



Remembering Their Legacy... Honoring Their Lives Tom Daley



Rusty Mills October 18, 1946 ~ October 3, 2024

Rusty was born and raised in the San Francisco Bay area. He graduated from San Francisco State on a water polo scholarship. When he was eight years old, he and his father became life members in NFAA and CBH/ SAA.

Rusty and his dad, along with others, built the first archery range at Kings Mountain Bowman in Redwood City.

Without a doubt, Rusty's passion was tournament archery. He has won National championships and State championships in the indoor and field in NAA-FITA-IFAA. He has won them in all age groups and styles: freestyle, freestyle limited, bowhunter freestyle, and traditional.

His highlight was in 2008, when he won four national championships in the senior division. The Redd 3-D shoot in freestyle, the NCAA field nationals, freestyle Limited, the NAA nationals, compound fingers, and compound release.

Rusty was the CBH/ SAA Vice President of Target Archery and served on the Hall of Fame committee for many years. He was inducted into the California Archery Hall of Fame in 2010. He also coached Archery at Stanford University and worked with a Nevada county gold team. He also served as a marine captain of artillery during the Vietnam War and spent the rest of his career as a successful salesman.

Most would say his superpower was making friends everywhere he went. He was always curious to hear stories and held onto those connections.. After suffering from Alzheimer's for many years, he is now at peace and will be missed greatly by his friends and family. He is survived by his wife, Gene; his son, Robert; his daughter, Kirstin; his son-in-law, Rich, Frida; and his grandkids, Aaron, Emily, and Aiden.

Rusty took great pride and his grandkids and teaching them how to shoot. He said, "Llife is good!" when his grandson said, "I wanna go shoot with Papa."

We honor you Rusty for all you gave to archery and this organization.



Richard "Dick" Eckenburg. August 24, 1937 – August 31, 2024

We once again have some heartbreaking news. We were recently informed that another icon in the archery community has passed. Dick Eckenberg was one of our dearest and most respected friends. He was a long time president of Nevada County Sportsmen's Club. Along with Charley Washburn, he was instrumental in introducing archery to the club. He will be forever missed.

More below from his obituary:

A beloved husband, father, grandfather, and cherished community member, passed away on August 31, 2024, at the age of 87.

Born in Aberdeen, Washington, to Ruth Vail and Henry "Buzz" Eckenburg, Dick lived a life full of dedication, passion, and service. Dick is survived by his wife of 56 years, Joey Eckenburg, and their three sons: Scott, Rich, and Dale. He was also a proud grandfather to Sydney (22) and Sam (20).

After serving with distinction as a member of the Army's 101st Airborne, Dick transitioned to a career as a welder at McClellan before joining Nevada Irrigation District where he worked for 31 years before retiring as Project Manager of the Yuba Bear Project. A passionate outdoors man, Dick was a founding member of the Nevada County Sportsman's Archery Club. He and Joey dedicated much of their time to the club, where they were deeply involved in building, working, and participating in archery events at the local, regional, and national levels.

Dick's contributions to the archery community were widely recognized. He was inducted into the California Bowman Hunters and California State Archers Association Hall of Fame in 2010 and served as president of the CBH-SAA for two terms.

He will be remembered for his dedication to his family, his love for the outdoors, and his unwavering commitment to the archery community.


