Legislative Information By Robert Moore

The next FGC meeting will be held August 19-20, 2020 by webinar/teleconference. No agenda has been posted at this time

The next Wildlife Resources Committee meeting will be September 17 by webinar/teleconference. No agenda has been posted at this time.

Legislation

AB 1387 (Wood) – Sport Fishing Licenses: 12 Consecutive Month Licenses; would, in addition to offering California residents a traditional calendar year fishing license, require DFW to offer a license that is valid for 12 consecutive months beginning on the date of purchase upon payment of a fee that is equal to 130% of the cost of the traditional calendar-year sport fishing license. AB 1387 would require DFW to provide applicants for these licenses the option of signing up for automatic renewal of the license by electronic payment and would set the fee for licenses issued upon automatic renewal at the same price as a calendar-year sport fishing license. Update: Now on the Senate side, AB 1387 has been referred to the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee but has not yet been set to be heard. AB 1387 has until August 7, 2020 to meet legislative deadline for being heard and passed out of Senate policy committee. **AB 2106** (Aguiar-Curry) –Nesting Bird Habitat Incentive Program: Upland Game Bird Stamp/State Duck Stamp. Legislation passed in 2018 required the Department of Fish & Wildlife (DFW) to establish the "Nesting Bird Habitat Incentive Program" and authorized DFW to make payments or provide other incentives to encourage landowners to voluntarily cultivate or retain upland cover crops or other upland vegetation on their idled lands to provide habitat and nesting cover for waterfowl, upland game birds, and other

the Nesting Bird Habitat Incentive Program.
Update: AB 2106 passed the Assembly and is now in the Senate AB 2106 has not yet been set for hearing in Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee.

Nesting Bird Habitat Incentive Subaccount within the California Waterfowl Habitat Preservation Account and

require the incremental revenue to be deposited in that

AB 2523 (Gray) – Fish and Game Commission: Youth Hunting Program: Special Hunting Permits As amended May 6, 2020, AB 2523 by Assembly Member Adam C. Gray (D/21-Merced) would require the California Fish and Game Commission to establish a program to increase opportunities to hunt big game, upland game birds and migratory game birds for youth under the age of 18 with terminal illnesses or who lost a parent in service to the state or country. AB 2523 defines "in service to the state or country" as a person who died while actively serving in the Armed Forces or in local, state, or federal law enforcement

or fire service. The legislation defines "terminal illness" as an incurable or irreversible condition with a corresponding life expectancy that does not exceed 60 months.

The bill would require the Commission to report any findings to the Legislature and the Governor on or before January 1, 2022, on the progress of the program.

Update: AB 2523 is held under submission in Assembly Appropriations Committee and didn't get pulled before deadline and technically is dead.

AB 3022 (Obernolte) – Junior Hunting Licenses: Age Eligibility

Legislation passed in 2014 increased junior hunting license age eligibility from 15 to 17 years of age. However, that bill included a "sunset" provision which requires the age eligibility to revert to 15 years on July 1, 2020 – the beginning of the upcoming 2020/2021 hunting license year – unless the provision is extended by subsequent legislation. As introduced, AB 3022 by Assembly Member Jay Obernolte (R/33-Hesperia) proposes to extend the "sunset" for one year to July 1, 2021. To have the bill take effect before the 2020/2021 license year begins on July 1, 2020, AB 3022 also includes an urgency statute which states the bill will take effect immediately upon enactment. Update: AB 3022 held under submission in Assembly Appropriations Committee and didn't get pulled before deadline and is technically dead. AB3030 (Ash Kalra) Protect Lands and Water: Would declare it to be goals of the state to, by the year 3030, protect at least 30% of California's lands and waters; to assist with the protection of 30% of the nation's oceans; and to support

efforts to protect at least 30% of the world's lands, waters and oceans.

AB 3030 is dangerously poorly written and ambiguous. Among many other things, although the bill calls out goals for the total percentage of our lands and waters that should be "protected", its language fails to identify the extent of existing protections already in place (i.e. the baseline). Even more troubling, the bill does not expressly define what the legislation means by the word "protect". As such, should the intent of AB 3030 be interpreted (and thus implemented) wrongly over the next decade, the "protections" the bill calls for in AB 3030 could easily result in sweeping closures to public access to much of California's lands and waters, and the hunting and fishing opportunities they currently, or could provide. Update: Now in the Senate, AB 3030 has been referred to the Senate Natural Resources and Water (SNRW) Committee that it is likely to be heard on Wednesday, August 5th.

SB 1175 (Stern). Animals: prohibitions on importation and possession of wild animals: live animal markets. Update: Now in the Assembly, SB 1175 has been set to be heard in the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee on Tuesday August 4th. That hearing will begin at 10:00 AM

CALIFORNIA BOWMEN HUNTERS BIG GAME CLUB POSITION STATEMENT

The California Bowmen Hunters-Big Game Club (CBH-BGC) has historically utilized the Boone & Crockett (B&C) / Pope and Young (P&Y) Measuring system (copyrighted 1887) to record trophy animals taken with a bow and arrow in California. CBH-BGC received copyrighted, but revocable, permission many years ago to utilize not only their scoring system, but their score forms, affidavits, and use of the term 'Fair Chase'. Both P&Y and B&C require an almost identical code of conduct and ethical requirement listed under their respective Fair Chase Affidavits for any animal submitted to their record programs.

On June 14, 2020, your CBH-BGC voted unanimously to continue to align with Pope and Young and Boone and Crockett's Fair Chase requirements and measuring system. Under their rules of "Fair Chase" neither club allows any animal harvested using electronic rangefinding bow sights (Garmin, Burris, IQ, etc.) for entry into their records program. This would violate number III of B&C's Fair Chase Affidavit, as well as #7 of P&Y's Fair Chase Affidavit. (http://www.boone-crockett.org/bc-position-statement-fair-chase - http://www.pope-young.org/fairchase/default.asp)

While the use of such electronic sights may be legal in California, they, unfortunately, will not be accepted into the CBH-BGC records program, as they clearly violate our rules of Fair Chase. This should, in no way, minimize the trophy taken or the hunter who utilizes such equipment; we (CBH-BGC) simply must maintain the integrity of our records program and continue to practice and encourage Fair Chase.

The Rules of Fair Chase for P&Y and CBH-BGC:

The term "Fair Chase" shall not include the taking of animals under the following conditions: ()

- 1. Helpless in a trap, deep snow or water, or on ice.
- 2. From any power vehicle or power boat.
- 3. By "jacklighting" or shining at night.
- 4. By the use of any tranquilizers or poisons.
- 5. While inside escape-proof fenced enclosures.
- 6. By the use of any power vehicle or power boats for herding or driving animals, including use of aircraft to land alongside or to communicate with or direct a hunter on the ground.
- 7. By the use of electronic devices for attracting, locating or pursuing game or guiding the hunter to such game, or by the use of a bow or arrow to which any electronic device is attached with the exception of lighted nocks and recording devices that cast no light towards the target and do not aid in rangefinding, sighting or shooting the bow.
- 8. Any other condition considered by the Big Game Committee as unacceptable.

In closing, the Fair Chase concept extends beyond the hunt itself; it is an attitude and a way of life based in a deep-seated respect for wildlife, the environment, and for other individuals who share the bounty of this vast continent's natural resource.

DOVE & FIG KABOBS



What you need:

- 16 dove breasts
- 16 fresh figs or dried figs reconstituted in water
- 1 cup red wine
- 3/4 cup teriyaki sauce
- 3/4 cup barbecue sauce
- skewers for the dove kabobs

What to do:

- 1. Carve dove breasts from the bone and set aside.
- In a saucepan, add the red wine, barbecue sauce and teriyaki sauce and whisk together.
- Let simmer for 10 minutes.
- Transfer the marinade to a bowl and dip the dove breasts into the liquid. Let soak for 1-4 hours.
- 5. When ready to cook, set the oven to broil.
- 6. Slice the figs in half and skewer the dove breasts and fresh figs.
- 7. Place on a sheet tray with a rack and cook in the oven for 10 minutes, rotating the skewers halfway through.
- 8. Let cool and serve at your dinner party! These are great appetizers.



Currently we are showing only three areas in the state that have the three necessary measurers needed for committee measurements. This is necessary for two year awards and all new state records to be recognized.

Looking forward we are entertaining the possibility of a new Big Game Club logo and are working on several different ideas. Also the possibilities of newly created awards.

Big game members requested business cards similar to LEG REPS and that project has been fulfilled.

As you know, a major part of the 2nd V.P. of Hunting is keeping track of game harvested as well as a two-year awards banquet. Bret Scott has led the effort and undertaken the project of developing new score sheets which have the current affidavit worded in compliance with Pope and Young and Boone and Crockett Clubs. We spent roughly \$400 to that end. Looking back at the 29th Recording Period we are unusually low in submissions. Usually there have been around 200-300 entries. This two year period is less than 10% of that hovering around 30 entries. We have been attempting to chase down animals we have heard were submitted but this is fairly futile without the assistance of hunters and measures who submitted the needed paperwork and funds. To further frustrate our members many animals recognized at the previous awards banquet are not recorded in the Master database on- line. We are pursuing those we know about but we need YOUR **HELP PLEASE!**



THE HISTORY OF ARCHERY

Archery is one of the oldest arts still practiced today. The evolution of archery began at the start of mankind's history, and evidence of ancient archers has been found around the world.

Although archery probably dates back to the Stone Age – around 20,000BC – the earliest people known to have regularly used bows and arrows were the Ancient Egyptians, who adopted archery around 3,000BC for hunting and warfare.

In China, the earliest evidence of archery dates to the Shang Dynasty – 1766-1027BC. A war chariot of that time carried a three-man team, a driver, a lancer and an archer. During the Zhou (Chou) Dynasty that followed – 1027-256BC – nobles at court attended archery tournaments that were accompanied my music and interspersed with entertainment.

Congratulations to Travis Scott on adding a striped skunk to his growing Small Game list. While on a pig hunt Travis noticed this little critter at a distance and realized he can use one of those to help him achieve his Double Eagle (50) different species. The stock was on as Travis slithered to get closer and a better shooting advantage. It did not take long for that to happen and his arrow hit what he was aiming for.

Congratulations Travis you're almost there.

Travis writes, "The great thing about adding your critters to your Small Game list is that you can be scouting, on another hunt or you can target a small game animal during its open and legal season. When registering your Small Game go to http://cbhbgc.com/SmallGame then click on Small Game Rules/Small Game Club Application then click on the GREEN tab at the bottom of the rules and fill out the form with your photo; and pay the \$3 application fee, it's that simple."

When Chinese people introduced Japan to archery in the sixth century it had an overwhelming influence on culture.

One of Japan's most well-known martial arts, originally known as "kyujutsu" (the art of the bow), is known as "kyudo" (the way of the bow). Modern kyudo is practiced primarily for physical, moral and spiritual development. After certain ritual movements, a kyudo archer steps onto the shooting line to shoot at a target 36cm in diameter, 28 meters away, set in a roofed bank of sand. The kyudo bow is 2.21 meters long and made of laminated strips of bamboo.

In the Greco-Roman period, archers in both warfare and hunting settings were frequently shown on pottery.

Middle Eastern superiority in archery equipment and technique reigned for centuries. With bows like those of the Assyrians and Parthians, who were probably the first to master archery from horseback, Attila the Hun and his Mongols conquered much of Europe and Asia, and Turkish archers threw back the Crusaders.



The English longbow became a force in the middle ages and was used in many famous European battles such as Crécy and Agincourt. A law in England that forced every man of adult age to practice archery every Sunday was never repealed, though it is presently ignored.

The first-known archery competition relatable to modern times was held in Finsbury, England in 1583 and had 3,000 participants.

Since the advent of gunpowder, archery's importance in warfare decreased – and it instead developed into a recreational and competitive sport.


