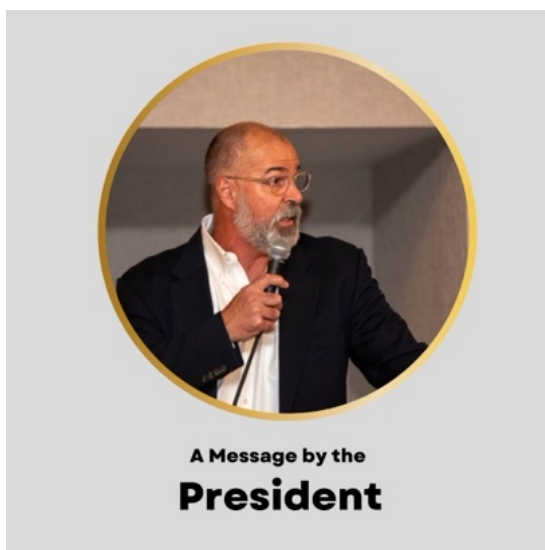
some really great new appointments for CBH/SAA. I am excited to announce that Robert Tehee has accepted the appointment to Vice President of CBH/SAA.

Bill gave a 3 hour debriefing on what is going on....20 bills are being tracked...there is a temporary hold on the issue of the Catalina Island Deer and a new bill is being sponsored to bring back bear hunting with dogs.

Success with 22 more archery hunting tags for elk! Chronic Wasting Disease is still out there and there was mandatory testing in zone X9 ABC & D7. Other areas were not mandatory, just optional.

Amanda has done a fabulous job of representing CBH/SAA with our legislative issues. She's also got a great team; Chriss Bowles, Jeff Franklin, Brad Belvedere, James Gallagher along with Johnnie Waddles running the IBEP program, which is hunter education. Thanks all!

After the legislative meeting, was the hospitality room where we could all get together and have food, and various beverages, to kick off the general meeting the following two days. NEW SHOOTING STYLE

Announced

Modern Bowhunter

1. Any site, moveable or fixed, without a lens in the sight and no magnification allowed. Points of attachment shall not be considered reference points. A line running vertically from its top attachment in the pin guard to its bottom attachment in the pin guard would be legal. Sighting reference points, string peep (with or without a lens) and/or kissers button may not be moved during a round. Scopes, clickers and draw check are not allowed. A round or oval housing around the points of reference is not considered a scope as long as no lens is used. No additional pin guard may be used.
2. Release aids will be permitted. In the case of physical disability of the arms or hands, a chew strap may be used in place of fingers or release aids.
3. A pinguard mounted on the sight, and a level mounted anywhere will be legal in this style of shooting.
4. A string of suitable material with a center serving and end servings of the same or different color than the sting may be used. One consistent nocking point only is permitted. Nocking point locators shall not extend more than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch above or below the arrow nock when at full draw. Brush buttons and string silencers properly attached will be legal.
5. One anchor point only is permitted.
6. All arrows shall be identical in size, length, weight, and fletching with allowances for wear and tear.
7. Brush buttons, string silencer, positioned no closer than midway between the nocking point and where the sting touches the wheel/cam, and bow quiver installed on the opposite side of the sight window, with no part of the quiver or attachments visible in the sight window are legal. One straight stabilizer, couple device included if used, which cannot exceed 15 inches at any time, as measured from the back of the bow, V-bar, counterbalance and string dampeners may be used.
8. An archer will not be permitted to change the draw weight of the bow during a round.
9. During a round, no adjustments may be made to the bow, with the exception of sight and its related equipment, unless equipment failure is recognized.
10. Peep verifier and clarifier allowed.
11. Adult class only first year.
12. Backbar may be attached to the stabilizer coupling device or anywhere else on the bow.

Archery and Mental Health Cover Story Jim Teel (AKA “Carp Killer”) Range Captain/Oranco Bowmen



When most people begin shooting field archery, they approach it as a sport. And practice makes perfect, right? The more you practice, the better you get. As you hone your archery skills, the natural progression is to begin competing in tournaments to measure yourself against other archers. But what drew me to archery had nothing to do with competition or even fitness, for that matter. I happened to stumble upon archery in a very round-a-bout way. And the difference it made in my life was nothing short of life-changing.

Ten years ago in February, I suffered the traumatic loss of my 17-year-old son, Jacob. If you're a parent yourself, then the first thought that probably went through your mind as you read that statement was probably something along the lines of "I couldn't even imagine..." And the truth is ***I don't want you to***. The thought alone is enough to bring any loving parent to their knees. The painful truth is that it is far worse than you could possibly imagine.

I was in a very dark place, for a very long time, before I found archery. As a veteran, I had access to support groups and a variety of antidepressants, none of which ever really solved the problem. And even though I relied heavily upon the medication I

took every single day, my mental health wasn't really improving, and I doubted that I would ever be free of the depression that utterly crippled me.

During a trip to Big Bear Lake with my girlfriend, Leigh Anne, I discovered how much better I felt when I was on the water. We rented a canoe and spent the day fishing for trout. I don't think we even caught anything that day, but being on the water felt much better than anything I'd tried until then. I decided to purchase a canoe of my own, and I made a habit of going to the lake.

Within the first few months, I found Big Bear had a substantial carp problem. Some mornings, the carp were so thick that they would literally hit the side of the canoe as they swam away from my silent approach.

"If I had a bow and arrow," I reasoned, "this would be child's play" ...or so I thought. So I bought a bow, got the necessary bow fishing gear, and began bow fishing right along with my regular fishing gear. It didn't take long for me to decide that I only wanted to bow fish and stopped taking my other fishing equipment altogether.

I was hooked.

I didn't know how to articulate it at the time, but the time I spent on the water, hunting down carp and repeating that sequence of drawing a bow over and over again, was providing me with a degree of peace that I never thought I would find again.

When the summer ended and there were no more carp to shoot, I knew I needed to continue shooting a bow. So I looked online for an archery club and found Oranco Bowmen.

I shot as often as possible and applied all of the points of instruction (generously offered by members) I received along the way. At the time, I didn't understand why I felt just a little bit better every day I had a bow in my hand. But the longer I shot - the better I felt on a day-to-day basis. So, I continued to shoot.

Like many archers new to the sport, I was reluctant to shoot any tournaments, reasoning that I wasn't good enough, etc. But I was talked into it by a community that welcomed me with open arms. I didn't win any awards straight out of the gate, but I did make a lot of friends and I always enjoyed the time I spent on the range.

I was in the process of finally healing and I didn't even know it.

A couple of years after I joined the club, I was able to wean myself off the medications I'd relied so heavily on for *so many years*. And I owe that to the sport of archery and the community that promotes it. Without knowing what to call this relationship between archery and my steadily improving mental health, the improvements in my quality of life were undeniable. I drank less, and I could see firsthand how my participation in the sport was very systematically reducing my depression and increasing my sense of well-being.



Somatic movement is the term for a form of mindful physical activity that focuses on the internal experience of the body rather than external goals or performance. Some of its benefits are:

- **Stress and Anxiety Reduction:** Somatic movements can help release tension, improve breathing patterns, and promote a sense of calm.
- **Increased Body Awareness:** By paying attention to sensations and movements in the body, individuals can gain a deeper understanding of their physical selves.
- **Improved Mobility and Flexibility:** Exploratory movements can gently stretch and release muscles, enhancing mobility and flexibility.
- **Emotional Release:** Somatic movement can facilitate the expression and release of emotions that may be stored in the body.
- **Enhanced Body-Mind Connection:** By cultivating a mindful approach to movement, individuals can strengthen their connection between their physical and mental states. (Continued on page 18.)

Conejo has a beautiful range and can host a variety of shoots and a number of different types of shooting. It was really great seeing a club working to enhance traditional archery here in California. Go check them out when you have time.

On Saturday March 15th I took a trip to Catalina Island to help Lt. Ryan Cordero of the CDFW put on an Intro to Archery program for a group of young kids from the Island. For those of you not familiar, Catalina is a small island off the coast of L.A. and is not without its controversy. Luckily, this time, we were just there for the fun. Thanks to Al Wiscovitch, President of Oranco Bowmen, for going with me and helping out with the whole project. It makes it a whole lot easier when you have an extra experienced archer who is also a bit of a local who knows the area. Catalina is the center of the Mule Deer eradication project, and it certainly made for some interesting discussion when in the presence of the conservancy personnel. We had a lot of fun showing the sport of archery to the kids, and not surprisingly, they are all ready to start their own archery team. Another group of happy campers!

I did attend one Fish and Game Commission meeting in February, just before the State meetings, and will be looking to attend the next one on April 16th. Happy to report that we are just a few weeks from getting the Big Game tag allocations finalized and see some improvement in AO Elk tags as well as some additional General Season Sheep tags for the entire hunting community. Thankfully, the coyote issue was tabled until the May WRC meeting. WRC will be on May 15th and will undoubtedly be a spirited discussion about coyotes. I would love for the hunting community to appear at that meeting and jump in on the discussion. If you can only attend online, that's better than nothing.

I genuinely believe we can put this to rest at that meeting, but you never know. Read up and be informed.

The bear bill, AB1038, is in play and will be heard in committee on April 29th. Follow the Houndsmen online and listen to HOWL for Wildlife for even more information as it becomes available. Getting hounds back for bear hunting would be a huge help especially as it relates to Human-Bear Conflict. More to follow as it becomes available. Please keep an eye out on SB 818 as well. This would be a huge win and is a big reach, but getting hounds back to run Mountain Lions is on the table. This isn't a hunting bill per se, but it does get hounds back to at least haze lions out of the urban areas and help protect citizens and domestic animals. As we get ready for the next hunting season in April, it will soon be time to get started on the 2026/2027 regulatory cycle. We will be looking to pursue some improvements in the bear regs and some other tag allocations. Make sure to see your CBH Regional Legislative Rep for more details, see how you can get involved, and let your ideas be heard.

As I head into April and May, I will look to continue my involvement in Sacramento as well as visiting more of the California Archery Pro Shops. There are always a lot of great CBH/ SAA activities and shoots to attend. Make sure to get the State Broadhead on your calendar. We will be at Oranco Bowmen in Chino this year, and it should be one of our biggest ever. Get your 10K drawing tickets now! They will sell out, and they're already going quick. A few new rules that should make it a fun shoot and some really sharp award buckles for the winners! Registration is open on the website now, so get signed up today. Make sure to notify the club beforehand if you're camping, as we expect it to be crowded. Continued Next Page.

Archery and Mental Health continued from pg 14 Now, if you're an archer - then you probably just read that section and said silently to yourself, "*That's archery.*" And you'd be right. Turns out, that by repeating that sequence of minding all of the details that accompany a perfectly released arrow, you gain something far more profound than the thrill of an arrow hitting the mark...you gain peace of mind. The same can be said for people who embrace similar sports where all of your attention has to be focused on a combination of factors to ensure proficiency.

Take surfing, for example. If you're going to do it well, you can't be thinking about anything other than staying on that surfboard. There's no time to think about financial woes, the fight you just had with your significant other, or anything other than *staying on that board*. A perfectly released arrow also demands that same level of heightened awareness. It's an endless pursuit of fleeting perfection. You never *arrive* per se, and every new arrow you nock onto your bowstring requires the same level of attention as the one before it. You may never find yourself on the podium for a state championship and you may never unseat one of the big shots in Las Vegas. But every single person who continues to shoot will reap the rewards of a mind more at ease.

If you have anxiety due to money or relationship problems...go shoot your bow. PTSD weighing on you like a Mack truck? Go shoot your bow. Difficulty finding peace? **Go and shoot your bow**. There will always be those individuals who excel in any given sport. I've won a couple of competitions here and there, and don't get me wrong - it does feel good to be celebrated for that brief moment in time. But the lasting effects of shooting your bow

every week are where the real rewards are found. The friendships you make along the way are equally important. Most of my best friends are within the field archery and bow fishing communities. I put a lot of my time and energy into supporting my club because I know that the lifeline I received will be needed by someone else in the future.

To be part of the team and part of the community that provides that healing environment is quite simply my greatest honor.

I wanted to remind all of you that the healing ability of this sport and of this community should be what you value the most. You can only put an award on your wall and show it off once in a while to a house guest. But what you get out of archery on a personal level is by far the greatest reward. I've put off writing this article for a long time for personal reasons. I didn't want to identify myself by the tragedy in my past. But it's been long enough now and I feel it needed to be said. So thank you for taking the time to read this long overdue testimonial.

CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

1. This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter. It is designed to offer the Archer the benefits of using their hunting equipment in a tournament. **NFAA rules do not apply to this event.**
2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
3. The 2nd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
4. The range for this event shall be laid in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
5. Archers must use hunting Broadheads for this event which is keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.
 - A. Scoring:
 - 1) Vital—10 Kill-8 Wound-5
 - 2) An arrow must be in the target to score, except a “pass-through” which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
 - 3) “Bounce-ins and Glance-offs” shall not score.
 - 4) “Antlers” do not score.
 - 5) Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
 - 6) Double scoring is required.
 - 7) This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.
 - B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:
 - 1) Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64):
 - c) Junior (12-17):
 - 2) Styles:
 - a) Sight Fingers (SF) Compound/Recurve
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Bowhunter Release (BR) up to 7 fixed pin, Max 12” Stab Front, Backbar OK.
 - d) Hunter Release (HR) Bow must be camo or matt finish, Quiver must be attached to bow, Any sight ok, No stabilizer restriction
 - e) Recurve (No Sight) (RC)
 - f) Longbow (No Sight) (L)
 - g) Junior Class will be Sights/Non Sights
 - C. Awards:
 - 1) CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
 - 2) Guest Class is one Class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
 - 3) No awards will be mailed.
 - 4) Cubs and Peewees Participation Awards Only
 - D. Tackle
 - 1) Mechanical Broadheads must be operational
 - 2) 12” stabilizer restriction on Bowhunter Release Class Only.
 - 3) Bow Quivers are allowed in all styles.
 - 4) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
 - 5) No compound over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no weight limit.
- 6) NO RANGE FINDING DEVICES ALLOWED!!
- 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot.
- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (7/8 minimum diameter)
- 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 12) Longbows: any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 13) Longbows: will be shot off the shelf
- 14) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- 15) All bows and broadheads must be inspected on Saturday morning.
- E. Miscellaneous:
 - 1) Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only
 - 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
 - 3) All protests to the Protest Committee will be in writing within thirty (20) minutes of the end of the tournament each day and include a \$25 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
 - 4) There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
 - 5) Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament. Cubs and Peewees will not be allowed to shoot in top flight groups. NO EXCEPTIONS
 - 6) **NO TARGET OR SIGHT NOTES ALLOWED (SIGHT TAPES OK)**
 - 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven’t shot will be assisted .
 - 8) No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours except for tournament officials
 - 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
 - 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
 - 11) Cell phones allowed, pictures and promotion on social media encouraged.
 - 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
 - 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualifications.

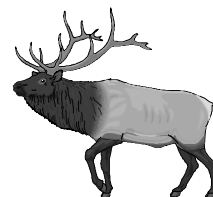

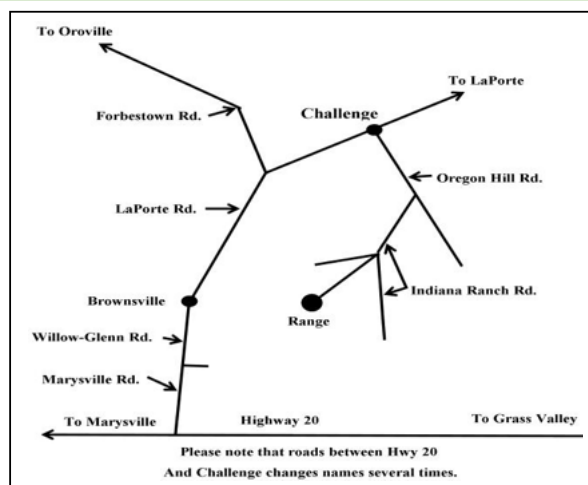

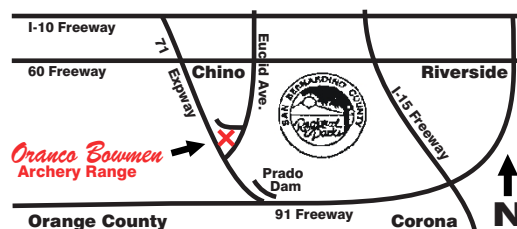
