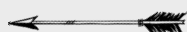


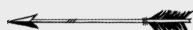

Legislative Information

The next FGC meeting will be held October 17th 2018, in Fresno. No agenda has been posted at this writing.

A Wildlife Resources Committee was held Thursday September 20th in Sacramento. Agenda items

2. Public comment for items not on the agenda 3. Department updates (A) Wildlife Branch (B) Fisheries Branch (C) Law Enforcement Division 4. Initial recommendations for 2019-20 regulations Identify and discuss initial recommendations for upland game birds 5. Committee recommendations for annual regulations

Discuss and consider approving recommendations for regulations for the 2019-20 seasons: (A) Mammal hunting One letter (Exhibit A1) calls for regulation changes to: (a) authorize the use of big bore devices to hunt wild pigs, (b) change the regulatory category for wild pigs, (c) authorize use of suppression devices on rifles, and (d) make changes to wild pig tags.

Two letters (exhibits A2 and A3) express concerns for wildlife injured or displaced by the recent California wildfires, damage to wildlife habitat and request a hunting ban. (B) Waterfowl hunting (C) Central Valley Chinook salmon sport fishing (D) Klamath River Basin salmon sport fishing 7. Deer and elk tag validation regulations Discuss and consider approving recommendations for deer and elk tag validation regulations in regards to firefighters. 8. Archery equipment and crossbow regulations Current regulations require hunters to use a bow or crossbow that casts an arrow or bolt at least 130 yards (Section 354(f)), a standard that is difficult to follow when choosing a bow for purchase.

Additionally, it is difficult for law enforcement to demonstrate in a court of law whether a bow meets the existing standard. DFW is proposing a change to identify a minimum draw weight, similar to regulations in other western states. The regulation change would serve to clarify the requirements for bows and crossbows, and to simplify law enforcement efforts by wildlife officers. Today DFW will provide recommendations on draw weights. 11. Future agenda items (A) Review work plan agenda topics and timeline. Some State Legislature bills that are in the process for this year, updates. This is the end of a 2 year cycle for bills within the state legislature and if not passed by August 31st. Governor has until the end of September to sign legislation that passed. **AB 2151** (Gray) – Hunting: Antelope, Elk, Bear, and Bighorn Ram Tags: Resident Apprentice Tag would reduce the fee for a resident apprentice (youth) antelope, elk, bear, and bighorn sheep tag to \$20. AB 2151 would not make any changes to the cost of an apprentice deer tag, [Signed by Governor](#).

AB 2805 (Bigelow) – Depredation: Wild Pigs, AB 2805 is Assembly Member Frank Bigelow's (R/05-O'Neals) latest effort to craft a bill which facilitates the ability of landowners to control wild exotic pigs and the extensive damage they do to public and private lands. After a few recent previous attempts to pass similar legislation, Assembly Member Bigelow jump started this effort roughly a year ago by reaching out to the Fish and Game Commission with the request that they work with DFW and interested stakeholders to pull together some recommended bill language, recent amended language will eliminate contained hunting for pigs. This will affect some veteran and disabled hunts. Discussions on how to allow these specific hunts are continuing. Passed out of Senate Appropriations and onto the Senate floor. Bigelow received major feedback on how the veteran/disabled hunts would be affected and removed a section of language while on the floor. This resulted in the bill being redirect back to Appropriations Committee where it **Died**. **SB1487** (Stern) Iconic African Species Protection Act would enact the Iconic African Species Protection Act and would prohibit the possession of any part, product, offspring, or dead body of African elephant, African lion, leopard, black rhinoceros, white rhinoceros, giraffe, Jentink's duiker, plains zebra, mountain zebra, hippopotamus, and/or striped hyena, [On the Governor's Desk](#).

And, the rebuilding has begun...

Not long after we were able to assess the damages, and not choke from the daily smoke that lingered over the property, we assembled two full weekends of work parties to start the clean up and the rebuilding of our beloved archery range, Straight Arrow Bow Hunters.

The barn and the conex boxes will be left to the debris removal experts and that's a good thing as we had MANY large trees that either came down across the roads and targets or they had to come down as they were partially burned or just a safety hazard now.

Our crews were set and ready to work.....chainsaws running, tractor and bobcat running, and many bodies set out in all directions to start the clean up. Oak trees cut down, brush piles started, burned up carpet bales and backstops (at least what was left) were hauled off to the debris pile. This was just one full weekend.

The following weekend we started with the rebuilding of target 10 and 11, the elk herd wall and the warm up range. As of this writing, all we need now on them is the paint! When you have to rebuild, from scratch, the warm up wall, this was quite the task....100 ft across and twelve feet tall, in the heat, with new footings...I have to say that these guys kicked it....!!!

On to tackle the upper range safety walls, backstops and target shack roofs. This will start the last weekend of September.

The major part of the rebuild is the balance of the range from target 25 through 70. We called in for advice from our NFAA Councilman, Tom Daley (and his lovely wife, Lesley), to assist us with safety concerns and target placements.

And, unfortunately for some of you, we are moving some targets! We have to remove some due to concerns now that the terrain has changed and place them in another area. We have another 15 acres that we haven't even used and we will now...not all of it, but some of it.

As we know exactly where the new targets will be and when we have a new target map, we will be letting you know so you can map out your new starting positions for the Western Classic, when registration opens the first week of January.

THE FIRST

CALIFORNIA STATE TRADITIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

For the first time CBH/SAA will be sponsoring the California State Traditional Championship. This will be held at the Verdugo range in Southern California in 2019 on the second week end in February. I am hoping to have the 2020 shoot in Northern California. If any Northern clubs are interested in hosting in 2020 please feel free to contact me. We would like to have the shoot one year in the southern part of the state and the next year in the northern part of the state alternating every year.

The categories will be Re curve off the shelf any arrow, Traditional Re curve raised rest ¼ inch above shelf, plunger, 12 inch stabilizer are ok, any arrow. Longbow Wood, Longbow aluminum or carbon. Primitive, (no modern materials) wood arrows. **And for the first time Primitive shooters will have a chance to become a state champion in their own category.** One, two and three piece bows are ok. One anchor point. Finger has to touch the nock in all styles.

The age brackets will be Adult, Senior, Silver Senior and Master Senior for men and women. It will be a 2 day shoot 40 targets on Saturday and 20 on Sunday. Distances will not exceed 30 yards.

Verdugo range can accommodate mobile homes, campers and dry camping with motel lodging nearby. You can go to Verdugo's web page to check out the range and directions. When I put out the flyer I will have GPS coordinates on it. They will have meals available at the range.

The awards will be belt buckles. Awards will be given to 3rd place. You will be able to order T shirts off the registration form and pick them up at the shoot. I am going to see if it is feasible that if you order off the registration form those T shirts will have the year on them. We will have a few T shirts for sale at the range but they will not have the year on them. So order it off the form. We will have a split the pot 52 Card drawing for \$20.00 a card as soon as the last card is sold, we draw and split the pot. We will have a split the pot shoot (Ding the Dime) that will be going on both days.

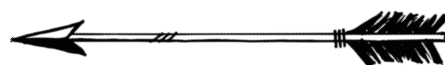

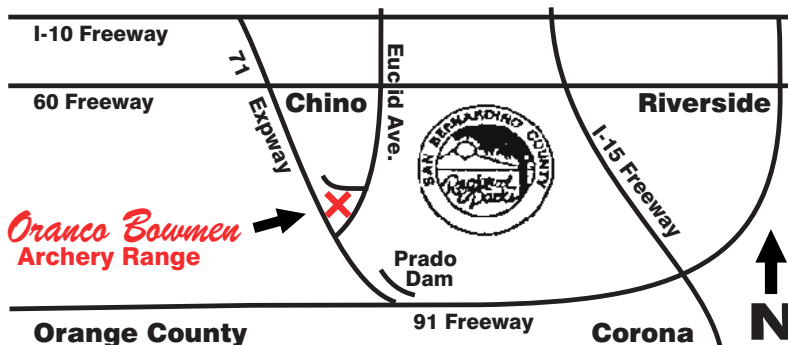

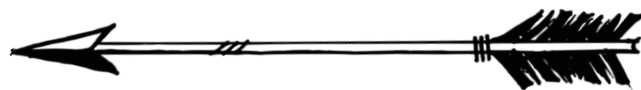
