# Legislative Coordinator Report Robert Moore

Fish and Game Commission meeting held May 11th by webinar/teleconference. 3. Central Valley sport fishingConsider adopting proposed changes to Central Valley sport fishing regulations and consider taking final action under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).(Amend subsections 7.40(b)(4), (43), (66) and (80), Title 14, CCR) 4. Klamath River Basin sport fishing Consider adopting proposed changes to Klamath River Basin sport fishing regulations and consider taking final action under CEQA. (Amend subsection 7.40(b)(50), Title 14, CCR) 5. Future meeting dates Discuss and consider approving proposed change to next Marine Resources Committee meeting date from July 20, 2021 to July 21, 2021.

Next FGC meeting will be held June 16 and 17 by webinar/teleconference. No agenda has been posted Next Wildlife Resources Committee meeting September 16<sup>th</sup>, no agenda has been posted at this writing.

AB 564 (Gonzalez) – Biodiversity Protection and Restoration Act. AB 564 by Assembly Member would establish the Biodiversity Protection and Restoration Act and require all state agencies, boards, and commissions to consider and prioritize the protection of biodiversity in carrying out their statutory mandates. The bill would require strategies related to the goal of the state to conserve at least 30% of California's land and coastal waters by 2030 to be made available to the public and provided to certain legislative committees by no later than June 30, 2022. Update: AB 564 has been referred to the Assembly Accountability and Administrative Review where it must be heard and passed out to Fiscal Committee by April 30th to meet deadline. Hearing set for April 14 but cancelled by author

**AB 614** Aguiar-Curry. Wildlife habitat: birds. This bill would raise by \$5 the upland game bird hunting validation and the state duck hunting validation fees, as specified, with that \$5 to be deposited, and available upon appropriation to the department for the Nesting Bird Habitat Incentive Program, in the Nesting Bird Habitat Incentive Program Account, which the bill would create in the Fish and Game Preservation Fund. This bill instead would require the Upland Game Bird Account advisory committee to annually review and provide comments to the department on all proposed projects and other expenditures funded from the Upland Game Bird Account to help ensure that specified requirements pertaining to the Upland Game Bird Account have been met and require the department to post budget information and a brief description on its internet website for all projects and other expenditures funded from the Upland Game Bird Account. Update: AB 614 is now in appropriations committee hearing set for April 28

AB 645 (Gallagher) – Fish and Wildlife: Poaching Violations – Probation. Laws which significantly increased fines for possessing more than three times the daily bag limit and for the illegal take of wildlife for profit or personal gain which increased penalties for the illegal take of trophy-class animals took a step back last year when the State Legislature passed legislation that reduced maximum probation from three years to one year for all misdemeanor violations whose provisions do not call out a specific probation length. Because current law does not specify maximum probation periods for any poaching crimes, the effect of this legislation was to limit probation for even the most serious misdemeanor poaching violations to one year. Said differently, prior to passage of last year's legislation, a judge could sentence individuals convicted of serious poaching crimes to probation that would prohibit them from hunting for up to three years. The option of a longer probationary period also helped to ensure that penalty assessments could be collected.

To address this serious concern, this bill as amended March 11, 2021, would reinstate a maximum 3-year probation for the following serious violations of the Fish and Game Code:

- §12012 The illegal take of wildlife for profit or personal gain
- §12013 The illegal take or possession in the field of more than three times the daily bag limit (Continued on page 5)

• §12013.3 – The illegal take of trophy deer, elk, antelope, bighorn sheep or wild turkey

• §12002.3(b) - The illegal sale purchase of abalone AB 645 is in appropriations committee hearing set for April 28th.


AB 804 Megan, Dahle. Free hunting days. Existing law authorizes the Director of Fish and Wildlife to establish 2 free hunting days per year: one in the fall, and one in the winter. Existing law authorizes a California unlicensed resident to hunt during a free hunting day if accompanied by a licensed hunter, subject to certain conditions. Existing law prohibits these provisions from being implemented until the Department of Fish and Wildlife's Automated License Data System is fully operational for at least one year. This bill would require, rather than authorize, the director to establish 2 free hunting days per year, one in the fall and one in the spring, no later than July 1, 2022. The bill would delete the prohibition requiring a delay in implementation of the above-described provisions. Update: AB 804 is on the assembly floor for 3<sup>rd</sup> reading

AB 1223 (Levine) Major rewrite to The Gun Violence Prevention, Healing, and Recovery Act, The Gun Violence Prevention, Healing, and Recovery Act, would, commencing July 1, 2022, impose an excise tax in the amount of 10% of the sales price of a handgun and 11% of the sales price of a long gun, rifle, firearm precursor part, and ammunition as specified. The tax would be collected by the state pursuant to the Fee Collection Procedures Law. The bill would require that the revenues collected be deposited in the CalVIP Firearm and Ammunition Tax Gun Violence Prevention, Healing, and Recovery Fund, which the bill would create. The bill would continuously appropriate moneys in that fund to the Board of State and Community Corrections to provide CalVIP grants, thereby making an appropriation. The bill would remove the \$1,500,000 CalVIP grant limit and authorize the Board of State and Community Corrections to determine the award amount. AB 1223 would continuously appropriate moneys in that Fund to the Board of State and Community Corrections to fund CalVIP programs which remediate the effects the illegal use of firearms has in our state. Implementing successful programs for addressing gun violence is something that all Californians support and would benefit from. As such, all of California should equally help to fund their implementation. However, under AB 1223, CalVIP programs would only be funded by lawabiding citizens who legally purchase firearms and ammunition. Because AB 1223 would result in a taxpayer paying a higher tax, the bill requires approval of 2/3 of the membership of each house of the Legislature. Update: AB 1223 has been extensively changed and is now on the Assembly floor SB 370 Dodd, Wildlife: Big Game Management Account: uses. Existing law establishes the Big Game Management Account within the Fish and Game

Preservation Fund. Existing law requires revenue from the sale of tags for antelope, elk, deer, wild pig, bear, and sheep to be deposited in the account, except as provided. Existing law requires funds deposited in the account to be expended, upon appropriation by the Legislature, by the Department of Fish and Wildlife, solely for specified purposes and pursuant to specified limitations. This bill instead would authorize the department to make grants to, reimburse, or enter into contracts or other agreements with public and private entities, including nonprofit organizations, and federally recognized Indian tribes for the use of the funds from the account to carry out those purposes. Update: SB 370 is in the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee with a hearing set for April 27th.

SB 470 Jones, Fishing and hunting: annual combined hunting and fishing licenses.

This bill would create the annual combined hunting and fishing license that would grant the holder of the license the same privileges as the annual hunting and fishing licenses and that would be valid for a term of one year from the date specified on the license. The bill would limit the issuance of these licenses to residents and would require the department to issue these licenses beginning January 1, 2023, upon payment of a fee of \$100, as adjusted annually for inflation. The bill would require the Fish and Game Commission to adjust the amount of the fee to fully recover, but not exceed, all reasonable administrative and implementation costs of the department and the commission relating to these licenses. The bill would require the department to provide an applicant for one of these licenses the option to automatically renew the license and would provide a 5% discount if the applicant selects this option. Update: SB 470 has been referred to the Senate Appropriations Committee.





## TILAPIA AND CARP AND **BULL FROGS OH MY!**

The 25th Annual CBH/SAA Small Game Club (SGC) Tilapia Tournament was a success for everyone involved. The weather was a little tough on Saturday with clouds and some wind but that didn't stop Alan Meurer from "sticking" the largest Tilapia of the tournament. His big old Tilapia tiped the scales at 5 lbs 6 oz. now entered in the SGC record books. Congratulations Alan!

The weather on Sunday was much better with clear skies, lots of sunshine and no wind. All of the contestants had to be back for the weigh-in by 1:00 p.m. otherwise they would be disqualified from winning the Tilapia Tournament Trophies or money from the Carp Jackpot. Twenty-two tilapia were weighed in over the weekend with more than a few weighing in over 3lbs. Wayne Raupe hauled in seven tilapia with the best of the catch weighing in at 3lbs 12oz earning him 2nd place.

A man not afraid of being in the competition, in his boat on the water, was Gary Roney. His 3lbs 8oz tilapia put him in third place. All three of these bowfisherman's big fish were entered into the SGC Record Book.

Brad Grap, a member of the CBH/SAA Big Game Club (BGC) Committee, and he is also an Official BGC Measurer. He has an outstanding big game portfolio in the Big Game Record Book. On Saturday Brad stuck a stud carp! It weighed a whopping 19lbs 7oz and earned him First Place in the Carp Jackpot. His carp has been entered into the SGC Record Book. In addition, he submitted his one tilapia, a 3oz tilapia, This will give him one more species on his list towards getting his Small Game Club Golden Eagle Society Award. Once he reaches thirty-five (35) small game species harvested with a bow and arrow, in California, he will be awarded this prestigious award.

Congratulations also to Alejandro "Alex" Romero, who added tilapia to his small game species credits, and to Kevin Carlson for adding carp to his small game species credit.

Did someone say, "BULLFROG?" Yes they did! And yes you can shoot them with your regular bow. In fact the bullfrog is a non-native invasive species in California. There is no limit nor season on them so you can hunt them year round. They are a reptile and one of the critters you can add to your species list in the record book. You can hunt them during the day or at night with a spot lite. When scanning for a bullfrog with your trusty spotlight you will first notice their two shiny glowing eyes. The smaller the eyes the smaller Barrett Brisbe, with her friend Matt, drove over the bullfrog, the bigger the eyes the bigger the bullfrog. But don't be fooled because some really small shiny eyes are the eyes of the spiders that inhabit the banks at night. Once you have spotted a bullfrog get ready quick because typically they are not sticking around for you to get real close.

Jackpot with a respectable 12 lb 6oz carp. Wayne Raupe harvested his frog on his third Marco's big carp exceeded the minimum weight shot. 


