During that archery season from carrying, or having under their immediate control, a firearm of any kind, except for an active or honorably retired peace officer. Current regulations allow CCW permit holders pursuing other big game species during archery season to carry a concealable firearm, but state law does not extend that same allowance to those archery hunting deer. This bill would correct that disparity by allowing those hunting deer during archery season to carry a concealable firearm for personal safety in the event they encounter an illegal marijuana cultivation site, an aggressive mountain lion, or other large predatory species. Our sponsored bill to allow CCW permit holders to carry for personal safety while archery deer hunting is gaining incredible momentum.

- Status: The bill passed off the Assembly Floor with a commanding 68-0 vote on April 16.
- Next Steps: It has moved to the Senate and is currently pending referral to a policy committee.

AB 1722 (CESA Self-Defense Clarification)

This bill seeks to protect individuals from penalties if they use reasonable force against a protected species in an act of

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

Greetings CBH/SAA friends and family! With the April policy committee deadlines behind us, we are navigating a flurry of fiscal hearings and floor votes to protect your rights as hunters and archers.

Legislative Wins and Priority Bill Tracking

AB 1912 (Archery Deer & CCW) – Major Progress As amended, this bill would repeal current law which prohibits a person taking or attempting to take deer

good faith self-defense.

Update: CBH/SAA officially signed on to the coalition letter of support.

Status: After passing the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife and Judiciary committees unanimously, it is now headed to the Assembly Appropriations Committee

AB 2207 (Youth & Disabled Veteran Tag Transfers)

Following member feedback, CBH has officially supported this legislation, which would allow the voluntary transfer of unused big game tags to youth with life-threatening illnesses or disabled veterans.

- Status: The bill passed out of the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee on April 14 and is pending a hearing in Appropriations.

Other Noteworthy Bill Statuses:

- **AB 1673 (County Propagation Funds):** Passed the Assembly Floor on April 23 and moved to the Senate. This bill expands the use of funds to include human-wildlife conflict programs.
- **AB 1948 (CCW Validity):** Passed the Assembly on March 26. It proposes extending CCW license validity to three years for new licenses.

Leg. Report from page 5**Other Noteworthy Bill Statuses:**

AB 1624 (Public Lands Protection): This bill, which sought to restrict zoning on transferred federal lands, was pulled by the author on April 15 and is now dead.

SB 1397 (Human-Mountain Lion Conflict Program):

Passed the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee on April 14 then briefly heard in the Senate Appropriations Committee on April 27 and placed on the suspense file. The Senate Appropriations Committee suspense hearing will be held on Thursday, May 14 upon adjournment of Session.

Defending Science-Based Management Opposition to Grizzly Reintroduction (SB 1305) We are standing firm against SB 1305, which directs the state to create a "roadmap" for reintroducing grizzly bears.

- Our Position: Adding North America's most dominant apex predator would escalate an existing predator crisis and suppress the recovery of our already fragile deer herds.
- Status: Despite our strong opposition, the bill passed its first committee on a party-line vote and is scheduled for a Senate Appropriations hearing on May 4.

The Battle for Catalina Island Mule Deer Our legal engagement to stop the eradication of mule deer on Catalina Island continues.

- Legal Update: We cannot file a formal injunction until "damages" are suffered, likely in September when the Conservancy plans to begin eradication of deer.

DONATE: To help fund efforts to stop eradication and ensure proper CEQA permitting is followed.

Fish and Game Commission (FGC) Updates

April 12 Meeting Recap

Tag Allocations: In a rare and positive move, bighorn sheep, elk, and pronghorn tags were approved "on consent" without lengthy debate.

Bear Regulations: Despite some agenda shuffling caused us to miss testimony, the expansion of the black bear hunting zone in Lassen and Modoc counties and the ability to purchase a second bear tag was approved.

The "Social Science" Shift: During testimony, we continue to see a concerning trend where anti-hunting groups are pushing for "social science" (often driven by emotion) to be weighed alongside traditional biological science.

Looking Ahead: WRC Meeting (May 14)

The Wildlife Resources Committee (WRC) meets this Thursday. The agenda is expected to be light, focusing on the Private Lands Management (PLM) program and initial vetting for the 2027-2028 tag allocations. Continued

After significant positive regulation changes last year, we expect a quiet year this year and maintenance of the status quo. Note: CBHSAA and our CHCC members do not plan to pursue a spring bear season unless hunting bear with hounds is restored through the state legislature.

2026 State Unmarked 3D Championship (see flyer on page 13): Mark your calendars for November 8, 2026, at Cherry Valley Bowhunters. We are currently looking for support to share the event flyer with local clubs and shops.

Conservation Win???: On a broader note, the Soda Mountain Solar Farm project has been downsized and approved with a vital wildlife overpass included in the plans. This was not the denial that we hoped but additional mitigation measures have been included that support wildlife.

On The Archer's Table

PERFECT SEARED FISH

Click for more tips

Ingredients:

4 fish fillets, about 1 1/2 pounds; Salt
2 tablespoons grapeseed, safflower
or peanut oil, or clarified butter; 1
tablespoon unsalted butter; Lemon
or limes for garnish

There is nothing quite so wonderful as a piece of perfectly seared fish: Crispy crust on one side, just-barely-done meat in the center. It is one of the great tastes of the world...



Instructions

*Take the fish out of the fridge and salt both sides well. Let them come to room temperature for 20 minutes.

*Near the end of that time, heat a large steel or cast iron sauté pan over high heat. When it's hot, add the oil and swirl it around. Pat the fish dry with paper towels, and if it has skin, use a butter knife to scrape the skin dry; there is often slime on it still.

*Have a metal spatula or a bacon press handy. Set the fish fillets, skin side (or the side where the skin used to be) down, and the instant they hit the pan, jiggle it so they don't stick. Set the bacon press down on the fillets to flatten them, or press down with the spatula. Keep the pressure on for 30 to 60 seconds.

*Baste the exposed side of the fish with the hot oil by tipping the pan a little to collect the oil. Do this until the fish turns opaque, about 30 seconds to 1 minute, if the fish is thick.

*Drop the heat to medium-high -- you want it to sound like bacon sizzling. Let the fish cook undisturbed until it wants to release from the pan, usually about 4 to 6 minutes. Jiggle the pan to see how it's going. With fish thinner than about 1 inch thick, you will not be flipping. When the fish has mostly or completely released, use a metal spatula to flip thick fillets, which get cooked another 3 to 5 minutes, or to remove thinner fillets to serve. Set them skin side up and grind some pepper over them.

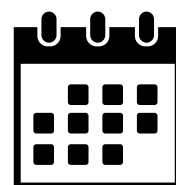

A Day of Coyote Hunting Where a Triple Turned into a Double

As I normally do, on my days off, I get into my truck at 5am and head out to hunt coyotes. Saturday, April 18th, 2026, was no different. My alarm went off at 4:30am and I got up and headed to my truck. I arrived at my first stop in the dark. I hopped out of my truck, got my bow and electronic varmint call from the back seat. I walked the two to three hundred yards to an advantageous position. I set up the call and waited for legal shooting time. I turned the call on and called for about 15 minutes. I packed up my stuff and headed back to the truck, nothing was interested in the sounds of my call. I walked back to my truck and drove a few miles down the road. I arrived at my second stand and began calling. Within just a minute or less I had two dogs come in and circled the call that I had placed in a bush. I looked for something to throw at them so they would leave. But I couldn't find anything, so I decided to use my remote to change the "rabbit in distress" sound to a "coyote howl." I didn't know if it would work or not, but I was interested to see what these dogs would do. They jumped back looking at the call but didn't leave. It was like they didn't know exactly what they should do. In the few seconds that I watched their reactions, I saw, in my peripheral vision, some movement. Before I could turn my head to look, I saw a coyote moving quickly toward the call and the two dogs. No, wait, It was six coyotes!! They started chasing and attacking the dogs. The dogs were confused and didn't know what the heck to do as they had coyotes coming at them from every direction. As quickly as the attack occurred the coyotes had the dogs chased off. Then one of the

coyotes came back to the call. He was standing 15 yards from me and was quartering slightly toward me. I put my 20-pin low on his shoulder and sent the arrow on its way. The arrow hit the back edge of his shoulder. He responded to the hit and ran right past me.

Coyotes From page 5 - Within seconds a second coyote came to the call and stood where the first one stood. I aimed the same way and put this arrow through his heart. He ran for about 50 yards and dropped. Not believing what was happening, a third coyote gave me a standing shot at 40 yards. I put my 40-yard pin on his chest, touched the trigger on my release and loosed a third arrow. It found its mark and he dropped. To my amazement he got up and slowly moved off. I kept the "rabbit in distress" call running hoping a fourth coyote would come to the call but no dice. After a few minutes I turned the call off and I began the task of looking for the three that I hit.

I set out to trail the first one that I shot as I figured it wouldn't have gone far. However, at this time of year, the high desert produces a wildflower bloom. On this day, it had already created a carpet of small red plants and flowers. I found it impossible to find the blood trail due to nature's red carpet. I went back to where the second one ran and started trailing it. I found it piled up not far from where it was standing when my arrow hit it. I took it back to the call and left it. I stood at the call and got my bearings on where the third one was standing when my arrow hit it. Trailing this one was easy for 50 yards or so then it crossed a dry wash. The trail ended there. I found my arrow on the top of the bank of the wash, then nothing. I spent about 15 minutes walking in half circles, expanding my search, hoping to find it or its blood trail, but luck was not with me on my third coyote.

I went back to the call and started my search for the first coyote again. I walked in the direction where it ran. Another coyote started howling ahead of me so I snuck over to see if I could get a shot at it. I quickly

realized it was one of the ones that I had shot. I snuck in and got a perfect shot on it. It was all over for that one in seconds I went back to search for the one that crossed the dry wash and searched for it but after 30 minutes or so, with no sign of a blood trail or a dead coyote, I headed back to the call and the truck.

Prior to me starting the trailing and recovery process, I was really excited about getting a triple from this one set. However, not being able to find one of coyotes turned my triple into a double. Getting three coyotes in one day is a major challenge, let alone getting a triple from one set. But still, I was very happy, because getting two coyotes in one day is few and far between let alone getting a double from one set.

These two coyotes increased my total coyote take and are numbers 138 and 139. I hunt exclusively with archery equipment, and all 139 coyotes were taken with my bow and arrow in California.

You might ask why I hunt and take so many coyotes. The answer is simple. Their population is typically high everywhere... in the wilds and in the towns and cities. They are one of the most successful predators in California as they hunt most of the time in pairs or packs. They prey on small game, rabbits, quail and etc., but they prey basically on all wildlife. Here in California, they take adult deer, adult bighorn sheep, adult desert bighorn sheep and adult elk, but they focus on the fawns, lambs and calves of these game animals. Of course, they also prey on domestic pets and livestock.

If you see me in the field or at an archery range in California... lets talk coyote hunting.
