New Youth Archery Program Comes to California

Scholastic 3D Archery (S3DA) has come to California. We are looking for coaches and potential future coaches to expand this program into California. Most archers are now familiar with the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP). NASP started in Kentucky as a school based archery

instruction program and has expanded to most states. Every year over 13,000 students meet in Louisville Kentucky to compete in a national tournament. A few of the creators of NASP recognized that although school archery participation had grown in leaps and bounds, many students were left wanting more. After learning archery at school, students had the desire to continue their archery training but there were very few opportunities to venture into other aspects of the sport. Many students wanted to learn how to hunt, learn how to shoot more advanced compound bows, use sights, and shoot at 3D animals.

S3DA was created to fill this need for more youth

archery opportunities. I like to think of S3DA as the little league of archery. S3DA has the national

organization allowing for National competition and support. Each state has a State coordinator and the states are broken up into regions allowing for state and regional tournaments. Almost anyone or any organization can create an S3DA team.

What does it take to start a team you ask? It is very simple, you need an S3DA certified coach, a place to practice and of course you need youth to participate. Coaches and teams are covered by a hefty insurance policy and students have some insurance as well.

What kind of gear is allowed in S3DA? We have recurve, compound, sights, no sights, and traditional classes in competition. We do have speed restriction on the bows based on age. S3DA's classes are very similar to ASA and NFAA. The goal of this program is to get youth archers interested in transitioning to shooting in NFAA and ASA tournaments and to appreciate ethical hunting. (Continued on Page 19)

CBH/SAA Elections: Okay, here I go again... As I said in my March Message, this is the odd numbered year in which the Offices of the President, Vice President and the 2nd Vice President of Hunting are up for election as their terms will end on March 3rd, 2018. We need interested individuals to toss their hats into the arena and run for the offices. As the deadlines will be here soon you must make your decision ASAP. The process is this... you provide a resume to your Regional Officers indicating that you have an interest in running for the office. I have appointed your Regional Officers as part of the Nominating Committee. The Regional Officers will then review your resume and nominate you for the position. They will send your resume to Pam Severtson, CHB/SAA Secretary, and me. We will then publish your resume in the Magazine and if there is more than one person running for the position, we will hold an election with ballots in the December issue of the Magazine. The members will use the ballots to vote for the candidate of their choice. The ballots will be due, by mail, to Pam by January 1st. The election results will be announced in January. If you are the only one running for the office there will be no ballot vote, however, you will be considered elected by a unanimous vote.

I was CBH/SAA President for two, two year terms 1994-1995 and 1996-1997 and then another three terms from 2012 to present with my current term ending in March of 2018. Some say that after five terms, 10 years, it's time for me to retire. Also there is a chance that I will be moving out of state as soon as I retire... oh that's right... I just remembered I am retired... sooooo... if you are interested in running for the office of President this is the perfect time for you to step up and assume this office. When you do decide to toss your hat into the ring you will also need to select a Vice President as your running mate.

Craig Fritz, 2nd VP of Hunting, has submitted his intent to "Not Run" and will retire after he completes his term in March 2018. With that being said, we need someone to step up to fill the position that Craig has held for the last 23 years. If you are a hunter and you are concerned with hunting here in California then now is your chance to make a difference. If you want to be a part of the team that records the animals and

accomplishments of your fellow hunter from now into perpetuity now is the time for you to get involved. Be a part of this "Historic Recording" that will be referred to for generations to come.

As of this date we haven't been hit with any hats being tossed into the arena by enthusiastic folks chomping at the bit to fill any of these positions. I remind you that you will NOT be standing alone as I and others will remain to help and guide you as needed. This is your sport and your organization. Don't let these positions go unfilled.

Mid-Year President's Meeting: Just a R E M I N D E R for CBH-SAA Officers, Staff and all Regional Delegates on June 17th we will have our Annual Mid-Year Presidents Meeting in Visalia at the Visalia Sportsman's Association located at 500 Roosevelt Ave. At this meeting we will be addressing the NFAA Petitions that we were not able to discuss or vote on because NFAA has, I hope for only this year, changed their deadlines for submitting and discriminating those petitions to the individual states for review and input. It is imperative that all delegates, or alternates, attend this

meeting as we must have full input on these petitions. This also means that as soon as our California NFAA Director, Gary McCain, receives and reviews the petitions he receives from the NFAA he will send them out to all of the Regions. Your Region is then to send the petitions to the clubs in



the Region. The clubs then review and vote on how they think the Region should vote at the meeting. The Regional Delegates will then bring your voice to the June Meeting and we will vote on each of the petitions.

During our Annual CBH/SAA Meeting last January there was some discussion about us moving our Annual Meeting date to accommodate NFAA's needs. I'm in strong opposition of moving our meeting date as I'm sure California would not be the only state to have to change their historic meeting dates to accommodate NFAA's lack of thought, accommodation and planning for their petition deadlines and their now Biennial (every 2 year) Meeting date.

CBH/SAA Membership: There is a subject that I haven't touched upon for a couple of years and that is our CBH/ SAA Membership. I/we have tried to motivate our local clubs to incorporate within their **Bv-Laws** requirement that any new member joining the club must also be a current member of CBH/SAA. suggested that for clubs that have member who, for what every reason, are opposed to this requirement to just grandfather them in so that it is their choice to join CBH/SAA or not. In the past we offered a free full page ad in our Magazine, for one of their tournaments, once they have incorporated the mandatory verbiage into their By-Laws or 100% of their membership are CBH/SAA Members. We have very few clubs who have moved in that direction. I know that Oranco Bowman in Chino, Riverside Archers Club in Corona and Mojave Archers in Phelan have all made it a requirement that their members be CBH/SAA members. There may be other clubs that I am not aware of and I apologize for not noting them here, however, the point is we need all of your help, clubs and members, in getting those unattached archers to join CBH/SAA and to start paying their fair share as they are enjoying the efforts, results and protection of the constant work of CBH/SAA. Currently, those of you that receive this Magazine are paying your dues and donating money to the needs of the CBH/SAA Legislative Defense Fund. You make it possible for the Legislative Team to continue to be where they are needed and also you pay for our full time Lobbyist... Gaines and Associates. The unattached archer on the other hand is... oh yes... they are riding in the car, that you are paying for, and they aren't even giving you gas money... Just say-en!!

Until next time... be safe, shoot as often as you can & enjoy this sport. Always remember, no matter what kind of stick you shoot or bow you bend, we must remain one united and strong FAMILY or we will fall!!!!

CDFW Officers Recognized for Outstanding Acts and Achievements

Several wildlife officers from the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) Law Enforcement Division were recently recognized for exceptional performances. Awards were presented in front of their peers during a CDFW luncheon held in January 2017, in conjunction with CDFW's annual Advanced Officer Training. Many of the awards are issued directly by CDFW, while others are issued through non-government organizations that support the mission and efforts of CDFW and its officers. At the core of each award are the exemplary efforts and commitment these officers have demonstrated, above and beyond the normal course of their duties. Awards presented by Chief of Enforcement D. CDFW Exemplary Service Award: Lifesaving -Warden Chad Edwards (Siskiyou) (above) In September 2014, an arsonist ignited a brush fire on the outskirts of the town of Weed. The fire spread into town where it burned more than 150 homes and numerous commercial structures in a matter of hours. Warden Edwards heard the radio traffic regarding the fire and immediately responded to the area. He evacuated homes by transporting people in his patrol truck and flagged down other evacuees with empty seats in their cars to shuttle people out. Working through the chaos of the actively burning areas and aerial retardant dump, Warden Edwards made trip after trip into the burning neighborhoods to rescue stranded families, senior citizens and pets. Warden Edwards acted with bravery above and beyond the call of duty. Amazingly, no lives were lost in this fire, due in part to the actions of Warden Edwards. Below

Oranco's Range looked fantastic thanks to all the hard work that the Oranco members did for the shoot, in fact it looks great all year long.

The 2017, State Field Championship, coming up on June 10th and 11th, will once again be held at Oranco. I look forward to having the shoot at the Oranco Range because the club sure does know how to host a shoot.

As for 2018, at the CBH/SAA Annual Meeting we had in January, 2017, we realized that there were some important issues that needed to be discussed at a letter date and that we could address them at the 2017, CBH/SAA Mid-Year President's Meeting which will be held at the Visalia Sportsman's Association located at 500 Roosevelt Ave. in Visalia. Based upon the importance of topics to be discussed the Regional Delegates voted to have all three Delegates from each Region be represented and each of those Delegates would have one vote on deciding what direction CBH/ SAA would take on each matter just like at our Annual Meeting. One important topic we will be discussing and voting on falls into my arena as the 2nd VP of Field. This has to do with the State Field Championship Tournament.

That is, will we continue with a one site venue or will we have a

multi-3-site venue which included a Southern, Central and a Northern California site. In the past we have had both, the one site venue and then later we changed to the multi-site venue. We went to the multi-site venue for two reasons.

First of all it was the need to promote archery, which came about by having the tournament sites located where it was more accessible to more archers. The other reason was based upon finances.

That is, through more participation in the tournament, we were able to generate more income which covered the tournament expenses and it also generated some income for the General Fund.

Also, to be discussed will be the mandatory assignment of targets based upon all participants shooting with their competition on both days or just on Sunday. We currently allow the shooters to pick who they shoot with on Saturday and then on Sunday it is a mandatory assignment to shoot with their competition on Sunday. I have received several requests to have shooters shoot with their completion on both days.

For now, that's all that I have to report. Until then, shoot 'em straight and in the "X".

A Memory About Bert By Scott Walker

It was about 1964 or 1965 when I went to my first shark derby. I was about 11 or 12 years old. I went with my dad and my brother Mike. When we arrived at Elkhorn Slough, we saw Burt Malech. Dad knew Burt and approached him and they began to talk about bow hunting. My brother Mike and I were getting anxious, as young boys do, so we asked Burt where to hunt for sharks and other fish. Burt not only told us where to go, but what to look for when we were walking the banks for the sharks, rays and other fish. He would say look for a swirl or a shark fin or some sort of movement, then shoot fast because the water is dark and murky. So my brother and I took off and a few hours later I came back with a leopard shark. I was so excited I wanted my picture taken in front of the shark derby sign. I saw Burt Malech and showed him my shark. He wanted to know everything. As a young kid, his kindness and interest in my conquest left a huge impression on me. As a man of "experience" I look back on this time with gratitude and admiration. Burt was a great guy who took the time to make a kid's day. That's the kind of man Burt Malech was.

My experience with Burt Malech was kind and encouraging and the more I learned about him and talked to other bow hunters about him, I see that my experience was not unusual. Bert was a kind, loving man who had a passion for bow hunting and archery. But more important than that, he had a passion and love for bow hunters and archers. He was a people person who liked nothing more than to sit around after a day of shooting and swap bow hunting stories. Many who attended his Shark Shoot each year tell that after the shoot was over everyone would go to



Burt's place for dinner and stories. Even after Bert got to the point where he was no longer able to physically go out and do the shoot, he never lost his enthusiasm for gathering hunters together and hearing about their experiences. Burt received many bow hunting awards and accolades during his lifetime. He was a member

accolades during his lifetime. He was a member of the Archery Hall of Fame and earned the Lifetime Achievement Award. In addition, he was the Historian for CBH for many years. think Burt's real legacy lies in the relationships and friendships he made within the bow hunting community. He was known amongst his friends and fellow hunters as an all-around good guy who never said a bad thing about anybody. He was a very humble man who called himself the "poor farmer". He had a great connection with people and he was always interested in what others had to say. Generally, humility is not a trait associated with hunters, but Burt was an exception. He will be missed, but the traditions and relationships he left behind will keep his legacy alive.

2017 CalNASP State Tournament

The morning sunrise was partially visible through the clouds as the rain had stopped a short time Volunteer staff were starting to arrive to finish prep and get ready for the first single site state championship for California National Archery in the Schools Program. The previous evening, volunteers arrived to build an archery range in the school's gym. Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) CalNASP State Coordinator, Lesa Johnston in cooperation with Placer County Tourism and the CalNASP steering Committee coordinated this tournament to replace the virtual tournaments that had been used for several years. The tournament was held Saturday February 4th at Sierra College in Rocklin. A total of 122 shooters from many locations around the state registered for the single day event to shoot in one of 4 flights.

Shooting equipment for CalNASP are specific, standard Genesis Bow and official Easton NASP 1820 arrow. A shooter can use a "no glove" attachment to the string and nock locators must be tied on, no other attachments to the string or bow are allowed. Sight window must be free of marks and with camo bows the sight window face must be taped. Before each flight an equipment inspection is performed. A shooter can use either a shooting glove or finger tab and an arm guard.

The official NASP scoring target is the 80cm FITA target with a total of 30 shots taken. The participants shoot ten 3 arrow ends, 5 at 10m and 5 at 15m. There are 2 shooters per target with double inspection scoring and judges to decide discrepancies. Divisions include; elementary, middle and high school. Each division will have individual boys and girls winners and can have a team that must include boys and girls.

Top prize for high individual score includes a new Genesis Bow for both boy and girl winners, team trophies for each division and medals for individual winners.





Legislative Information

A Next California Fish and Game Commission meeting (CFGC) will be held April 13th (teleconference). Agenda includes salmon and halibut adoptions and discuss proposed changes to regulations concerning the use of dogs for the pursuit/take of mammals (Section 265, Title 14, CCR). Another meeting will be held April 26-27 in Van Nuys. This meeting will include the adoption of Big Game regulations. No agenda has been posted at this writing.

The next Wildlife Resources Committee meeting will be May 24th in Sacramento; no agenda has been posted but continued discussion on 2018 fishing regulations and Predatory Policy update should be on the agenda.

Predator Policy Work Group (PPWG) met March 20th in Sacramento. Agenda items, 2. Discuss and revise draft predator policy 3. Discuss and possibly develop a recommendation on FGC Petition No. 2015-008 concerning recreational take of American badgers and gray fox 4. Identify and prioritize predator-related regulations to propose for revision.

The state legislature has started the next 2 year cycle for proposed laws. Bills not passed this year can be carried over to 2018. Several bills have already been introduced that affect sportsmen. Here is a list of bills related to hunting and their current positions in the legislature; AB478, increase age requirement for fishing license, in Appropriations Committee. AB521, reduce the tag cost for resident elk tags, in Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. AB573, depredation permits for wild pigs (spot bill), No Committee assignment yet. AB986 reduced fees for veterans, in Appropriations Committee. AB1544 lead ammo ban relief, in Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. AB1617, additional funding sources for DFW, No committee assigned. SB234 local regulation prohibition, in Judiciary Committee. SB710 use of suppressors for hunting, in Public Safety Committee. Additional bills related to firearms and DFW budgeting are not listed at this time. Bills could change content when close to expiration with the term gut and amend. Our conservation partners in the Hunting Conservation Coalition also have lobbyists to monitor concerns of sportsmen. This network of information and participation is advantageous to keeping informed of laws and regulations that affect what we do. Robert

Who has S3DA partnered with? S3DA has partnered with many organizations that want S3DA to thrive. 

Rules & Regulations, Map and General Information on Back of Flyer

2017 CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

- This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to offer the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Field tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event
- 2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be either a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
- The 2nd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
- The range for this event shall be laid out in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
- Archers shall use hunting tackle for this event which is in keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.

A. Scoring:

- 1) Vital 10 Kill 8 Wound 5
- An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "Pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
- 3) "Bounce-ins and "Glance-offs" shall not score.
- 4) "Antlers" do not score.
- Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
- 6) Double scoring is required.
- 7) This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.

B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:

- 1) Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64): Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (ages 15-17): Male and Female
 - d) Youth (ages 12-14): Male and Female
- 2) Styles
 - a) Sight (S)
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Release (R)
 - d) Recurve (Rc) Adults and Seniors only
 - e) Traditional (T) Adults and Seniors only

C. Awards:

- CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
- Guest Class is one class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
- 3) No awards will be mailed.

D. Tackle:

- 1) One stabilizer not over 12 inches, allowed
- 2) Bow quivers are allowed in all styles.
- 3) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
- No compound bows over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no limit
- 5) Binoculars are allowed. NO RANGE FINDERS!
- No range finding devices allowed at any time on the range.
- Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot – expandable broadheads are allowed if they meet Ca. Fish & Game Codes.

- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (7/8" minimum diameter)
- Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 12) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 13) Longbows: Must be shot off the shelf
- 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.

E. Miscellaneous:

- 1) Cubs: Due to safety considerations a Cub division will not be included at this event.
- Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
- All protests to the Protest Committee must be in writing within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the tournament and include a \$25.00 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
- There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
- Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament.
- 6) No target or sight notes allowed (sight tapes ok)
- No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will not be assisted.
- No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours – except for tournament officials.
- Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
- 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
- 11) NO cell phones, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or bow.
- Tournament officals will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
- 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.




