

CALIFORNIA R3

The California Dept. of Fish & Wildlife is working to implement R3 program strategies to encourage more hunting in California. R3 refers to *recruit, retain* & *reactivate* hunters and anglers — future, present and past. This is a national issue, but as with a lot of things, in California, it is more pronounced.

Conservation is the practice of maintaining balance in nature. Nature on this world is a closed system of limited resources. If nature appears as a series of feast-famine sine waves, conservation management is the practice of leveling the extremes so that starvation is less likely.

Everything that lives will someday die and return its energy to the ecosystem. This is nature's way of transferring energy from one generation to the next. Everything that is alive needs some form of energy – food – to continue living.

Hunting is a tool to maintain the balance so that few of the ecosystem's inhabitants feels the pangs of hunger or thirst, or the stress of sharing their territories with another critter who keeps pushing the intraspecies boundaries. It is easy to adjust the amount of take harvested in order to maintain the relative balance and still fill some freezers.

Hunters are conservationists and work very hard to protect and enhance the environments that the wild critters like. Hunters follow the rules as to what is best for different species in different environments. Hunters are not poachers who care only for themselves – not the wildlife or their environments.

Natural does not necessarily mean pain-free. Starving is rarely pain-free. It may be caused by insufficient resources, suffering an injury that makes getting food difficult, such as locking antlers, disease, unfortunate encounters with vehicles, etc. There are a lot of ways to almost die that are lingering and "natural" (i.e. not directly caused by people) that would make death preferable to a life of hardship on way to becoming a scavenger's meal – whether dead or not quite. Legislative Information By Robert Moore

The next FGC meeting is April 17-18, 2019 in Santa Monica. No agenda has been posted at this writing but there should be a vote on mammal regs and bowhunting equipment change. FGC just press released information that the CEQA postings for Elk and Big Horn Sheep discussion will be continued till the next FGC meeting.

The next Wildlife Resources Committee will be held Thursday May 16th in Sacramento. No Agenda has been posted at this writing.

We have been fortunate that the current DFW executive management (Director & Deputy Directors) and current FGC commissioners are very responsive to fishers and hunters. The mid-year elections are over and there is a new Governor for California. The Governor could appoint a Director of Fish and Wildlife and several Deputy Director positions within DFW. All members of the Fish and Game Commission are appointed by the Governor and 2 positions are open. All appointments need confirmation from the Senate. One position has been filled on the FGC. Samantha Murray, of Del Mar, was appointed to the Commission in March 2019. Murray has been executive director of the master of advanced studies program in marine biodiversity and conservation at Scripps Institution of Oceanography since 2017 and principal at Samantha Murray Consulting since 2015. She was director of the water program at the Oregon Environmental Council from 2015 to 2016. She directed various programs at the Ocean Conservancy from 2007 to 2014, and was conservation director at the Golden Gate Audubon Society from 2005 to 2007. Murray was assistant director of conservation at the Audubon Society of Portland from 2004 to 2005 and a legal intern at the Columbia Inter-Tribal Fish Commission in 2003. She earned a Juris Doctor degree from Lewis & Clark Law School. Her term expires January 15, 2021.

DFW has approved the Recruitment, Retention and Reactivation (R3) overall plan. This is a collaborative effort between DFW and Conservation groups and indi-

viduals to increase hunters and fishers within the state. Micro plans are in discussion and formulated to be implemented for "on the ground" work. Mentoring new hunters and fishers to stay hunting and fishing will be paramount. Reduced hunter and fisher numbers directly relate to reduced monies to DFW at many levels and less conservation influence.

Habitat loss and degradation is a bigger threat to wildlife and hunting. This may be the primary influence by humans. As the population increases, there is a push for more human housing throughout California. Suitable land is a limited resource with many demands placed on it. The more that people take, whether for development or infrastructure, the less that is available for habitat and wildlife.

Agriculture is unique in that it may both be developed to support human needs and act as havens and transition areas for wildlife. Without our agricultural lands, many species that have been brought back from the brink would still be hovering there or worse.

There are a lot of animals that have found, through the generations, that it is easier to live near us. This is not always a mutually beneficial relationship. Nor is it without conflict. But it can be managed so that lethality is a last resort.

The most egregious and dangerous threat to our wildlife and our wilderness areas are from illegal marijuana grows. This is a threat not only to the wilderness and its inhabitants, but also to recreationists who are casually riding or hiking into the woods, our public lands, with their friends, kids or both.

Illegal marijuana grows are notorious for devastating the ecosystems in the areas radiating miles from where they exist. They are known to divert creeks and other water sources for their own use. This dries out the former homes of fish, frogs, newts and any other critter that depends on clean water close to their traditional homes. They use poisons that not only kill the rodents, but the animals up the food chain that eat the rodents or that eats them and so on. These are not pleasant deaths and they contaminate the ecosystem long term.

Additionally, this theft of our natural resources for illegal pot grows damage the environment and the wildlife and endanger the public. The public expects, and is entitled, to be able to enjoy their public lands without having to be concerned about booby traps or hazards created by lawbreakers.

Another cause for concern is legislation and possible actions by the powers-that-be that cripple the efforts of conservationists to use hunting as a very flexible tool for wildlife and ecosystem management. If the system becomes to difficult to navigate or tools of the hunt (guns, archery equipment, their paraphernalia, dogs, etc.) become so circumscribed that hunters will be scratching their heads trying to figure out how to legally use them or to travel with them from one site to the next (including their homes, shops, hunting locations, ranges, etc.) hunters will start looking elsewhere where the laws are more reasonable and comprehensible or will forgo hunting. If this happens, wildlife will suffer and the agencies responsible for their care and management will be impaired. Even in government, resources are limited.

The most intangible threat is the also the most difficult to confront. At some point it appears there has been a cultural shift that demonized hunting and hunters. There are many media savvy organizations that are doing everything they can to reward this belief, regardless of the consequences in the real world. This may be because some people mistakenly confuse hunters with poachers with no regard to the facts, data or the truth. Hunters are not poachers. Poachers are criminals with no regard for critters or ecosystems. Hunters are honorable stewards of wildlife and the environments they inhabit.

At one time game wardens and hunters worked more closely together to foster and protect wildlife and the environment. It almost seems like this was another world. The reality is that the world was very different 50+ years ago. There were fewer people and those that were here, lived closer to the land and had gardens, pets, livestock and they hunted and fished to supplement what they grew – plant or animal. The cycle of life and death was the life they lived every day.

Another insidious obstacle in today's world is the lure of the virtual, the digital, worlds where we can create and change the worlds on a whim. It is easy to get what you want by merely pushing a button or saying the word and having it delivered soon after. It is easy to create worlds or be waited on. This leads to the question: Is it real or is it illusion? Which world will people choose to live in? Continued on page 26



AND ACHIEVER DEDICATED TO ALL OF ARCHERY

Born in Modesto, California, Betty became involved in bowhunting and archery in 1949. Betty pursued the sport of archery, winning many state and local championships throughout California. One of the most prized achievements was the state championship she won in 1963 making her the first woman State Broadhead Champion.

Betty Walker's induction into the California Archery Hall of Fame was not judged for her early tournament skills alone.

During the time of competing in tournaments through the 1950s and 1960s, Betty made time for bowhunting big game and worked with the Cub and Boy Scouts. In the 1960s that involved her own three children, Scott, Mike and Patricia Walker, during their growing years. Betty unselfishly devoted her time to such groups, teaching the Cubs and Boy Scout troops archery. This also included top summer camps such as the Bob Mathias Boys and Girls Camp.

In 1957 Betty was the first woman to take a buck deer in California, and later in 1967 Betty's qualifications for acceptance into the California Big Game Club as the first woman regular member did not come lightly. She had to qualify by taking with a bow and arrow, four big-game species, with two of them being of record class, and she did this by taking with a bow and arrow, a 3x4 buck deer, bobcat, Catalina goat, wild boar and a wild turkey, all of which have been entered in the Record Books of the California Big Game Club. Betty is the only woman ever to make a "Grand Slam" on Catalina Island, by taking a record boar and Spanish goat on a single hunt.

Betty also has worked within the state organization, the California Bowman Hunters and State Archery Association, heading the Woman's Leaque of Bowhunters to the state capitol to fight for bowhunter rights and she was the CBH & SAA EDITOR FROM 1979 TO 1985.



es, it would involve writing another book, but I'm going to re-cap just some of her bowhunting happenings and favorite pictures. We were married in 1948, and Betty was always with me from the start of my getting involved with bowhunting. We waited five years before deciding to start our family and our first son, Scott, was born December 5, 1953. We figured he needed a brother or sister, so we didn't waste any time and the following year on December 29, 1954, Betty gave birth to our second son, Michael.

As the boys grew older, we wanted a girl. So in 1960 we picked the name "Pat" just in case, but we ended up with our girl and Patti Ann was a big part of the Walker bowhunting family.

Waiting five years to have children gave us the time to do a lot of things we wanted to do, and one of those things was bowhunting. Betty was with


me that first year, in 1949, when I took my first deer. Being a member of the California Bowman Hunters (CBH), we went to a lot of archery tournaments. We made a lot of friends and got involved with organized archery, namely the California Bowman Hunters and the National Field Archers Association. Betty enjoyed bowhunting and getting involved with bowhunting as much as I did. During those early years, I had her hunting big game with me and in 1957 she took her first deer, a nice 3x4 buck in Mariposa County. She was recognized by the California Bowman Hunters (CBH) as being the first lady bowhunter in California to take a deer with a bow and was presented with one of CBH's very first Buck Awards and also NFAA's Art Young Big Game Award.

When I was working for Fred Bear through the 1960s, we enjoyed going to Arizona and I'd plan my

trips to see dealers by making sure it was during the deer seasons. Our favorite place to hunt was the Kaibab Forest, and Betty took several deer on those hunts.

We did a lot of varmint calling in California, and while hunting the lower foothills of the Sierras in California, a large bobcat tried to sneak in on us and Betty got off one of her quick deadly shots and the cat didn't go but 20 yards, when it dropped dead.

Besides being the first lady bowhunter to take a deer with a bow and arrow in California, in 1957, Betty was the first lady bowhunter to take and record a record-class Catalina goat and wild boar. Natural Resources Management Act

- search-and recovery-missions.

In addition, the bill reauthorizes the Historically Black Colleges and Universities Historic Preservation Program and the National Cooperative Geologic Mapping Program.

2019 CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

- This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to offer the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Field tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event
- The State Broadhead Tournament shall be either a one or two day event.
- The 2nd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
- The range for this event shall be laid out in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
- Archers shall use hunting tackle for this event which is in keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.

A. Scoring:

- 1) Vital 10 Kill 8 Wound 5
- An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "Pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
- 3) "Bounce-ins and "Glance-offs" shall not score.
- 4) "Antlers" do not score.
- Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
- 6) Double scoring is required.
- 7) This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.

B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:

- 1) Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64): Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (ages 15-17): Male and Female
- d) Youth (ages 12-14): Male and Female
- 2) Styles
 - a) Sight (S)
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Release (R)
 - d) Recurve (Rc)
 - e) Traditional (T)

C. Awards:

- CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
- Guest Class is one class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
- 3) No awards will be mailed.
- Cubs and Peewees will not be shooting for awards but will receive a participation award.

D. Tackle:

- 2 stabilizer bars in total, no single bar over 12".
 A quivalizer is not considered a stabilizer.
- 2) Bow quivers are allowed in all styles.
- 3) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
- No compound bows over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no limit
- Binoculars are allowed. NO RANGE FINDERS!
- 6) No range finding devices allowed at any time on the range.
- Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot –

- expandable broadheads are allowed if they meet Ca. Fish & Game Codes. Expandable broadheads must open and not be altered to stay closed.
- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (7/8" minimum diameter)
- Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 12) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 13) Longbows: Must be shot off the shelf
- 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.

E. Miscellaneous:

- Cubs & Peewees: For safety reasons Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only.
- Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
- All protests to the Protest Committee must be in writing within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the tournament and include a \$25.00 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
- There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
- Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament.
- 6) No target or sight notes allowed (sight tapes ok)
- No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will not be assisted.
- No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours – except for tournament officials.
- 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
- 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
- NO cell phones, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or bow.
- Tournament officals will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
- 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.


