President's Message by Wayne Raupe

This is what happened last month so all of you that got the electronic version of the Magazine received the un-proofed issue first. Subsequent to that, Pam, CBH/SAA Secretary, received the CORRECTED version and sent it out to you so you received to Magazine links from her but only the second one is the corrected one. Those of you that received the hard copy, via snail mail, received the corrected version as we sent an urgent "STOP THE PRESS" order then got the correct version to them so all was well with the snail mail version. As we all know "stuff" happens and we got it corrected and we will do our best to make sure that this doesn't happen again. We apologize for any inconvenience and hope this didn't negatively impact any of you or the clubs.

On to some bad news... and then some good news. First the BAD news... Some of us just learned, in the last couple of weeks, that the CA Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) had another strong and influential advocate for California's wildlife, habitat, hunting, fishing and Hunter Education retire about a month ago. Yep, lots of us were left out of the loop as Roy Griffith, Assistant Chief Law Enforcement, retired. Most of you might remember him as Captain Roy Griffith and that he was in charge of the Hunter Education Program. It was quite a surprise to me as well as I had talked with him in December at the Department of Fish and Game (DFG) Commission Meeting in San Diego and he said nothing to me about his retirement. He will be missed by all of us who knew him, worked with him and relied upon his experience, knowledge and professionalism. So now for the "GOOD" news... well Roy Griffith is still in the mix and we will be seeing and working with him on the same kind of issues except he will be on the outside of the DFW. He is now employed by the California Rifle and Pistol Association (CRPA) advocating for the preservation of firearm ownership, hunting and proper management of California's fish and wildlife. He will be a huge asset to them and us. It



will be a pleasure to work with him in his new capacity and there will be many occasions to work side by side as issues of the CRPA are ultimately the issues of CBH/SAA. Enjoy your retirement Roy... er... well retirement... not so much. Enjoy your new adventure "Captain Roy".

California archers are under attack again by the extreme liberal left that thinks the only way we can be protected is for them to take our protection away from us and allow the California government to protect us. We will no longer have the ability or choice to protect our property, our families or ourselves from the criminals that are NOT disarmed! In this round we are being attacked by **Lt. Governor, Gavin "I Want to Be Governor" Newsom**. He is pushing his gun control initiative, coined the "*Safety for All Act of 2016*", through the initiative process so he can make a name for himself by getting his initiative on California's November 2016 Ballot. He thinks by doing this it will give him an edge on becoming the next governor of CA. He knows that most likely, that sending it through the legislative process where the legislators and the Governor would have to give it their blessing, it would die. So he is doing his best to get it on the ballot so that the "uninformed", ill-informed" and the anti-gun zealots who don't understand and hate the Second Amendment, can vote on it. Interestingly enough Mr. "**I Want to Be Governor**" is not willing to give up his guns nor take away the guns of his security squad. He and his family, just like the wealthy and other government officials and their families, will have their full complement of guns and ammunition as will their armed security. Yet they will leave the law-abiding-citizens of California defenseless and vulnerable to armed criminals and an armed government.

I know right now some of you are saying ***“What does this have to do with me and my archery equipment? I thought you said at the beginning of this that California ARCHERS are under attack”?*** You ask ***“How does this affect me because I don’t shoot or own a gun”?***

Let me remind you that all of us who shoot some sort of weapon; for pleasure, for completion, for hunting or if we trap and fish or if we are falconers, or if we are some other kind of consumptive user of our public lands and wildlife... we are threatened. You have to realize that all outdoors organizations are siblings of the same family. If one sibling is attacked and falls that means we as a family are weaker and more vulnerable to losing another sibling to attack and if that continues, sooner or later we will have no family. We will be standing alone or should I say we will be on our knees and we will have no freedoms or rights.

Very few of you have had the opportunity to stand in front of a government agency, senators or representatives and debate and fight for our rights. But many of us have. We haven’t done it alone and we haven’t done it just once or twice. We have done it many times as we try to protect ourselves and our siblings. With unity we are strong... as a family unit we are strong and that is our only chance of survival. In the fray at the state capital and up and down the state we have stood side by side with our siblings from all reaches to fight to protect everything we have today. Sadly, we have had a couple of siblings wounded but as a family we continue to stand with them. Let me be clear, the gun folks are much stronger than almost any other sibling in the family. They have stood and fought in front of us, at our sides and behind us providing their support and power while we were fighting our battles. If they fall the rest of us will be in peril.

Here is what Mr. **“I Want to Be Governor”** is pushing upon us and this is what his initiative would do... just so you know. Don’t take any of it lightly as it will disarm all law-abiding-gun owners in California without taking one gun. It will be done by removing access to ammunition and it will automatically make felons of many of you and fellow law-abiding-citizens from many different

angles if this gets passed into law. Here you go.... Read it and get angry!

- *Ban all on-line and mail order sales of ammunition;
- *Require all who purchase ammo to apply for a “Firearms Purchaser Certificate”;
- *The certificate would cost \$50, and would take about 30 days to receive it;
- *The certificate has to be renewed every two years;
- *A background check would be conducted on you at every purchase of ammunition;
- *All ammo purchases would be registered to you by serial the #'s stamped on each round of ammo and tracked by the CA DOJ;
- *Require everyone who sells more than 500 rounds of ammo in a 12 month period to register with the CA DOJ;
- *Ban possession of, and confiscate all lawfully purchased magazines capable of holding more than 10 rounds of ammunition regardless of when you purchased it/them;
- *Ban all private transfer of ammunition which includes any and all friends and family members, even your underage children when at the shooting range or in the field hunting or target practicing;
- *Prohibit you from bring any and all ammunition into California that you obtained out of state;
- *Prohibit you from bring unused ammo home that you purchased at a shooting range;

As an organization we MUST defend against this attack! You as a law-abiding-citizen must inform everyone you know to vote against this initiative **“when”** it gets on the ballot and it will as millions of dollars are being dumped into Mr. **“I Want to Be Governor”** lying campaign. All of us have to be involved in this fight. I ask that you get involved spread the word... **this isn’t a Democrat or a Republican thing...** this is an attack on you and the constitution and will negatively impact all citizens of California.

Until next time... be safe, shoot as often as you can & enjoy this sport. Always remember, no matter what kind of stick you shoot or bow you bend, we must stand with our siblings and remain one united and strong FAMILY... or we fall!

The gobbler was in full strut, feathers puffed up, his beard was sticking out of his chest and looked like a rope. We decided to make the stalk and started our approach, keeping cover between us and the birds. When we had closed the distance to about 50 yards of the birds, EW told me to continue the stalk on my own to the last piece of cover. The cover was somewhat sparse so I was hoping that my Human Energy Concealment System (H.E.C.S.) suit was going to do its job and keep me concealed. When I reached that last bit of cover I moved to the left side of it (I'm a lefty) just enough to give my bow clearance for drawing and shooting. As I moved the gobbler looked my way and alerted but then settled back into strutting and showing off for his lady friends. The H.E.C.S. suit apparently did its job as the gobbler acted like I was a non-threatening object. I ranged the gobbler and it was 35 yards from me, a distance that I had shot many times over the last couple of months at the Oranco Bowman Archery Range. I drew the bow with confidence when the gobbler tuned away from me then I bracketed his vitals with my 30 and 40 yard pins when he turned broadside. I applied pressure to the trigger of my release. The V1 Victory arrow tipped with a three blade, 75 gr WacEm broadhead hit the bird perfectly. I turned with eyes wide and arms waiving to look at EW and I quietly but excitedly yelled... "Did you see that shot?!!" EW was beaming with pride and excitement as this was my second turkey with a bow but this was my FIRST LONG BEARD and potential a CBH/SAA Big Game Club (BGC) Record Book Bird. I focused my attention back on the gobbler and started tracking him and I found him piled up 25 yards from where he was when I shot him. EW looked at his watch and said... "It's only 7:30am!!!" Then he gave me a hi-five, some hugs and congratulations on making an awesome stalk and for keeping my cool all the way through to the end of the shot. We took a moment to honor the bird and thank God for the opportunity of taking this beautiful bird... THEN THE PHOTO SHOOT STARTED!!!!

EW contacted Bret Scott, an Official Measurer for the CBH/SAA BGC, Pope & Young, and the Boon and Crockett Club, and asked him if he would measure my gobbler. Bret said he would and would meet us in Riverside at the Trophy Room Taxidermy shop, where I am having owner, Keith Hopkins, mount this beautiful bird for me.

The final numbers are: Beard 9 - 10/16 inches + right spur 14/16 inches + left spur 14/16 inches with a total score = 116/16 inches and my gobbler ranks #104 in the book!!

I am one HAPPY bowhunter!!!

Legislative Information

The next Fish and Game Commission (FGC) meeting will be April 13 and 14th in Santa Rosa. Agenda items of interest, 26. Adopt proposed changes to mammal hunting regulations (Section 265, et al., Title 14, CCR)

27. Waterfowl hunting (B) Adopt proposed changes to regulations (Sections 502 and 507, Title 14, CCR) 28. Request for authorization to publish notice of intent to amend upland game bird regulations (Section 300, et al., Title 14, CCR), require broadheads for the take of turkey. I. Presentation by the California Trappers Association concerning petition to reconsider bobcat trapping regulations (B) Action on non-regulatory requests received at previous meetings (C) Other 33. Receive Department presentation concerning the Conservation Plan for Gray Wolves in California.

The next Wildlife Resources meeting was to be held May 18th in Sacramento. 1. Approve agenda and order of items 2. Public forum for items not on agenda 3. Discuss and approve recommendations for 2017 sport fish regulations (Sections 1.45, et al.) 4. Identify and discuss initial recommendations for 2017-2018 regulations:

(A) Mammal hunting (Sections 360, et al.) (B) Waterfowl hunting (Section 502) (C) Klamath River sport fishing (Sections 7.50, et al.) 5. Discuss and approve recommendations for enhanced penalties for the illegal take of game regulations 6. Discuss wild pig management 7. Predator Policy Workgroup (A) Workgroup update

(B) Discuss and approve recommendation for proposed work plan 8. Future agenda items (A) Review work plan agenda topics and timeline (B) Potential new agenda topics for FGC consideration.

The DFW Big Game Fund advisory committee met 4/28 to review project proposals totaling 1.3 million for grants out of the account. The Upland Bird fund advisory account meets 5/19.

The 2016 Legislative Cycle began in January. Bills submitted last year that was granted 2 years to complete will have action or defeated. New bills can also be introduced but must be completed this year.

Bills to watch: and current positions.

AB499 Cooley, amend Fish and Game Code 4370, archery season in regards to Concealed firearms permit holders. To meet legislative deadline, AB 499 must be heard in Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee by April 22nd.

AB665 Frazier, amend Fish and Game Code 203.1 and add sections 200.5 & 200.6, clarifies authority to Fish and Game Commission on Hunting and Fishing, Appropriations Committee

AB1192 Wood, Elk tags for Indian tribes, appropriations committee.

SB1191 Berryhill DFW wildlife management plans, Senate Natural Resources committee

CBHSAA lobbyist, Bill Gaines through his special reports will keep us informed on the above bills and any that may be modified later. His Special Reports will be posted on the CBHSAA website under legislative link and distributed to legislative reps that I have email addresses for.

Student Archers in CDFW State Competition Rack up the Scores

The California National Archery in the Schools Program (CalNASP), hosted by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), has concluded its sixth annual Virtual State Archery Tournament and the students wrapped up the season with some impressive scores.

“We would like to congratulate all of the students that participated in this year’s Virtual State Archery Tournament and we would especially like to commend the top boy and girl shooter of the tournament,” said Lesa Johnston, CDFW CalNASP Coordinator. “These young archers took their training very seriously and worked hard throughout the school year to develop the skill it takes to be precise and consistent in a competition.”

Manly Arvizo, a 12th grader at Sultana High School in San Bernardino County came in as the top boy shooter and top overall shooter in the state competition with a score of 290 points out of a possible score of 300. Manly came in second in last year’s tournament. Manly is planning to enter the Marine Corps after graduation, so when he is not practicing archery, he focuses on physical fitness training. Manly is also a member of his school’s Outdoor Club and enjoys a variety of outdoor pursuits.

Melissa Osorio, an 11th grader from Kearny High School in San Diego County, is the top girl shooter for the second year in a row with a score of 284 out of a possible 300. Melissa also came in second place as overall shooter in the tournament. When Melissa is not practicing archery, she enjoys spending time with her friends, playing tennis or watching movies.

Both shooters will each receive a new Genesis Special Edition compound bow donated by the manufacturer to the schools. Their coaches will present the bows to them.

The Virtual State Archery Tournament is designed to give students the opportunity to challenge their mastery of the sport in a supportive environment in which they can compete with other students statewide without traveling. Students compete at their own school either in a gymnasium or an outdoor range and their scores are posted in a national database that not only ranks the state scores, but also provides coaches with national rankings to report to students. The state tournament is a qualifier for the national tournament, which will be held in Kentucky this May.

Honorable mentions were given to: James Bui, ninth grader from Sultana High School, rank two as the overall boy shooter and third overall state shooter; Selena Schmidt, 10th grader from Sultana High School, second place overall girl shooter and fourth overall state shooter; Lilly Bell, 12th grader from Sultana High School, tied for second place overall girl shooter and fourth overall state shooter; Patrick Allain, 12th grader from Calaveras High School in northern California, third overall boy shooter and number five shooter in the overall state ranking.

Archery is a sport that can be enjoyed by students of all abilities and sizes – it can be enjoyed outdoors and encourages students to lead a more active lifestyle. Broiled Tilapia with Horseradish and Herb-Spiked Mayo

- ✓ 1 lemon
- ✓ 4 (6-ounce) Tilapia fillets
- ✓ Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- ✓ 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- ✓ 1/3 cup light mayonnaise
- ✓ 2 teaspoons prepared horseradish, or more to taste
- ✓ 2 tablespoons chopped fresh chives
- ✓ 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley leaves

Directions

Preheat the broiler. Coat a large baking sheet with cooking spray.

Finely grate 1 teaspoon of zest from the lemon and set aside. Squeeze the juice from the lemon over both sides of the fish. Season both sides of the fish with salt and pepper, to taste, and the garlic powder. Place the fish on the prepared baking sheet and broil until fork-tender, about 3 minutes per side.

Meanwhile, in a medium bowl, combine the mayonnaise, lemon zest, horseradish, chives, and parsley. Serve the fish with the mayonnaise mixture spooned over the top.

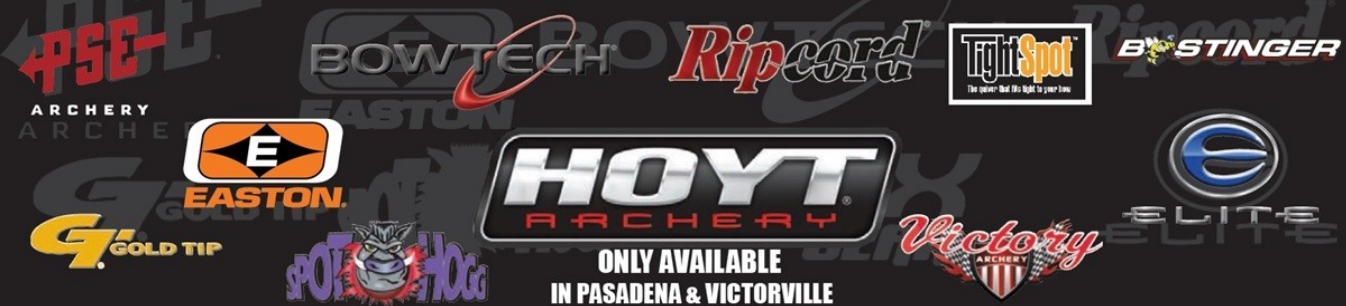

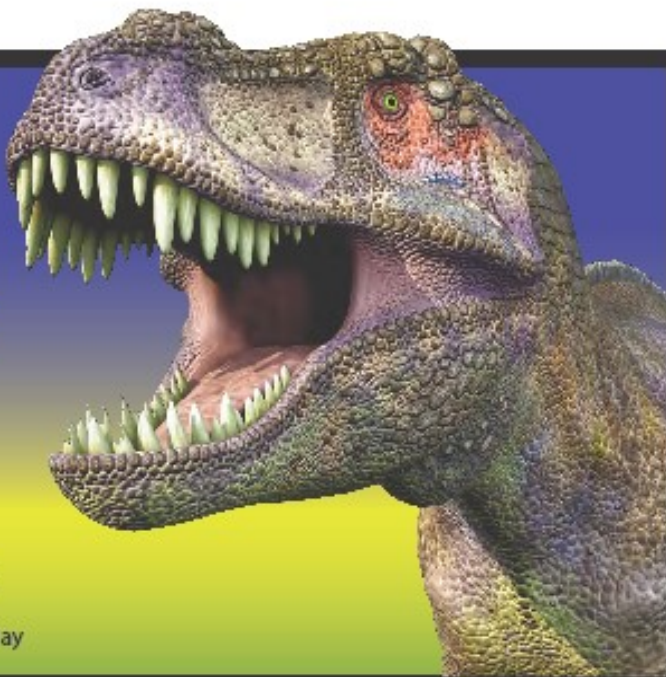
