Just a few quick notes. We have a couple of youth

outdoor events coming up in Southern California. Compton Hunt and Fish Club Youth event on June 29th and Safari Club Youth Safari at Raahauge's shooting enterprises on July 20th. I will need some volunteers for a long day for both events. Let me know if you can help out. Both of these events will be introducing youth to archery and hunting. Please also take note of the youth hunt being sponsored by Jason Duysings and our own Big Game Club. It's coming up in November and will be held at Tejon Ranch. More from Jason on that later.

Now for some of the distressing news. I attended the California Fish and Game commission meeting last week and was suitably disturbed. I have encouraged hunters to get involved and show up for these meetings on numerous occasions. They are always well attended by the anti-hunting community and this meeting was no exception. The Trump administration via the USFWS is looking at de-listing the wolf from the endangered/threatened status in the US and the Anti groups were having none of it. There was a line out the door to stand up at the open mic and voice their concern as well as



encourage the Commission to write a letter to the President and condemn his actions. Of course none of this is based on science and the best part is that the Gray Wolf is already fully protected in California at the state level. That's how ridiculous this has become. The bigger problem however is where this hysteria leads. We now have legislation at the state level in the form of an assembly bill that will outlaw Bobcat hunting entirely. Robert Moore will undoubtedly have an update on this extremely misguided legislation later in this newsletter. Bill Gaines of Gaines and Associates has been working diligently behind the scenes to try and water down this bill and get something that at least sunsets this law and gets the management of the species back to the DFW where it belongs. For now however we may be looking at 5 years of no Bobcat hunting. Many of you may say that you don't hunt Bobcats anyway and believe me most don't, but this is just a gateway to more and more restrictions.

A FGC meeting was held April 17-18, 2019 in Santa Monica. Agenda items of interest: 3. Committee assignments (A) Marine Resources Committee, Murry and Sklar, (B) Wildlife Resources Committee Burns and Sklar, (C) Tribal Committee, Jackie and Silva. CONSENT ITEMS 10. Archery equipment and crossbow Consider adopting proposed changes to archery equipment and crossbow regulations, including bow draw weight (minimum 30lbs and 125 for crossbows) and possession of a firearm while bow hunting (does not apply while deer hunting) (B) Legislative report, federal regulatory notices, and possible action I. Proposed delisting of gray wolf under the federal Endangered Species Act, commissioners drafted a letter to condemn the proposed delisting. 14. Wildlife Resources Committee Discuss and consider approving draft agenda topics for the next committee meeting. Consider approving new topics to address at a future committee meeting. All I can say is January 5th 2019, was a good day for me. Still working on my CBH/SAA Small Game Club, Golden Eagle Award, I took advantage of the day and drove out to the Old Walker Ranch in hopes of adding waterfowl to my species list.



Before I left home, I grabbed a couple of “flu-flu” arrows and put a broadhead on each one. FYI, a reminder to all of you that want to hunt waterfowl with a bow you must use flu-flu fletched arrows. There is one exception to this DFW Regulations but for the sake of remaining legal under all situations always use flu-flu arrows for shooting any waterfowl and or shooting any bird in flight or one in a tree where you will be shooting up.

When I got to the ranch, I grabbed my bow and headed over to the lake. I knew where I could get close to the water and get a close shot. Just as I got there a small flock of Ring-Neck Ducks landed and headed my way. I closed the deal on the beautiful drake at 17 yards, a pass through, then watched my arrow take a big skip out to the middle of the lake. As I sat there wondering how I was going to retrieve my arrow I heard some honking from the sky. I looked up and saw a flock of Canada Geese circling the trees getting ready to land. I nocked another arrow and waited and then they landed. In just a few minutes I had geese approaching my side of the lake. Only this time they were out about 20 yards. I loosed my arrow at a honker and watched my arrow connect perfectly, another pass through, then it skipped off the water and joined my other arrow in the middle of the lake. My arrows are still in the lake, but it was a **GREAT** day!!!

CBH Tilapia Shoot 2019

On April 6th &7th, 2019, I participated in the annual, California Bowman Hunters/Small Game Club, ‘Tilapia Shoot’ at PaloVerde, California. Palo Verde, is a small town about twenty miles south of Blythe, California, which is also a small town, on the edge on the California/ Arizona boarder. It’s primarily a farming community that depends on the Colorado River for the water to irrigate their fields. It’s this warm swallow water running off from the river where the Tilapia and Carp make their homes. Both species are invasive to the United States and therefore can be taken with a bow, unlike game fish, which cannot.

I’ve participated in this tournament many times, but not in several years, and the water flow has changed a great deal since the last time I was there. What has not changed is the scenery, its flat farmland in the desert and the sun beats down on you all day as you stand on the banks of backwater estuaries or irrigation canals, or on the deck of your boat or kayak, if you’re lucky enough to have one. This year it was only in the low nineties which was much better than the typical hundred degrees.

While this is a tournament aimed at getting the largest Tilapia there is a side event for the largest Carp. This year I think I saw one, maybe two, Tilapia but was never close enough to get a shot. Continued on page 10

Hunt of a Lifetime

On April 13 & 14, 2019, I competed in the 18th 'Traditional Bowhunters of California,' "Hunt of a Lifetime" charity shoot for seriously ill children. The shoot is held at the Chamberlin Ranch located in Los Olivos, California, about ten miles from Solvang. Chamberlin Ranch is a huge ranch composed of rolling hills and ancient oak trees. It's a really pretty place especially this time of year.

This years competition hosted four hundred and twenty-nine registered shooters using traditional archery equipment, recurve, long bow, and primitive bows shot off of the shelf or hand. There were classes for wood or carbon/aluminum arrows in the long bow classes. Many tournaments only allow wood arrows for long bow shooters, which I think is a big mistake, by the organizations hosting those events. There were many more shooters (almost double) at this event shooting carbon/aluminum than wood, just imagine how many shooters don't attend those other organizations shoots due to their wood only restrictions. It's costing them a lot of competitors and a ton of revenue.

I arrived on Thursday to set up my camp as I know that it can get very crowded as the weekend approaches and I have learned from past experience that if you want to get a good spot you gotta get there early. I camped in the

same location as last year in close proximity to many of my old friends and some new ones. It was very windy on Thursday and Friday but on Saturday and Sunday the wind calmed and the weather was a very mild 70's by midday, it couldn't have been nicer. Food is available for purchase at the range on Saturday and Sunday and on Saturday night there is a great dinner for purchase. This year is was half a Bar-B-Que chicken, salad, beans, dinner roll, cookie and drink, all for \$10.00.

The shoot consists of three courses A,B & C. with fifteen 3-D targets on each course. Two courses are to be shot on Saturday and one on Sunday with the scores cards to be turned in by noon on Sunday. The start time is nine on Saturday and whenever your squad agrees to start on Sunday. It's a two arrow shoot scoring 10,8,5 with multiple targets at most stations. Two mulligans and two doe tags were available for purchase at a dollar each, another revenue maker that some clubs don't take advantage of. There were some timed stations and other novelty targets, including pop-ups and moving targets which score double points. I'm guessing a little over one thousand points is possible, but highly unlikely, I'd like to meet the archer who could do it and take some lessons.

This shoot is probably one of the most highly attended traditional only shoots in the nation and certainly California. This year, after expenses, they earned about \$10,000 dollars for the charity. This is an event you have to attend if pull a stick with a string.





San Francisco Archers Traditional Rendezvous 2019

On March 30 & 31, 2019, I drove up to Pacifica, California to participate in the 'San Francisco Archers' annual 'Traditional Rendezvous'. Pacifica is a short distance south of San Francisco but the range is part of the City of San Francisco's park system. The range is located in a beautiful and lush coastal rainforest where barely any sunlight makes it to the ground. Wildlife is abundant in the area and the critters in the area have become habituated to people and barely pay any mind to human activity. The rabbits, squirrels, and turkeys that I saw could not have cared less about our presence. The weather was nice in the high 60's low 70's during the day and we were blessed with no rain.

The tournament was a one day shoot conducted on Sunday the 31st and about 125 archers were in attendance. It was a forty target, two arrow shoot, scoring 10, 8, 5. There were four novelty type targets in-

corporated into the shoot. Timed pop ups, bobbing frogs, running pig, and steel deer. The furthest target may have been a little over fifty yards and the target placement was great. My only complaint was that the course was difficult to follow and would have been easier with the addition of more trail markers. I shot with a group of four of their club members and even they were a little lost. The course was laid out over a huge area and there were longer distances between targets that you usually see. I guess if you have the space you might as well take advantage of it. It's pretty dark in that forest and most of the targets were in the shadows.

Apparently they were using a new computer scoring system and I was passed over during the awards ceremony, I wonder how many others were also missed. They rectified it after I brought it to their attention and their scorekeeper was very apologetic. I did shoot a good score even though I was shooting my wood (bamboo) arrows which I rarely do. If I'd shot my carbons I would have been put into the recurve division.

It was a very long drive, about 400 miles each way, to shoot forty targets but it was well worth it. There aren't too many ranges that are this pretty. If you get a chance you should check out this range, you won't be disappointed. More photos on page 10

TILAPIA Continued from page 7- Oh, they're there but just not in the same numbers as the carp, and they are also more elusive. This year only two people got 'one' Tilapia each. The rest of us settled for a few carp. I shot seven of them but nothing anywhere close to the winning fish which weighted in at 16lbs 5oz. I think the big Tilapia was a little over two pounds. There were about a dozen shooters signed up for the competition this year.

If bow fishing is your thing and you don't mind standing on your feet all day in the hot sun dealing with frustration you might want to give this a try next year. The next local tournament is the Carp Shoot at Lake Isabella in about a month. Hope to see you there.
