

foot) box trailers to haul all of this gear. If anyone has or knows of one for sale then please reach out.



I'm sure Robert Moore will have some additional information on the recent legislative session in Sacramento, but it has seen some nice wins for the moment. Using a little known time limit/ filibuster rule in the State Constitution, Republicans were able to kill the Iconic African

Species (Stern) act. This bill would have restricted the importation of any body parts of many African animal species into California. This would have done significant harm to the African hunting trips that many of our members enjoy. We also saw the death of the Wild Lands Protection (Kalra) legislation. proposed bill would put additional restrictions on development and use of many of California's open spaces. Our concern was the possibility of additional access restrictions for hunters and fisherman. The bill was very broad and dangerously vague. With a lot of lobbying from various NGO's including CBH/SAA we saw this one die on the vine as well. Huge thanks to Bill Gaines of Gaines and Associates for his tireless commitment to our interests as well the entire outdoor sports community here in California.

With most of the state shut down and a six day a week work schedule, I can honestly say I haven't done much hunting. I have seen some great pictures Continued on page 5

FROM OUR HISTORIAN **SCOTT WALKER**

My articles in the past few months have been in reference to the Founding Fathers of CBH; How many Founding Fathers were there and who were they? As I reached out to receive response to these questions, I realized that many people knew some of the Founding Fathers but nobody knew exactly who they were, or more importantly, what they did. Where can we find this kind of information? well, to tell you the truth, it is right under our noses. It starts in the California Bowhunters Record Book. We can also find this information in the CBH 50 year and 75 year anniversary books. These books not only contain a history of our club, but they talk about the men in CBH who made history and who also started CBH and SAA.

In the early 1940s, there were two separate Archery associations in the state of California: the Southern California Field Archery Association and the Northern California Field Archery Association. On May 5, 1943, Roy Hoff of the Southern California organization and Bill Childs of the northern group met in Sacramento with other concerned bowhunters at a legislative meeting of the Fish And Game Commission. These two men, as presidents of their separate organizations, decided that for the overall advancement of archery in California, the north and south should join forces to form one state archery organization. Out of this meeting the California Bowman Hunters was born. The prime objective of the California Bowman Hunters during its first few years was to obtain a bow hunting season for deer in California. Through the combined legislative efforts of the CBH and the Associated Sportsmen of California, such a bow season was eventually instituted in 1949. This deer season, exclusively for bowhunters, continues to this day. In 1962, under the leadership of CBH president Doug Walker, three new CBH state offices were created. These included, Second VP Field, Second VP Hunting, and Second VP Target. At this time it became the responsibility of the Second VP Hunting to coordinate all the hunting programs for CBH. That same year the California Big Game Record Club was established to start keeping records of the big game animals taken by bowhunters within the state of

California.

know today as CBH/SAA.

Throughout the years, CBH/SAA has continued to promote legislation to improve archery and hunting as well as the means to better expose the sport of archery to the general public. Their mission is dedicated to promoting and protecting archery and bowhunting rights in California.

So who are the founding fathers of CBH? Well I think we definitely need to say that it was Roy Hoff and Bill Childs. In addition, I don't think we can ignore the innovative changes made by Doug Walker that expanded the club and enabled CBH/SAA to serve the diversity of its members and more effectively represent the different aspects of archery. (I may be a little bit biased about that last one.)

EASY CATFISH TACOS RECIPE WITH SLAW

Ingredient Checklist

1 pound skinless catfish fillets, cut into 16 pieces 3/4 cup whole buttermilk

1/2 cup fine yellow cornmeal

1/2 cup panko (Japanese-style breadcrumbs)

2 tablespoons Cajun seasoning (such as Slap Ya Mama)

3/4 teaspoon kosher salt, divided

1/4 cup mayonnaise

2 tablespoons fresh lime juice (from 1 lime)

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

2 cups shredded napa or green cabbage (from 1 small cabbage)

8 (6-inch) yellow corn tortillas, warmed

2 radishes, cut into matchsticks (1/4 cup)

1 ripe avocado, thinly sliced

2 tablespoons fresh cilantro leaves

2 tablespoons minced fresh chives

Lime wedges

Hot sauce, to taste

Directions:

Preheat oven to 450°F with oven rack 6 inches from heat.

Combine catfish and buttermilk in a medium bowl; cover and chill 20 minutes or up to 1 hour

Whisk together cornmeal, panko, Cajun seasoning, and 1/4 teaspoon of the salt in a shallow dish.

Drain catfish; discard buttermilk. Working in batches, dredge fish in cornmeal mixture. Place fish on a wire rack set inside a rimmed baking sheet.

Bake in preheated oven until it's golden brown and flakes with a fork, 20 to 25 minutes.

Meanwhile, whisk together mayonnaise, lime juice, pepper, and remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt in a medium bowl. Add cabbage; toss to coat.

Place 2 pieces of catfish in each tortilla. Top with cabbage mixture, radishes, avocado, cilantro, and chives. Serve with lime wedges and hot sauce.

CALIFORNIA BOWMEN HUNTERS BIG GAME CLUB POSITION STATEMENT

The California Bowmen Hunters-Big Game Club (CBH-BGC) has historically utilized the Boone & Crockett (B&C) / Pope and Young (P&Y) Measuring system (copyrighted 1887) to record trophy animals taken with a bow and arrow in California. CBH-BGC received copyrighted, but revocable, permission many years ago to utilize not only their scoring system, but their score forms, affidavits, and use of the term 'Fair Chase'. Both P&Y and B&C require an almost identical code of conduct and ethical requirement listed under their respective Fair Chase Affidavits for any animal submitted to their record programs.

On June 14, 2020, your CBH-BGC voted unanimously to continue to align with Pope and Young and Boone and Crockett's Fair Chase requirements and measuring system. Under their rules of "Fair Chase" neither club allows any animal harvested using electronic rangefinding bow sights (Garmin, Burris, IQ, etc.) for entry into their records program. This would violate number III of B&C's Fair Chase Affidavit, as well as #7 of P&Y's Fair Chase Affidavit. (http://www.boone-crockett.org/bc-position-statement-fair-chase - http://www.pope-young.org/fairchase/default.asp)

While the use of such electronic sights may be legal in California, they, unfortunately, will not be accepted into the CBH-BGC records program, as they clearly violate our rules of Fair Chase. This should, in no way, minimize the trophy taken or the hunter who utilizes such equipment; we (CBH-BGC) simply must maintain the integrity of our records program and continue to practice and encourage Fair Chase.

The Rules of Fair Chase for P&Y and CBH-BGC:

The term "Fair Chase" shall not include the taking of animals under the following conditions: ()

- 1. Helpless in a trap, deep snow or water, or on ice.
- 2. From any power vehicle or power boat.
- 3. By "jacklighting" or shining at night.
- 4. By the use of any tranquilizers or poisons.
- 5. While inside escape-proof fenced enclosures.
- 6. By the use of any power vehicle or power boats for herding or driving animals, including use of aircraft to land alongside or to communicate with or direct a hunter on the ground.
- 7. By the use of electronic devices for attracting, locating or pursuing game or guiding the hunter to such game, or by the use of a bow or arrow to which any electronic device is attached with the exception of lighted nocks and recording devices that cast no light towards the target and do not aid in rangefinding, sighting or shooting the bow.
- 8. Any other condition considered by the Big Game Committee as unacceptable.

In closing, the Fair Chase concept extends beyond the hunt itself; it is an attitude and a way of life based in a deep-seated respect for wildlife, the environment, and for other individuals who share the bounty of this vast continent's natural resource.




