Results were as follows: 1st Place Longest Shark Bret Scott, Shovelnose 51 1/2" + Leopard shark 48", Thornback Guitar fish.

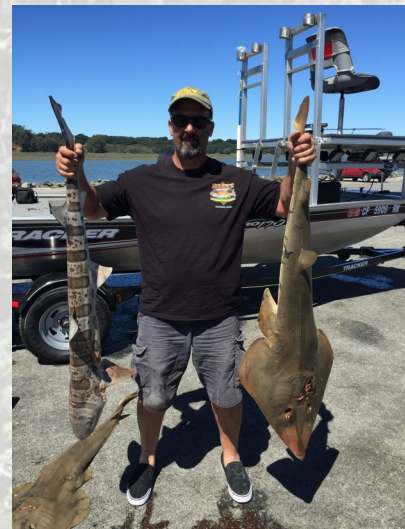
1st Place Widest Ray Tony Williams, 17" Bat Ray + 43 3/4" Shovelnose

President's Message -by Wayne Raupe

This is going to be a short message this month so those of you that get tired of reading a two or a three page President's Message you will like this one. I am currently on a 5 + week trip to Las Vegas; Canon City, Colorado, Lubbock, Texas; elk camp in Utah; back to Grand Junction, Colorado; back to Las Vegas and then home. With any kind of luck, we will be bringing four elk home for our very empty freezers. I hope all of you have great hunts and are successful in filling your freezers like we hope.

Other than that I hope each if you are watching the bills going through our legislature that are directly related to hunting and fishing and or the sportsmen and sportswomen. For example...

*AB-1844 which will reduce fees for annual and lifetime hunting and fishing licenses for all veterans who are residents in California.

*AB-1792 which would allow Federally Recognized Tribes to utilize and set their own numbers of take of the three species of elk in California, both on and off their lands, as a subsistence animal. In California the tule elk originally numbered 500,000 animals but that is not the case now. If approved, this bill could be devastating to our current elk populations. Outdoors groups such as the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation and other groups brought the elk herds back from almost extinction to huntable numbers. The tule elk herd numbered just two, a cow and a bull, in the 1870's. Thanks to hunters, hunter's money and the organizations that they belong to, along with the Department of Fish and Game, who were and are charged with population management of our wildlife, including our elk. The tule elk are now



viabile and huntable in 22 different areas of the state and have an approximate population of 4,300. The other two species are also growing in population numbers. And again, thanks to hunters, there is both an intrinsic and monetary value assigned to all elk in California and North America. *AB-2148 Drone Regulations: Know and follow the regulations on the use of drones while hunting any and all wildlife. The Drone regulations will be discussed on August 1st as will the above Assembly Bills.

Remember, no matter what kind of bow you bend or stick you shoot we must remain one family and we must stick together as do ALL Outdoors clubs and groups. We must focus on removing ALL of the Anti-Hunting lawmakers at the State and the local levels.

THINKING BACK

Now that I cannot bow hunt anymore and have time to review my hunting adventures something had become very clear I am a failure as a big game trophy class hunter. Oh yea I have harvested deer, sheep, goats and pigs and sixty-six small game species but few trophy animals.

Most of my success has come when I hunted alone or dump forkie who didn't realize they were huntable came by. When group hunting it even got worse with no trophy animals.

On a Idaho family hunt for white tail deer we were group hunting pockets of timber and I was given a blocker post and again no luck. A young Idaho hunter asked me why I was standing up at the ridge of the timber brush pocket and said your likely gonna get anything standing up here you need to get down three into the brush and it hit me the reason the for my continued failures. The animals were sky lighting me because the wise ones wanted to move slow and return to their pocket hideout. They would simply circle in the brush. Too late smart.

Looking back at other group hunts and the pictures of great bucks as they gave me one look and disappeared into the deep dark brush flooded my mind.

That's why I am writing this article in hopes that you will adopt in successful bow hunting. It is all I can do for you and if fear from someone shooting at you while in the brush find some trees to hide in and don't move around too much.

My most successful hunt was in Nevada in the days where you could buy a license and tags over the counter. That Wild Horse Reservoir with Al Hobson, Fran Comacho, Frank Anger and myself. A four point buck made a mistake but a few minutes quicker two monster bucks got by me as I was too slow cutting off their escape and if I told you how big the horns of these two bucks were you wouldn't believe me. Another problem I have is the bigger the animal is the more I shake.

Legislative Information

The next Fish and Game Commission (FGC) meeting will be held August 24 and 25 in Folsom, Ca. Agenda has not been posted at the writing of this article. Upland bird regulation changes that include requiring the use of broadheads for turkeys should be finalized at this meeting.

The next Wildlife Resources meeting will be September 21st in Woodland Ca. Agenda has not been posted at the writing of this article.

State legislation for the current cycle has a few bills remaining. These have been listed in previous articles using Gaines and Associates Leg reports to keep us up to date. These reports are also on our website under the Legislative link. Below are listed bills and a brief synopsis, for more information on these bills you can view at <http://leginfo.legislature.ca.gov/>

AB 499 (Cooley) – Archery Hunting: Concealed Firearm, In June, with the bill having met all of the necessary legislative deadlines, Assembly Member Cooley choose to gut the bill's original text and replace it with language which now deals with earthquake insurance.

AB 1792 (Wood) – Elk Tags: Federally Recognized Tribes, After much effort, in late May, AB 1792 was substantially watered down to, among other things, delete the language which authorized the Commission to allocate tags to the tribes. As newly amended, the bill now would only direct DFW to meet with individual tribes, if requested, to discuss elk-related issues for elk located within the territory of that tribe, and to work with the tribes to identify possible science-based solutions.

With our concerns addressed, the bill, as amended, passed off of the Assembly Floor by a 58 – 17 vote in early June, and out of Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee on a unanimous 8 – 0 vote in late June. The bill is now slated to be heard in Senate Appropriations Committee on August 1st. The hearing will be held in State Capitol Room 4203, beginning at 10 a.m.

AB 1844 (Gallagher) – Reduced Veterans Hunting/ Fishing License Fees, AB 1844 passed out of the Assembly Appropriations Committee in late May on a 20 to 0 vote, and off of the Assembly Floor just days later on a 78 to 2 vote. Now on the Senate side, AB 1844 passed out of the Senate Natural Resources Committee in late

June on a unanimous 8 to 0 vote. The bill is now slated to be heard in Senate Appropriations Committee on August 1st. The hearing will be held in State Capitol Room 4203, beginning at 10 a.m. Gaines & Associates has been pleased to testify in support of this legislation

AB 2148 (Holden) – Drone Regulation, Recognizing the possible benefits of this legislation to the promotion and protection of wildlife, Gaines & Associates worked with the bill's sponsor in an effort to help insert language which allows agency use of drones for wildlife research and conservation, while ensuring protections remain in place which fully prohibit their use by others for scouting, herding or other purposes which do not embrace the fair chase ethic. AB 2148 passed off of the Assembly Floor by a 57 – 18 vote on May 19th and moved to the Senate. The bill was then heard in the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee on June 28th, passing out on a 6 – 2 vote. The bill's next stop is Assembly Appropriations Committee, where it is yet to be scheduled, but must be heard by August 12th to meet legislative deadline.

SB 345 (Berryhill) – The Sport Fishing Stimulus Act of 2015, After sitting idle for over a year – but having met all the necessary legislative deadlines – SB 345 was finally brought up for hearing on the Assembly side, passing out of the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee on a unanimous vote in late June. The bill's next stop will be the Assembly Appropriations Committee, where it is scheduled to be heard on August 3rd. The hearing will be held in State Capitol Room 4202, beginning at 9:00 a.m.

SB 868 (Jackson) – Drones, Among other things, AB 868 would prohibit the operation of a drone within the airspace overlying a state park, or land or waters managed by DFW without a permit, or regulations authorizing the use.

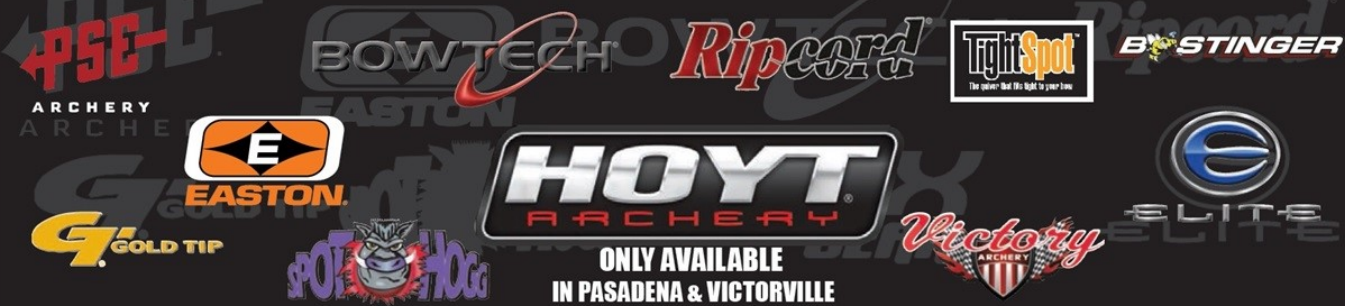
