Legislative Coordinator Report Robert Moore

The next Fish and Game Commission meeting will be held April 14 and 15 by webinar/teleconference. Agenda has not been posted at this writing

Next Wildlife Resources Committee meeting May 11th, no agenda has been posted at this writing.

The Governor's office has appointed Erika S. Zavaleta, 49, of Santa Cruz to replace resigned Commissioner Russell Burns. Ms. Zavaleta has been a Professor at the University of California, Santa Cruz in the Ecology and Evolutionary Biology Department since 2016, where she was a Professor in the Environmental Studies Department from 2003 to 2016. She held multiple positions at The Christensen Fund from 2005 to 2007, including Consultant and Program Specialist for Landscape Ecology. Zavaleta was a Postdoctoral Fellow at the University of California, Berkeley from 2001 to 2003. She is a Fellow of the California Academy of Sciences and the Ecological Society for America; a Howard Hughes Medical Institute Professor; a member of the Society for Conservation Biology and the International Union for Conservation of Nature's Connectivity Conservation Specialist Group and

Invasive Species Specialist Group; an advisory board member at the Wildlife Conservation Society – Climate Adaptation Fund; and Associate Editor at Elementa. Zavaleta earned a Doctor of Philosophy degree in biological sciences and a Master of Arts degree in anthropology from Stanford University.

Ms. Zavaleta must be confirmed by the Senate in the next 12 months. In the meantime, she will have all the voting rights and privileges of a seated Commissioner. Governor Newsom also reappointed Jacque Hostler-Carmesin and Samantha Murray to this seats on the Commission.

Legislative information: You can follow current legislation at <u>http://leginfo.legislature.ca.gov/</u> **SB252** Weiner, Ban Bear Hunting, as written this bill would ban all bear hunting in the state. Update: This bill has been "gut and amended" and is now about animal testing.

AB 564 (Gonzalez) – Biodiversity Protection and Restoration Act. AB 564 by Assembly Member would establish the Biodiversity Protection and Restoration Act and require all state agencies, boards, and commissions to consider and prioritize the protection of biodiversity in carrying out their statutory mandates. The bill would require strategies related to the goal of the state to conserve at least 30% of California's land and coastal waters by 2030 to be made available to the public and provided to certain legislative committees by no later than June 30, 2022. In October 2020, following the defeat of AB 3030, Governor Newsom signed Executive Order N-82-20 (EO N-82-20) which establishes a goal of the state to conserve at least 30 percent of California's land and coastal waters by 2030. EO N-82-20 expressly states the need for lands protected under the directive to "support our outdoor heritage" and pledges "to expand equitable outdoor access and recreation for all Californians", and that state agencies shall collaborate with, among others, "outdoor recreation and access groups and fishing and hunting organizations" in achieving these goals. Further, EO N-82-20 also addresses to establish a baseline assessment of California's biodiversity. Fast forward to today and the California is now preparing to begin implementation of EO N-82-20 via the CNRA led stakeholder engagement process called for in Governor's EO, which will conclude with a final report to state leadership in February 2022. To further ensure that hunters and anglers are fully at the table and our concerns are recognized during this process, conservation groups have submitted a second statement to CNRA leadership which reaffirms the commitment to work with agencies and other stakeholders to ensure the proper design and implementation of the EO, and which reiterates that this process must fully recognize the lead role hunters and anglers play in conservation and embrace maximum Continued on page 6

Legislative Report from page 5 - access and hunting and fishing opportunity on lands and waters protected via this process. According to the author's office, the intent of AB 564 is to codify the biodiversity protection provisions of EO N-82-20 by requiring that all state agencies, boards, and commissions utilize their authority in advancement of the purposes and goals laid out in the executive order. While Section 2 of EO N-82-20 directs the CNRA and others to develop a report on strategies to conserve at least 30 percent of California's land and coastal waters by 2030, AB 564 would also provide additional accountability by requiring this report to be submitted to the Assembly Committee on Water, Parks and Wildlife and the Senate Committee on Natural Resources no later than June 30, 2022. It remains to be seen if AB 564 will be amended in the future to take steps that go above and beyond what is called out in EO N-82-20. Update: AB 564 has been referred to the Assembly Accountability and Administrative Review where it must be heard and passed out to Fiscal Committee by April 30th to meet deadline. AB 564 has not yet been set for hearing at this writing. AB 614 Aguiar-Curry. Wildlife habitat: birds. This bill would raise by \$5 the upland game bird hunting validation and the state duck hunting validation fees, as specified, with that \$5 to be deposited, and available upon appropriation to the department for the Nesting Bird Habitat Incentive Program, in the Nesting Bird Habitat Incentive Program Account, which the bill would create in the Fish and Game Preservation Fund. This bill instead would require the Upland Game Bird Account advisory committee to annually review and provide comments to the department on all proposed projects and other expenditures funded from the Upland Game Bird Account to help ensure that specified requirements pertaining to the Upland Game Bird Account have been met and require the department to post budget information and a brief description on its internet website for all projects and other expenditures funded from the Upland Game Bird Account. Update: AB 614 is set to be heard in the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee on Thursday, April 8th.

AB 645 (Gallagher) – Fish and Wildlife: Poaching Violations – Probation.

Laws which significantly increased fines for possessing more than three times the daily bag limit and for the illegal take of wildlife for profit or personal gain which increased penalties for the illegal take of trophy-class animals took a step back last year when the State Legislature passed legislation that reduced maximum probation from three years to one year for all misdemeanor violations whose provisions do not call out a specific probation length. Because current law does not specify maximum probation periods for any poaching crimes, the effect of this legislation was to limit probation for even the most serious misdemeanor poaching violations to one year. Said differently, prior to passage of last year's legislation, a judge could sentence individuals convicted of serious poaching crimes to probation that would prohibit them from hunting for up to three years. The option of a longer probationary period also helped to ensure that penalty assessments could be collected. To address this serious concern, this bill as amended March 11, 2021, would reinstate a maximum 3-year probation for the following serious violations of the Fish and Game Code:

• §12012 – The illegal take of wildlife for profit or personal gain

• §12013 – The illegal take or possession in the field of more than three times the daily bag limit

• §12013.3 – The illegal take of trophy deer, elk, antelope, bighorn sheep or wild turkey

• §12002.3(b) - The illegal sale purchase of abalone AB 645 is set to be heard in the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee on Thursday, April 8th. **AB 804** Megan, Dahle. Free hunting days. Existing law authorizes the Director of Fish and Wildlife to establish 2 free hunting days per year: one in the fall, and one in the winter Existing law authorizes a California unlicensed resident to hunt during a free hunting day if accompanied by a licensed hunter, subject to certain conditions.

Existing law prohibits these provisions from being implemented until the Department of Fish and Wildlife's Automated License Data System is fully operational for at least one year. This bill would require, rather than authorize, the director to establish 2 free hunting days per year, one in the fall and one in the spring, no later than July 1, 2022. The bill would delete the prohibition requiring a delay in implementation of the above-described provisions. Update: AB 804 is set to be heard in the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee on Thursday, April 8th.

AB 1223 (Levine) – Firearms and Ammunition: Excise Tax AB 1223 by Assembly Member Marc Levine (D/ 10-San Rafael) would, until January 1, 2028, impose an excise tax in the amount of \$25 per firearm on sale of any new handgun, semiautomatic rifle or shotgun, and a "yet to be determined" percentage excise tax on the sale of all ammunition. AB 1223 would require that revenues collected be deposited in the California Violence Intervention and Prevention (CalVIP) Firearm and Ammunition Tax Fund, which the bill would also create.

AB 1223 would continuously appropriate moneys in that Fund to the Board of State and Community Corrections to fund CalVIP programs which remediate the effects the illegal use of firearms has in our state. AB 1223 is highly similar to AB 18, legislation also introduced by Assembly Member Levine in 2019 that failed passage.

Legislative Report from page 5 Implementing successful programs for addressing gun violence is something that all Californians support and would benefit from. As such, all of California should equally help to fund their implementation. However, under AB 1223, CalVIP programs would only be funded by law-abiding citizens who legally purchase firearms and ammunition. Because AB 1223 would result in a taxpayer paying a higher tax, the bill requires approval of 2/3 of the membership of each house of the Legislature. Update: AB 1223 is set to be heard in the Assembly Public Safety Committee on April 6th.

SB 370 Dodd, Wildlife: Big Game Management Account: uses. Existing law establishes the Big Game Management Account within the Fish and Game Preservation Fund. Existing law requires revenue from the sale of tags for antelope, elk, deer, wild pig, bear, and sheep to be deposited in the account, except as provided. Existing law requires funds deposited in the account to be expended, upon appropriation by the Legislature, by the Department of Fish and Wildlife, solely for specified purposes and pursuant to specified limitations. Existing law authorizes the department to make grants to, reimburse, or enter into contracts or other agreements with nonprofit organizations for the use of the funds from the account to carry out those purposes, including related habitat conservation projects. This bill instead would authorize the department to make grants to, reimburse, or enter into contracts or other agreements with public and private entities, including nonprofit organizations, and federally recognized Indian tribes for the use of the funds from the account to carry out those purposes. Update: SB 370 has been referred to the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee with a hearing set for April 15th.

SB 470 Jones, Fishing and hunting: annual combined hunting and fishing licenses.

This bill would create the annual combined hunting and fishing license that would grant the holder of the license the same privileges as the annual hunting and fishing licenses and that would be valid for a term of one year from the date specified on the license. The bill would limit the issuance of these licenses to residents and would require the department to issue these licenses beginning January 1, 2023, upon payment of a fee of \$100, as adjusted annually for inflation. The bill would require the Fish and Game Commission to adjust the amount of the fee to fully recover, but not exceed, all reasonable administrative and implementation costs of the department and the commission relating to these licenses. The bill would require the department to provide an applicant for one of these licenses the option to automatically renew the license and would provide a 5% discount if the applicant selects this option. Update: SB 470 has been referred to the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee with a hearing on April 15th.

CDFW Seeks Artists to Enter Annual California Duck Stamp Art Contest

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) invites artists to submit their original artwork to the 2021-2022 California Duck Stamp Art Contest. Submissions will be accepted April 26 through June 4.

The artwork must depict the species selected by the California Fish and Game Commission, which for the 2021-2022 hunting season is the gadwall. These common dabbling ducks are similar in size and shape to a mallard, with both males and females donning somewhat muted coloring. Despite lacking the bright colors typical of other male ducks, male gadwalls exhibit intricate feather patterns with subtle yet striking color variations of brown and gray ending in a black patch at the tail.

The winning artwork will be reproduced on the 2021-2022 California Duck Stamp. The top submissions are traditionally showcased at the Pacific Flyway Decoy Association's art show in July, but this year's show status is pending due to COVID-19.

The design is to be in full color and in the medium (or combination of mediums) of the artist's choosing, except that no photographic process, digital art, metallic paints or fluorescent paints may be used in the finished

design. Photographs, computer-generated art, art produced from a computer printer or other computer/mechanical output device (air brush method excepted) are not eligible for entry and will be disqualified. The design must be the contestant's original hand-drawn creation. The entry design may not be copied or duplicated from previously published art, including photographs, or from images in any format published on the Internet.

The contest is open to U.S. residents 18 years of age or older as of March 8, 2021. Entrants need not reside in California. All entries must be accompanied by a completed participation agreement and entry form. These forms and the official rules are available online at wildlife.ca.gov/duck-stamp/contest.

Entries will be judged in June. The judges' panel, which will consist of experts in the fields of ornithology, conservation, and art and printing, will choose first, second and third-place winners, as well as honorable mention.

Since 1971, CDFW's annual contest has attracted top wildlife artists from around the country. All proceeds generated from stamp sales go directly to waterfowl conservation projects throughout California. In past years, hunters were required to purchase and affix the stamp to their hunting license. Now California has moved to an automated licensing system and hunters are no longer required to carry the physical stamps in the field (proof of purchase prints directly onto the license). However, CDFW will still produce the stamps, which can be requested by interested individuals at wildlife.ca.gov/licensing/collectorstamps.

Archers Display Skill, Good Sportsmanship

GALT. The Lodi and Stacktan clubs were successful in the CLRA, rabbit drive here today with a total of 12 kkils reported. The drive was held on the Valreson Ranch and a very commendable landowner-hunter relationship resulted through the good sportsmanship of the archers. The tancher, Mr. Valenson, was of the verbal opinion that even though the weapons employed were highby dangerous he had little to fear concerning killed and wounded stock.

Through the cooperation of such man as Valenson and the conscientions conduct of this type howmen the relationship between farmers and hunters is daily developing more and more hunting areas that otherwise would remain closed.

A 20 minute archery demonstration was put on by Tom Fields for the benefit of the rancher and like most non-archers Mr. Valenson was highly impressed.

Especially when Fields bere down and knocked over two rabbits in the course of the demonstration.

Ingredients:

- 6 Eggs
- 2 Tablespoons Milk
- 5 oz Wild Smoked Salmon
- 1/4 Cup, chopped dill
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 bunch asparagus, chopped
- 3 oz prosciutto, roughly chopped

Directions: 1. Preheat oven to 350° 2. In a medium-large bowl whisk eggs, milk, salt, and pepper. 3. Fold in salmon, and dill. 4. In a 10-inch cast-iron skillet heat 1 Tablespoon of butter. Sauté asparagus pieces for 5 minutes. Asparagus should be tender and have slight bite. 5. Pour egg mixture in the cast-iron skillet and top with prosciutto. 6. Bake at 350° for 15-20 minutes or until egg is set. 7. Let cool to room temperature before slicing. Notes: Trim the woody ends of the asparagus off. Then cut asparagus into 2-inch pieces. • All ovens cook differently. 15-20 minutes at 350° is recommended but you may need to adjust cooking time for your oven.





CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

- This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to offer the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Field tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event
- The State Broadhead Tournament shall be either a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
- The 2rd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
- The range for this event shall be laid out in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
- Archers shall use hunting tackle for this event which is in keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.
 - A. Scoring:
 - Vital 10 Kill 8 Wound 5
 - An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "Pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
 - 3) "Bounce-ins and "Glance-offs" shall not score.
 - 4) "Antiers" do not score.
 - Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
 - Double scoring is required.
 - This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.
 - B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:
 - Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64): Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (ages 15-17): Male and Female
 - d) Youth (ages 12-14): Male and Female
 - Styles
 - a) Sight (S)
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Release (R)
 - d) Recurve (Rc)
 e) Traditional (T)
 - C. Awards:
 - CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
 - 2) Guest Class is one class (Male and Female
 - combined) and there will be no awards. 3) No awards will be mailed.
 - 4) Cubs and PeeWees Participation Award Only
 - D. Tackle:
 - One stabilizer not over 12 inches, allowed. A Quivalizer is not considered a stabilizer
 - Bow quivers are allowed in all styles.
 - No magnifying scopes are allowed.
 - No compound bows over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no limit
 - Binoculars are allowed No range finding binoculars allowed even with the battery removed NO RANGE FINDERS Period !
 - Broadheads must be duiled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot – expandable broadheads are allowed if they meet Ca. Fish & Game Codes.

- Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (7/8" minimum diameter)
- Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- All bows shall be limited to 300 tps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 11) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 12) Longbows: Must be shot off the shelf
- 13) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- E. Miscellaneous:
 - 1) Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only
 - Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
 - All protests to the Protest Committee must be in writing within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the tournament each day and include a \$25.00 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
 - There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
 - Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament. Cubs and Peewees will not be allowed to shoot in top flight groups. NO EXCEPTIONS
 - 6) No target or sight notes allowed (sight tapes ok)
 - No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will not be assisted.
 - No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours – except for tournament officials.
 - Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
 - 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
 - NO cell phones, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or bow.
 - Tournament officals will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
 - Unsportsmanike conduct can result in disqualification.




