Legislative Team Update

Greetings CBH/SAA friends and family!

I wanted to take some time this month to provide some additional details related to **AB 28 Firearm Excise Tax** – legislation which would impose an additional 11% excise tax on the sale of all firearms, firearm parts, and ammunition sold in California. As mentioned in my last article, the bill passed off the Assembly Floor and over to the Senate on May 25. AB 28 is now going to Senate Public Safety, which is an extremely liberal committee, and the expectation is that it will pass out of that committee on a party-line vote (4 democrats and 1 republican) on July 11. Once it passes out of Senate Public Safety it will go to Senate Appropriations Committee – needing another simple majority to pass. CBH/SAA and our partners in the California Hunting and Conservation Coalition (CHCC) have an outside chance of killing the bill by holding it in suspense, meaning it does not make it onto the committee agenda to be heard. However, the Committee Chair (Senator Portantino) supports/writes many gun control bills himself. While we won't hold our breath on this strategy, our lobbyist and CHCC partners and their lobbyists will take every opportunity to kill the bill and can hopefully work some magic with Senator Portantino's staff.

IMPORTANT: Our best shot to kill this bill is on the Senate Floor where it needs 2/3rds of the vote to pass. Bill and team are keeping close tabs on the expected vote count and it's extremely close. This is where YOU can HELP!!! Sign up for CBH/SAA Legislative Alerts and watch for an email from VoterVoice calling you to action! ALL HANDS ON DECK! This is your opportunity to be heard! Hopefully, this detail regarding the legislative process and how CBH/SAA and our partners approach bills like these inspires you to get involved in this effort and future efforts.

CBH/SAA is also active in the State legislature providing support related to the **Senate confirmation of the appointment of Anthony Williams and Eric**

Sklar to the California Fish and Game Commission by Governor Newsom. According to our lobbyist, Bill Gaines, both Commissioner Williams and Commissioner Sklar have proven track records of commitment to science-based wildlife management and support for maximum justifiable hunting and fishing opportunities. To be seated for the entire 6-year Commission term, their appointments must be confirmed by a vote of the full State Senate within 12 months. Anthony Williams was reappointed to the Commission by Governor Newsom in October 2022 (previously appointed to the Commission in 2015 by Governor Brown).

Per Bill Gaines, "Commissioner Williams has proven to have a firm understanding and respect for hunting and angling and the critical role we play in the conservation of wildlife." Eric Sklar was reappointed to the Commission by Governor Newsom in March 2023. Commissioner Sklar was also first appointed to the Commission by Governor Brown in 2015 and reappointed to the Commission in January 2017 by Governor Newsom. Continued on page 4

This latest term ended in January and was reappointed in March 2023. Mr. Sklar is currently serving as President of the Commission. He is an active hunter, who has consistently demonstrated his support for our outdoor traditions during his lengthy tenure on the Commission.

Following up on discussion at the CBH/SAA Annual Meeting in February, **CBH/SAA donated \$3,000 to Lassen Volcanic National Park earmarked for support of a bear study** in partnership with UC Davis. This opportunity was brought to us in the CHCC by Backcountry Hunters and Angler (BHA), who also donated \$5,000. UC Davis researchers will conduct a population study of black bears following the large-scale Dixie Fire (2021). The study will occur within properties managed by the National Park Service in Lassen County and will focus on an un-hunted population of bears.

The study methods will mirror a black bear population study that was conducted in the same location prior to the Dixie Fire to analyze population trends before and after the fire, thereby providing key data and insights into how bear populations recover following fire events. I am proud of CBH/SAA support of this effort! We constantly advocate for science-based decision making related to wildlife management and we are walking the talk when we participate in the scientific process. Thank you for your support!

Wrapping up with more good news... CBH/SAA also signed a coalition letter of **support for a U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) proposal to fund a program which would provide for a state-of-the-art wildlife monitoring and tracking system.**

The program would run through the Wildlife Conservation Board (WCB),

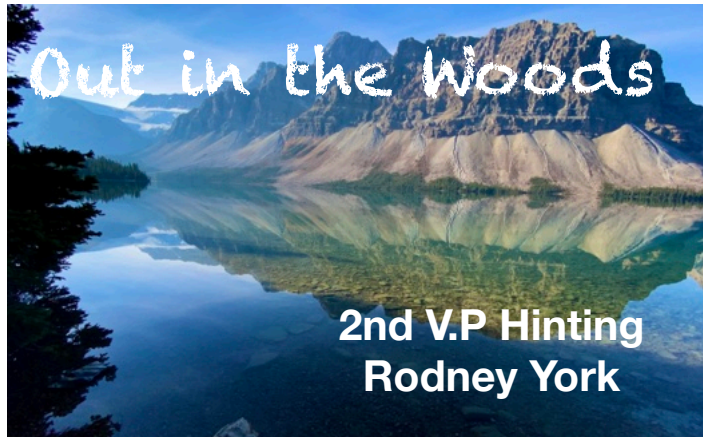
which serves as the “acquisition arm” of the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Over the last several decades, the WCB has spent many millions of dollars funding the acquisition, restoration, and enhancement of our wildlife habitats on both public and private lands. But these land and habitat values could be further enhanced. Data provided by this USGS proposed system would provide wildlife managers with critical information they need for the adaptive management of conserved habitats and the benefits they provide to wildlife. The end goal being healthier wildlife populations and increased viewing and hunting opportunities on both public and private lands. Following up on our support, Bill Gaines arranged for the lead scientist on the USGS wildlife project, Mike Casazza, to meet with us via zoom to discuss this proposal, and to answer any questions or concerns. Several CBH/SAA leaders and legislative team members were in attendance. I hope to share more with you in future articles.

Reminder: Whether you’ve been involved in archery or hunting your whole life, or are new to this sport, **you have something of value to add to the conversation and I encourage you to reach out to me and the CBH Legislative team and share your knowledge and experience!** We look forward to hearing from you soon!

- Quiet! -

One of the things which might draw a hunter into using a bow is the solitude that a noiseless trip into the woods can provide. These days we are bombarded with an overabundance of noise.

As a hunter, noise is in third place next to scent followed by movement. Once attuned to the lack of noise however, seemingly quiet things like the release of a string launching an arrow can become nearly as annoying as fingernails drug across a chalkboard. Attending a target archery tournament may lead to an overwhelming desire for ear plugs. Okay, perhaps we are becoming a little eccentric here. At any rate we will attempt to address some things which can ridiculously reduce auditory irritation and lead to better performance; and even success. The string is a great place to begin. The extreme acceleration of the string and then its abrupt halt on the limbs can indeed create quite a loud; and unusual noise. Various silencers with the same varying results may be used. Researchers suggest that the peak of vibrating harmonics occurs at 6 and 12 inches from contact point with the wheels or limb tips. Speed, for better trajectory and less consequence from error in judging distance seems to be highly sought after by most these days. Thus the weight of your preferred silencers may need to be considered as the heavier they are, the slower the cast of the arrow as seen here. This would be inherently obvious to those shooting traditional bows.

Metal on metal, metal on wood; any hard surface touching on another will also create noise, perhaps an unacceptable amount of noise in the hunter or games' evaluation. One of the most profound examples can be cited in new *International Limb Fit* or "ILF" components. While the concept developed by Doug Denton & Earl Hoyt Archery in 1985 is ingenious it can be the source of ridiculous loud clamour. The ILF limb is held in the "pocket" mostly by pressure on the top of the limb by the limb bolt.



The bottom of the limb also has a fulcrum (pressure point) on which it pivots. Not only are these areas of friction, but also vibration _ noise!

Quiet from page 5 -Once the bow has been shot 20/30 times and the noise no longer tolerable one can unstring the bow and remove the limbs easily without tools (great for backpacking hunts). Inspection on the underside of the limbs will show signs of abrasion at the contact points (look at the top of each toothpick). By placing half circle adhesive spots over the rubbed areas you can create an extremely quiet shooting limb bow.

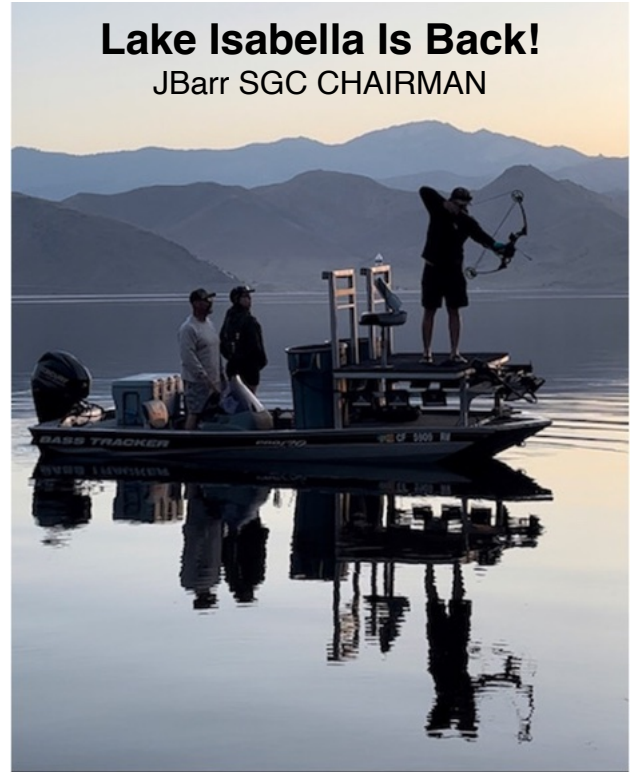

Lake Isabella Is Back!

On June 3rd and 4th, this year's Small Game Club Carp Round-Up Tournament at Lake Isabella, proved to be impressive. Despite the closure of three roads, enthusiastic carp hunters arrived from all directions, eager for an opportunity at bow fishing. Both boaters and shore shooters were successful, managing to harvest a total of 616 pounds of carp. The first notable miracle was the lake being filled with cold water from melting snow, extending all the way back to Little Lake and beyond. Miracle #2 was the perfect weather experienced during the tournament. Although the wind picked up around 1-2 PM, the presence of Ozark-like trees provided a shield, allowing participants a bit more time to  make accurate shots (and stick more fish). The presence of fresh new habitat, including trees, willows, cottonwood brush piles, as well as the grass and rocks along the shoreline, created ideal conditions for both shore shooters and boat captains. In the men's division, Alan Clifton not only secured 1st place but also managed to shoot two catfish—one before the tournament on Friday and another on Saturday. Jim Teel, (AKA: Carp Killer on YouTube) had a stroke of luck (and skill) by winning the jackpot with his 8.12 pounds of carp shot on Sunday. Brad Grapp had a pleasant surprise on Saturday when he harvested not just one, not just two, but three feral goldfish, exceeding his expectations. Furthermore, this harvest of new species was particularly valuable as Brad is working towards adding to his small game species list, which with feral goldfish brings his total to 57 species he has harvested with a bow.

As for the women's division, Marcie Hughes claimed 1st place, which comes as no surprise considering she is a local avid bow "fisherwoman." Jyn Scott secured 2nd place by shooting the smallest carp of the tournament, weighing only 1.13 lbs. Her accuracy with such a small target is quite impressive. Leigh Ann, who has become an exceptional archer in a short period of time, took 3rd place and always brings joy and hugs to everyone she meets.

On June 21, 2023, I attended the Zoom meeting that Bill Gaines setup with Mike Casazza regarding USGS, Wildlife Monitoring/Tracking. They are beginning with waterfowl, showing how they migrate, and which wetlands they prefer. They monitor, the US, over seas, and even your favorite hunting zones. They are looking for Wildlife Conservation Board funding, so they can include deer, bear and pretty much any kind of animal to monitor. By installing state of the art transducers they will be tracking and monitoring like conservationist, and CFG with an end goal being healthier wildlife populations. This will be beneficial to so many groups in the future including hunters. It is expensive, but worth it. This meeting was very informative, well produced and to the point. DOVE SCHNITZEL



On September 1st, the Dove opener lands on a Friday this year. Make sure to grab a migratory stamp, take your bow, and head over to your favorite bow shop. Don't forget to get a dozen or two flu flu arrows and Judo Tips. Once you're out there, be sure to send me some photos. Good luck to all of you who participate in these small game events, and remember safety first, fins, feathers, fur and fun. Enjoy your time in the great outdoors and feasting on your harvest!

COURSE: MAIN COURSE

CUISINE: GERMAN

SERVINGS: 8 PEOPLE

PREP TIME: 20 MINUTES MINUTES

COOK TIME: 20 MINUTES MINUTES.

TOTAL TIME: 40 MINUTES MINUTES.

INGREDIENTS:

- Breast meat from 12 to 16 dove
- Salt
- 1 to 1 1/2 pounds chanterelles or other fresh mushrooms, cleaned and roughly chopped
- 1 yellow onion, roughly chopped
- 10 tablespoons bacon fat, lard or butter, divided
- Flour for dusting (optional)
- 4 tablespoons flour
- 2 cup dove, duck or beef stock
- 2 or 2 tablespoons sour cream
- 4 tablespoons chopped parsley
- Black pepper to taste

INSTRUCTIONS

- Place each dove breast between two pieces of plastic wrap and pound until it is about 1/8 inch thick. Do this firmly, but don't wail on the meat or you will tear it.
- Set a large frying pan over high heat for 1 minute, then add the mushrooms to the hot, dry pan. Shake them around so they don't stick too much and cook the mushrooms until they give up their water, about 3 or 4 minutes. Add 2 tablespoons of the bacon fat and onions and stir-fry everything until the onions begin to brown, about 4 minutes. Remove the mushrooms and onions and set aside.
- Dust the dove breasts in flour if you want to. Add the remaining fat to the pan and let it heat over medium-high heat. Do not let it smoke. Sear the cutlets for 1 minute on the first side. Keep them from curling up with a spatula. Flip the cutlets and sear another minute for medium doneness. Remove the cutlets to a plate and put them in an oven set to "warm."
- Add the 2 tablespoons flour and mix with the fat in the pan. Turn the heat to medium and let the flour-and-fat mixture cook until it is the color of coffee-with-cream. Slowly pour in the stock, plus any juices that have come off the cutlets while they rest. You should have a thick gravy. If it is thin, let this boil down a minute or two. If it is really thick, turn off the heat, wait for the sauce to stop bubbling and stir in the sour cream. Add the mushrooms and onions back to the pan and toss to coat in the sauce. Add salt and black pepper to taste. Pour this over the cutlets and serve at once. Garnish with a little parsley. Enjoy!

- *1/8 c Kosher Salt /Optional

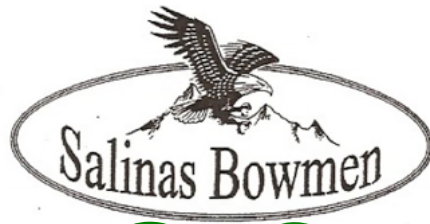
- 1) **Soak Overnight** in Salt Brine

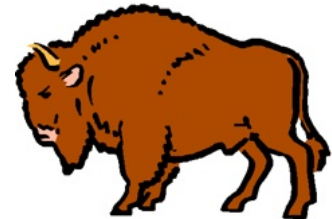

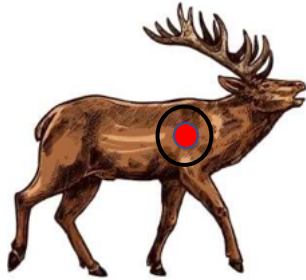
