

How To Fix These 4 Bowhunting Mistakes Before They Happen

Petersen's Bowhunting

No one likes a pessimist, but there are times when it pays to look for the dark clouds we hate to admit are there — to determine what can go wrong. While negative thinking is usually a curse, it can serve a purpose when you look at these possible outcomes and come up with a plan to fix them before they happen.

Looking for worst-case scenarios is a good plan for many outdoor activities, be it wilderness camping or bowhunting. These are unforgiving — you make one mistake, and the whole thing unravels faster than a cheap shirt in a patch of multiflora rose.

I am going to zero in on things that can go wrong during the moment of truth. It would be nice if we could just leave this until the time it actually happens, but those encounters come with a lot of adrenaline and not much time — both push cerebral capacity well past its limit. I must rehearse every possible outcome, or I will most likely misplay my big opportunity. Here are four things that can go wrong and ways to avoid the tragic ending:

Paralysis By Analysis

I once had a friend come to film my hunt, and I encouraged him to bring his bow. A nice, mature buck came through, but it was not one of the bucks I was after. So, I swung the camera over, and my friend grabbed his bow. The buck was within 30 yards for at least a minute, but my friend never drew. Afterwards, I asked him why not. "He never offered me a shot," Thad said.

I thought the buck offered him several shots, so I asked what he was looking for. As it turns out, Thad wanted something closer to the classic, broadside shot at 20 yards with the deer in the wide open and his head turned looking the other way. I applaud the careful nature of my friend's shot selection, but that buck got away because my friend overanalyzed the situation. You need to be ready for the first good shot you get; don't wait for perfect when good enough is right in front of you.

Don't overthink — get your bow drawn as soon as the deer gets within range, and when you see a shot you know you can make, take it.

No Shooting Lane

I have another friend with a lesson to teach. Rod hunted a giant buck for two years before it finally followed a doe straight toward his stand. The doe went past on the "correct" side, walking right through my friend's shooting lane, but the buck circled the tree on the other side to cut her off.

Rod assumed no deer would pass on that side. So, he didn't have a shooting lane where the buck walked. Rod never had another chance at that buck. Never assume a buck will do a certain thing, because the one time he doesn't will really sting.

I remember shooting a buck back in 1991. I was in the stand for an hour and kept looking at two small trees that covered a possible shot to a nearby cornfield. Finally, I climbed down and cut the trees. Two hours later, a buck stopped right in that opening. I killed him only because I had cut those trees down. Play all the possible shots out in your mind once you get to the stand. If there is an angle that leaves you stymied, get your saw out and open a lane.

Clogged Nocks & Broken Pins

Another of my friends once had a great buck get away because he had dirt in his nock. The arrow didn't seat all the way onto the string, and when my friend drew back, the arrow pinched loose and fell to the ground. Of course, the buck was long gone before my friend could load another arrow. When Larry set the bow down at the base of his tree in the pre-dawn darkness, the arrow nocks pushed into the dirt and came out plugged. He didn't realize the problem until it was too late. After hearing that story, I always adjust my quiver so that my arrows don't stick out past the bottom cam and I look at them every time I pull the bow up.

I have had my own share of failures in the tree. I once had my bow snag on a barbed wire fence while I was pulling it up into the tree. Rather than climb down, I bounced it around for a few seconds until it finally came free. I can't remember what prompted me to draw the bow a short time later, whether a buck or doe, but I do remember my top sight pin — the one I needed — was no longer there! I broke it off when I bounced the bow. That deer got away because I made a mistake — not the bouncing part, but the lack of diligence once the bow reached my lap.

Both Larry and I could have avoided issues had we drawn our bows after loading our arrows and settling into the tree. You never know what issue your bow or clothing may have developed since the last time you hit full draw. A quick test draw and aim will shake out all these problems while you still have time to fix them.

A Javelina Almost 40 Years Later

I have been intrigued with Javelina Hunting for almost 40 years. This came about by reading the stories and looking at the pictures featured in the "Western Bowhunter" publication back in the 1980's when Dough Walker had his "Doug Walker's Javelina Bowhunters Get-Together" near Globe, Arizona on the San Carlos Apache Reservation. I have always wanted to hunt these little gray ghosts, but the timing was always wrong.

So, as it turned out, I never did go until three years ago when Brett Scott asked me to go with him on his annual deer and javelina hunt near Bagdad, AZ. Our time was limited as we only had three days to hunt with a day of travel on either end of the hunt. I finally saw one of the ghosts trucking across a clearing, so I made my way to a position where I thought I could intercept him. I set up next to a little tree for a 30-yard shot but when he finally stopped it had turned into a 40-yard shot. I got a clean shot off and my arrow was on its way to the pig's vitals until all there was remaining for my arrow to penetrate was dust... and what a mighty fine job my arrow did on that dust cloud! I swear that pig was 50 yards way when my arrow passed over his tracks!

Brett was holding off on shooting pigs and concentrating on hunting deer but of course everywhere he went he was surrounded by pigs and everywhere I went, because I only had a javelina tag, I was surrounded by deer! At noon the next day Bret, on his ATV, had just left camp on his way to his deer stand when he saw two pigs motoring along about 100 yards off the road. He drove up ahead of them got off his ATV and made a 150-yard stalk on-em and anchored his pig at 20 yards. He brought it back to camp where I was, and I got to watch him field dress it and that was as close as I got to getting a javelina. I had a great time and thanks to Bret I had my first javelina hunt under my belt.

Recounting my hunt with Bret to Earl Williams (EW), my other hunting partner, EW said... "Why don't you go with Mary and me next year? We go every year and I know the area really well because I have been going there for 40 years." Well, I "him hawed" around for the next two years and then finally EW and Mary cornered me in their kitchen and forced me to make a decision. They were submitting their applications that day. I had to put my arm in a sling after all the twisting, but I finally said, "Ok I'll go with you." No sooner had the words exited my mouth Mary snatched my credit card before I could change my mind and my application was submitted.

January 26th, 2018, found Bob King, EW & Mary and me with our RV's in an RV park about two hours east of Phoenix. That evening we made plans for an early wake-up and drive the desert in our pickups. An hour before dawn we were loading up the trucks for the days hunt. Just after sunrise we were looking in an area where Bob got his big pig last year, but we found nothing. We looked in some very encouraging places where pigs should be and places where they had gotten pigs before but there were no little gray ghosts there and there were NO tracks to indicate otherwise. We went to several other locations with the same results... no pigs, but we did see some very respectable Coues Deer bucks.

On the morning of day two we did a lot of looking but found nothing then we drove to an area that held a deep creek with vertical volcanic walls. We left the trucks on the ridge above the creek and moved slowly through the chaparral toward the exposed volcanic cliffs of the creek. Mary was the first one to the edge of the cliffs and as she scanned the area she saw about 10 pigs just below the canyon rim in a thick bed of tall cactus and about 100-yards from her. Bob was about 40-yards from the pigs, so she guided him into a position just above the herd. Bob saw his target and drew his bow and when it all seemed right he released his arrow. The pigs took off and Bob saw his arrow sticking in one of the big ears of cactus. So close yet so far! And that is hunting... as day two came to a close.

Day three started the same way. We put about 60 miles on our trucks and had seen only a few pig tracks by noon. We did, however, see lots of quail and we saw one desert Mule Deer buck that had a 40-inch-wide rack that was taller than it was wide... just a monster 4x4 buck, a once in a lifetime buck! At noon we headed back to the canyon, where Bob got his shot at a pig, and we found nothing while glassing and walking the hill sides and canyon. While we were on our hike EW wore a blister on the heal of both feet, so he went back to his truck and glassed from the comfort of a leather bucket seat. Shortly after EW went to his truck we got a call on the radio from him that he had spotted some pigs over a mile away and summoned us all back to his position. We drove as close as we could get to the pigs which left a half mile stalk. We devised a plan for a stalk and took off toward the pigs. They were on the hillside just above a dry creek bed and just beyond a 90-degree curve to the right. We had Continued on page 8

Last Hour, Last Day By Mary Williams

We woke up from our afternoon nap wondering if the last Javelina hunting day was to end without event. We slowly moved out of our warm and comfortable truck seats into the mode of let's get going or we're not going to have one last opportunity. As I jumped out of the truck to head to the edge of a nearby canyon to glass for Javelina, my husband EW, calls out "I think I see pigs", but don't say anything on the radio yet until I'm sure because they are a long way away. After he confirmed he was looking at 3 or 4 pigs on a hillside feeding he called me over and showed me where to look. Even with my binoculars it was difficult to pick them out because they were two miles away but soon I saw a few dark pig shaped spots moving around. We called the rest of our hunting team, Wayne and Bob, on our radios and told them to head over our way and get ready to get some pigs. (On the San Carlos Apache Reservation, it is legal to use radios when hunting and stalking big game.

It had been 2 days since Wayne shot and harvested his pig and time was running out for us so we were scouting and glassing all the area's we could think of to find pigs again. Discussing and brainstorming with each other trying to determine whether it was the current moon phase (Full) that had them feeding at night and kept them from being active during the day, or if it was that there was not enough water, or if it was the heat that kept them hidden in the shade



of Juniper Trees in the vast Apache Reservation Desert. Depending on the big game animal we are hunting, will dictate which method of hunting we will use. For us, hunting javelina is different than when we are hunting deer or elk where we most often are sitting in a tree stand or in a ground blind. For the ever elusive javelina, we do more walking, driving, glassing, and following tracks and sign of the javelina. Hunting this way provides us the opportunity sit quietly and enjoy nature and take in the background sounds of the Quail and the meadowlark. It also allows us to blend in with nature as we sit in silence and soak in the beauty of this adventure while we glass the canyons, washes, cactus covered hillsides and rocky cliffs w/ Junipers all the while hoping to see the shadow or form of those gray and black desert Javelina feeding, moving from one area to another or snoozing in the warm sun of the early morning.

Once Wayne and Bob caught up with us we again confirmed the location of the pigs and we decided to drive our trucks as close to them as possible, which cut the twomile distance in half. After arriving at our new location EW looked at Bob and me and asked if we were up for the long uphill hike. It was 4:30pm with darkness coming within 2 hours.

I had already made up my mind that I was going to make the hike, so I had already downed a 5-hour Energy shot. This was going to be our one last opportunity before we had to head home, and I was going to need all the energy my tired body could summon. I was locked into getting up that mountainside and giving it one last shot. After Bob and I geared up and headed out we stopped and said a quick prayer asking God to be with us.

We trekked across the open hillside, down a ravine and back up the other side in the direction of the feeding Javelina. We stopped many times to check the wind and catch our breath. We reached the steeper section of the hill, about 300 yards behind and below the pigs. We were making good time and keeping pace to get to the pigs with enough light to get an arrow off. We had radios with earpieces allowing EW and Wayne from a mile away to correct our direction as we could not always see where the pigs were. About 100 yards from the spot where we should expect to find pigs, we stopped to catch our breath, checked the wind again verifying we had the wind in our favor and we were moving in the right direction. We moved in behind some Juniper Trees. Bob and I could see 2 or 3 pigs feeding 15-20 yards from us. There was a lot of cactus between us and the pigs and we couldn't get a clear shot, besides neither of us could hold our rangefinder still enough to verify the distance anyway. We could see some of the herd farther away about 60-70 yards broadside feeding on the hillside but that was too far for an ethical Continued on Page 8 shot.

Bob, being the gentleman that he is, motioned for me to move ahead. I looked up to see a Javelina about 20 yards away staring right at us. We stood still and waited and finally it went back to feeding.

From EW's point of view, he could see more pigs to my left and around the huge Juniper tree in front of us. So, following



his radio direction I moved slowly out to the left of the tree and could see one pig right away. I slowly raised my rangefinder to my face, I could barely hold it still as I was shaking so badly, and I was fogging the lens up to boot! Finally, on my 4th attempt I could see the pig and got a good reading, it was 50 yardages away. Already having an arrow knocked, I raised my bow up and I slowly drew it back. I was actually able to THINK in the midst of this adrenaline rush to look at my bubble and make sure it was centered and level. I looked through my peep and found my 50-yard pin which I placed on the vital kill zone on the feeding pig. The Arrow took quick flight and hit the pig perfectly. The pig ran 15 yards and crashed in the brush. I could only see the bushes moving vigorously until there was no more motion. It was over in seconds. I was lost in a hunting moment and then I realized Bob was still behind me. I pointed to the bushes ahead to jester that my pig had gone down and he gave me thumbs up.

By the time the field dressing was completed the Sun had set and Wayne had walked in to meet us, bringing with him a very bright light. The 3 of us headed back to the trucks as Wayne led the way with his light. On the way back, Bob and I recounted the stalk, the rush of the adrenalin and shaky rangefinders and everything else that we experienced on the stalk. It was a feeling of accomplishment for me and good walk back in the dark. To add to the adventure, the Fullest of Moons shone in the beautiful desert sky and we gave thanks to God for the opportunity and gift of the harvest.

the wind in our favor, so we dropped down into the creek and made our way up the creek bed. We got about 40 yards from the pigs when Mary and I felt the wind on the back of our necks. We looked at each other and decided... what do we have to lose as they will smell us no matter what we do so we decided to continue and about that time the pigs busted out of the juniper and ran into the thick cactus and disappeared. Day two ended again with nothing in the coolers.

Day three came and again we were up an hour before dawn and headed into an area EW knew very well and where he had had good luck in the past. We stopped at a few areas that looked promising but again we saw no sign of recent pig activity, so we moved on. We stopped on a relative wide and flat ridge top between two dry creek beds. We spread out on the flat top and move parallel down the ridge through juniper and cactus. It was about 10am and the sun was starting to get hot, so I would stop, glass and then move a little further and repeat. There was good fresh pig sign here and there down the ridge, so I was hoping to walk in on something soon. I had gone about half a mile and was getting into an area with more junipers and less open stuff or cactus. I stopped and took a drink of cool water from my camel pack when I notice movement to my left and behind me. I turned my head and immediately recognized the animals coming toward me and said to myself ... "Holey s**t... I got pigs!!!"

I have been having trouble with "Buck Fever" for several years now. It seams as though the older I get the worse it gets. I know that some of it is brought on by me because I have set some goals for myself. I need to get certain animals or species for the CBH/SAA Big Game Record Book and this self-induced pressure along with the rush I get when I see one of my target animals just makes things go haywire and sometimes I can't even get a good reading on my range finder!!! So, I have been playing a little head game with myself by reciting the sentence... "These are nothing more than 3-D targets." So, when I realized I was going to get a 20-yard shot at a pig I recited the line several times.

The lead pig was trucking right along and by the time I was ready to shoot it had passed through the only two-foot-wide shooting lain I had and had disappeared. There were at least two more behind it that I could see, and they were on the same trail as the first pig. I drew

Legislative Information

The next California Fish and Game Commission meeting (CFGC) will be held April 18th and 19th in Ventura. No agenda has been posted at the time of this article. The 2018 big game seasons and tag allotments will be voted on for this meeting, no changes are expected.

Wildlife Resources Committee meeting is scheduled for Thursday May 17th in Los Alamitos. No agenda has been posted for this meeting at this time.

The State Legislature are using a tactic called gut and amend to spot bills that just hold a position in the process.

AB 3 (Bonta) – Firearms: Age Restrictions As amended March 7, 2018, AB 3 – legislation by Assembly Member Bob Bonta (D/18-Alameda) – would prohibit the sale or transfer of any firearm by a licensed dealer to any person under 21 years of age. AB 3 would also raise the legal age to purchase any ammunition to 21 years of age. Under existing law, a person must be 18 years of age to purchase a long-gun and/or long-gun ammunition and must be 21 years of age to purchase a handgun or handgun ammunition.

Prior to being gutted and amended earlier this month, the subject of AB 3 was repeat offenders and recidivism reduction. AB 3, as previously written, had passed through the Assembly and over to the Senate last summer. **AB 3199**, legislation authored by Assembly Member Chris R. Holden (D/41-Pasadena) that would prohibit the use of firearms (except for antiques) as a prize in raffles conducted by private nonprofit organizations.

AB 3199 was amended late yesterday, March 20, 2018. Prior to being gutted and amended, the legislation was a spot bill on the topic of CalWORKs sanctions.

The bill has not yet been assigned to a committee, but must be heard in policy committee before April 27th to meet legislative deadline.


Additional legislation of interest to conservation groups include:

AB 2151 (Gray) – Hunting: Antelope, Elk, Bear, and Bighorn Ram Tags: Resident Apprentice Tag Fees

As amended March 13, 2018, AB 2151 – legislation authored by Assembly Member Adam Gray (D/21-Merced) – would reduce the fee for a resident apprentice (youth) antelope, elk, bear, and bighorn sheep tag to \$20. The bill would also prohibit any future adjustment of those fees. AB 2151 would not make any changes to the cost of an apprentice deer tag.

Existing law does not distinguish between the cost of an adult or youth big game tag and provides for the cost of the tags to be adjusted annually pursuant to a cost index. For comparison purposes, the current (2017) fees for the impacted youth/adult resident big game tags are as follows: antelope tag \$149.86; elk tag \$446.40; bear tag \$45.62; and bighorn sheep tag \$408.50. By providing California families a substantial cost break on the cost of many apprentice big game tags, AB 2151 would make hunting more accessible to our youth and play a big role in the recruitment of young new hunters.

AB 2151 passed out of the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee earlier today. The bill must next be heard in Assembly Appropriations Committee. The bill has not yet been set for hearing but must be heard by May 25th to meet legislative deadline. AB 2670 (Kiley) – Fish and Wildlife: Natural Community Conservation Planning Act As amended March 15, 2018, AB 2670 - legislation authored by Assembly Member Kevin Kiley (R/06-Granite Bay) - would require the Director of the Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) to designate two days per year as "Free Hunting Days" with one free hunting day in the fall hunting season, and the other free hunting day during the spring hunting season. The bill would require the individual taking advantage of the free hunting day to be accompanied by a licensed hunter who has held a valid hunting license for at least the last three consecutive years. AB 2670 would also require the individual who is accompanying the unlicensed hunter to be 21 years of age or older and allow them to only accompany one unlicensed hunter at a time. AB 2670 would require the unlicensed hunter to have successfully completed the Hunter Safety Course, and to have their hunter safety course certificate in their possession while in the field, along with any required tags or report cards, federal entitlements, or entry permits. The bill would also require the unlicensed hunter to remain in close visual and verbal contact with the licensed hunter at all times so the licensed hunter can provide adequate direction and immediately assume control of a firearm from the unlicensed hunter at any time, if necessary. AB 2670 would not allow unlicensed hunters participating in free hunting days to take any species that requires a draw or lottery to obtain a tag. Continued on page 10



AB 2670 would take effect on July 1, 2019. AB 2805 (Bigelow) -Depredation: Wild Pigs, Introduced February 16, 2018, AB 2805 is Assembly Member Frank Bigelow's (R/05-O'Neals) latest effort to craft a bill which facilitates the ability of landowners to control wild exotic pigs and the extensive damage they do to public and private lands. After a few recent previous attempts to pass similar legislation, Assembly Member Bigelow jump started this effort roughly a year ago by reaching out to the Fish and Game Commission with the request that they work with DFW and interested stakeholders to pull together some recommended bill language. After months of effort, the suggested language was approved by the Commission and forwarded to Assembly Member Bigelow for his consideration late last year. SB 1311 (Berryhill) -Fishing and Hunting: Annual Sportsman's Licenses Introduced February 16, 2018, SB 1311 - legislation by Senator Tom Berryhill (R/08-Modesto) - would create annual sportsman's license that provides the same privileges as annual hunting and fishing licenses, but that is valid for a term of one year from July 1st to June 30th. SB 1311 would limit the issuance of these licenses to California residents.

SB 1311, as introduced, does not call out the cost of the annual sportsman's license. However, the bill will be amended in the near future to call out a fee which will offer California's outdoorsmen and women a reasonable cost savings over the cost of buying both an annual hunting and fishing license separately.

The Pope and Young Club is working with federal officials and have this press release:

WASHINGTON – The National Park Service (NPS) is proposing to allow sportsmen to transport unarmed bows and crossbows through NPS-administered areas without a permit. Under current NPS regulations, individuals may only carry unarmed bows and crossbows without a permit within motor vehicles and other forms of mechanical transport. The proposed updates would extend the same access to individuals transporting bows and crossbows on foot or horseback when accessing otherwise inaccessible lands or waters contiguous to a park area when other means of access are otherwise impracticable or impossible.

In some national parks, sportsmen wishing to access private property may need to park vehicles in privately-owned parking lots but then must cross a road maintained by NPS to get to the private property. Currently, the individual would need to obtain a permit from the park to lawfully cross the street with a bow and crossbow. The proposed updated regulations would no longer require the sportsmen to obtain a permit in these and other circumstances covered by the proposed rule.

"This is a commonsense approach to providing access to responsible sportsmen without changing long standing legal regulations regarding hunting in national park areas," said NPS Deputy Director Dan Smith. "This rule removes an unnecessary requirement and cost for individuals seeking to safely access remote land and waters."

The updated regulations would have no impact on hunting regulations within a given national park. Possessing bows and crossbows in this manner would be subject to applicable state laws and would not be allowed if the individual is otherwise prohibited by law from possessing a bow or crossbow

(See Chapter 2.25 of the California Freshwater Sport Fishing Regulations).

Finally, here is a list of other small game species in season. Be sure to check state and local regulations for any restrictions/ limitations (<u>HTTPS://WWW.WILDLIFE.CA.GOV/REGULATIONS</u>).

Non-Game Animals including: English sparrow, starling, domestic pigeon (Columba livia), coyote, weasels, skunks, opossum, moles and rodents (excluding tree and flying squirrels, and those listed as furbearers, endangered or threatened species): All Year, No Limit, Statewide

Jackrabbit: All Year, No Limit, Statewide

Eurasian Collared Dove: All Year, No Limit, Statewide American Crow: December 2 – April 5, Limits Apply, Hunt Zone

my bow and followed the next pig as it passed behind some brush and when it came out into the lain I released my arrow. I heard the sound that an arrow makes upon contact and the pig squealed and took off disappearing into and under five thick juniper trees that grew very close together. I immediately started to do a low "woof". EW told that Vince DiMiceli had told him that after you bust a bunch of pigs you can call them back in by doing a low "woof". Well, Vince was correct because I called at least six pigs back and could have shot two of the six. One came in from behind me and was popping his teeth and woofing at the same time... a very interesting noise. He was only about 10 yards from me. Calling them back in was almost as big of a rush as getting the shot at my pig.

I noted the time and waited for about 20 minutes then I went to recover my arrow which I could not find. I was sure that I had gotten a complete pass-through, so I was disappointed in not being able to find my arrow... (I found it later, it was hiding in the five junipers about 15 feet away from me). I then decided to try and recover the pig, so I circled the five junipers to find where it came out. I found a blood trail and trailed it for about 40 yards and decided I would give it more time as I didn't want to push it, so I backtracked and looked for the rest of my partners. We sat down and had a bite to eat and after about an hour we took up the trail and we found him piled up in a bush. We did a bunch of high fives, hugging and took a bunch of pictures. I had my first ever Javelina!!! I was stoked to say the least, but I don't really know who was the most excited,... me, EW, Mary or Bob because there was no doubt that they were as excited about me getting my first javelina as I was. Those are the kind of hunting partners everyone needs.

Our last day was very slow for the first 6 hours. No pigs, did a lot of traveling, glassing and walking. As a last-ditch effort, we decided to return to the area where Bob got his shot on the second day. Bob, Mary and I did some walking and glassing while EW nursed his blistered heals and glassed from the comfort of his truck. Again, EW located some pigs only this time they were about two miles away. What Is Bow Hunter's Syndrome? WebMD

Do you get dizzy, feel vertigo, or notice tingling when you turn your head or neck a certain way? You could have bow hunter's syndrome, or rotational vertebral artery occlusion, as it's officially known. It takes its name from the way a hunter turns his head to aim a bow and arrow.

You might also hear this condition called:

- Cervical vertigo
- Cervical dizziness
- Cervicogenic vertigo
- Cervicogenic dizziness

And while these terms are used a lot, none is an officially recognized and diagnosed condition. What Causes It?

The most common cause is a bone spur on the vertebrae in your neck. These mostly result from wear and tear over time. When you move your head a certain way, it pinches the artery shut. You might get symptoms if you have a narrowed artery or poorly formed blood vessel in your neck.



2018 CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

- This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to offer the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Field tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event
- 2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be either a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
- 3. The 2nd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
- The range for this event shall be laid out in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
- 5. Archers shall use hunting tackle for this event which is in keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.
 - A. Scoring:
 - 1) Vital 10 Kill 8 Wound 5
 - An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "Pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
 - 3) "Bounce-ins and "Glance-offs" shall not score.
 - 4) "Antlers" do not score.
 - 5) Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
 - 6) Double scoring is required.
 - 7) This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.
 - B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:
 - 1) Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64): Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (ages 15-17): Male and Female
 - d) Youth (ages 12-14): Male and Female
 - 2) Styles
 - a) Sight (S)
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Release (R)
 - d) Recurve (Rc)e) Traditional (T)
 - C. Awards:
 - 1) CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
 - 2) Guest Class is one class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
 - 3) No awards will be mailed.
 - D. Tackle:
 - 1) One stabilizer not over 12 inches, allowed
 - 2) Bow quivers are allowed in all styles.
 - 3) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
 - 4) No compound bows over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no limit
 - 5) Binoculars are allowed. NO RANGE FINDERS!6) No range finding devices allowed at any time
 - on the range.
 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot expandable broadheads are allowed if they
 - meet Ca. Fish & Game Codes.

- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (7/8" minimum diameter)
- Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 12) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 13) Longbows: Must be shot off the shelf
- 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- E. Miscellaneous:
 - 1) Cubs: Due to safety considerations a Cub division will not be included at this event.
 - 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
 - All protests to the Protest Committee must be in writing within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the tournament and include a \$25.00 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
 - 4) There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
 - 5) Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament.
 - 6) No target or sight notes allowed (sight tapes ok)
 - No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will not be assisted.
 - No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours – except for tournament officials.
 - 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
 - 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
 - 11) NO cell phones, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or bow.
 - 12) Tournament officals will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
 - 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.




