Members and interested parties on the previous mailing list will receive a notification via email with these instruction on how to opt back in.

Also, check out our flyer for the CBH/SAA Showcase Tournament and Legislative Defense Fundraiser in this newsletter. The tournament will be held at Oranco Bowmen in Chino, CA on October 23, 2022. Planning is well underway and we continue to seek raffle donations, volunteers to assist before and during the event, and vendors that would like to set up booths in the assembly area. If you are interested in helping, please reach out to me at CBHLegTeam@gmail.com. My contact info is also on the CBH/SAA website.

THANK YOU to all individuals and club members that continue to answer the fundraising call and donate to the Legislative Defense Fund. YOU are making a difference and the Legislative Committee is grateful and encouraged by your support! You are appreciated!

Lastly, Gaines and Associates is working closely with The Outdoor View (https:// theoutdoorview.org) to present a "Celebration of Conservation" on October 22, 2022, at the Shakespeare Club in Placerville, CA. Members of the California Hunting and Conservation Coalition (CHCC) will join together for an evening of food, live music from Bob Kinney & The Livin Daylites (https://thelivindaylites.net/), dancing, and comments from Assembly Member (and candidate for Congress) Kevin Kiley, El Dorado County Sheriff John D'Agostini, and CDFW Chief of Enforcement, David Bess. The evening will also include the "Grapefather" himself - Nello Olivo (https://nelloolivo.com) - pouring his award-winning wines, and Gary Ritz of Hwy 50 Brewery (https:// hwy50brewery.com) in Camino pouring his handcrafted beers. A short auction is also anticipated. This is not a fundraising event and there

and there will be a small "yet to be determined" charge for attendees to cover the cost of the hall, food, band, and other expenses. The Legislative Committee is working with Chriss Bowles to secure a table of 8-10 for CBH/SAA members to participate. Please contact CBHLegTeam@gmail.com if you are interested in attending.

Now for an update on our current legislative challenge - AB 2571 Firearms: Advertising to minors. This legislation, authored on behalf of the Governor by Assembly Member Rebecca Bauer-Kahan (D/16-San Ramon), and was signed into law by Governor Newsome on June 30, 2022, right before the legislature summer recess. Because it included an "urgency clause" the law went into effect immediately. As of July 1, 2022, California law now prohibits a "firearm industry member" from advertising or marketing any firearm-related product in a manner that is "designed, intended, or reasonably appears to be attractive to minors." The law imposes a civil penalty of up to \$25,000 for each violation (not each event) of these provisions and would authorize a person harmed by a violation to bring suit to recover any damages suffered. So, what does this have to do with archery or bowhunting?

Non-profit organization publications, hunter education programs, fundraising efforts, and other R3 (recruit, retain, reactivate) related outreach that target youth hunting and shooting programs are in jeopardy! Caution and concern regarding the way AB 2571 loosely defines what/ who qualifies as a "firearm industry member", what would actually qualify as "designed, intended, or reasonably appears to be attractive to minors", the possible substantial penalty for each violation, and that the legislation authorizes persons "harmed" by a violation to bring suit, AB 2571 has brought R3 efforts and NGO outreach to youth regarding hunter education, youth raffles, apprentice hunts, youth camps and other related efforts to a screeching halt. In the few weeks since this bill was signed, we've seen:

- Cancellation of Hunter Education classes for youth and adult participants hosted at California Rifle and Pistol Association (CRPA) and other firearm industry hosted locations
- Suspension of raffles for firearms when youth are present affecting potential fundraising activities
- Suspension of shooting booths at youth outdoor events
- Cancellation of youth outdoor events, some of which also included archery booths/ demonstrations
- •Removal of all advertisements, posters, magazines, website content, etc. that featured youth hunters and youth shooting sports
- •Website warnings asking viewers under 18 and living in the State of California not to proceed in viewing content on certain websites

Leading up to Newsom signing this bill into law, our lobbyist at Gaines and Associates worked closely with lobbyists from other members of the CHCC to try to insert language in the bill which would expressly exempt non-profit organization publications and other outreach programs that promote youth hunting, shooting, camps and other R3 efforts.

In response, both the author and the Governor's

office confirmed that, although impacting our youth outreach efforts was not the intent of AB 2571, because the bill was on the fast-track, they could not take amendments.

Instead, the Governor's office committed to working with the bill's author to place a letter in the "journal" stating that hunter education and youth outreach in non-profit publications and other media is not intent of the bill. However, the "journal" is akin to meeting minutes for the proceedings in the State Assembly and Senate, they are not part of the law.

Lobbyists representing the CHCC will work with our State Representatives to introduce "clean-up" legislation when the State Legislature reconvenes in August. Meanwhile, CRPA and other plaintiffs filed a lawsuit and requested an injunction against the enforcement of this law on the basis that it violates the First Constitutional Amendment protecting free speech. Due to statutory timeframes for filing such actions, we do not expect the courts to act until after August 21, 2022.

To assist CBH/SAA and other partners in the CHCC navigate uncertainty around this new law, Gaines and Associates called an emergency meeting of the CHCC on July 20, 2022. We collectively discuss the ramifications of AB 2571. the status of CHCC members' efforts to address our concerns legislatively, the status of efforts to address our concerns in the courts, the status of legal challenges being filed, and to provide some guidance to CHCC members' leadership as to how to safely handle outreach to youth in our publications, social media and other mediums while we wait. As of July 23, 2022, Gaines and Associates and CRPA are compiling a FAQ document to assist affected parties including CBH/SAA and our member clubs. Updates are expected to be available on CRPA's website (https://crpa.org/). Stay tuned!

Other Legislative Team actions and updates this month:

- CBH/SAA member Raylene Proto brought to my attention Federal Legislation HR 8167: Return our constitutional rights act of 2022 (introduced 6/22/22, Clyde from GA and 58 republican cosponsors). This bill seeks to repeal the Pittman-Robertson excise tax on firearms and ammunition and on bows and arrows and repeal the excise tax on transferring and making firearms under the National Firearms Act. HR 8167 was introduced in retaliation to firearm regulation legislation in an attempt to increase firearm sales. However, repealing the Pittman-Robertson excise tax would have a catastrophic impact on conservation funding, which averages \$751M per year. Gaines and Associates is tracking this bill and it's being actively opposed by the Congressional Sportsmen's Foundation and other national NGOs. Folks close to the action on this one do not believe the bill will pass in this Congress. But, to ensure it doesn't crop up again next Congress - efforts are needed to educate Congressional representatives regarding the substantial positive value of Pittman-Robertson and the sweeping support it enjoys from our community. Thanks for the heads up, Raylene! Way to go!
- *SB 370 Big Game Management Account was signed into law by Governor Newsom on July 19, 2022 and will go into effect on January 1, 2023. This legislation clarifies that DFW may enter into agreements with for-profits, non-profits and federally recognized Indian tribes for the use of Big Game Management Account (BGMA) funds to deliver programs and projects that promote big game species and their public hunting opportunity.
- •SB 856 Wild Pigs: Validation will next be heard in Assembly Appropriations Committee on August 3, 2022. This bill was amended June 29, 2022 to address substantial concerns raised by members of the CHCC. CBH/SAA no longer opposes this bill. - •AB 311 Firearms: Gun Shows was signed into law by Governor Newsom on July 21, 2022 and will go into effect on January 1, 2023. CBH/SAA opposed this bill.
- •AB 1769 Firearms: Prohibited Places was signed into law by Governor Newsom on July 21, 2022 and

will go into effect on January 1, 2023. CBH/SAA opposed this bill.

*SB 906 School Safety: Mass Casualty

Threats was signed into law by Governor Newsom on July 21, 2022. In direct response to CBH/SAA and CHCC strong opposition, SB 906 was substantially amended in April to only require schools to annually send parents/guardians information related to the safe storage of firearms. Following these amendments showing up in print, we formally dropped our opposition to SB 906.

- **SB 915 Firearms: State Property** was signed into law by Governor Newsom on July 21, 2022 and will go into effect on January 1, 2023. CBH/SAA opposed this bill.

September 1st Dove Season Opens

Opening day of dove season is just around the corner. Did you know that doves are the most harvested species in the United States? It is estimated that one million people hunt dove annually. This is a hunting and conservation success story as they have been sustainably harvested for decades. Continued. pg 8



The Gift

As you are reading this, I have the harder job. I am out in the wilds of Idaho once again pursuing my annual meat supply. With each year I enjoy the excursions even more than the last. I savor each days' dawn, as the birds begin to awaken and I from my slumber. Perhaps it is the distant call of a coyote or in this case the haunting howl of a timber wolf that catches my attention. Rolling from your sleeping bag the anticipation grows to welcome that cup of coffee and the steaming hot bowl of oatmeal. They both are far more desirable than the nip of the southwestern 10 mile per hour "breeze."



With age (I have a lot of that) comes a deeper appreciation for the things you have come to love in life. These should not be brushed off or dismissed in any manner for each is a gift.

Life for most of us is far better than we deserve (but tend to expect). In the context of this article we will focus on one mans' walk in the woods.

Back in 1972 it was this hunters' privilege to take his first trek out of state to hunt. The state was Colorado, the month was November. As has been my norm, this was to be a Do-It-Yourself hunt as the joy of planning time is a good portion of the hunt.

Elk were the first quarry to be pursued and connect with my arrow. On the third day the meat was hanging from an old barn cantilever. No application, no waiting for the drawing results. And as a non-resident the cost was a mere \$25.

Yes: you read that correctly. The over the counter thing was working well so you guessed it; I invested another \$25 for another first for me: a pronghorn tag. See where this is going? Savor the moments friend - pack them with you.

Now I will say there are those things you won't cherish as well. In this case the plains can get a bit nippy sleeping in the back of your Chevy LUV. But two down bags can do a lot to brace 20 below temps if you cover up with a tarp. Now after missing about thirty pronghorn (yes Joe Wylie, your record of 62 still stands) this hunter finally figured out a string bent over a branch does NOT catapult a stick as fast as a bullet! Somehow I concluded if you get within 12 yards of a sleeping buck antelope your lead need be only 10 yards in front of him to pierce his heart - more meat for the table on the sixth day. Now I don't recall harvesting two animals on the same hunt other than on an outing for "mulies" in Nevada. Speaking of Nevada, that too bears mentioning. Time was non-resident bowhunters (up to 2200) could purchase two state-wide deer tags. You know it's coming - Savor the times.

Beer-Battered Fried Dove Breast

Ingredients

Serves 6-8

30 dove breasts, bone in

4 cups vegetable or grapeseed oil*

2 cups flour

1 tablespoon baking powder

1 teaspoon salt

1 can beer

Salt and pepper to taste

The Mourning Dove, one of the most abundant birds in North America, has an estimated population of around 350 million in the United States. Each year hunters harvest around 20 million doves, which is between 5% and 10% of the whole population.

Mourning Doves are among the most numerous of any upland game bird species. California hunters harvested near 700,00, in the 2020-21 hunting season alone. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service estimates the total Mourning Dove population among seven western states, including California, at more than thirty-three million birds. This type of successful harvest brings in millions of dollars that will ultimately go towards conservation programs and efforts that benefit wildlife species, both hunted and non-hunted.

California is home to several species of the dove. Mourning Dove and White-Winged Dove have a daily bag limit of 15, up to 10 of which may be White-Winged Doves. The possession limit is triple the daily bag limit. There are no limits on Spotted Dove and the Ringed Turtle Doves. Hunting for Eurasian Collard-Dove is legal year-round with no limit. Shooting hours for dove begin one-half hour before sunrise and ends at sunset.

If You love a good challenge, then wing shooting dove may be your small game of choice, just don't

forget your flu flu arrows because it's the law and required when hunting these migratory birds.

Beer-Battered Fried Dove Breast

Directions

- **1.** Rinse the dove breasts under cold water until the water runs clear.
- **2.** Pat the dove breasts dry with paper towel and set aside on a plate.
- **3.** In a medium-sized pot, wide enough to hold about eight dove breasts at a time, add the oil and begin heating it on medium heat. The wider your pot, the more vegetable oil you will need to completely submerge the dove breasts.
- **4.** In a large bowl combine the flour, baking powder and salt. Slowly whisk in the beer until the liquid is uniform and the consistency of thick syrup.
- **5.** Using your fingers or a fork, dip one breast into the batter until it is uniformly covered. Dip one side of the breast into the hot oil to see if it immediately sizzles. If it doesn't, wait for the oil to get hotter. Keep testing with the same dove breast, then add more battered breasts, enough to cover the bottom of the pot.
- **6.** Once one side of the breast is golden brown, turn it over and cook the other side until golden brown, about 5 to 7 minutes total.
- **7.** Set a wire rack over a sheet tray. Remove the breasts from the pot with a slotted spoon and place them on the rack. Sprinkle them with salt and pepper to help retain the crispiness.
- **8.** Repeat until all of the dove breasts are cooked, and serve immediately. Serve with sweet and sour dipping sauce or homemade barbecue sauce
