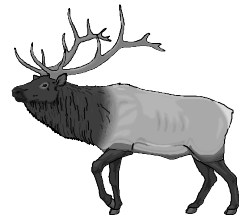

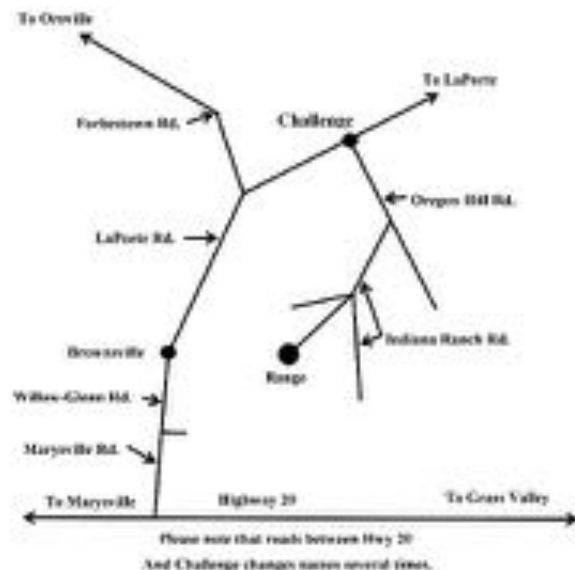
