## Straight Arrow Bow Hunters and the Carr Fire

July 23<sup>rd</sup> was the start of a nightmare for so many people in Shasta and Trinity County and many of us did not realize it would hit us like it did. What started as an RV trailer tire having a blow out on Hwy 299 near the Carr Powerhouse at Whiskeytown Lake, began the nightmare.

The "Carr Fire" led to evacuations of the small historic town of French Gulch. A few of our club members live in this town, some evacuated and some did not. Those who did not, stayed at their homes and fought the fire from within for 19 days straight, to some success. Who would have ever thought that this beast would quickly move its way east towards Old Shasta, another historic town, but it did, by Thursday, July 26<sup>th</sup>.

As our Range Chairman, Glen Pine, and a couple other club members watched the smoke rise over the hills to the west, they decided to move the vehicles and the trailer to the grass area. Next thing you know, the beast is coming for a direct hit to the archery range....needless to say, no other time to waste but to get out of there and fast, which is what they did.

As we sat and waited to determine what was lost, what was saved and where in the world do we go from here, it was excruciating, the not knowing. We were lucky to have an individual be able to go in and officially assess the situation on Friday. And, depending on your view, it was either a positive or a negative. We lost so much, but it could have been worse.



The barn with 95% of our 3d targets was gone....flat....down to the ground...the railway/con x boxes that housed the Rinehart walls, ice chests, water jugs, scene animals, etc....bulged out, ripped the paint right off of the boxes and everything gone. The trailers for moving the animals around the range, bale compressor, excess lumber, tools, etc....you get the picture, gone.

Yes, Bigfoot has been cremated. But, he will be rebuilt, like the Six Million Dollar Man (many of you young'uns won't get this, but us older ones will 😞). But, the elk herd was saved! The elk were in the raffle booth, which was spared. The club house and a couple of the buildings nearby were spared. The warm up back wall and partial sides are gone.

Target #11 is completely gone, the carpet bale, shack and safety wall but for target #10 only the safety wall. The rest of these on the lower 14 are good.

Then, you get to the balance of the range. The Western Classic Trail Shoot targets, other than what was already mentioned, #25-#70 are pretty much gone, a couple here and there are okay, but we have a lot of rebuilding of back stops and safety walls to rebuild.

The shade structure at the winding bears and the Meadow Snack Shack made it....although the fire went ALL around it, took out the bridges too, those are still standing. The Ridgetop and Bigfoot shacks are gone.

The amount of trees, LARGE and small, that are down is countless. We have closed the range for any shooting as safety comes first. Once we clean up the range from the trees and debris, then we will be rebuilding the lower 14, the upper 14 and then the balance of the range. Ishi Archers in Red Bluff, has been kind to open their range to our members so they may continue shooting.

Straight Arrow Bow Hunters will rebuild and we will make new memories from this tragic event. We are all #ArcheryStrong. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts.

## A Trip to NFAA Nationals By Debi Tuttle

At the end of July, my family and I packed our bags and bows and got on a plane to the East Coast. As it so happened, my in-laws live about an hour away from Mechanicsburg, PA, the site of the 2018 NFAA National Outdoor Field Championships. How could we say no to that opportunity, especially since we had a new nephew to visit as well? I grew up on the East Coast, but have been living in Southern California for nearly thirty years now. Returning east is always a shock when I see how GREEN everything is. The rolling hills and light woods of central Pennsylvania were beautiful.

NFAA Field Nationals was a five-day event running from Wednesday to Sunday. Each day a different event (field, hunter, animal) was scheduled; field and hunter were offered twice. You had to shoot each event at least once, but if you shot twice, your higher score would be counted for final scoring. We decided to shoot Friday through Sunday.

The Mechanicsburg Sportsmen's Protective Association is a wonderful facility. Nestled up against a small mountain range, it has room for FIVE full 28-target field archery ranges, and on their 153-acre property they also have hunting, fishing, and rifle and pistol shooting (both indoor and outdoor ranges). Several small streams cross the property, lending a soothing aural background as you walk from target to target. Breakfast and lunch were served every day in the clubhouse. The Lancaster Archery mobile shop was there as well as a handful of other vendors.

It had been raining pretty steadily during the days leading up to the tournament, and I was worried what would happen if a thunderstorm blew up during the day. On Wednesday, my son and I headed out to the range to check in and to get the lay of the land, and we witnessed the procedure. At the first rumble of thunder, air horns were blown and everyone was herded off of the course. Archers huddled under the tents and pavilions as the skies opened up and rain poured down. But in the way of summer storms, the rain stopped within about 15 minutes and the skies cleared. By regulation, it was necessary to wait at least thirty minutes after the last peal of thunder before allowing the tournament to continue. Then they allowed about forty minutes for archers to get back to the targets they had left, before blowing the horns again to resume shooting. All in all, it was quite the delay. However, we were lucky; on the days that we competed, there was no rain during the tournament, although it would rain later in the afternoon or evening. Due to this and the previous rains, the courses were particularly muddy in spots. I was extremely thankful that I had brought my good rain boots.

One of the attractions of any national tournament is the chance to meet the pros. My son is quite the fan of many top compound archers, and had no problem chatting up and getting selfies with Stephen Hansen, Jessie Broadwater, Braden Gellenthien, Tanja Jensen, Steve Anderson, Paul Tedford, and California's own Paige Pearce Gore. As was our experience at the Vegas Shoot, all of the pros we approached were friendly and generous with their time, and always encouraging to young archers.

When it came time to shoot, everything was well organized. Scorecards with pre-assigned targets could be picked up each morning. They also had a nice arrangement for the cubs; each shooting group of cubs was assigned a "guardian angel" who made sure that the kids got to their targets and stayed on schedule and were scoring properly, etc.. After morning announcements, about thirty minutes was allotted for everyone to walk to their targets. The first target of each day was for practice only and not scored. There was very little waiting, except sometimes at the long walk-up targets. Each day I was assigned different shooting partners; I believe that every night all of the scores were tallied and new groups were assigned based on cumulative scores. I was shooting in the adult women's freestyle category and I knew going in that I had no chance to be competitive, so I approached the tournament as a chance to gain experience and to have fun. Strolling through the sunlight-dappled wooded course (okay, I have to admit that it was sometimes actually squelching through ankle-deep mud), making new archer friends, and of course, getting to shoot my bow ... what more could I ask for from a summer vacation? Oh yes, I actually achieved my tournament goal, which was to finish NOT LAST! I don't know if I'll ever get back to Mechanicsburg or shoot another Field Nationals, but I'm extremely glad that I made it this year.

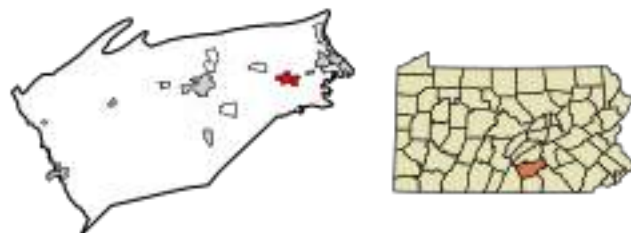

## Switzerland and the World Archery Masters Championship

For those that don't know me, my name is Daniel Stafford & I am a 7 year member & current Range Captain of the Pasadena Roving Archers. I am also a 6 year member of the CBH & NFAA. While I enjoy all styles of archery, I am primarily a traditional archer & am partial to shooting a longbow.

This past week the 1st ever World Archery Masters Championship was held in the Olympic Capital of Lausanne, Switzerland from August 12th - 19th. This was an open event for archers aged 40+ & competitors from around the world were in attendance. I was fortunate enough to be amongst them.

The competition was comprised of three separate events: Indoor, Outdoor & Field. Offering shooting categories in Compound, Olympic Recurve, Barebow, Instinctive & Longbow. I, of course, competed in the LongBow category & I also elected to shoot all three events. While I felt my strongest discipline would be the Field Round, I jumped at the chance to compete in the Indoor & Outdoor events. I know that many traditional archers find Field or 3D archery more fun, but Target Archery can be just as challenging & I find participating in target rounds will not only provide you with valuable competition experience, but will also help to hone your archery skills overall.

While I could happily write pages & pages about my wonderful experience abroad, I'll instead do my best to be brief. So here's a quick recap of my trip, day to day:

**Day #1:** After three flights (LAX to Chicago, Chicago to London & London to Geneva) & a long day of travel, I finally arrived in the city of Lausanne. It is a beautiful city which is situated along the edge of Lake Geneva. I lodged at the Hotel Movenpick, located in the Ouchy section of Lausanne, which had a spectacular view of the lake & which also had, arguably, one of the best breakfast buffets I've ever experienced. The breakfast buffet was included for archers participating in the tournament & I would spend an hour every morning indulging in all manner of breakfast delights while enjoying the view from the comfort of an outdoor seating area. I surely must have eaten my weight in crepes, cheese & croissants over the course of the week.

**Day #2:** Was the official practice day & I spent nearly 8 hours at the World Archery Excellence Centre "sighting-in" my longbow. While there, I was able to meet & shoot alongside many of the competitors from the various nations, all who were very friendly & excited to be at the event. Everyone I spoke to was absolutely thrilled that World Archery had taken the steps to give Master archers (archers from 40 to 80 years of age) the opportunity to fulfill their desire to compete at a high level internationally. While taking the opportunity to spread some goodwill by passing out some stickers & pins from my home club that I had brought along, I fell in with a few archers from Seattle, WA who were part of the US contingent. From then on, I spent much of my free time, when not shooting archery, traveling & dining with them. A few unlucky folks had their baggage mishandled while traveling to Switzerland & their archery equipment didn't arrive in time for the event. It was in this moment that I witnessed a true display of sportsmanship as archers from every country gladly loaned bows, risers, limbs, arrows, sights & all types of equipment to their direct competition so that even if they didn't have their own gear, these archers would still be able to compete. It was a testament to the archery community to see such conduct amongst complete strangers.

Day #3: Indoor Round at the World Archery Excellence Center. 60 arrows @ 25 meters (27.34 yards) followed by 60 arrows @ 18 meters (19.68 yards). This event was a test of endurance. It was essentially like shooting four 300 Rounds in succession. Beginning at 9:30A, we finished our final end just after 4P. I found it hard to maintain a singular focus throughout & found that it took quite a bit of extra effort to keep my mind on the task at hand. To compound the issue, there were 4 archers assigned to each target face & each archer's current scores were posted alongside the target in clear view & for all to see. With each end of 3 arrows, you knew exactly how many points you were ahead or behind. I really enjoyed the added pressure, but it took a bit of getting used to. My shooting started out slow, but was able to shoot a personal best on the last round & bring home a Gold Medal for the US.

Day #4: Field Round at Montheron. 72 Arrows over 24 targets. 12 targets at marked distances + 12 targets at unmarked distances. The course was absolutely beautiful & well designed. The setting was densely wooded & offered steep uphill & downhill shots. The unmarked targets were expertly set at distances that made them difficult to range & it was a bit tricky to determine the target sizes. It's exactly that particular mystery that makes the World Archery Field Round so challenging & fun! Having shot this type of Field Round only once before, I was able to increase my score & set a new personal best for myself. Again, I was fortunate enough to claim Gold for the US Team. Continued from page 12. Day #5: Sight-Seeing in the Alps & Gruyeres. The organizers wisely included a day of rest & relaxation in the busy competition schedule & my new friends from Seattle & I made the most of it. We rented a car in Lausanne & traveled to Gstaad where we were treated to a breathtaking panorama of the Swiss Alps by taking a gondola to the top of Glacier 3000. From the top you could see many other famous peaks in the Swiss Alps including the Matterhorn, Eiger & Mont Blanc. Further along our drive we passed through a number tiny villages complete with traditional wooden houses, chalets covered in hanging flower baskets & Brown Swiss dairy cows. Now I know where all that delicious Swiss cheese & chocolate comes from! We next traveled to the medieval town of Gruyeres, where we ended our day by gorging ourselves on fondue & local Swiss wine from Lavaux.

Day #6: Outdoor Round & Closing Ceremonies. The last & final day of competition was held at the World Archery Excellence Center. It was a windy day & my fellow competitors & I found ourselves having to aim off target significantly to the right in order to counter the effects of the wind.

Those five inch feathers on my wood arrows certainly catch the wind like a sail! Although my shooting wasn't as strong as I had hoped, I was able to walk away with another Gold for USA. Shortly after the competition, awards were presented & the closing ceremonies were held. My teammates & I took special care to thank the organizers, staff & volunteers who made this event possible. As things were winding down, I found it harder that expected to say goodbye to all the extraordinary people I had met during my short visit. With luck, I will see some of them again at another event in the future.

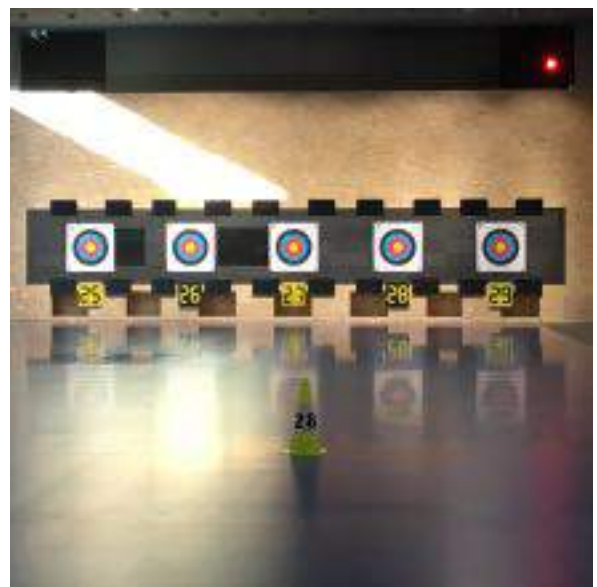

## One Million B.C. Shoot San Francisco Archers by Richard Barron

This archery shoot was held August 4th & 5th In Pacifica, California.

A very popular 3D shoot, in a wooded site in Pacifica, California. The site is a combination of old growth woodland of cypress and eucalyptus forest in a hilly terrain very near the Pacific Ocean. The weather was in the low 60s in the morning, with a little San Francisco fog, with the sun arriving around 11 AM but never really too warm. Great weather for shooting archery.

The shoot is a mixed shoot with traditional and compound archers. The shoot has become very popular and this year they put a limit on the number of archers at 500. They suggest you preregister. They had 460 preregistered archers with only 40 spots open with first come first serve at 6:30 AM on Saturday morning. So you definitely want to preregister if you plan on coming to this shoot. The shoot takes place two days, there are two courses, marked "red course" and "white course". A lot of the shots are steep up hill shots. The terrain can be challenging at times for us older archers, the Red Course has more aggressive trails.

There are few things unique about this competition. First, when you sign up you are able to choose long or short stakes. Which basically separates traditional shooters from compound shooters. Second unique item is when you preregister the club assigns you a target placement for your first target. I understand it is possible for a group to request to be grouped on a target together when preregistering. But if you don't make this request you are assigned a target at random. Rather than the more typical way of signing up with your friends on a target board the morning of the shoot. It just creates confusion as people try to reorganize who they are shooting with with the registration woman at her computer, as you might imagine its not fun for her. I am hoping they thought this was a way to streamline things and they learned their lesson.

The short course, which I shot ,in not all short shots, with several 48 yard targets. The compound guys were out at 80 -100 yards on those targets. Most of the short course targets were in the 24-36 yard range. And the longer shots were usually at a very large dinosaur.

As the name implies the shoot is about 3D dinosaurs, and there are a lot of them to shoot at, there are a few paper targets mixed in (also dinosaur themed) but the vast majority are very realistic looking and big dinosaurs, all varieties of the big lizards. There are 63 targets on the course. Its a fantastic location and site for archery, extremely picturesque. This was my first time at this range and I was very impressed and will be returning next year. I highly recommend this shoot for those who love 3D tournaments. It is one of the best! The San Francisco Archers have a very well run club with a healthy membership, thank you SFA for putting on a great shoot ! More pictures on page 16

(A) Director's report I. Update on tricolored blackbird population estimates and progress with safe harbor agreements (B) Wildlife and Fisheries Division, and Ecosystem Conservation Division I. Update on efforts to eradicate nutria in California 29. Commission administrative items Discuss and consider action on the upcoming meeting agenda items and rulemaking timetable, and identify any new business for discussion at a future meeting.

(A) Next meeting – October 17-18, 2018 in Fresno (B) Rulemaking timetable updates (C) New business Adjourn The next Wildlife Resources Committee meeting is scheduled for Thursday September 20<sup>th</sup> in Sacramento. No agenda has been posted for this meeting at this time. Some State Legislature bills that are in the process for this year, updates. This is the end of a 2 year cycle for bills within the state legislature and if not passed by August 31<sup>st</sup> would have to be resubmitted when the legislature reconvenes.

**AB 3** (Bonta) – Firearms: Age Restrictions would prohibit the sale or transfer of any firearm by a licensed dealer to any person under 21 years of age and raise the legal age to purchase any ammunition to 21 years of age. *Hunting and shooting training under this provision to minors would now be against the law as currently written*, in Senate Appropriations committee, suspense file, failed to move, **Dead AB 3199**, Holden (D/41-Pasadena) that would prohibit the use of firearms (except for antiques) as a prize in raffles conducted by private nonprofit organizations. The bill is in the Assembly Rules Committee. Failed to move, **Dead AB 2151** (Gray) – Hunting: Antelope, Elk, Bear, and Bighorn Ram Tags: Resident Apprentice Tag would reduce the fee for a resident apprentice (youth) antelope, elk, bear, and bighorn sheep tag to \$20. AB 2151 would not make any changes to the cost of an apprentice deer tag, **passed out of Senate Appropriations committee and is on Governor's desk.**

**AB 2670** (Kiley) – Fish and Wildlife: Natural Community Conservation Planning Act would require the Director of the Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) to designate two days per year as "Free Hunting Days" - with one free hunting day in the fall hunting season, and the other free hunting day during the spring hunting season, bill is in assembly appropriations committee. Failed to move, **Dead AB 2805** (Bigelow) – Depredation: Wild Pigs, AB 2805 is Assembly Member Frank Bigelow's (R/05-O'Neals) latest effort to craft a bill which facilitates the ability of landowners to control wild exotic pigs and the extensive damage they do to public and private lands. After a few recent previous attempts to pass similar legislation, Assembly Member Bigelow jump started this effort roughly a year ago by reaching out to the Fish and Game Commission with the request that they work with DFW and interested stakeholders to pull together some recommended bill language, recent amended language will eliminate contained hunting for pigs. This will affect some veteran and disabled hunts. Discussions on how to allow these specific hunts are continuing. **Passed out of Senate Appropriations committee and is on Senate floor. There were amendments placed on this bill in Appropriations but in the haste of getting many bills passed by deadlines they were not included when submitted to the Senate floor. The author will try to get them included while on the floor.**

**SB 1311** (Berryhill) – Fishing and Hunting: Annual Sportsman's Licenses– legislation by Senator Tom Berryhill (R/08-Modesto) – would create annual sportsman's license that provides the same privileges as annual hunting and fishing licenses, but that is valid for a term of one year from July 1st to June 30th. SB 1311 would limit the issuance of these licenses to California residents, bill currently in Assembly Appropriations Committee. Failed to move, **dead**

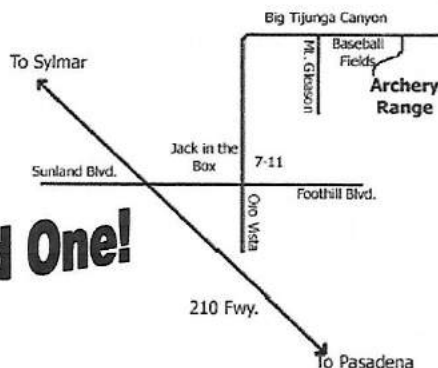
