


we have been seeing in the past years so please feel free to attend.

#### **Legislative Report by Robert Moore**

The next California Fish and Game Commission meeting (CFGC) will be August 16th in Sacramento. Agenda has not been posted at this writing but should include inland fisheries ISOR presentation from DFW. CBHSAA proposal related to bowfishing should be included in the ISOR.

The next Wildlife Resources Committee meeting will be held September 13 in Riverside. No agenda has been posted at this writing but the Predator Policy Group should be finalizing their recommendation soon. From the last FGC meeting priorities the WRC will be reviewing include; wild pig management, falconry regulations, Commission climate change policy, petition for stripe bass and predatory policy.

The Predator Policy Work Group held a meeting July 13th in Sacramento. Agenda items include final recommendations on draft predator policy and regulation change. A discussion on regulations 401, 465.5, 460 and 472 and a goal to final wrap up on predator policy changes at the next meeting.

The state legislature has started the next 2 year cycle for proposed laws. Bills not passed this year can be carried over to 2018. Several bills have already been introduced that affect sportsmen. Here is a list of bills related to hunting and their current positions in the legislature; AB478, increase age requirement for fishing license, in Appropriations Committee, update in suspense file. AB521, reduce the tag cost for resident elk tags, update now in the Senate Appropriations Committee, failed passage. AB573, depredation permits for wild pigs, update in Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. AB986 reduced fees for veterans, in Appropriations Committee. AB1544 lead ammo ban relief, in Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. AB1617, additional funding sources for DFW, update in Senate Natural Resources Committee. SB234 local regulation prohibition, update passed senate and now in assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. SB710 use of suppressors for hunting, in Public Safety Committee, update hearing canceled. Additional bills related to firearms and DFW budgeting are not listed at this time. Bills could change content when close to expiration with the term gut and amend. Our conservation partners in the Hunting Conservation Coalition also have lobbyists to monitor concerns of sportsmen. This network of information and participation is advantageous to keeping informed of laws and regulations that affect what we do.

### California Archery Hall of Fame - 2018 Inductees



Gary McCain -

Gary was brought up with archery in his family growing up. From shooting in the yard to advancing to a local archery club and that was it, he was hooked. Gary would find any number of people that he could ride with to go to these "archery shoots". It wasn't long after the experience of going to these shoots that Gary was asked to be the Range Captain for Nomad Bowmen

Archery Club. And, he took it.

When Gary and Sandy got married, they were definitely on the same track with their political views of archery and got involved with the local clubs, then regionally, then statewide and now as California Director to NFAA. When Gary got involved in organized archery he was provided a one line philosophy which he still stands by today and that is... "don't let them get away with anything!"

Gary has served on the CBH/SAA Big Game Club Committee for many years. He has several animals in the record books and animals in the Pope & Young Club.

Gary not only hunts with his bow, he is an accomplished target archer;

- -10 NFAA National Championship Titles
- -2 International Championship Titles
- -1 USA Championship Title
- -40+ CBH/SAA Championship Titles
- -World, National, State, Regional and Local archery records
- -Lifetime Achievement Award in the Big Game Club
- -1 World Bowhunter Team Champion
- -Fresno Safari Champion many times over
- -Redding's Western Classic Trail Shoot Champion 5 times
- -3 CBH/SAA Big Game Record Book animals and 4 Pope and Young Record Book animals
- -Archery instructor for Fish & Game, IBEP, National Wild Turkey Federation and Boy Scouts  $\,$
- -Numerous National, State, Regional, local offices held

Need we say more as to why this deserving individual is being inducted into the California Archery Hall of Fame.

Earl Williams – At the age of 9, Earl and his father were at the Army Navy store. A bow and arrow set was on the wall behind the counter and he really wanted it but knew better than to ask his dad for it. His dad noticed Earl's interest in the bow and arrow set. To Earl's surprise when his dad was at the cash register his dad asked for the set and handed it to Earl. That was the start of a lifelong love affair with archery.

At the age of 11 Earl was very proficient in shooting rabbits, squirrels, and anything else that moved. He began hunting big game as soon as he was old enough to obtain a hunting license. At the age of 14 he killed his first deer with his bow and arrow. While developing his love for hunting and pursuit of big game animals he met and became very good friends with Bob & Betty Gulman (CA HOF). Bob and Betty mentored Earl and took him on his first out of state hunting trip which



became an annual event. Bob and Betty also introduced Ear to tournament archery which he enjoyed but he was really a hunter at heart.

Through the years Earl has proven his hunting skills over and over and over....He harvested his first deer at the age of 14 and as of a few years ago, he had harvested more than 85 deer.

His accomplishments over the years include;

- -Harvested 85 deer
- -Has entered 11 species into the CBH /SAA Big Game Record Book
- -Received the California Deer Slam Award he was the first recorded California hunter to achieve this... and includes a mule deer in 1975, blacktail in 1976 & Pacific Hybrid in 1977
- -CBH/SAA Golden Eagle Society award which requires the harvesting of 35 different California small game species
- -Received the NFAA Art Young Big Game Award of Master Bowhunter in 1984 and accomplished that milestone a total of three times which qualified him for the Grand Master Bowhunter Award in 2001
- -Harvested 5 elk
- -Harvested more than 43 javelina while mentoring many young and first time hunters in the art of hunting these elusive gray ghosts
- -Harvested seven black bear
- -He also harvested many different species of small game while hunting out of state
- -From his treestand one morning he harvested one coyote and two racoons -At Oranco Bowmen, received awards Big Game Hunter (2), Master Hunter (several times), Master Big Game Hunter, Big Buck award

But, he did still keep up with target archery....he received the CBH/SAA Grand Slam award for his winning four State Championships in a twelve month period. He won the State Indoor, State Field, State Broadhead and the State Target. He accomplished this in the year 2015-2016. He also received the Tournament Archer of the Year from Oranco Bowmen in 2015.

By the looks of it, Earl doesn't appear to be slowing down...it will be an honor to have him inducted into the California Archery Hall of Fame.



Wayne Raupe - Wayne came from a hunting family with 3 brothers and 3 sisters. His father started taking the boys hunting small game at the age of five and big game at the age of 12. The last 3 boys were less than two years apart. Wayne was the "little brother" and got the hand me downs. One of his hand me downs was a bow. As it always is with little brothers, the big brothers were always pushing him by setting examples that proved they could do everything better than he could. Wayne took the challenge and he proved his abilities to his brothers....and boy, did he.

Wayne had harvested numerous carp, cottontail, pheasants, doves and ducks....and the magpies by the hundreds. As years passed, the "big game" eluded him time after time, but he never gave up.

Three years after he returned from his tour of duty in Vietnam he returned to his love of archery and in 1979, he purchased a bow from Jim Velasquez and Bob Fromme at Weisser Sporting Goods. They pushed him into joining Bear State Bowhunters so he did. Bear State Bowhunters required that all of their members belonged to CBH/SAA and NFAA so Wayne joined both.

From there on out, Wayne was involved in the politics, promotion and preservation of archery....

1982 to 1984 – Legislative Representative for Bear State Bowhunters 1984 to 1988 – Vice President of Southern Border Archery Association (SBAA)

1988 to 1991 - Legislative Representative for SBAA

1989 to 1994 - Active spokesman for hunters

1991 to 1994 - Legislative Representative for Region #5

1994 to 1998 - CBH/SAA President

While serving as CBH/SAA President, he served on the committees of: California Archery Hall of Fame, Archery Foundation, Range Committee and the Big Game Committee

1998 to 2012 - Legislative Representative for Region #5

2011 to 2012 - CBH/SAA Legislative Coordinator

2012 to present – CBH/SAA President (again....)

Over the years, he has also served on the Small Game Committee, ran the Tilapia Jamboree, raised thousands of dollars for the Legislative Defense Fund, is a Senior Member of the Big Game Club with 9 different big game species that exceed the CBH/SAA Big Game Record Book minimum score, is a committee member of the DFW Big Game Budget Advisory Committee and Upland Game Advisory Committee, he is a BGC measurer, CBH/SAA State Field Champion, State Broadhead Champion and is also a committee member of the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation.

The big game Wayne has taken with a bow include: American Elk 5 x 5, Barron Ground Caribou bull, 5 Pacific Hybrid bucks, Northern California Mule Deer buck, 6 Spanish Goats, 5 Moreno Sheep, Siskiyou County Black Bear, Wild Boar, Antelope, 3 Wyoming Mule Deer , 2 Jake and 2 Tom Turkeys and a coyote.

Wayne has given countless hours often forgoing hunting excursions to serve the California Bowman Hunters and other legislative battles for bowmen in California. It is about time he is inducted into the California Archery Hall of Fame.

Jim Cox— Archer, business owner, promoter, marketer, innovator, hunter.....although he had owned bows and arrows all of his life, it wasn't until 1965 when he joined NFAA, the Salinas Bowmen and then he started competitive archery. He realized that shooting a right handed bow doesn't work too well for a lefty. He finally figured it out and got the "right" equipment and was hooked on competitive archery.

In 1974 (until 1995), Jim joined Martin Archery. He was the Chairman of Martin Archery Advisory Council and later became the Sales Rep for California and Nevada. His main position was in Research and Development and was



instrumental in designing the Martin Cougar, the first metal handle riser. With Jim's background in auto body repair, he encouraged Martin to offer the risers in custom colors.

In the 1980's, together with Martin Archery, they developed the Dynabo and the Jim Cox Take Down Recurve. Jim was ahead of his time as the Dynabo had the positive stop (at one time, it was outlawed by CBH).

Jim also was looking out for the hunters and growing the archery community. He leased 27,000 acre Laguna Ranch and he and his partner ran 300-400 hunters through a year. Jim had sold his Elkhorn Archery Shop in 1989 and opened a new shop in 1990, Jim Cox Adventures, which is still open today. He is constantly teaching archery through community outreach in the schools, special needs youth and adult programs, 4H groups, Boys/Girls/Cub Scouts, corporate groups, evening leagues and special private events.

Jim had hunted both Catalina and Santa Cruz Islands over 50 times each, before they closed to hunting. He taught many archers over the years on bowhunting and how to set your equipment.

His other accomplishments and/or experience;

- -Field tested product for numerous manufacturers
- -Advisory staff member for Sagittarius Archery and Beaman Arrow
- -Coach & technical advisor for U.S. Army Recreation Service Div at Fort Ord
- -Official Measurer for Pope and Young
- -State and National Champion, numerous times
- -Licensed Guide for California
- -Harvested game in Africa-impala, kudo, nyala, warthog & water buck. Australia-water buffalo, dingo and wild boar. Alaska-moose, black bear and caribou. Arizona-javelina and elk. California-antelope, black bear, blacktail deer, bobcat, coyote, mule deer and wild boar. Catalina Island-Spanish goat & wild hog. Colorado and Idaho-elk. Montana-antelope, coyote, elk, mule and whitetail deer. Missouri-whitetail deer. Nevada-coyote & mule deer. Ohio-whitetail deer. Oregon-blacktail deer, elk & mule deer. Santa Cruz Island-Merino sheep & wild hog. Utah-cougar & mule deer. Washington-elk, blacktail & mule deer. Wyoming-moose, mule deer & antelope. Texas-alligator. And, last but not least; badger, carp, ducks, fox, geese, jack and cottontail rabbits, pheasants, peacock, snakes, stingrays, tree & ground squirrels & turkeys... whew!!!

With the experiences this gentleman has been in and through, doesn't it just make you want to chat with him for a while...it's about time he is inducted into the California Archery Hall of Fame.



### From Our Historian - Scott Walker 1977



Matt Yuric, outstanding State and National Champion in tournament archery, became a champion in films on March 28th when he received that coveted "Oscar" at the 49th Annual Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Sciences. Matt received his award and the Special Effects category for "Logan's Run." Matt is one of the nations outstanding landscape artists but is highly talented and special effects which gives him the opportunity to express his diversified talents. His exhibitions are the main attraction at the El Dorado Galleries in Sedona, Arizona. His film credits as impressive as his archery accomplishments and this multi-faceted artist was at his best in "The Towering Inferno", "Young Frankenstein', "The Greatest Story Ever Told", "The Robe", "Mutiny On The Bounty", and "Ben Hur". Logan's run is now being filmed as a pilot for television.

Matt's status as an archer is not a secret. He began his archery career as an amateur when he won the Castaways tournament in 1961, those aspirations were behind him and he joined the ranks of the "freestylers" (using a pin sight) and went on to win the 1962 Sahara-Colt NFAA Indoor National. From that day on he chalked up first place awards at the Pow-Wow, Safari, and State championship tournaments. His closest competitors at that time we're Lou Rangle and Clarence Kozlowski in 1961 he won the NAA York-Dbl. American and it was a good many years before his record was broken.

While talking to Matt he was asked what was your most outstanding memory while you were active in archery he replied there are many fond memories of friends and the fun we really had... but I think one of the most memorable is a foot race, down a hill, with a 25 year old Lou Rangle who thought he was going to :beat the pants" off the "ol man"...but didn't.

The archers of California extend their congratulations to find man a Talented artist and a great archer we hope he returns to the ranges soon.


