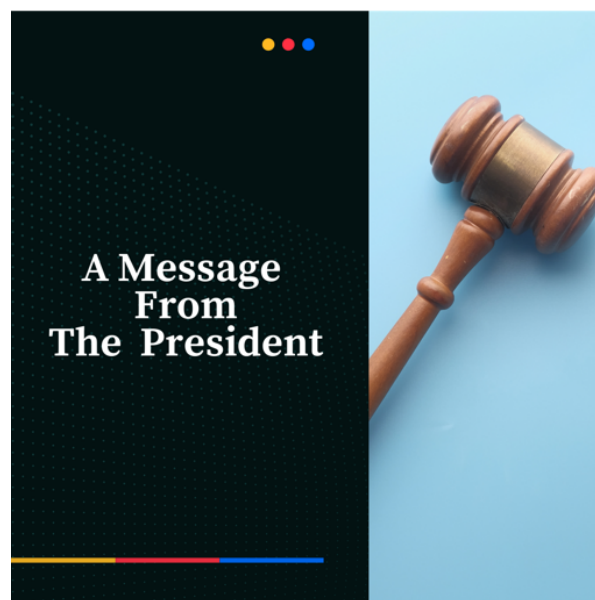

Legislative Coordinator Report Robert Moore

A Fish and Game Commission meeting will be held October 14th, 2021 by webinar teleconference. Agenda item of interest, **Update outcomes of the meeting** 14. Wildlife Resources Committee Receive summary and consider approving recommendations from the September 16, 2021 committee meeting. Discuss referred topics and consider revisions to topics and timing. *WRC developed two recommendations for FGC consideration: 1. Support the proposed regulation changes for waterfowl hunting, Central Valley sport fishing, and Klamath River Basin sport fishing, as recommended by DFW. 2. Support the proposed regulation changes to restore preference points for certain hunts and to refund certain tag fees in instances where public lands were closed due to wildfires during the 2021 and 2022 mammal hunting seasons, as recommended by DFW.* 15. Mammal hunting preference points and tag refunds. Consider authorizing publication of notice of intent to amend regulations for big game species preference points and tag refunds. *The Commission authorized the publication of a notice as proposed.* 19. Justice, equity, diversity and inclusion Receive and discuss an update on developing the justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion plan. *The Commission adopted a working JEDI vision statement: "All people enjoy safe and equitable access to California's thriving native wildlife and natural habitats, supported by*

inclusive decision-making that reflects the needs and values of the state's diverse communities." 26. Petitions for regulation change received at previous meetings. Consider whether to grant, deny, or refer for additional review petitions for regulation change received under general public comment at previous meetings. Note: New petitions for regulation change will be received under general public comment. I. Petition 2021-013: Request to revise regulations for commercial market squid fishing in Monterey Bay, including changes to allowed days, times, and lighting. **Denied** (B) Action on pending regulation petitions referred to staff or the Department for review II. Petition 2021-001: Request to restore recreational and commercial red abalone harvest at San Miguel Island, Santa Barbara County, **Denied** Adjourn

The next FGC meeting will be December 15-16, 2021 Wildlife Resources Committee meeting September 16th. This meeting starts the process for next year's vetted proposals. The agenda is long so I will pick the items that would be the most interest to CBHSAA Agenda items 4. Discuss and potentially make recommendations on regulatory options for 2022-23 seasons for: (A) Upland game bird hunting, *large discussion on habitat, fires, feral horses and burros and management of them.* (B) Mammal hunting, *No regulation changes this year. Discussion: A commenter asked the Commission to act on his petition, related to wild pig hunting. Melissa Miller-Henson explained that petition referral to the Department is for review and ultimately are commendation from the Department, and that the Commission will take action after it receives the recommendation. A representative of Tolowa Dunes Stewards voiced a concern for Roosevelt elk, and asked for information, transparency, and science on the elk. The organization is looking for a report on the elk herds that was expected in the summer and urges the development of a management plan for trepaneme-associated hoof disease (TAHD). Another commenter hoped that some of the new Department funding would be used to address TAHD in Roosevelt elk and for wildlife corridors, and that hunting quotas on Roosevelt elk be reduced. A biologist for the Yurok Tribe stated that the tribe is working to improve elk habitat and is interested in creating habitat corridors to facilitate herd connections to Yurok lands. ommenter encouraged the Commission to allow hunters to acquire a second bear tag and to convert some deer tags to premium hunts to increase hunting opportunity and Department funding.* (C) Waterfowl hunting, *Melanie Weaver presented recommendations for waterfowl hunting regulation changes, including minor seasonal adjustments and moving two days in the Balance of State Zone from early Canada goose season to late A season. She also provided the latest updates on mallard harvest rates.*

Legislative Report from page 5- *Discussion A* representative of the California Waterfowl Association supported the movement of the two hunting days. They also agreed with the Department's assessment that any mallard decreases were due to habitat declines and not hunting pressure. They and other meeting participants requested that the federal DD Form 214 (commonly referred to as a DD214) be permitted as a valid identification document for military and veteran hunts. They also requested that the start of the late goose season in the Balance of State Zone be moved from the third weekend in February to the second weekend in February to coincide with the veteran and active military hunt. III. Permits for game and fish contests (also known as "tournaments"), Valerie gave a presentation on the Department's proposal for changes to the regulations that govern permitting for game fish tournaments. Potential amendments could include: • Changes to the different event classifications, • allowing catch-photo-release events, • extending black bass event maximum durations, • clarifying applicant eligibility and permit stipulations, • expanding the criteria for permit denial or suspension, and • revising the permit conflict resolution process. The regulation changes are intended to expand tournament opportunities, clarify associated permit processes by eliminating procedures that may allow skewing of the odds for successful permit drawing, and facilitating improved enforcement of the permits. The Department is reaching out to stakeholders, and is anticipating requesting that the regulatory changes be effective in July 2022. Discussion A commenter encouraged the Commission to ensure there would be an avenue for public participation in the course of the rulemaking. Commissioner Zavaleta stated that these issues are complex, she is eager to hear from the public regarding the proposals, and that the sometimes slow pace of progress is in the service of greater public participation. 5. Mammal hunting tag returns (A) Discuss and consider recommendations on a potential rulemaking to address returns of mammal hunting preference points and fee refunds in response to public land closures due to wildfire for the 2021-22 seasons. (A) Regulation for 2021-22 Brad Burkholder gave a presentation on a Department proposal for regulation change to address big game hunts that suffer a substantial loss of opportunity due to wildfires; this regulation would be similar to one that was adopted in the previous year. The proposal would reinstate preference points, and award one preference point for the license year, for certain deer tags, and would refund tag fees, reinstate preference points, and award one preference point for the license year for bighorn sheep, pronghorn antelope, and elk tags, when hunt zones are inaccessible for 66% or more of the season because of public land closures caused by wildfires. The proposed regulation would be effective for the 2021 and 2022 license years only, which would give time for the Commission to adopt a permanent regulation for tag returns. Commissioner Silva asked about timing, and Scott Gardner responded that the Department is looking to have the regulation effective by February, to give enough time to process tag returns before the next year's drawing.

He noted that the core team for the regulation has been in heavy planning discussions, and that fortunately national forests were reopening for public access – with the caveat that closures could start again if wildfire activity increased.

Discussion: A representative of the California Deer Association, Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, and the Wild Sheep Foundation thanked the Department and the Commission for proposing the regulation; they strongly support the proposal.

The California Deer Association supported the inclusion of preference point returns for premium deer tags, and asked that deer fees be considered for refunds, despite the understanding that the cost of administering the refunds exceeds the refunded amount. They suggested that a credit might be issued in lieu of a refund. They would like to work with the legislature to "backfill" some of the refunds to the Department's Big Game Management Account. A commenter mentioned a petition regarding land closures that was rejected under staff review; he asked that it be added to a future agenda. Scott Gardner elucidated the focus of the regulation as preserving "once-in-a-lifetime" opportunities in the face of extraordinary circumstances. He stated earlier return times are better, and stressed the importance having a single deadline to avoid confusion; the core team will consult with the Department's License and Revenue Branch (LRB) to see what works best. The Department has endeavored to simplify the proposal. Brad explained that some of the reason for later dates had to do with the timeline for the regulation to become effective, and the 2022 license year may have earlier dates. He mentioned that LRB spends a great deal of time reissuing tags (using a list of alternates) if they are returned before the season starts or if a hunter chooses not to purchase a tag after being drawn. Recommendation, The Wildlife Resources Committee recommended that the Commission support the proposed regulation changes to restore preference points for certain hunts and to refund certain tag fees in instances where public lands were closed due to wildfires during the 2021 and 2022 mammal hunting seasons, as recommended by the Department. (B) Discuss and consider recommendations on a potential rulemaking to provide the Department general authority to address returns of mammal hunting preference points and fee refunds in response to potential future public land closures. Adjourn

AB 614 Aguiar-Curry. Update: signed by the governor.

AB 645 (Gallagher) – Fish and Wildlife: Poaching Violations – Probation. Laws which significantly increased fines for possessing more than three times the daily bag limit and for the illegal take of wildlife for profit or personal gain which increased penalties for the illegal take of trophy-class animals took a step back last year when the State Legislature passed legislation that reduced maximum probation from three years to one year for all misdemeanor violations whose provisions do not call out a specific probation length. Because current law does not specify maximum probation periods for any poaching crimes, the effect of this legislation was to limit probation for even the most serious misdemeanor poaching violations to one year. Said differently, prior to passage of last year’s legislation, a judge could sentence individuals convicted of serious poaching crimes to probation that would prohibit them from hunting for up to three years. The option of a longer probationary period also helped to ensure that penalty assessments could be collected.

To address this serious concern, this bill as amended March 11, 2021, would reinstate maximum 3-year probation for the following serious violations of the Fish and Game Code:

- §12012 – The illegal take of wildlife for profit or personal gain
- §12013 – The illegal take or possession in the field of more than three times the daily bag limit
- §12013.3 – The illegal take of trophy deer, elk, antelope, bighorn sheep or wild turkey
- §12002.3(b) - The illegal sale purchase of abalone

AB 645 Update: is in appropriations committee and held under submission

AB 804 Megan, Dahle. Free hunting days. Existing law authorizes the Director of Fish and Wildlife to establish 2 free hunting days per year: one in the fall, and one in the winter. Existing law authorizes a California unlicensed resident to hunt during a free hunting day if accompanied by a licensed hunter, subject to certain conditions. Existing law prohibits these provisions from being implemented until the Department of Fish and Wildlife’s Automated License Data System is fully operational for at least one year. This bill would require, rather than authorize, the director to establish 2 free hunting days per year, one in the fall and one in the spring, no later than July 1, 2022. The bill would delete the prohibition requiring a delay in implementation of the above-described provisions. **Update:** Signed by Governor

AB 1223 (Levine) The Gun Violence Prevention, Healing, and Recovery Act, The Gun Violence Prevention, Healing, and Recovery Act, would, commencing July 1, 2022, impose an excise tax in the amount of 10% of the sales price of a handgun and 11% of the sales price of a long gun, rifle, firearm precursor part, and ammunition as specified.

Update: 2 year bill

AB 1237 This legislation requires the DOJ to release the personal information of law-abiding individuals who purchase ammunition/firearm parts in California to the Firearm Violence Research Center at U.C. Davis and allow the release of the data to other nonprofits/agencies involved with the study and prevention of violence.

Update: This unpopular bill was put through a legislative end run from the normal process. AB173 and SB173 bills that were sitting on the floors for a simple vote, was gut and amended with the AB1237 language. This allowed the bills to be passed without debate. AB173 passed and was sent to the Governor’s Desk and he signed it on 9/23/2021 and is effective immediately.

SB 370 Dodd, Wildlife: Big Game Management Account: uses. Existing law establishes the Big Game Management Account within the Fish and Game Preservation Fund. Existing law requires revenue from the sale of tags for antelope, elk, deer, wild pig, bear, and sheep to be deposited in the account, except as provided. This bill instead would authorize the department to make grants to, reimburse, or enter into contracts or other agreements with public and private entities, including nonprofit organizations, and federally recognized Indian tribes for the use of the funds from the account to carry out those purposes. **Update:** SB 370 2yr bill

SB 470 Jones, Fishing and hunting: annual combined hunting and fishing licenses.

This bill would create the annual combined hunting and fishing license that would grant the holder of the license the same privileges as the annual hunting and fishing licenses and that would be valid for a term of one year from the date specified on the license. The bill would limit the issuance of these licenses to residents and would require the department to issue these licenses beginning January 1, 2023, upon payment of a fee of \$100, as adjusted annually for inflation. The bill would require the Fish and Game Commission to adjust the amount of the fee to fully recover, but not exceed, all reasonable administrative and implementation costs of the department and the commission relating to these licenses. The bill would require the department to provide an applicant for one of these licenses the option to automatically renew the license and would provide a 5% discount if the applicant selects this option. **Update:** 2yr bill

CBHSAA State Legislative Representative for Regions 3 and 4 are vacant. Region 3 area covers Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, Sacramento (partial)*, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, San Francisco, San Joaquin (partial)*, Solano, Sonoma, and Yolo (partial)* counties. Region 4 area covers Fresno, Kern, Kings, Madera, Mariposa, Merced, Monterey, San Benito, San Luis Obispo, Stanislaus, Tulare and Tuolumne counties. Out In The Woods

Rodney York 2nd VP Hunting



I should probably start by introducing myself. I am agent *Sticker*: AKA: *34Cheater*. This year in late August I was commissioned by the Colorado Parks and Wildlife Service to head up an undercover sting operation along the Continental Divide in the central part of Colorado.

My mission was to assemble a team of well seasoned agents to conduct surveillance on two subjects who would allegedly attempt to infiltrate the rocky terrain on the western side of "The Divide".

The field officers which I chose were known to be trustworthy, devoted agents that would persevere throughout the 45 day task force assignment. Specialists "BoxCar" and "PotBelly" were teamed up as Squad1. They had worked together in the area for more than the past six years. Agents "*Stripper*", "*15*" and "*3High*" rounded out our team.

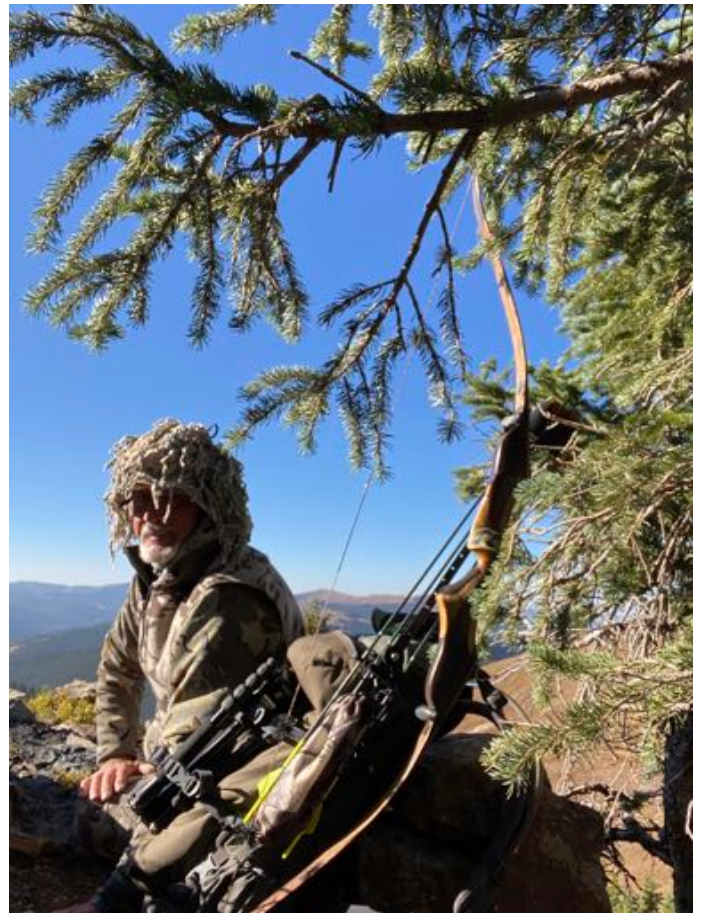
I would meet with them each night after the curtain of light had been displaced by dark. Our discussion of tactics and areas of distribution would last until the second hour of light the following day when I would break off on my own to the tallest of willow patches or the steepest, widest rock slide I could find.



Our subjects were hotdog and hamburger. Hotdog was a tall local; sleek and wirey - while hamburger was built low to the ground and a tenacious little rascal

arriving from another state. Our briefing revealed the subjects would be on location with the intent of removing the game for consumption.

Our job was to observe from a distance of at least 50 yards but we were most often overly cautious preferring a comfortable 1/4 to 1/2 mile, thus ensuring our safety. True to reports it was hamburger that first appeared. Up through the small valley he came slowly one evening looking like a turtle (pack) until he removed this shell and produced a larger orange shell (tent) into which he crawled and didn't exit until two hours before light. Even before dawn he had snuggled into the mile distant rocky structure known as Marmot Lookout, and he was back against the cluster to hide his silhouette. He seemed hurt as he didn't move for over 4 hours. His eyes seemed all "bugged out" (binoculars and spotting scope) as he glared back at me.



More uncanny than this, he seemed to know where all the agents and other fur-bearers were located and gazed at them as well. By 10:00 on most mornings all of us that pursued him were exhausted from the long night of eating and drinking together. Continued page 11

We would retire to the willows or a tree's north side if we could find one.

A reader may think it wouldn't get too warm at elevations of over 12,000 feet, but in the seventies, it was enough to burn the pointed nose of our subject in his first two days. Usually an hour after noon brunch, hamburger would slowly ascend a mountain and pass out of sight. By this time the winds from the west had become stronger and more persistent in bending the willows as they danced.

It became even harder to find the slow moving creature whose skin seemed to blend with all terrains perfectly in camouflage. It was in times such as these the blurred figure would somehow approach to a dangerously close proximity; sometimes with one long and one short stick (bow and arrow), others with a three-legged black box (video camera) into which he peered.

Each day for more than a week this peculiar behavior continued; nearly always I ventured into a different canyon or climbed the highest peak to find this unusual being. As days continued Hotdog surfaced. Sometimes with hamburger and other days waving white flags at each other just before one of them would become dangerously close to us.

is indeed being consumed in both Colorado and California.

As for hamburger; 13 stalks later - when the snows began at the end of September he too disappeared into the whiteout. I however remain to carry out yet another assignment next fall. To pursue me all one needs is 14 years of preference points or \$3,500 for a unit-wide landowners tag.

Specialist Sticker, signing out for now - I am glad to have served.

The main difference between the two other than being a hotdog and a hamburger was that the hotdog didn't carry a three-legged black box. He was much more aggressive and carried the long stick and would often hurl the shorter stick at either myself or one of our special agents.

On his 10th day his short stick over took one of our oldest and most experienced agents. We didn't see much of hotdog after this encounter. It is my duty to report that "Specialist 15" has not been seen nor heard from since September 18th. It is known that he

Grilled Yellowtail
Charred Tomato-Nopal Salsa
8 Ingredients 50 Minutes 730 Calories

Ingredients: 4 SERVINGS

- 6 garlic cloves (peeled and finely chopped)
- 1/2 cup olive oil (good-quality)
- 2 tablespoons fresh lime juice (preferably key limes- you'll need about 4)

- 46 ounces yellowtail (skinless, or other firm white fish like American Red Snapper or striped bass fillets)
- salsa (Charred Tomato-Nopal on page 12)
- 1/2 cup chicharron (coarsely crumbled, Mexican crisp-fried pork rind)

Grilled Yellowtail continued: INSTRUCTIONS: Take skinless yellowtail (or other firm white fish like American Red Snapper or striped bass) fillets. Place the fish in the bowl and smear all sides with the marinade. Heat half of a gas grill to medium-high. Spoon the Charred Tomato-Nopal Salsa over the top and garnish with the crumbled chicharron.

Charred Tomato-Nopal Salsa

Ingredients:

- 4medium (about 8 ounces total)nopales (fresh cactus paddles)
- 5 knob onions (about 7 ounces)
- 1tablespoon olive oil
- 1 1/4pounds (6 to 8 plum or 12 large)
- 1/2 teaspoon Mexican oregano
- Salt

Holding a paddle with a pair of tongs, trim off the edge that outlines the paddle, including the blunt end where the paddle was severed from the plant. Slice or scrape off the spiny nodes from both sides of the paddle.Heat a gas grill to medium-high or light a charcoal fire and let it burn until the charcoal is covered with white ash. Lay the nopales and onions on the grill and drizzle with oil. Add the tomatoes and chiles to the grill and cook, turning everything at least once, until the vegetables are charred on all sides and very soft, about 10 minutes for the nopales and 15 minutes for the onions, tomatoes and chiles. Cool, then peel the chiles and tomatoes, if you wish. Stem and seed the chiles, then cut them into 1/2-inch pieces and scoop into a bowl. Chop the tomatoes and nopales the same size and add to the bowl. Using only the white part of the onion, slice them 1/4-inch thick and add to the bowl. Sprinkle in the oregano and mix well. Taste and season with salt, usually a generous teaspoon and your salsa is ready to serve.

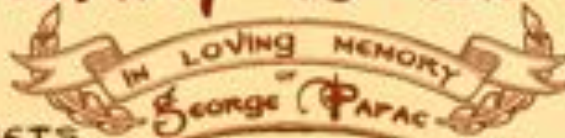
